Re: Response to Priority Call by Mr. Nicholas Singleton in the San Saba Watershed of the Colorado River Basin

Dear Mr. Singleton:

On August 9, 2018, you submitted a priority call based on your superior domestic and livestock use to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) San Angelo Regional Office. In your priority call, you expressed a need of 20 gallons per day to water peach trees. In response, the San Angelo Region staff conducted investigations of your priority call on August 9, 2018 and August 13, 2018. Based on those investigations and as discussed below, sufficient water was observed as available for beneficial use at your location. Therefore, suspension of diversion or impoundment of state surface water by junior water rights is not appropriate at this time.

On August 9, 2018, TCEQ field investigations were conducted at your location and at one site located upstream of your property in the San Saba River watershed. Photographs were taken at the time of the investigation. No flow was observed in the location investigated in the area upstream of your property. At your property, small pools of water were present. Downstream of your property, pools were present.

Between August 10, 2018 and August 13, 2018, the Lower Colorado River Authority's Hydromet recorded approximately 6.76 inches of rainfall at the Menard, Texas site. As a result, the TCEQ's San Angelo Regional Office conducted a subsequent investigation at your location, at one site upstream of your property and two sites downstream of your property on August 13, 2018. Flow was observed upstream and at your property. Pools of water were present in both locations downstream of your property.

Despite recent rainfall, this area of the state is experiencing drought conditions. Consequently, the TCEQ's San Angelo Regional Office has been conducting routine monitoring in the San Saba River Basin. The TCEQ will continue monitoring for as long as these conditions persist.

If the river condition changes on your property and you believe a new priority call is warranted, please contact Mr. Christopher Mayben at TCEQ's San Angelo Regional Office via email at Christopher.Mayben@tceq.texas.gov or by phone at (325) 655-9479. Contacting Mr. Mayben to discuss the river conditions and to coordinate arrangements for access will greatly assist the Regional Office in investigating your priority call.
