



SIP Revision: Texas, February 15, 1974

This page contains the complete text of the Texas State Implementation Plan (SIP), based on the original Texas SIP, dated January 26, 1972, and reflects all revisions made up to February 15, 1974.

Summary of the SIP Revision

Adoption Date: 02/15/1974

EPA Approval Date (Partial): 04/20/1977 (42 FR 20462) and 07/06/1977 (42 FR 34517)

Background: The Texas SIP was revised on February 15, 1974, to reflect organizational changes to the Texas Air Control Board (TACB) and updated regional classifications reflecting the revised sulfur dioxide (SO₂) and nitrogen dioxide (NO₂) National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS). Starting with this SIP revision, air quality data was no longer included in the SIP revision itself, and instead was submitted directly to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) on a quarterly basis.

Key Changes: This SIP revision included the addition of TACB enforcement orders, a progress update on deployment of the monitoring network, deletion of outdated data from source monitoring, updates to the Permit System Procedures, information on local program funding, a reworked emergency episode plan, and new TACB rules and regulations.
