Consideration of application by Ingram Concrete, LLC, for Air Quality Permit No. 152417L001, to authorize a rock crushing plant to be located at 1346 County Road 401, Nemo, Somervell County, Texas. The Commission will also consider requests for hearing or reconsideration, related responses and replies, public comment, and the Executive Director's Response to Comments. representatives and customers and the City of Glen Rose's employees working in the immediate vicinity of the facility including sensitive subgroups; b) Whether the draft permit contains adequate conditions to protect against adverse effects on plants, animals, wildlife and sensitive receptors within the requestors' respective properties and the City of Glen Rose's ETJ boundaries in the immediate vicinity of the facility; c) Whether the application's air dispersion modeling properly calculated and addressed potential emission sources, emission rates, and background concentrations resulting in the establishment of appropriate conditions in the draft permit; d) Whether the draft permit contains adequate conditions to protect against nuisance dust conditions affecting the requestors' properties during operations; e) Whether the applicant substantially complied with TCEQ's public notice requirements for air permit applications to maintain jurisdiction to decide the application; f) Whether the draft permit contains adequate monitoring and record keeping requirements to demonstrate compliance with its terms; g) Whether the draft permit's allowance of the facilities to operate up to 8,760 hours per year is protective of the health and safety of the requestors and their families; Set the hearing duration for the proceeding at 180 days from the date of preliminary hearing to the issuance to the Proposal for Decision and; Refer the matter to the Commission's Alternative Dispute Resolution Program to run concurrently with the SOAH Preliminary hearing scheduling efforts. BJ/EL; all agree.

Consideration of the application by Camp Champions Texas L.P. for a new permit, TCEQ Permit No. WQ0015643001, to authorize the disposal of treated domestic wastewater at a daily average flow not to exceed 10,000 – 20,000 gallons per day (seasonal) via surface irrigation of 6.2 acres of non-public access grassland. This permit will not authorize a discharge of pollutants into water in the state. The wastewater treatment facility and disposal site will be located approximately 0.27 mile southwest of the intersection of County Road 125/Highland Drive and Farm-to-Market Road 1431, in Burnet County, Texas 78654. The Commission will also consider requests for hearing or reconsideration, related responses and replies, public comment, and the Executive Director's response to comments. Grant the City of Highland Haven's hearing request; Refer the matter to Commission's Alternative Dispute Resolution Program to run concurrently with the SOAH preliminary hearing scheduling efforts; Refer the matter to SOAH for a contested case hearing on the following issues: a) Whether the water quality of the effluent to be used for irrigation under the draft permit is adequately protective of the public drinking water wells and b) Whether the geology of the irrigation area could result in subsurface flow of contaminants, particularly bacteria, into a public water supply; and

Specify that the maximum duration of the hearing is 150 days from the preliminary hearing to the issuance of the Proposal for Decision. EL/BJ; all agree.

SECTION 46.035 OF THE TEXAS PENAL CODE PROHIBITS HANDGUN LICENSEES FROM CARRYING THEIR HANDGUNS AT GOVERNMENT MEETINGS SUCH AS THIS ONE. THIS PROHIBITION APPLIES TO BOTH CONCEALED CARRY AND OPEN CARRY BY HANDGUN LICENSEES.
