RE: Alert for Permitted State Surface Water Diversions

Dear County Judge:

Drought conditions have returned to some parts of Texas, and forecasters are predicting that dry conditions may persist in the coming months. Persistent drought conditions can result in low or reduced stream flows and shortages can impact senior and superior water rights. The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) is closely monitoring the evolving situation.

As a first response, the TCEQ is notifying water right holders throughout the state about potential impacts to water rights. That notification letter is enclosed for your reference.
