The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) has recently completed a prioritization of all ranked sites in the Dry Cleaner Remediation Program (DCRP). In accordance with Texas Health and Safety Code (THSC) Section 374.155 and 30 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) Section 337.50, the TCEQ may postpone or indefinitely suspend corrective action at a site in order to make money available for corrective action at a site with a higher priority. Based on the prioritization results, corrective action at the above referenced site has been postponed.

Please note that the TCEQ prioritizes all DCRP sites every six months and this site will be included during the next DCRP prioritization. You will be notified if the priority status of the site changes as a result of that prioritization. Also, pursuant to 30 TAC Section 337.31, an applicant to the DCRP may submit an updated application for ranking to reflect changes in site conditions as a result of corrective action or other circumstances at a site. Such updates are limited to one per site per state fiscal year, and may result in a different ranking and prioritization. In addition, 30 TAC Section 337.31 also provides that a person may take corrective action at the person's own expense at any time in accordance with commission rules.

Please also be aware that, in order to maintain eligibility for the DCRP, you are required to continue to pay all applicable registration fees. Additionally, pursuant to 30 TAC Section 337.53, once corrective action costs have been incurred at a site by the DCRP, an applicant may not withdraw the site from the DCRP prior to completion of corrective action at the site. However, in the event that corrective action has been suspended, postponed, or terminated at a site pursuant to 30 TAC Sections 337.30 or 337.50, an applicant may request to withdraw the site from the DCRP. An applicant may withdraw a site from the DCRP only upon express TCEQ approval.
