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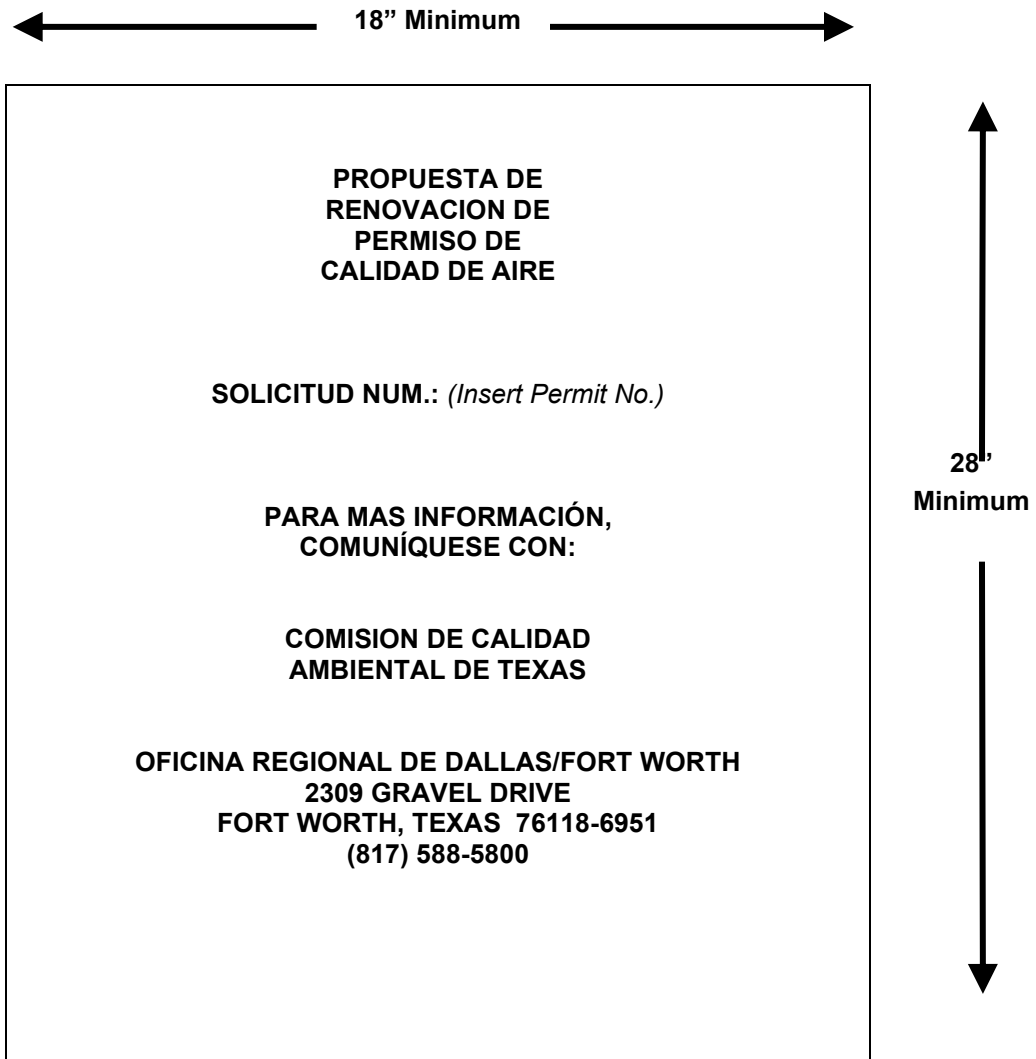

Note - The information shown is an example only. It is your responsibility to verify that the appropriate information pertaining to your application is accurate. Each sign placed at the site must be located within 10 feet of each (every) property line paralleling a public highway, street or road. Signs must be visible from the street and spaced at not more than 1,500-foot intervals. This application was submitted to the TCEQ on September 11, 2025. The application will be available for viewing and copying at the TCEQ central office, TCEQ Dallas/Fort Worth regional office, and the Haltom City Library, 4809 Haltom Road, Haltom City, Tarrant County, Texas beginning the first day of publication of this notice. The facility's compliance file, if any exists, is available for public review in the Dallas/Fort Worth regional office of the TCEQ. The application, including any updates, is available electronically at the following webpage: <https://www.tceq.texas.gov/permitting/air/airpermit-applications-notices>

The executive director has determined the application is administratively complete and will conduct a technical review of the application. Information in the application indicates that this permit renewal would not result in an increase in allowable emissions and would not result in the emission of an air contaminant not previously emitted. **The TCEQ may act on this application without seeking further public comment or providing an opportunity for a contested case hearing if certain criteria are met.**

**PUBLIC COMMENT.** You may submit public comments to the Office of the Chief Clerk at the address below. The TCEQ will consider all public comments in developing a final decision on the application and the executive director will prepare a response to those comments. Issues such as property values, noise, traffic safety, and zoning are outside of the TCEQ's jurisdiction to address in the permit process.

**OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING.** You may request a contested case hearing if you are a person who may be affected by emissions of air contaminants from the facility. If requesting a contested case hearing, you must submit the following: (1) your name (or for a group or association, an official representative), mailing address, daytime phone number; (2) applicant's name and permit number; (3) the statement "[I/we] request a contested case hearing;" (4) a specific description of how you would be adversely affected by the application and air emissions from the facility in a way not common to the general public; (5) the location and distance of your property relative to the facility; (6) a description of how you use the property which may be impacted by the facility; and (7) a list of all disputed issues of fact that you submit during the comment period. If the request is made by a group or association, one or more members who have standing to request a hearing must be identified by name and physical address. The interests the group or association seeks to protect must also be identified. You may also submit your proposed adjustments to the application/permit which would satisfy your concerns.

The deadline to submit a request for a contested case hearing is 15 days after newspaper notice is published. If a request is timely filed, the deadline for requesting a contested case hearing will be extended to 30 days after mailing of the response to comments.

If any requests for a contested case hearing are timely filed, the Executive Director will forward the application and any requests for a contested case hearing to the Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting. Unless the application is directly referred to a contested case hearing, the executive director will mail the response to comments along with notification of Commission meeting to everyone who submitted comments or is on the mailing list for this application. The Commission may only grant a request for a contested case hearing on issues the requestor submitted in their timely comments that were not subsequently withdrawn. **If a hearing is granted, the subject of a hearing will be limited to disputed issues of fact or mixed questions of fact and law relating to relevant and material air quality concerns submitted during the comment period.** Issues such as property values, noise, traffic safety, and zoning are outside of the Commission's jurisdiction to address in this proceeding.

**MAILING LIST.** In addition to submitting public comments, you may ask to be placed on a mailing list for this application by sending a request to the Office of the Chief Clerk at the address below. Those on the mailing list will receive copies of future public notices (if any) mailed by the Office of the Chief Clerk for this application.

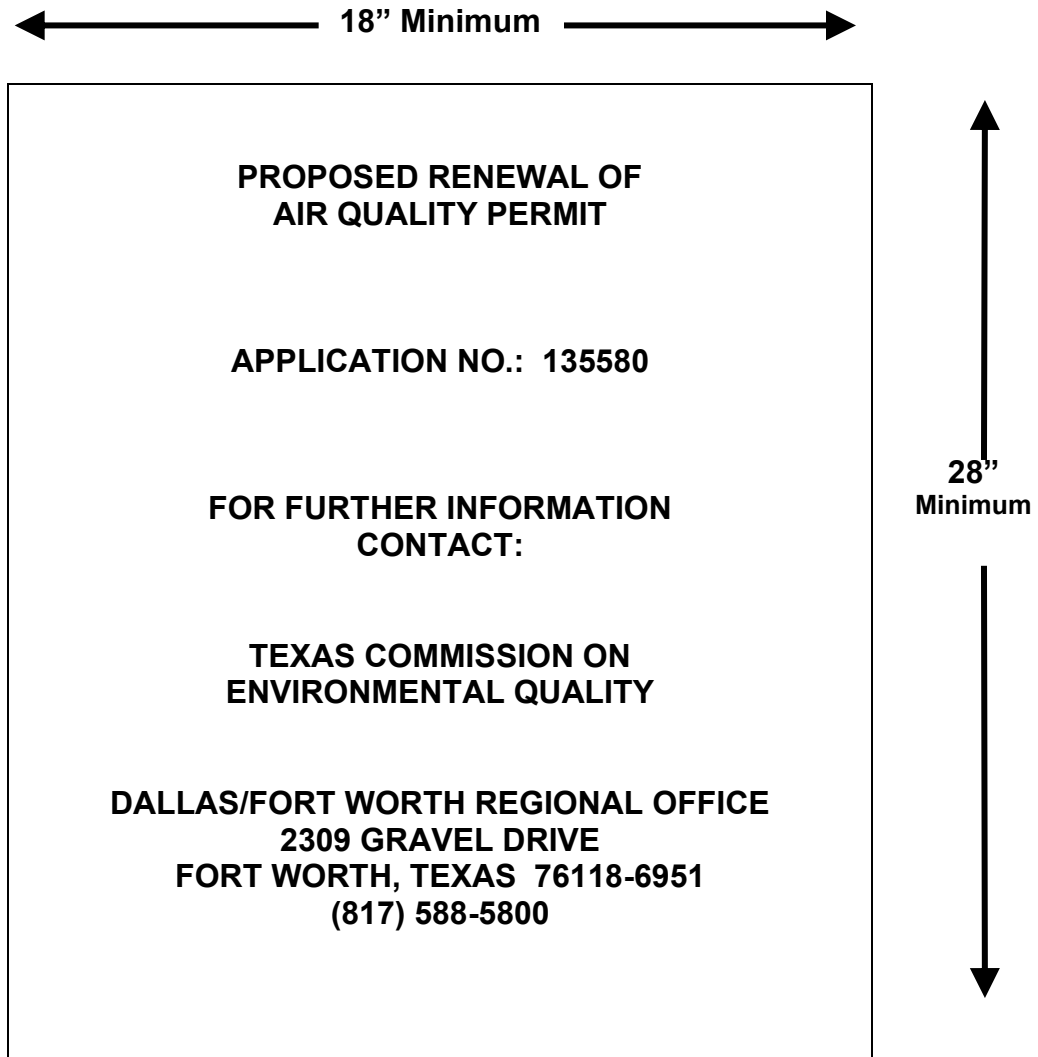

## Instructions for Public Notice For New Source Review Air Permit Renewal

### Notice of Receipt of Application and Intent to Obtain Permit

Your application has been declared administratively complete and now you must comply with the following instructions:

#### Review Notice

Included in the notice is all of the information which the commission believes is necessary to effectuate compliance with applicable public notice requirements. Please read it carefully and notify the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) immediately if it contains any errors or omissions. You are responsible for ensuring the accuracy of all information published. You may not change the text of the notice without prior approval from the TCEQ.

#### Newspaper Notice

- You must publish the enclosed *Notice of Receipt of Application and Intent to Obtain Permit* within **30 calendar days** after the date of administrative completeness. Refer to the cover letter for the date of administrative completeness.
- You must publish the enclosed *Notice of Receipt of Application and Intent to Obtain Permit* at your expense, in a newspaper that is of general circulation in the municipality where the facility is or will be located. If the facility is not located within a municipality, the newspaper should be of general circulation in the municipality nearest to the location or proposed location.
- You must publish this notice in one issue of any applicable newspaper.
- You will find two example notices enclosed in this package. *Example A* must be published in the "public notice" section of the newspaper. The phrase "Example A" is not required to be published. *Example B* must be published in the **same issue** of the newspaper as *Example A*; however, it must be published in a prominent location (other than the public notice section). *Example B* refers the public to the "public notice" section of the newspaper where *Example A* provides more information regarding the permit application.
- *Example B* must be a total of at least **6 column inches (standard advertising units)** with a height of at least **3 inches** and a horizontal dimension of **2 column widths**. If the newspaper chosen does not use standard advertising units for measurement, the notice must be at least **12 square inches** with the shortest side at least 3 inches.
- The bold text of the enclosed notice **must** be printed in the newspaper in a font style or size that distinguishes it from the rest of the notice (i.e., **bold**, *italics*). **Failure to do so may require re-notice.**

## Alternative Language Notice

- In certain circumstances, applicants for air permits must complete notice in alternative languages.
- Public notice rules require the applicant to determine whether a bilingual program is required at either the elementary or middle school nearest to the facility or proposed facility location. Bilingual education programs are determined on a district-wide basis. When students who are required to attend either school are eligible to be enrolled in a bilingual education program, some alternative language notice is required (signs, or signs and newspaper notice).
- Since the school district, and not the schools, must provide the bilingual education program, these programs do not have to be located at the elementary or middle school nearest to the facility or proposed facility to trigger the alternative language notice requirement. If there are students who would normally attend the nearest schools eligible to be taught in a bilingual education program at a different location, alternative language notice is required.
- If triggered, publication of alternative language notices must be made in a newspaper or publication primarily printed in each language taught in the bilingual education program. This notice is required if such a newspaper or publication exists in the municipality or the county where the facility is or will be located.
- The applicant must demonstrate a good faith effort to identify a newspaper or publication in the required language. If a newspaper or publication of general circulation published at least once a month in such language cannot be found, publishing in that language is not required, but signs must still be posted adjacent to each English language sign.
- Publication in an alternative language section or insertion within an English language newspaper does not satisfy these requirements.
- The applicant has the burden to demonstrate compliance with these requirements. You must fill out the **Public Notice Verification Form (Form TCEQ-20244)** indicating your compliance with the requirements regarding publication in an alternative language. **This form is available at [www.tceq.texas.gov/permitting/air/nav/air\\_publicnotice.html](http://www.tceq.texas.gov/permitting/air/nav/air_publicnotice.html).**
- It is suggested the applicant work with the local school district to do the following:
  - (a) determine if a bilingual program is required in the district;
  - (b) determine which language is required by the bilingual program;
  - (c) locate the nearest elementary and middle schools; and
  - (d) determine if any students attending either school are eligible to be enrolled in a bilingual educational program.
- **If you determine that you must meet the alternative language notice requirements after receipt of the full public notice package, you are responsible for ensuring that the publication in the alternative language is complete and accurate in that language. Spanish notice templates are available through the Air Permits Division Web site at [www.tceq.texas.gov/permitting/air/nav/air\\_publicnotice.html](http://www.tceq.texas.gov/permitting/air/nav/air_publicnotice.html). All italic notes should be replaced with the corresponding Spanish translations for the specific application and published in the alternative language publication. Email a copy to Air Permits Division staff.**
- If you are required to publish notice in a language other than Spanish, you must translate the entire public notice at your own expense.

## Public Comment Period

- The public comment period should last at least **30 calendar days**. With the exception of renewals whose comment period should last at least **15 calendar days**.
- The comment period will be longer if the last day of the public comment period ends on a weekend or a holiday. In this case, the comment period will end on the next business day.
- The comment period for the permit may lengthen depending on whether a public meeting is held or if second notice is required. If a public meeting is held, the comment period will be extended to the later of either the date of the public meeting or the end of the second notice period.

## Proof of Publication

- Check each publication to ensure that the articles were accurately published. If a notice was not published correctly you may be required to republish.
- For each newspaper in which you published, you must submit proof of publication that shows the notice, the date of publication, and the name of the newspaper to the Office of the Chief Clerk within **10 business days** after the date of publication. Acceptable proofs of publication are 1) copies of the published notice or 2) the newspaper clippings of the published notice. If you choose to submit copies of the published notice to the Office of the Chief Clerk, copies must be on standard-size 8½" x 11" paper and must show the actual size of the published notice (do not reduce the image when making copies). Published notices longer than 11" must be copied onto multiple 8½" x 11" pages. Please note, submitting a copy of your published notice could result in faster processing of your application. It is recommended that you maintain newspaper clippings or tear sheets of the notice for your records.
- You must submit an **affidavit of publication for air permitting and alternate language affidavit of publication for air permitting (if applicable)** to the Office of the Chief Clerk within **30 calendar days** after the date of publication. **You must use the enclosed affidavits of publication.** The affidavits must clearly identify the applicant's name and permit number. You are encouraged to submit the affidavit with proof of publication described above.
- You must submit the **Public Notice Verification Form (Form TCEQ-20244)** to the Office of the Chief Clerk within **10 business days** of the end of this public comment period. You must use this form to certify that you have met alternative language notice requirements. **This form is available at** [www.tceq.texas.gov/permitting/air/nav/air\\_publicnotice.html](http://www.tceq.texas.gov/permitting/air/nav/air_publicnotice.html).
- The **affidavits of publication, Public Notice Verification Form, and acceptable proof of publication of the published notices** should be emailed to [PROOFS@tceq.texas.gov](mailto:PROOFS@tceq.texas.gov) or be mailed to:

- Please ensure that the affidavit(s) you send to the Chief Clerk have all blanks filled in correctly.
- Photocopies of newspaper clippings, affidavits, and verifications must also be sent to those listed on the enclosed *Notification List* within the deadlines specified above.

## Failure to Publish and Submit Proof of Publication

You must meet all publication requirements. **If you fail to publish the notice or submit proof of publication on time, then** the TCEQ may suspend further processing on your application or take other actions.

## Sign Posting

Applicants for air quality permits must also post signs.

- You must post at least one sign in English and as applicable, in each alternative language.
- Signs must be in place on the first day of publication in a newspaper and must remain in place and be legible and be visible from the street for the entire duration of the publications' designated comment period (see Example C).

The executive director has determined the application is administratively complete and will conduct a technical review of the application. Information in the application indicates that this permit renewal would not result in an increase in allowable emissions and would not result in the emission of an air contaminant not previously emitted. **The TCEQ may act on this application without seeking further public comment or providing an opportunity for a contested case hearing if certain criteria are met.**

**PUBLIC COMMENT.** You may submit public comments to the Office of the Chief Clerk at the address below. The TCEQ will consider all public comments in developing a final decision on the application and the executive director will prepare a response to those comments. Issues such as property values, noise, traffic safety, and zoning are outside of the TCEQ's jurisdiction to address in the permit process.

**OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING.** You may request a contested case hearing if you are a person who may be affected by emissions of air contaminants from the facility. If requesting a contested case hearing, you must submit the following: (1) your name (or for a group or association, an official representative), mailing address, daytime phone number; (2) applicant's name and permit number; (3) the statement "[I/we] request a contested case hearing;" (4) a specific description of how you would be adversely affected by the application and air emissions from the facility in a way not common to the general public; (5) the location and distance of your property relative to the facility; (6) a description of how you use the property which may be impacted by the facility; and (7) a list of all disputed issues of fact that you submit during the comment period. If the request is made by a group or association, one or more members who have standing to request a hearing must be identified by name and physical address. The interests the group or association seeks to protect must also be identified. You may also submit your proposed adjustments to the application/permit which would satisfy your concerns.

The deadline to submit a request for a contested case hearing is 15 days after newspaper notice is published. If a request is timely filed, the deadline for requesting a contested case hearing will be extended to 30 days after mailing of the response to comments.



If any requests for a contested case hearing are timely filed, the Executive Director will forward the application and any requests for a contested case hearing to the Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting. Unless the application is directly referred to a contested case hearing, the executive director will mail the response to comments along with notification of Commission meeting to everyone who submitted comments or is on the mailing list for this application. 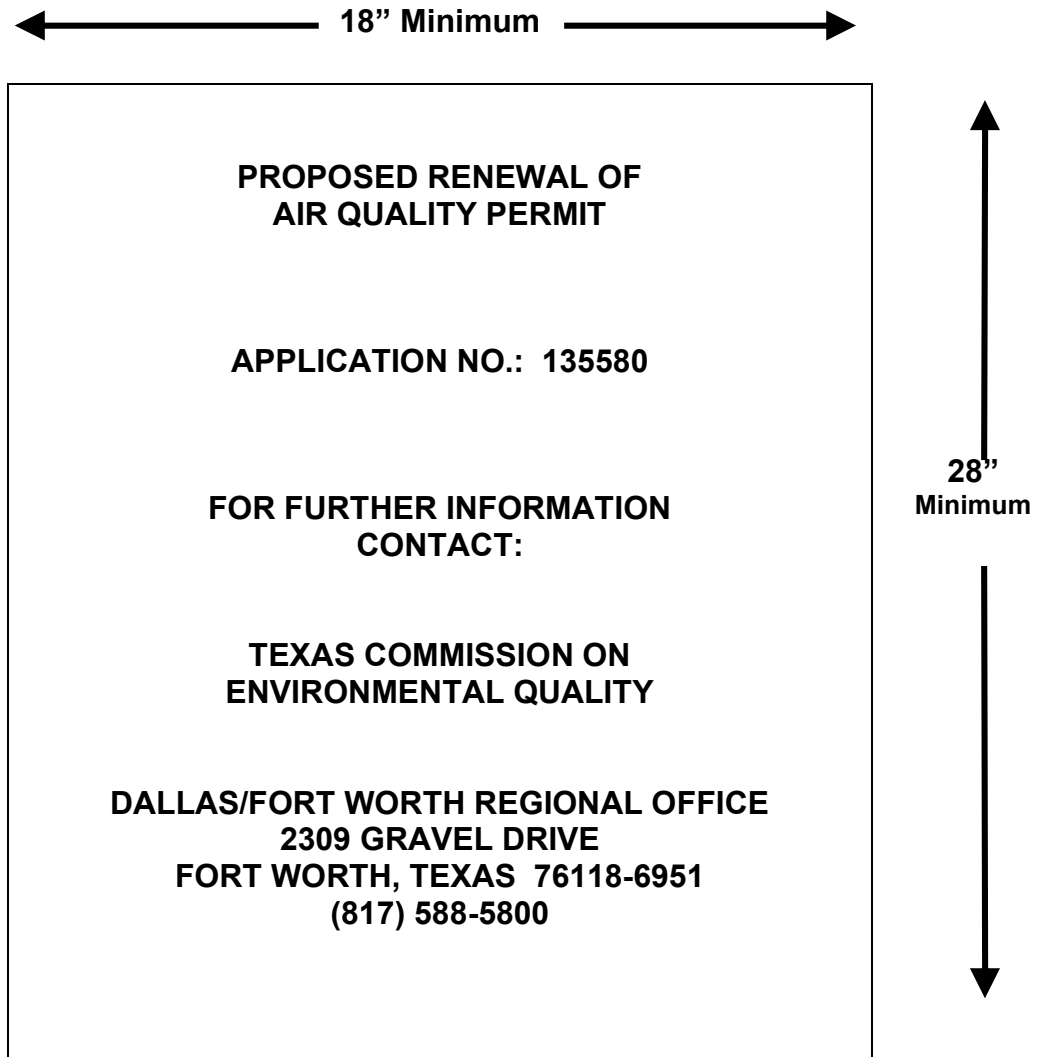

## Instructions for Public Notice For New Source Review Air Permit Renewal

### Notice of Receipt of Application and Intent to Obtain Permit

Your application has been declared administratively complete and now you must comply with the following instructions:

#### Review Notice

Included in the notice is all of the information which the commission believes is necessary to effectuate compliance with applicable public notice requirements. Please read it carefully and notify the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) immediately if it contains any errors or omissions. You are responsible for ensuring the accuracy of all information published. You may not change the text of the notice without prior approval from the TCEQ.

#### Newspaper Notice

- You must publish the enclosed *Notice of Receipt of Application and Intent to Obtain Permit* within **30 calendar days** after the date of administrative completeness. Refer to the cover letter for the date of administrative completeness.
- You must publish the enclosed *Notice of Receipt of Application and Intent to Obtain Permit* at your expense, in a newspaper that is of general circulation in the municipality where the facility is or will be located. If the facility is not located within a municipality, the newspaper should be of general circulation in the municipality nearest to the location or proposed location.
- You must publish this notice in one issue of any applicable newspaper.
- You will find two example notices enclosed in this package. *Example A* must be published in the "public notice" section of the newspaper. The phrase "Example A" is not required to be published. *Example B* must be published in the **same issue** of the newspaper as *Example A*; however, it must be published in a prominent location (other than the public notice section). *Example B* refers the public to the "public notice" section of the newspaper where *Example A* provides more information regarding the permit application.
- *Example B* must be a total of at least **6 column inches (standard advertising units)** with a height of at least **3 inches** and a horizontal dimension of **2 column widths**. If the newspaper chosen does not use standard advertising units for measurement, the notice must be at least **12 square inches** with the shortest side at least 3 inches.
- The bold text of the enclosed notice **must** be printed in the newspaper in a font style or size that distinguishes it from the rest of the notice (i.e., **bold**, *italics*). **Failure to do so may require re-notice.**

## Alternative Language Notice

- In certain circumstances, applicants for air permits must complete notice in alternative languages.
- Public notice rules require the applicant to determine whether a bilingual program is required at either the elementary or middle school nearest to the facility or proposed facility location. Bilingual education programs are determined on a district-wide basis. When students who are required to attend either school are eligible to be enrolled in a bilingual education program, some alternative language notice is required (signs, or signs and newspaper notice).
- Since the school district, and not the schools, must provide the bilingual education program, these programs do not have to be located at the elementary or middle school nearest to the facility or proposed facility to trigger the alternative language notice requirement. If there are students who would normally attend the nearest schools eligible to be taught in a bilingual education program at a different location, alternative language notice is required.
- If triggered, publication of alternative language notices must be made in a newspaper or publication primarily printed in each language taught in the bilingual education program. This notice is required if such a newspaper or publication exists in the municipality or the county where the facility is or will be located.
- The applicant must demonstrate a good faith effort to identify a newspaper or publication in the required language. If a newspaper or publication of general circulation published at least once a month in such language cannot be found, publishing in that language is not required, but signs must still be posted adjacent to each English language sign.
- Publication in an alternative language section or insertion within an English language newspaper does not satisfy these requirements.
- The applicant has the burden to demonstrate compliance with these requirements. You must fill out the **Public Notice Verification Form (Form TCEQ-20244)** indicating your compliance with the requirements regarding publication in an alternative language. **This form is available at [www.tceq.texas.gov/permitting/air/nav/air\\_publicnotice.html](http://www.tceq.texas.gov/permitting/air/nav/air_publicnotice.html).**
- It is suggested the applicant work with the local school district to do the following:
  - (a) determine if a bilingual program is required in the district;
  - (b) determine which language is required by the bilingual program;
  - (c) locate the nearest elementary and middle schools; and
  - (d) determine if any students attending either school are eligible to be enrolled in a bilingual educational program.
- **If you determine that you must meet the alternative language notice requirements after receipt of the full public notice package, you are responsible for ensuring that the publication in the alternative language is complete and accurate in that language. Spanish notice templates are available through the Air Permits Division Web site at [www.tceq.texas.gov/permitting/air/nav/air\\_publicnotice.html](http://www.tceq.texas.gov/permitting/air/nav/air_publicnotice.html). All italic notes should be replaced with the corresponding Spanish translations for the specific application and published in the alternative language publication. Email a copy to Air Permits Division staff.**
- If you are required to publish notice in a language other than Spanish, you must translate the entire public notice at your own expense.

## Public Comment Period

- The public comment period should last at least **30 calendar days**. With the exception of renewals whose comment period should last at least **15 calendar days**.
- The comment period will be longer if the last day of the public comment period ends on a weekend or a holiday. In this case, the comment period will end on the next business day.
- The comment period for the permit may lengthen depending on whether a public meeting is held or if second notice is required. If a public meeting is held, the comment period will be extended to the later of either the date of the public meeting or the end of the second notice period.

## Proof of Publication

- Check each publication to ensure that the articles were accurately published. If a notice was not published correctly you may be required to republish.
- For each newspaper in which you published, you must submit proof of publication that shows the notice, the date of publication, and the name of the newspaper to the Office of the Chief Clerk within **10 business days** after the date of publication. Acceptable proofs of publication are 1) copies of the published notice or 2) the newspaper clippings of the published notice. If you choose to submit copies of the published notice to the Office of the Chief Clerk, copies must be on standard-size 8½" x 11" paper and must show the actual size of the published notice (do not reduce the image when making copies). Published notices longer than 11" must be copied onto multiple 8½" x 11" pages. Please note, submitting a copy of your published notice could result in faster processing of your application. It is recommended that you maintain newspaper clippings or tear sheets of the notice for your records.
- You must submit an **affidavit of publication for air permitting and alternate language affidavit of publication for air permitting (if applicable)** to the Office of the Chief Clerk within **30 calendar days** after the date of publication. **You must use the enclosed affidavits of publication.** The affidavits must clearly identify the applicant's name and permit number. You are encouraged to submit the affidavit with proof of publication described above.
- You must submit the **Public Notice Verification Form (Form TCEQ-20244)** to the Office of the Chief Clerk within **10 business days** of the end of this public comment period. You must use this form to certify that you have met alternative language notice requirements. **This form is available at** [www.tceq.texas.gov/permitting/air/nav/air\\_publicnotice.html](http://www.tceq.texas.gov/permitting/air/nav/air_publicnotice.html).

## Failure to Publish and Submit Proof of Publication

You must meet all publication requirements. **If you fail to publish the notice or submit proof of publication on time, then** the TCEQ may suspend further processing on your application or take other actions.

## Sign Posting

Applicants for air quality permits must also post signs.

- You must post at least one sign in English and as applicable, in each alternative language.
- Signs must be in place on the first day of publication in a newspaper and must remain in place and be legible and be visible from the street for the entire duration of the publications' designated comment period (see Example C).
- The sign template enclosed (*Example C*) is an example only. Read the sign template carefully and notify the TCEQ if it has an error or omissions. It is your responsibility to verify that the appropriate information pertaining to your application is accurate. Any changes to the text prepared by the TCEQ must be approved by the agency.
- Signs placed at the site must be located within 10 feet of each (every) property line paralleling a public street, road, or highway. Signs must be spaced at not more than 1,500-foot intervals. A minimum of one sign, but not more than three signs are required along any property line paralleling a public street, road, or highway. Sign(s) must be placed at a sufficient height above the ground that is necessary for sign(s) to be 100 percent visible from the street.
- All lettering on the sign must be no less than 1½" in height with block printed capital lettering. The sign must be at least 18" wide and 28" tall, and consist of black lettering on a white background.
- Alternative language signs are required if alternative notice is required, even if no newspaper can be found.
- Inspect each posted sign daily to ensure it is present and visible throughout the entire comment period.
- You must submit verification of sign posting using the **Public Notice Verification Form (Form TCEQ-20244)** within **10 business days** after end of the publications' designated comment period. Do not submit the *Public Notice Verification Form* verifying sign posting until after the comment period is over. You cannot certify that the sign posting is in compliance until after the comment period is over. **This form is available at [www.tceq.texas.gov/permitting/air/nav/air\\_publicnotice.html](http://www.tceq.texas.gov/permitting/air/nav/air_publicnotice.html).**

## Application in a Public Place

- You must provide a copy of the administratively complete application at a public place for review and copying by the public. This place must be in the county in which the facility is located or proposed to be located.

Do not submit the form verifying that the application was in a public place until after the comment period is complete. If a public meeting is held or second notice is required causing the public comment period to be extended, at a later date you will be required to verify that the application was in a public place during the entire public comment period. **This form is available at [www.tceq.texas.gov/permitting/air/nav/air\\_publicnotice.html](http://www.tceq.texas.gov/permitting/air/nav/air_publicnotice.html).**



The executive director has determined the application is administratively complete and will conduct a technical review of the application. Information in the application indicates that this permit renewal would not result in an increase in allowable emissions and would not result in the emission of an air contaminant not previously emitted. **The TCEQ may act on this application without seeking further public comment or providing an opportunity for a contested case hearing if certain criteria are met.**

**PUBLIC COMMENT.** You may submit public comments to the Office of the Chief Clerk at the address below. The TCEQ will consider all public comments in developing a final decision on the application and the executive director will prepare a response to those comments. Issues such as property values, noise, traffic safety, and zoning are outside of the TCEQ's jurisdiction to address in the permit process.

**OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING.** You may request a contested case hearing if you are a person who may be affected by emissions of air contaminants from the facility. If requesting a contested case hearing, you must submit the following: (1) your name (or for a group or association, an official representative), mailing address, daytime phone number; (2) applicant's name and permit number; (3) the statement "[I/we] request a contested case hearing;" (4) a specific description of how you would be adversely affected by the application and air emissions from the facility in a way not common to the general public; (5) the location and distance of your property relative to the facility; (6) a description of how you use the property which may be impacted by the facility; and (7) a list of all disputed issues of fact that you submit during the comment period. If the request is made by a group or association, one or more members who have standing to request a hearing must be identified by name and physical address. The interests the group or association seeks to protect must also be identified. You may also submit your proposed adjustments to the application/permit which would satisfy your concerns.

The deadline to submit a request for a contested case hearing is 15 days after newspaper notice is published. If a request is timely filed, the deadline for requesting a contested case hearing will be extended to 30 days after mailing of the response to comments.

If any requests for a contested case hearing are timely filed, the Executive Director will forward the application and any requests for a contested case hearing to the Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting. 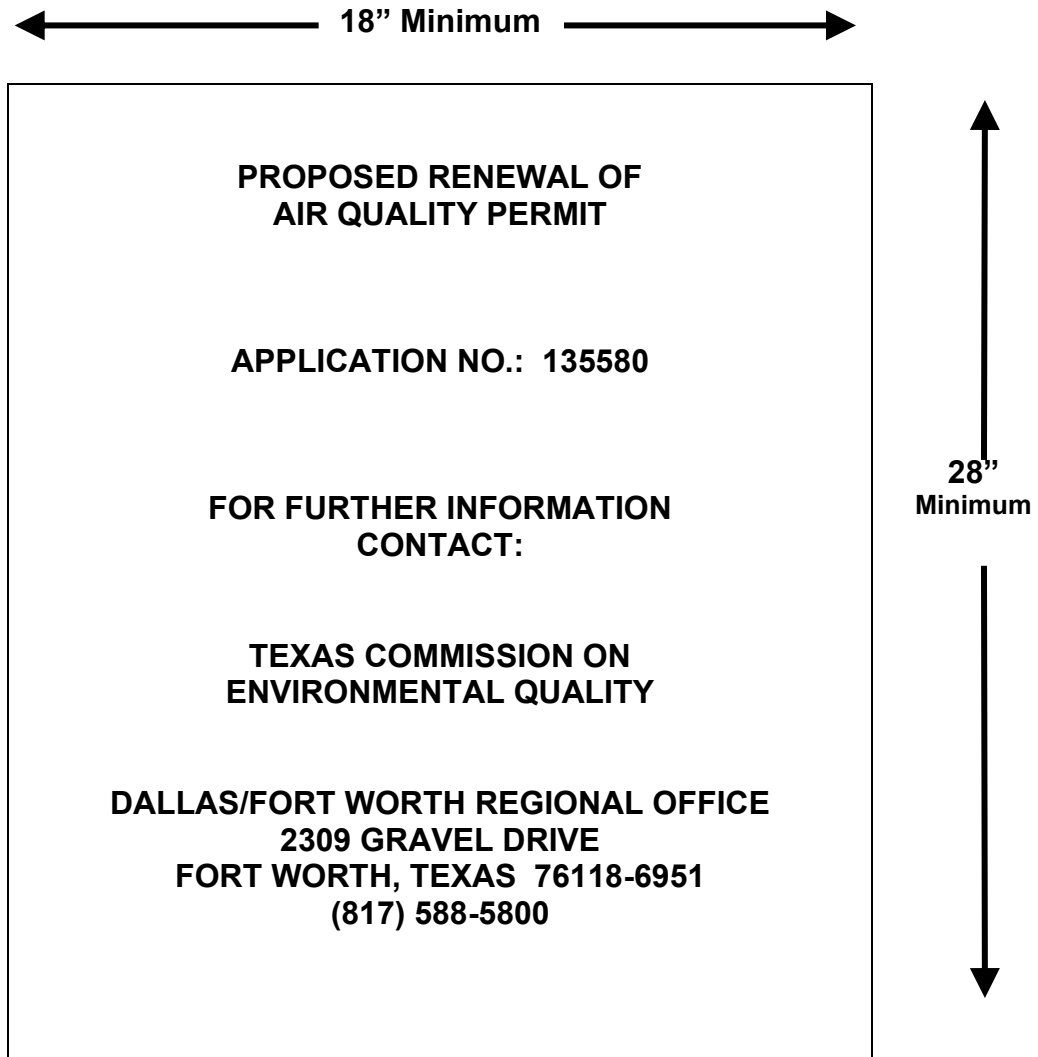

## Instructions for Public Notice For New Source Review Air Permit Renewal

### Notice of Receipt of Application and Intent to Obtain Permit

Your application has been declared administratively complete and now you must comply with the following instructions:

#### Review Notice

Included in the notice is all of the information which the commission believes is necessary to effectuate compliance with applicable public notice requirements. Please read it carefully and notify the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) immediately if it contains any errors or omissions. You are responsible for ensuring the accuracy of all information published. You may not change the text of the notice without prior approval from the TCEQ.

#### Newspaper Notice

- You must publish the enclosed *Notice of Receipt of Application and Intent to Obtain Permit* within **30 calendar days** after the date of administrative completeness. Refer to the cover letter for the date of administrative completeness.
- You must publish the enclosed *Notice of Receipt of Application and Intent to Obtain Permit* at your expense, in a newspaper that is of general circulation in the municipality where the facility is or will be located. If the facility is not located within a municipality, the newspaper should be of general circulation in the municipality nearest to the location or proposed location.
- You must publish this notice in one issue of any applicable newspaper.
- You will find two example notices enclosed in this package. *Example A* must be published in the "public notice" section of the newspaper. The phrase "Example A" is not required to be published. *Example B* must be published in the **same issue** of the newspaper as *Example A*; however, it must be published in a prominent location (other than the public notice section). *Example B* refers the public to the "public notice" section of the newspaper where *Example A* provides more information regarding the permit application.
- *Example B* must be a total of at least **6 column inches (standard advertising units)** with a height of at least **3 inches** and a horizontal dimension of **2 column widths**. If the newspaper chosen does not use standard advertising units for measurement, the notice must be at least **12 square inches** with the shortest side at least 3 inches.
- The bold text of the enclosed notice **must** be printed in the newspaper in a font style or size that distinguishes it from the rest of the notice (i.e., **bold**, *italics*). **Failure to do so may require re-notice.**

## Alternative Language Notice

- In certain circumstances, applicants for air permits must complete notice in alternative languages.
- Public notice rules require the applicant to determine whether a bilingual program is required at either the elementary or middle school nearest to the facility or proposed facility location. Bilingual education programs are determined on a district-wide basis. When students who are required to attend either school are eligible to be enrolled in a bilingual education program, some alternative language notice is required (signs, or signs and newspaper notice).
- Since the school district, and not the schools, must provide the bilingual education program, these programs do not have to be located at the elementary or middle school nearest to the facility or proposed facility to trigger the alternative language notice requirement. If there are students who would normally attend the nearest schools eligible to be taught in a bilingual education program at a different location, alternative language notice is required.
- If triggered, publication of alternative language notices must be made in a newspaper or publication primarily printed in each language taught in the bilingual education program. This notice is required if such a newspaper or publication exists in the municipality or the county where the facility is or will be located.
- The applicant must demonstrate a good faith effort to identify a newspaper or publication in the required language. If a newspaper or publication of general circulation published at least once a month in such language cannot be found, publishing in that language is not required, but signs must still be posted adjacent to each English language sign.
- Publication in an alternative language section or insertion within an English language newspaper does not satisfy these requirements.
- The applicant has the burden to demonstrate compliance with these requirements. You must fill out the **Public Notice Verification Form (Form TCEQ-20244)** indicating your compliance with the requirements regarding publication in an alternative language. **This form is available at [www.tceq.texas.gov/permitting/air/nav/air\\_publicnotice.html](http://www.tceq.texas.gov/permitting/air/nav/air_publicnotice.html).**
- It is suggested the applicant work with the local school district to do the following:
  - (a) determine if a bilingual program is required in the district;
  - (b) determine which language is required by the bilingual program;
  - (c) locate the nearest elementary and middle schools; and
  - (d) determine if any students attending either school are eligible to be enrolled in a bilingual educational program.
- **If you determine that you must meet the alternative language notice requirements after receipt of the full public notice package, you are responsible for ensuring that the publication in the alternative language is complete and accurate in that language. Spanish notice templates are available through the Air Permits Division Web site at [www.tceq.texas.gov/permitting/air/nav/air\\_publicnotice.html](http://www.tceq.texas.gov/permitting/air/nav/air_publicnotice.html). All italic notes should be replaced with the corresponding Spanish translations for the specific application and published in the alternative language publication. Email a copy to Air Permits Division staff.**
- If you are required to publish notice in a language other than Spanish, you must translate the entire public notice at your own expense.

## Public Comment Period

- The public comment period should last at least **30 calendar days**. With the exception of renewals whose comment period should last at least **15 calendar days**.
- The comment period will be longer if the last day of the public comment period ends on a weekend or a holiday. In this case, the comment period will end on the next business day.
- The comment period for the permit may lengthen depending on whether a public meeting is held or if second notice is required. If a public meeting is held, the comment period will be extended to the later of either the date of the public meeting or the end of the second notice period.

## Proof of Publication

- Check each publication to ensure that the articles were accurately published. If a notice was not published correctly you may be required to republish.
- For each newspaper in which you published, you must submit proof of publication that shows the notice, the date of publication, and the name of the newspaper to the Office of the Chief Clerk within **10 business days** after the date of publication. Acceptable proofs of publication are 1) copies of the published notice or 2) the newspaper clippings of the published notice. If you choose to submit copies of the published notice to the Office of the Chief Clerk, copies must be on standard-size 8½" x 11" paper and must show the actual size of the published notice (do not reduce the image when making copies). Published notices longer than 11" must be copied onto multiple 8½" x 11" pages. Please note, submitting a copy of your published notice could result in faster processing of your application. It is recommended that you maintain newspaper clippings or tear sheets of the notice for your records.
- You must submit an **affidavit of publication for air permitting and alternate language affidavit of publication for air permitting (if applicable)** to the Office of the Chief Clerk within **30 calendar days** after the date of publication. **You must use the enclosed affidavits of publication.** The affidavits must clearly identify the applicant's name and permit number. You are encouraged to submit the affidavit with proof of publication described above.
- You must submit the **Public Notice Verification Form (Form TCEQ-20244)** to the Office of the Chief Clerk within **10 business days** of the end of this public comment period. You must use this form to certify that you have met alternative language notice requirements. **This form is available at** [www.tceq.texas.gov/permitting/air/nav/air\\_publicnotice.html](http://www.tceq.texas.gov/permitting/air/nav/air_publicnotice.html).

- Photocopies of newspaper clippings, affidavits, and verifications must also be sent to those listed on the enclosed *Notification List* within the deadlines specified above.

## Failure to Publish and Submit Proof of Publication

You must meet all publication requirements. **If you fail to publish the notice or submit proof of publication on time, then** the TCEQ may suspend further processing on your application or take other actions.

## Sign Posting

Applicants for air quality permits must also post signs.

- You must post at least one sign in English and as applicable, in each alternative language.
- Signs must be in place on the first day of publication in a newspaper and must remain in place and be legible and be visible from the street for the entire duration of the publications' designated comment period (see Example C).
- The sign template enclosed (*Example C*) is an example only. Read the sign template carefully and notify the TCEQ if it has an error or omissions. It is your responsibility to verify that the appropriate information pertaining to your application is accurate. Any changes to the text prepared by the TCEQ must be approved by the agency.
- Signs placed at the site must be located within 10 feet of each (every) property line paralleling a public street, road, or highway. Signs must be spaced at not more than 1,500-foot intervals. A minimum of one sign, but not more than three signs are required along any property line paralleling a public street, road, or highway. Sign(s) must be placed at a sufficient height above the ground that is necessary for sign(s) to be 100 percent visible from the street.
- All lettering on the sign must be no less than 1½" in height with block printed capital lettering. The sign must be at least 18" wide and 28" tall, and consist of black lettering on a white background.
- Alternative language signs are required if alternative notice is required, even if no newspaper can be found.
- Inspect each posted sign daily to ensure it is present and visible throughout the entire comment period.
- You must submit verification of sign posting using the **Public Notice Verification Form (Form TCEQ-20244)** within **10 business days** after end of the publications' designated comment period. Do not submit the *Public Notice Verification Form* verifying sign posting until after the comment period is over. ## Application in a Public Place

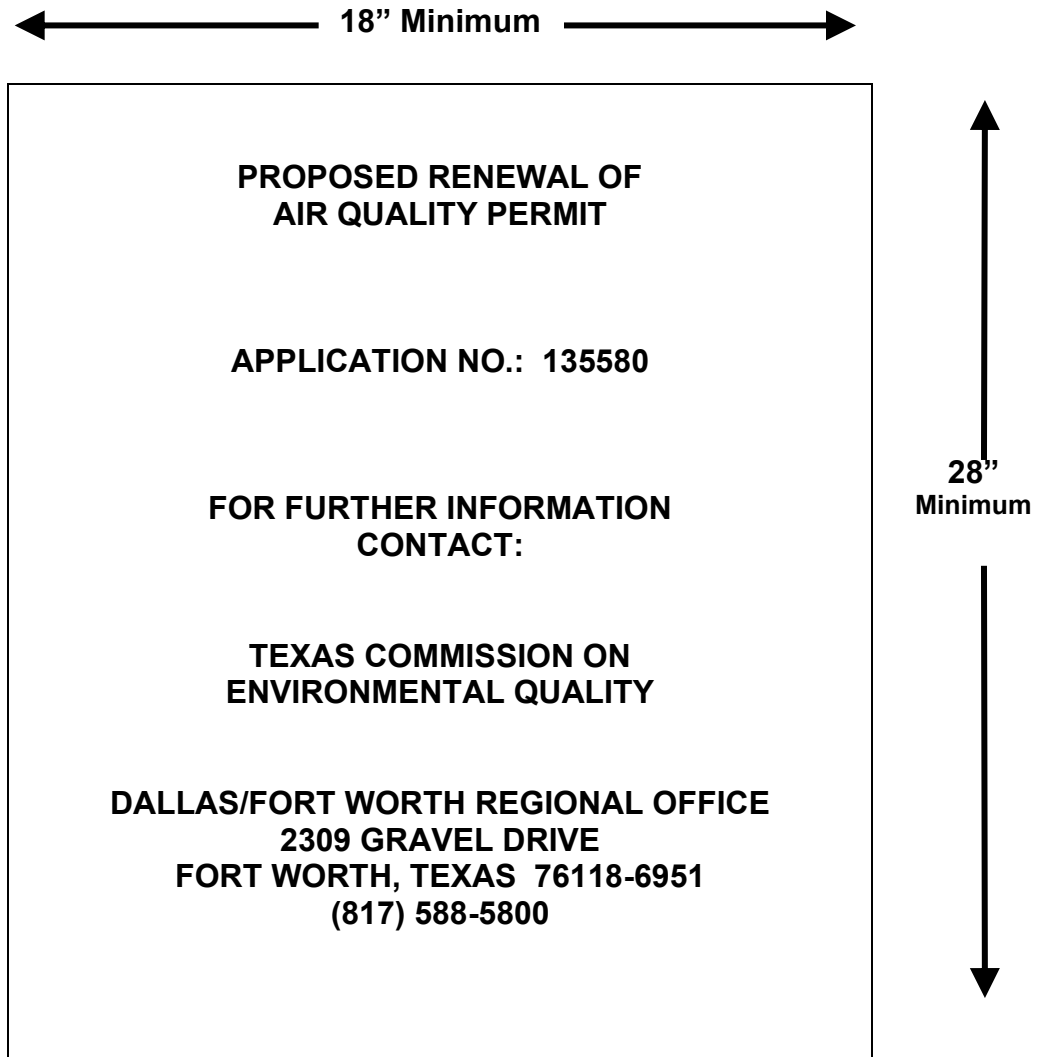

## 1. Executive Summary

UniFirst is submitting a case-by-case New Source Review renewal application for permit 135580 for continued authorization of commercial washer operations.

UniFirst Corporation (UniFirst) is a leading supplier of uniforms, workwear and related products to businesses, providing a wide range of apparel from traditional uniforms, industrial wear, specialty and protective clothing to corporate casual and executive attire. The company provides floorcare and restroom products, including a range of mats, mops, soaps, air fresheners, and paper items, and provides rental wipers (often referred to as towels). At all of its facilities, UniFirst uses conventional water-wash industrial laundry equipment and methods, e.g., washing machines (or washers) and natural gas-fired dryers, to launder the apparel, linen, mats, mops and shop towels that it rents to customers. UniFirst does not use “dry-cleaning” solvents to launder any products.

On February 15, 2013, UniFirst conducted stack tests to measure the emissions of Volatile Organic Compounds (VOCs) and Hazardous Air Pollutants (HAPs) from the laundering of shop towels at its Portland, Maine facility. The results of the testing indicated that small amounts of VOCs and HAPs are emitted from washers, dryers, and the wastewater treatment (WWT) system due to the laundering of shop towels.

The majority of the equipment at the Fort Worth UniFirst Plant qualifies for historic and current Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) De Minimis and Permit by Rule (PBR) authorizations. For example, the standard laundry operations and ancillary equipment can be authorized under the following PBRs and/or De Minimis Facilities:

- Dryers – PBR 106.415 Laundry Dryers and De Minimis 116.119(a)(1)
- Washers – PBR 106.262 Facilities (Emission & Distance Limitations) and De Minimis 116.119(a)(3)
- Boiler - PBR 106.183 Boilers, Heaters, & Other Combustion Devices
- Steam Tunnels – PBR 106.183 Boilers, Heaters, & Other Combustion Devices
- Wastewater Treatment – PBR 106.532 Water & Wastewater Treatment
- Space Heaters – PBR 106.102 Comfort Heating

UniFirst is submitting this permit renewal application for permit number 135580 to maintain additional operational flexibility beyond the limitations of PBR 106.262 for washing machine operations for shop towel cleaning. This minor New Source Review (NSR) permit renewal application is submitted to provide maximum operational flexibility for the washer operations at the Fort Worth Plant. The dryers, boiler, steam tunnel, wastewater treatment, and space heater operations will continue to be authorized under the respective PBRs noted above.

The Fort Worth Plant is located in Tarrant County, which is currently designated as a non-attainment area for primary and secondary eight-hour ozone NAAQS, whose precursors are volatile organic compounds (VOCs) and oxides of nitrogen (NO<sub>x</sub>).

UniFirst will comply with all necessary requirements and emission limits. The UniFirst site is a minor source with respect to Prevention of Significant Deterioration (PSD), Nonattainment New Source Review (NNSR), and the Federal Operating Permits Program (Title V).

## **2. Process Description and Process Flow Diagram**

General operations at UniFirst's laundry include apparel and allied products receiving and storing, washing, drying and a variety of pressing, folding, and aggregating steps prior to the cleaned items being returned to customers. Washer wastewater from the laundering process is commonly pre-treated on-site prior to discharge to the local sewer authorization.

The following laundering operations represent potential sources of VOC and organic HAP emissions during the laundering of soiled shop towels:

- Shop towel receiving/sorting;
- Shop towel washing;
- Shop towel washer wastewater discharge into an open-top interior trench;
- Shop towel washer wastewater discharge from open-top trench to interior pit;
- Shop towel washer wastewater shaker screen;
- Wastewater treatment operations; and
- Dryer vents.

Some of these operations are point sources of emissions while others are fugitive emission sources. Facility-wide VOC and HAP emission factors were developed based on the February 15, 2013 testing at UniFirst's Portland, Maine facility that followed the US EPA Region 1 approved test protocol.

## **3. Emission Rates**

Emissions from shop towels are based on maximum hourly and annual process rate of shop towels of 3,000 pounds shop towels per hour with an annual maximum of 2,250,000 pounds per year.

Potential emissions of VOCs and HAPs were estimated using the production limitation presented above and emission factors developed from the emissions testing. Facility emissions for VOCs and HAPs were calculated using the emission factors developed on a pound emitted per pound of soiled shop towel (lb/lb) basis from results of the stack testing at UniFirst's Portland, Maine facility.

#### 4. Federal and State Requirements

The actual emissions of VOCs and HAPs from the UniFirst facility are significantly lower than federal major source permitting thresholds. For emission sources of this size, federal regulations do not generally require air dispersion modeling to demonstrate compliance with National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) because emissions are considered small enough that there is essentially negligible effect on ambient air quality.

No New Source Performance Standard (NSPS) has been promulgated for industrial laundering operations under 40 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 60. Additionally, no National Emission Standard for Hazardous Air Pollutant (NESHAP) standard has been promulgated under 40 CFR 61 nor Maximum Achievable Control Technology (MACT) under 40 CFR 63 for industrial laundering.

Below is a summary of the applicable State requirements outlined in Title 30 of the Texas Administrative Code (30 TAC) Section (§) 116.111, General Application.

##### 4.1 Protection of Public Health and Welfare (30 TAC §116.111(a)(2)(A)(i))

Air pollutant emissions from the commercial laundry will comply with all rules and regulations of the Texas Clean Air Act (TCAA) as described below.

###### 4.1.1 General Rule (30 TAC Chapter 101)

The commercial laundry will be operated in accordance with the applicable requirements provided in 30 TAC Chapter 101.

###### 4.1.2 Control of Visible Emissions and Particulate Matter (30 TAC Chapter 111)

Visible emissions and particulate matter emissions from the commercial laundry exhaust stacks will comply with the applicable sections of 30 TAC Chapter 111.

###### 4.1.3 Control of Air Pollution from Sulfur Compounds (30 TAC Chapter 112)

*Rule 112.3 specifies that “no person in the State of Texas may cause, suffer, allow, or permit emissions of sulfur dioxide (SO<sub>2</sub>) from a source or sources operated on a property or multiple sources operated on contiguous properties to exceed a net ground level concentration of 0.4 part per million by volume (ppmv) averaged over any 30- minute period.”*

*Rule 112.31 specifies that “no person may cause, suffer, allow, or permit emissions of hydrogen sulfide (H<sub>2</sub>S) from a source or sources operated on a property or multiple sources operated on contiguous properties to exceed a net ground level concentration of 0.08 ppm averaged over any 30-minute period if the downwind concentration of hydrogen sulfide affects a property used for residential, business, or commercial purposes.”*

The UniFirst site will comply with 30 TAC Chapter 112. The small combustion sources at the

UniFirst site combust pipeline quality natural gas which generates negligible emissions of SO<sub>2</sub> and H<sub>2</sub>S, though these sources are not covered in this permit application. No other requirements of Chapter 112 apply to commercial laundry operations.

#### 4.1.4 Standards of Performance for Hazardous Air Pollutants and for Designated Facilities and Pollutants (30 TAC CHAPTER 113)

The operations covered by this application are not subject to any National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAPs) pursuant to 40 CFR 61 or 40 CFR 63.

#### 4.1.5 Control of Air Pollution from Motor Vehicles (30 TAC Chapter 114)

The provisions in 30 TAC Chapter 114 regulate emissions from motor vehicles and are not intended for industrial emissions to the atmosphere. Therefore, this regulation does not apply to the commercial laundry.

#### 4.1.6 Control of Air Pollution from Volatile Organic Compounds (30 TAC Chapter 115)

The commercial laundry is located in Tarrant County, which is an affected county pursuant to 30 TAC Chapter 115. The commercial laundry operations are not subject to the requirements under this chapter.

#### 4.1.7 Control of Air Pollution by Permits for New Construction or Modification (30 TAC Chapter 116)

This permit application is being submitted to the TCEQ to comply with the applicable provisions of 30 TAC Chapter 116.

#### 4.1.8 Control of Air Pollution from Nitrogen Compounds (30 TAC Chapter 117)

The commercial laundry site is located in Tarrant County, which is an affected county for purposes of 30 TAC Chapter 117. This permit application seeks to authorize emissions from the laundering of shop towels which are not emission sources regulated by 30 TAC 117.

#### 4.1.9 Control of Air Pollution Episodes (30 TAC Chapter 118)

UniFirst will continue to comply with the rules relating to generalized and localized air pollution episodes. The commercial laundry is located in Tarrant County, which is not a designated county under 30 TAC §118.5. Emissions of any air contaminant will not exceed 100 tpy; therefore, no emissions reduction plan is required.

#### 4.1.10 Federal Operating Permits (30 TAC Chapter 122)

Rule 122.10(14) defines a major source with respect to Title V of the Federal Clean Air Act (FCAA).

The commercial laundry will not have emissions greater than the major source thresholds for Federal Operating Permits; therefore this facility is not required to submit a Title V permit.



#### **4.2 Protection of Public Health and Welfare (30 TAC §116.111(a)(2)(A)(ii))**

UniFirst will continue to comply with and provide the applicable information to meet the requirements of this rule.

#### **4.3 Best Available Control Technology (30 TAC §116.111(a)(2)(C))**

Section 8 of this permit application demonstrates that emission controls that constitute Best Available Control Technology (BACT) will be utilized.

#### **4.4 New Source Performance Standards (30 TAC §116.111(a)(2)(D))**

There are no NSPS standards that apply to this site.

#### **4.5 National Emissions Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (30 TAC §116.111(a)(2)(E) and (F))**

There are no NESHAPs that apply to this site.

#### **4.6 Performance Demonstration (30 TAC §116.111(a)(2)(G))**

The commercial laundry will submit any necessary data demonstrating performance upon request from the Executive Director.

#### **4.7 Nonattainment Review (30 TAC §116.111(a)(2)(H))**

The commercial laundry is located in Tarrant County, Texas, which is currently designated as nonattainment for ozone, a criteria pollutant. The site is a minor source for ozone and nonattainment new source review does not apply.

#### **4.8 Prevention of Significant Deterioration Review (30 TAC §116.111(a)(2)(I))**

40 CFR 52.21 specifies requirements for prevention of significant deterioration (PSD) new source review for attainment pollutants. UniFirst's Fort Worth Plant is a minor source for PSD.

#### **4.9 Hazardous Air Pollutants (30 TAC §116.111(a)(2)(K))**

The site is not a major source or a major modification; therefore, the provisions of 30 TAC §116.111(a)(2)(K) do not apply.

#### **4.10 Mass Cap and Trade Allowances (30 TAC §116.111(a)(2)(L))**

The UniFirst site is located in the Dallas-Fort Worth (DFW) ozone nonattainment area. The site is not required to obtain allowances according to the Mass Emissions Cap and Trade Program because it is not subject to 30 TAC 101, Subchapter H, Division 3, per 30 TAC 101.351(a)(2). The site is not a major source of NO<sub>x</sub>, as defined in 30 TAC 117.10.

## 5. Best Available Control Technology (BACT)

Title 30 TAC §116.111, specifies that to be granted a permit or a permit amendment, an applicant must demonstrate that the facility will “*utilize BACT, with consideration given to the technical practicability and economic reasonableness of reducing or eliminating the emissions from the facility*” [30 TAC §116.111(a)(2)(C)]. BACT review by the TCEQ is conducted using a three-tiered approach, with the review continuing from one tier to the next only if required by the applicable situation. BACT Tier descriptions are provided below:

- Tier I – Emission reduction performance levels accepted as BACT in recent permit reviews for the same process and/or industry.
- Tier II – Consideration of controls that have been accepted as BACT in recent permits for similar air emission streams in a different process or industry.
- Tier III – Detailed technical and quantitative economic analysis of all emission reduction options for the process under review.

UniFirst is using a Tier I BACT analysis for the commercial laundry operations. The following represents a review of BACT requirements.

### 5.1 Laundry VOC Emissions Regulatory Limits and Determinations

#### 5.1.1 NSPS, NESHAPS, RACT and Other Limits

No NSPS has been promulgated for this type of operation at 40 CFR 60. No traditional NEHSAP has been promulgated for this type of source at 40 CFR 61. No NESHAP or Maximum Available Control Technology (MACT) standard has been promulgated or proposed for this type of source at 40 CFR 63.

#### 5.1.2 Limitation on throughput and Best Management Practices

One of the ways to reduce total emissions is by limiting the amount of shop towels that can be washed at the facility. UniFirst proposes that the permit restrict the quantity of soiled shop towels processed to 2,250,000 pounds per year and therefore limit potential annual emissions of VOC to 2.28 tons per year from the washing of shop towels. This is technically feasible and consistent with current operating practices, allowing a margin for growth.

A review of industrial practices identified a series of BMPs. These practices are designed to minimize fugitive emissions. These include:

- Facility will launder no more than a specified quantity of shop towels per 12 month period.
- Facility will launder shop towels but will not launder print or furniture towels, where the following definitions apply.



- A shop towel is defined as a piece of cotton fabric or other material that is used to clean equipment, parts, objects or surfaces of general soil, grease or oil.
- A print towel is a piece of cotton fabric or other material, received from a customer whose SIC Code is 27 (NAICS Code 323) or whose business is otherwise identifiable as printing or graphic arts, that is used to clean printing equipment, parts, objects or surfaces and that contains any solvent with a flash point less than 140°F.
- A furniture towel is a piece of cotton fabric or other material, received from a customer whose SIC Code is 25 (NAICS Code 337) or whose business is otherwise identifiable as wood furniture manufacturing or refinishing, that is used in the cleaning, finishing or refinishing of wood furniture and that contains any solvent with a flash point less than 140°F.
- The facility will follow the following pre-laundering procedures:
  - Containers or bags of soiled shop towels received at the Facility will be kept closed until the towels are sorted for washing.
  - Soiled shop towels received during a day will be laundered that same day (or night) they are received. Soiled shop towels that are not laundered on the day or night of receipt will be stored in closed containers or bags.
- Any print towels or furniture towels that are received at the facility will be stored in closed containers or bags and will be transported off-site for laundering.

## **5.2 BACT Review**

### **5.2.1 Ranking of Technically Feasible Control Options**

Based on the discussion above, the only technically feasible control option for shop towels is Best Management Practices coupled with limitations on production quantities.

### **5.2.2 Energy Impacts**

BMPs and the limitation on annual throughput will not result in significant energy impact.

### **5.2.3 Other Environmental Impacts**

BMPs and the limitation on annual throughput will not result in significant other environmental impacts.

## **5.3 BACT Summary for VOC from Laundry Operations**

Based on the technical feasibility analysis, the control for VOCs that is technically feasible for the laundering of shop towels is the limitation of annual throughput and the use of BMPs as described in Section 8.2.4. These practices would be considered BACT for the laundering of shop towels.

**Introduction**

Laundry equipment used in the cleaning of shop towels includes washers, dryers, and a wastewater treatment facility. Emission calculations are based on Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) regulations, as well as UniFirst's Portland, Maine *Emissions Test Report*, and industry standard practices.

**Washers - NSR Permit Sources**

Washer calculations are based on the *Emissions Test Report*. Emission factors were generated from the tests on a pound of emissions per pound of shop towels laundered (lb/lb). The emission factor was multiplied by the capacity of the washer, and by the time to wash one load, to arrive at a pound per hour emission rate.

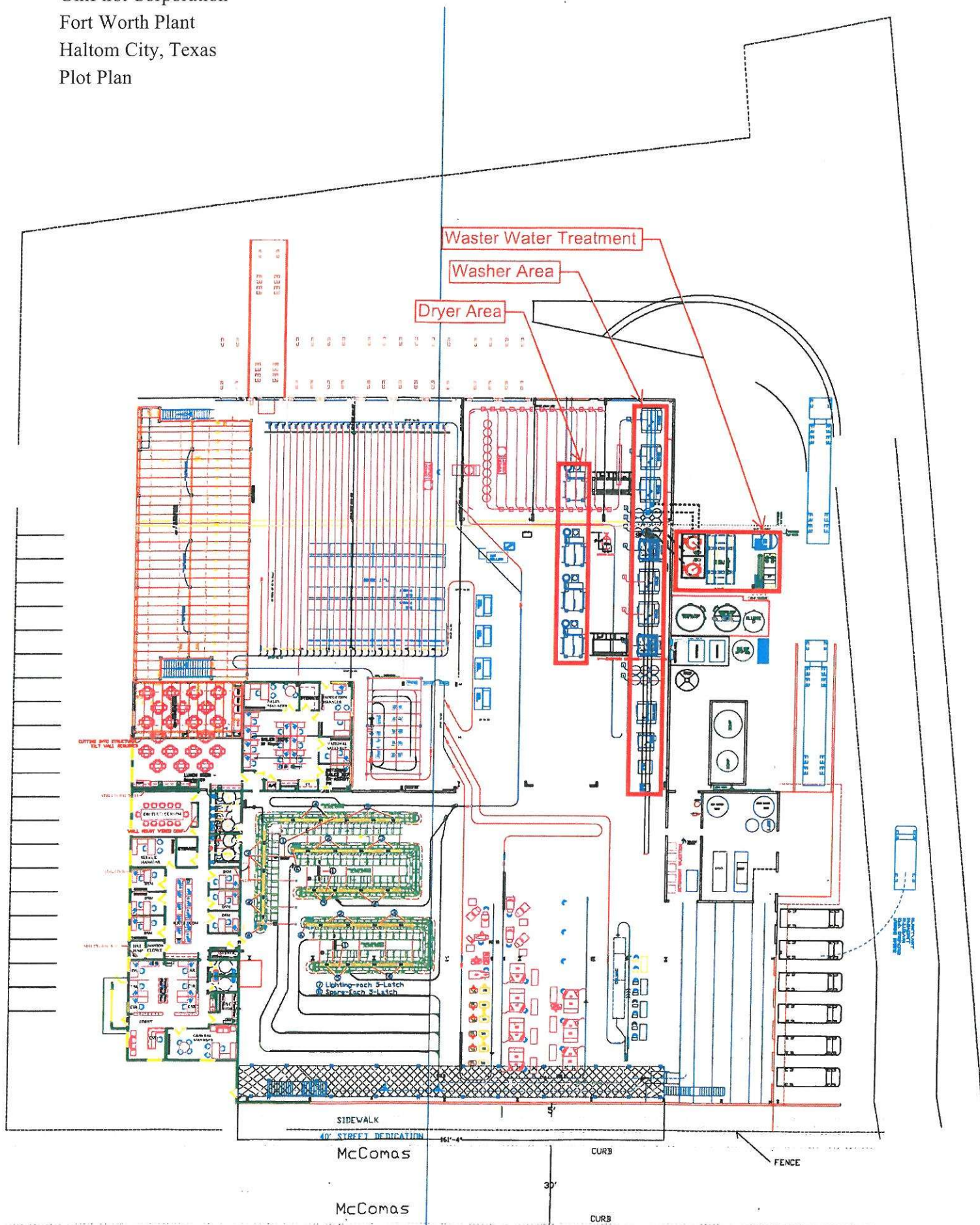
