

## Dry Cleaner Fees for FY2004 & FY2005

Annual Dry Cleaner Registration Fees FY2004 & FY2005 for Dry Cleaning Facilities and Drop Stations		
Facility Type	Determining Criteria	Annual Registration Fee
Dry Cleaning Facility	Registered Dry Cleaning Facility or Participating Non-Perchloroethylene Dry Cleaning Facility with Gross Annual Receipts of more than \$100,000	\$2,500
Dry Cleaning Facility	Registered Dry Cleaning or Participating Non-Perchloroethylene Dry Cleaning Facility with Gross Annual Receipts of \$100,000 or less	\$250
Dry Cleaning Facility	Non-Participating Non-Perchloroethylene	\$250
Dry Cleaning Facility	Uses Carbon Dioxide and Owner has never used or allowed the use of Perchloroethylene	\$0
Drop Station	Owned by the Owner of the Dry Cleaning Facility	\$1,000
Drop Station	Owned by the Owner of a Dry Cleaning Facility with a Non-Participating Non-Perchloroethylene Certificate	\$1,000*
Drop Station	Not Owned by the Owner of the Dry Cleaning Facility	\$250

\*TCEQ will not bill Non-Participating Non-Perchloroethylene owners for unpaid balances exceeding \$250 on invoices for 2004 and 2005 drop station registration fees until June 2005.

Annual registration fees can be paid in full or paid using the [installment plan](#).

### Dry Cleaner Solvent Fees FY2004 & FY2005

State Law requires that [solvent distributors](#) collect a fee on the purchase of dry cleaning solvents at certain facilities with the exception of carbon dioxide (CO<sub>2</sub>).

The solvent fees are \$15 per gallon for perchloroethylene (“perc”) and \$5 per gallon for other solvents.

The following table lists the types of certificates and whether solvent fees should or should not be collected.

<b>Certificate Type</b>	<b>Solvent Fees Collected</b>
Drop Station	Solvent should not be delivered to a drop station.
Registered Dry Cleaning Facility	Solvent Fees should be collected from a facility with this certificate.
Participating Non-Perchloroethylene	Solvent Fees should not be collected from a facility with this certificate, however, if perchloroethylene is delivered, it should be reported to the TCEQ.
Non-Participating Non-Perchloroethylene Dry Cleaning Facility	Solvent Fees should not be collected from a facility with this certificate, however, if perchloroethylene is delivered, it should be reported to the TCEQ.
