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# ABOUT THE MUNICIPAL SOLID WASTE REPORTING PROGRAM

## Definition of Municipal Solid Waste (MSW)

The definition of municipal solid waste (MSW) is found in the Texas Administrative Code (TAC), Title 30, Chapter 330, Subchapter A (General Information). MSW is defined as "solid waste resulting from or incidental to municipal, community, commercial, institutional, and recreational activities, including garbage, rubbish, ashes, street cleanings, dead animals, abandoned automobiles, and all other solid waste other than industrial solid waste." Industrial solid waste is defined and regulated under 30 TAC Chapter 335.

Nonhazardous industrial waste may be accepted at certain permitted MSW facilities in Texas, though it is not defined as MSW under 30 TAC Chapter 330. The MSW rules allow the acceptance of industrial waste that does not require special handling. Industrial waste that does require special handling may also be accepted at MSW landfills under certain circumstances and with prior authorization from the TCEQ. Further, the Texas definition of MSW differs from that of the EPA and several other states, particularly in that the Texas definition includes construction and demolition (C&D) debris and municipal sludge. Consequently, per capita MSW disposal and generation rates for Texas appear to be significantly higher than those of other states and the nation as a whole.

## Who Files Reports

Under 30 TAC 330, Subchapter P (Fees and Reports), "All registered or permitted facility operators are required to submit reports to the commission covering the types and amounts of waste processed or disposed of at the facility or process location..." This report was produced using data submitted by both permitted and registered facilities.

## Reporting Period

Reports from MSW facilities are based on the Texas state fiscal year, which runs from September 1 to August 31. All references to 2004 are to fiscal year 2004. This report covers data from September 1, 2003, to August 31, 2004.

## Data Used

The data in this summary is condensed from reports submitted by 256 landfills and 34 other permitted MSW facilities in 2004. Other facility types include transfer stations and resource recovery (e.g., recycling or composting) facilities. Data was also received from 156 registered facilities, mostly small transfer stations that do not require a permit. However, this report is focused mainly on permitted facilities.

Facility operators report information from different aspects of the facility, such as operational (what is the average haul distance to their facility), administrative (who is operating the facility), and facility activities such as amounts and types of waste accepted at the facility.

Facilities are referred to in this report as "open" if their permits have not been revoked. Permit holders may request revocation of their own permits, or the agency may revoke them—these are the only conditions that change a facility from "open" to "closed." TCEQ rules state that even inactive landfills that are in post-closure care are able to reactivate and accept waste, subject to certain requirements. All open facilities retain the use of their permits, no matter what their operational state.

Population data for this report was obtained from the Texas State Data Center (TSDC) population estimates (<http://txsdc.utsa.edu>) for July 1, 2004. The TSDC uses U.S. Census data and other information to create those estimates.

## WHAT THE DATA SHOW ABOUT LANDFILLS

### Facility Information

**Reporting facilities.** There were 256 MSW landfills providing data in 2004, and 223 were considered open. Of these landfills, 189 were active (accepting waste) and 34 were open but inactive (not accepting waste.) Table 1 details the status codes. Of the inactive landfills, 21 previously accepted waste and 13 had not yet received waste. The remaining 33 landfills were considered closed; 4 landfills ceased operation in 2004 and 29 landfills reporting were in post-closure status.

**Type IV facilities.** Of the 223 landfills open at the end of the year, 44 (19.7 percent) were permitted as Type IV. These facilities accept only brush, construction and demolition (C&D) debris, and other similar waste that will not putrefy. These Type IV facilities are not distributed equally across the state; nearly half are located in the greater Houston area. Type IV landfills handled 8.6 percent of the total waste disposed in landfills and accounted for 4.4 percent of the remaining capacity in 2004.

**Public facilities.** Over two-thirds of the open landfills (69 percent) were publicly owned at the end of 2004. Despite being the majority of facilities, these 154 landfills only account for 41.7 percent of the state's remaining capacity, handling only 33.8 percent of the total disposal in 2004.

**Use of scales.** Most of the active landfills in Texas (79.7 percent) used scales to measure some portion of their incoming waste. Those facilities handled about 90 percent of the total waste stream; however, many facilities with scales also reported waste disposal by volume.

**Tipping fees.** Tipping fees are reported by weight, by volume, or a combination of the two. Landfills collect fees based on different units of measure depending upon the type of waste and method of delivery to the landfill. For example, a landfill might measure an open roll-off dumpster by weight and measure a compactor truck by volume. Most landfill operators (112, or 44 percent of the active landfills) reported that they collected tipping fees by tons of waste, and the state-wide average rate was \$26.09 per ton. Fees for waste measured in compacted cubic yards averaged \$7.44 per yard at 59 facilities (23 percent); and 86 facilities (33 percent) reported collecting fees for waste measured in uncompacted cubic yards, with an average rate of \$7.12 per yard.

**Arid exemption (AE).** In 2004, 65 facilities (25 percent) had an arid exemption<sup>1</sup> from some regulatory requirements. These facilities accounted for just under 1 percent of the total disposal and 1.7 percent of the total remaining landfill capacity in the state in 2004.

**Gas recovery.** There were 13 permitted landfills and 10 registered facilities that recovered gas for fuel in 2004. These gas recovery facilities collected 12.004 billion cubic feet of methane gas. The gas was used to generate 24.95 million kilowatt-hours of electricity for on-site facility use and 434.66 kilowatt-hours for off-site use.

# CAPACITY INFORMATION

**Per-capita rate.** For 2004, total disposal in the state was 29.58 million tons. Based on the state population estimate of 22,490,022,<sup>2</sup> the per-capita landfill disposal rate for 2004 was 7.21 pounds per person per day. Using the EPA definition of MSW (excluding construction and demolition debris and treatment plant sludge) the per capita disposal rate in Texas was 5.39, which is 19.7 percent above the EPA national average for 2003 (most recent data available) of 4.5 pounds per person per day.

The per-capita disposal rate stayed essentially the same from the 2003 rate of 7.20 pounds per person per day, even though increases were reported in some categories. Construction and demolition debris (C&D) actually decreased by 1.5 percent despite economic growth in the state. Residential waste increased by six percent and commercial waste increased by seven percent. This translates to just over 1.2 million tons more waste landfilled in 2004 than in 2003 for these waste types, an increase of four percent of the total annual waste stream. However, the population of the state increased by approximately 371,500 persons which accounts for roughly half a million tons in the residential category. The remaining three-quarters of a million tons, or 2.5 percent of the total waste stream, can be attributed to the increase in commercial waste, indicating growth in the commercial sector.

**Landfill capacity.** Total remaining landfill capacity in the state at the end of 2004 was 2.83 billion cubic yards. Based on reported compaction rates, this volume would hold 1.13 billion tons of waste and serve for 37.35 years. Table 2 details remaining capacity for Type I and Type IV landfills. All estimates of remaining years presume that no new landfill expansions or new permits are issued and that the 2004 population and disposal amounts remain constant.

**Growth and attrition.** Statewide capacity increased in 2004, although the number of facilities remained constant. Two facilities closed. Two new facilities received permits to open and 19 received permit amendments to expand. The resulting net increase was approximately 1.31 billion cubic yards (roughly 436 million tons equivalent) or an 86 percent increase from the statewide 2003 capacity. This increase can be attributed to the two new, large landfills that opened in the middle of FY 2004.

**Statewide distribution.** Although on a statewide basis Texas appears to have a significant reserve of landfill capacity in 2004, this capacity is not evenly distributed over every region of the state. There are 24 councils of governments (COGs) across the state (see Figure 5 on page 14), which are responsible for MSW management planning.<sup>3</sup> Of the 24 COGs, four had less than 20 years capacity remaining, and two of those had less than 10 years capacity remaining.


# Waste Information

Waste types. The largest single waste type disposed of in landfills in 2004 was residential waste, comprising 35.17 percent of the total waste stream, followed by commercial waste, with 34.69 percent of the waste stream, and construction and demolition debris (C&D) with 18 percent. These three types compose the vast majority of the waste stream—87.86 percent of all the waste disposed of in Texas. See Table 4 for a comparison of these waste types over the past five years. See Table 5 for detailed waste characterization.

# Processing Facilities' Activity in 2004

Separate solid waste processing facilities (i.e., not a landfill) are classified as Type V. These facilities encompass processing plants that transfer, incinerate, shred, grind, bale, compost, salvage, separate, dewater, reclaim, and/or provide other processing of solid waste. A closed disposal facility, an inactive portion of a disposal facility, or an active disposal facility, used for extracting materials for energy and material recovery or for gas recovery for beneficial use is classified as Type IX.

**Transfer stations (5TS)** Four facilities became Inactive, one facility became Active, and one new facility has not yet opened for a net loss of one Active facility.

**Waste incinerators (5WI)** Incinerators disposed of 13,831 tons of waste. One facility closed and two facilities became Active after a period of inactivity.

**Waste-to-energy (5RE) WTE** facilities recovered energy from 3,235.13 tons of waste. There were no permits revoked.

**Liquid processors (5GG)** Liquid processors treated 124.97 million gallons of grease, grit, septage, and other liquid wastes. Two new facilities became Active.

**Composting (5RC)** The three permitted composting facilities in the state processed 14,291 tons of solid waste and 715,000 gallons of liquid waste. Two new facilities opened. The majority of composting facilities are exempt from permitting or registration requirements under the MSW regulations, and therefore do not report.

**Recycling and recovery (5RR)** The one active recycling and recovery facility recovered 6,504 tons of waste. One facility changed status from Active to Inactive and one facility closed.

**Gas recovery (9GR)** Landfill gas was recovered at one permitted processing facility, which collected 2.57 billion cubic feet of gas for beneficial use. There was no change in the number of open facilities.

# MSW IMPORTATION AND EXPORTATION

Mexico imports. Texas received 48,121.04 tons of MSW from Mexico in 2004 at eight facilities, up only slightly from 48,116.84 in 2003.

State imports. Eight facilities imported 215,981.65 tons of MSW in 2004 from Arkansas, Louisiana, New Mexico, and Oklahoma.

Waste exports. There are no requirements to track MSW exported from Texas. The regional solid waste management plans maintained by the COGs estimate that 518,698 tons of waste were exported to other states in 2004.

Net result. Based on the estimated exports from the COG plans and the known imports, Texas exported 254,595.31 more tons of waste than it imported.

## MSW GENERATION

EPA definition. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) defines MSW generation as the sum of: disposal (landfilling and combustion), recycling (including composting), and the net of imports and exports.

Texas recycling. Texas established an official recycling rate for the first time in 1997.<sup>4</sup> The analysis herein assumes that the established 35 percent recycling rate is still appropriate for this data.

Diversion. Materials were diverted for recycling or reuse at 119 permitted facilities in 2004, accounting for 5,659,286.65 tons of material that was not landfilled. Of these, 108 facilities chipped, mulched, or composted 699,553.07 tons of brush and yard waste. The remaining estimate of recycling amounts comes from registered transfer stations and material recovery facilities.

Generation in 2004. Using the EPA definition of generation, Texas' generation of MSW for the 2004 fiscal year is:

# TRENDS ANALYSIS

Landfill closures. There have been over 700 MSW landfill closures in Texas since 1986, most due to the more stringent requirements of Subtitle D of the Federal Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA). However, since the late 1990s the total number of permitted facilities has stopped decreasing, leveling out at about 220. Even with fewer landfills in the state, capacity has grown significantly in the past ten years. This indicates a continued move away from smaller community landfills and towards larger regional landfills. See Figure 7 on Page 16 for a graphic representation of this trend.

Capacity reserve. From 1986 to the mid-1990s, the state's reserve capacity for disposal was less than 22 years. The reserves have shown a steady increase since that time, with the current reserve capacity for disposal at about 37 years. This increase is due in part to increases in available volume of permitted disposal capacity, and in part to improvements in landfill technology. These technological improvements have nearly doubled the average waste compaction rates over the last twenty years. In 1986 the average compaction rate was 650 pounds of waste per cubic yard; the average in 2000 was approximately 1,200 pounds per cubic yard and the rate has remained nearly constant since then. The 'flattening' of this trend may indicate that available, affordable landfill compaction technologies have reached their peak efficiencies.

Regionalization. In addition to improvements in the operation of landfills, the size and service area of landfills has continued to grow over the last decade and a half. In 1986, the average landfill size was 50 acres with an average depth of 6.5 feet and a height of 13 feet. In 2004, the average landfill size was 190.8 acres with an average depth of 36 feet and average height of 64.9 feet. This data year, 2004, is the second consecutive year in which there has been an increase in the number of regional landfills with maximum heights over 100 feet (39, up from 34 in 2003 and 31 in 2000). There was also an increase in the number of landfills with maximum heights over 200 feet (6 in 2004, up from 5 in 2003).

Counties served. Table 7 shows the regionality of landfills in Texas. Service to more than one county was provided by 123 landfills (57.06 percent). Of those facilities, two served more than 20 counties. The most counties served by one landfill was 27.




Figure 4. TCEQ Service Regions




Figure 6. Counties with Active Landfills in 2004

Figure 7: Number of Permitted Landfills and Remaining Capacity




Figure 8. Texas Total and Per-Capita Landfill Disposal





Figure 9. Private Ownership of Texas MSW Landfills
