Consideration of an application by the City of Denton for a major amendment to authorize the vertical and lateral expansion of the City of Denton Landfill, which operates under existing Municipal Solid Waste Permit No. 1590A. The landfill is located at 1527 South Mayhill Road in the City of Denton, Denton County, Texas. The Commission will also consider requests for hearing or reconsideration, related responses and replies, public comment, and the Executive Director's Response to Comments. (Chandra Yadav, Kathy Humphreys, Sierra Redding)

Grant the hearing requests of Heidi Berry, Jessica Bond, Kevin Bond, Taylor Brown, Kelley Compton, Cullen Gibson, Jody Gilbert, Laisa Gomez, David Neall, Donna Sincere, Marina Suslova, Laura Threlfall, Edenilson Ulloa, Brittany Ward, Debby Whitworth, and Stacey Wolf; Deny the remaining hearing requests and requests for reconsideration; Refer the matter to SOAH for a contested case hearing on the following issues: a) Whether the landfill gas management plan meets all applicable rule requirements; b) Whether the site operating plan contains sufficient measures to prevent nuisance odors and control disease vectors; c) Whether the draft permit is protective of the health and welfare of affected persons and their families; d) Whether the applicant provided the required traffic data and documentation to meet the requirements of 30 TAC § 330.61(i); e) Whether the visual screening of the landfill expansion complies with commission rules and regulations; f) Whether the draft permit contains sufficient control measures to protect groundwater, surface water, and drinking water, as required by applicable rules; g) Whether the landfill expansion is compatible with surrounding land use; h) Whether the applicant's compliance history warrants denying or altering the terms of the draft permit; i) Whether sufficient measures are proposed to control windblown waste as required by applicable rules; j) Whether the applicant substantially complied with all applicable notice requirements; k) Whether sufficient measures are proposed to maintain the landfill cover as required by applicable rule requirements; and l) Whether sufficient measures are proposed to control dust in accordance with applicable rule requirements; and Specify that the maximum duration of the hearing is 180 days from the preliminary hearing to issuance of the proposal for decision. EL/BJ; all agree.

Consideration of the application by City of San Angelo for renewal of TCEQ Permit No. WQ0010641003, which authorizes the disposal of treated domestic wastewater at a daily average flow not to exceed 16,300,000 gallons per day via evaporation and irrigation. This permit will not authorize a discharge of pollutants into water in the state. The wastewater treatment facility and disposal site are located at 1898 City Farm Road, in the City of San Angelo, in Tom Green County, Texas 76905. The Commission will also consider requests for hearing or

Find that there is no right to a hearing on this application pursuant to Texas Water Code § 26.028(d) and 30 Texas Administrative Code § 55.201(i)(5); Deny the hearing request and request for reconsideration; Issue the renewal of Permit No. WQ0010641003, to the City of San Angelo, as recommended by the Executive Director; and Adopt the Executive Director's Response to Comments. Grant the hearing requests of the Lieutenant Colonel Michael Wiatrowski; Refer the application to SOAH for a contested case hearing on the following issues: a) Whether the draft permit is protective of the requestor's health; b) Whether the draft permit is protective of water quality by preventing wastewater effluent from discharging into surface waters or adversely affecting ground water; c) Whether the applicant's compliance history for the previous five years raises issues regarding the applicant's ability to comply with the material terms of the permit that warrant altering the terms of the draft permit; d) Whether the draft permit complies with applicable requirements to abate and control nuisance conditions in the irrigation areas and odors as set forth in 30 TAC Chapters 309 and 222; e) Whether the draft permit contains adequate provisions to protect against over-application and runoff of treated effluent from irrigation areas; and f) Whether the permit contains adequate monitoring requirements to maintain proper operations; Refer the matter to the Commission's Alternative Dispute Resolution Program to run concurrently with SOAH's scheduling process; and Set the hearing duration of 180 days from the date of the preliminary hearing until the Proposal for Decision is issued.
