Training course on managing petroleum chemical spills scheduled for Nov. 18-19, 2015, in Austin

June 2015 - Learn about solutions to the problems that these liquids present and better understand and manage risks from LNAPL contamination by attending this two-day training course.

Gasoline and diesel spills can contaminate soil and groundwater. These, and other light nonaqueous-phase liquids (LNAPL), can present a challenge for corrective action and cleanup at facilities with these products.

[Registration](#)  is now open for the course “Light Non-Aqueous Phase Liquids (LNAPL): Science, Management, and Technology,” offered and presented by the Interstate Technology and Regulatory Council (ITRC) for the first time in Texas, and hosted by the TCEQ.

The course is designed for site owners, consultants, regulatory staff, and industry staff, including fleet managers.

Consumer Confidence Reports for Public Water Systems due July 1

May 2015 - Consumer Confidence Reports for Public Water Systems due July 1

The TCEQ requires every **community** Public Water System (PWS) to provide a Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) to their customers by July 1 of every year. Use the [Instructions on How to Complete Your Consumer Confidence Report \(CCR\) Using the TCEQ CCR Generator](#) to develop your report.

However, it is important to know that the template created using the CCR Generator above is not your complete CCR. Make sure that you also follow TCEQ rules:

Once you have provided the CCR to your customers, you must complete a certification of delivery form, make a copy of the certification and CCR for your records, and mail both to the TCEQ. Visit the [Certification of Consumer Confidence Report \(CCR\)](#) Web page for instructions to obtain and complete this form.
