Re: Alert for Permitted State Surface Water Diversions

Dear County Extension Agent:

Despite recent rains, drought conditions persist across much of Texas. The National Weather Service's Climate Prediction Center seasonal drought outlook predicts that dry conditions will continue to persist in the coming months. Persistent drought conditions can result in low or reduced stream flows and shortages can impact senior and superior water rights. The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) is closely monitoring the situation.

As a first response, the TCEQ is notifying water right holders throughout the state about potential impacts to water rights. That notification letter is enclosed for your reference.
