- 10. Failed to take all reasonable steps to minimize or prevent any discharge that has a reasonable likelihood of adversely affecting human health or the environment [Tex. Water Code § 26.121(a)(1), 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 305.125(1) and (4), and TPDES Permit No. WQ0010140001, Permit Conditions No. 2.d].

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Corrective Actions/Technical Requirements

Corrective Action(s) Completed:

- 1. By October 2, 2019, removed and properly disposed of the sludge from the railroad ditch by applying it to the Facility's sludge drying beds, and cleaned the railroad ditch.
- 2. By November 11, 2019:
 - a. Increased the number of days the Facility is operated by the licensed chief operator to a minimum of five days per week;
 - b. Began accurately monitoring for Escherichia coli;
 - c. Began verifying the colorimeter, performing standards and duplicates for dissolved oxygen, and utilizing a contract laboratory to measure pH onsite; and
 - d. Began maintaining records of Facility inspections.
- 3. By December 13, 2019:
 - Restricted the unlicensed operators from performing process control and operational duties;
 and
 - b. Ceased the increased monitoring frequency of pH.
- 4. By December 27, 2019:
 - a. Submitted a revised 2019 ASR naming the correct sludge transporter; and
 - b. Implemented procedures to ensure records of monitoring activities are properly maintained, including identity of the individual collecting samples.
- 5. By January 2, 2020:
 - a. Equipped the County Road 103 Lift Station and Hearne Street Lift Station with functioning audio-visual alarms; and
 - b. Ensured a transporter with the required registration to transport sewage slude is utilized.

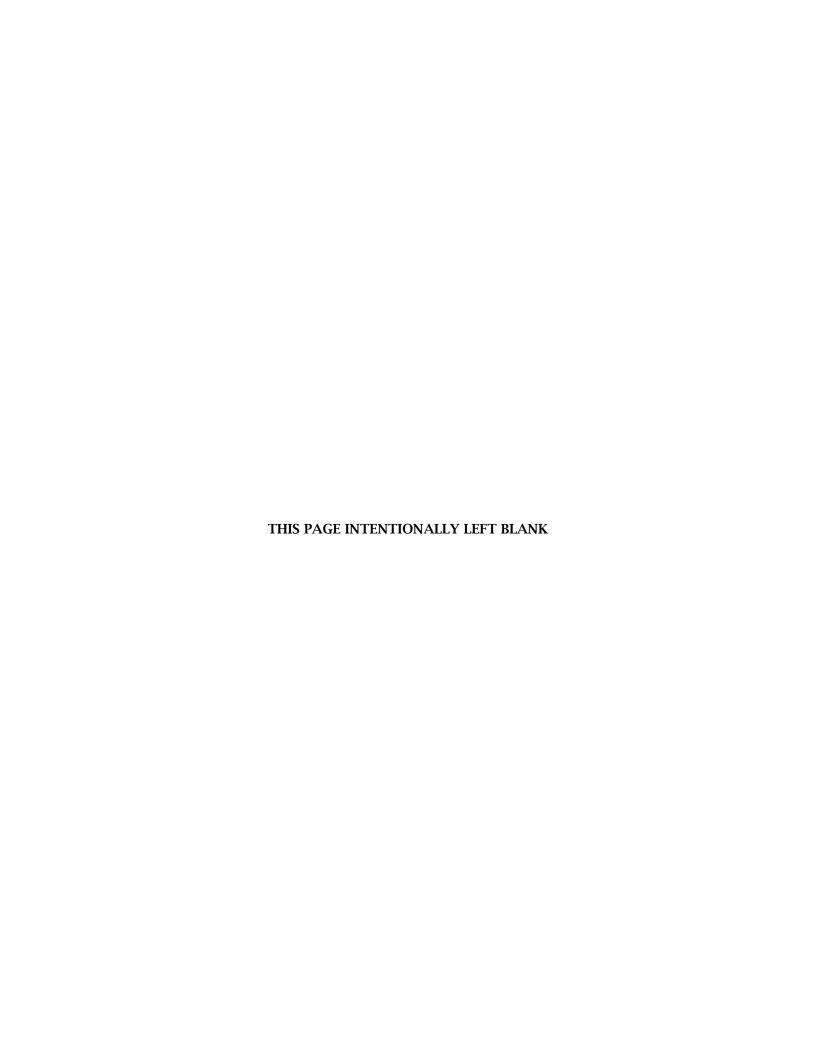

AGREED ORDER

I. JURISDICTION AND STIPULATIONS

On	, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality
("Commission" or "TCEC	(2") considered this agreement of the parties, resolving an enforcement
action regarding the Cit	y of Agua Dulce ("Respondent") under the authority of Tex. WATER CODE
chs. 7, 26, and 37 and T	EX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE ch. 361. The Executive Director of the TCEQ,
represented by the Litig	ation Division, and Respondent, represented by attorney Hal George,
together stipulate that:	, , , , , , , , , , , , , , , , , , , ,

- 1. Respondent owns and operates a wastewater treatment facility located approximately 450 feet southeast of the intersection of State Highway 44 East and Farm-to-Market Road 70 in Nueces County, Texas (the "Facility"). The Facility is near or adjacent to water in the state as defined in Tex. Water Code § 26.001(5). The Facility contains and/or involves the management of municipal solid waste ("MSW") as defined in Tex. Health & Safety Code ch. 361.
- 2. The Executive Director and Respondent agree that TCEQ has jurisdiction to enter this Order pursuant to Tex. Water Code §§ 7.002, 7.051, and 7.073, and that Respondent is subject to TCEQ's jurisdiction. The TCEQ has jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to Tex. Water Code § 5.013 because it alleges violations of Tex. Water Code chs. 26 and 37, Tex. Health & Safety Code ch. 361, and the rules of the TCEQ.
- 3. The occurrence of any violation is in dispute and the entry of this Order shall not constitute an admission by Respondent of any violation alleged in Section II ("Allegations"), nor of any statute or rule.
- 4. An administrative penalty in the amount of thirty-five thousand sixty-four dollars (\$35,064.00) is assessed by the Commission in settlement of the violations alleged in Section II. The Revenue Operations Section of TCEQ's Financial Administration Division reviewed the financial documentation submitted by Respondent and determined that Respondent is unable to pay all or part of the penalty and qualifies for a deferral of all or part of the penalty under Tex. Water Code § 7.034. Therefore, thirty-five thousand sixty-four dollars (\$35,064.00) of the penalty is deferred contingent upon Respondent's timely and satisfactory compliance with all the terms of this Order and shall be waived only upon full compliance with all the terms and conditions contained in this Order.
- 5. The Executive Director and Respondent agree on a settlement of the matters addressed in this Order, subject to final approval in accordance with 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 70.10(a). Any notice and procedures which might otherwise be authorized or required in this action are waived in the interest of a more timely resolution of the matter.
- 6. The Executive Director may, without further notice or hearing, refer this matter to the Office of the Attorney General of the State of Texas ("OAG") for further enforcement proceedings if the Executive Director determines that Respondent has not complied with one or more of the terms or conditions contained in this Order.

- 7. This Order represents the complete and fully-integrated agreement of the parties. The provisions of this Order are deemed severable, and, if a court of competent jurisdiction or other appropriate authority deems any provision of this Order unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall be valid and enforceable.
- 8. This Order shall terminate five years from its effective date or upon full compliance with all the terms and conditions set forth in this Order, whichever is later.
- 9. The Executive Director recognizes that Respondent implemented the following corrective measures at the Facility:
 - a. By October 2, 2019, removed and properly disposed of the sludge from the railroad ditch by applying it to the Facility's sludge drying beds, and cleaned the railroad ditch (Allegation 1.j.).
 - b. By November 11, 2019:
 - i. Increased the number of days the Facility is operated by the licensed chief operator to a minimum of five days per week (Allegation 1.a.);
 - ii. Began accurately monitoring for Escherichia coli ("E. coli") (Allegation 1.g.);
 - iii. Began verifying the colorimeter, performing standards and duplicates for dissolved oxygen, and utilizing a contract laboratory to measure pH onsite (Allegation 1.h.); and
 - iv. Began maintaining records of Facility inspections (Allegation 1.i.).
 - c. By December 13, 2019:
 - i. Restricted the unlicensed operators from performing process control and operational duties (Allegation 1.a.); and
 - ii. Ceased the increased monitoring frequency of pH (Allegation 1.f.).
 - d. By December 27, 2019:
 - i. Submitted a revised 2019 annual sludge report ("ASR") naming the correct sludge transporter (Allegation 1.c.); and
 - ii. Implemented procedures to ensure records of monitoring activities are properly maintained, including the identity of the individual collecting samples (Allegation 1.e.).
 - e. By January 2, 2020:
 - i. Equipped the County Road 103 Lift Station and Hearne Street Lift Station with functioning audio-visual alarms (Allegation 1.b.); and
 - ii. Ensured a transporter with the required registration to transport sewage sludge is utilized (Allegation 1.d.).

II. ALLEGATIONS

- 1. During an investigation commenced on October 2, 2019, an investigator documented that Respondent:
 - a. Failed to ensure that the Facility is operated a minimum of five days per week by a licensed chief operator or operator holding the required level of license or higher, in violation of 30 Tex. Admin. Code §§ 30.350(j) and 305.125(1) and Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System ("TPDES") Permit No. WQ0010140001, Other Requirements No. 1. Specifically, the licensed chief operator was only onsite at the Facility two to three days per week;

- b. Failed to ensure the Facility and all of its systems of collection, treatment, and disposal are properly operated and maintained, in violation of 30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE §§ 305.125(1) and (5), 317.3(e)(5), and TPDES Permit No. WQ0010140001, Operational Requirements No. 1. Specifically, the County Road 103 Lift Station and Hearn Street Lift Station were not equipped with functioning audio-visual alarms;
- c. Failed to submit a complete ASR to the TCEQ by September 30th of each year, in violation of 30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE § 305.125(1) and TPDES Permit No. WQ0010140001, Sludge Provisions, Section III.G.7. Specifically, the 2019 ASR did not name the correct sludge transporter;
- d. Caused, suffered, allowed, or permitted the unauthorized storage, processing, removal, or disposal of any solid waste, in violation of 30 Tex. Admin. Code 330.7(a). Specifically, sewage sludge was transported from the Facility to El Centro Landfill on February 5, 2019, and July 15, 2019, by an unauthorized transporter;
- e. Failed to properly record monitoring activities during effluent sampling, in violation of 30 Tex. Admin. Code §§ 305.125(1), (5), and 11(C) and 319.7(a) and (c), and TPDES Permit No. WQ0010140001, Monitoring and Reporting Requirements No. 3.c. Specifically, the identity of the individual who collected the sample or made the measurement was not recorded for the pH, dissolved oxygen, and total chlorine residual samples;
- f. Failed to indicate an increased frequency of sampling on the self-reported discharge monitoring report ("DMR"), in violation of 30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE §§ 305.125(1) and 319.5(e) and TPDES Permit No. WQ0010140001, Effluent Limitations and Monitoring Requirements No. 3 and Monitoring and Reporting Requirements Nos. 1 and 4. Specifically, increased frequency of monitoring occurred for pH, but was not indicated on DMRs;
- g. Failed to monitor, on a regular basis, each parameter included in its permit, which is also included on its commission monthly effluent report form, in violation of 30 Tex. Admin. Code §§ 305.125(1) and 319.4 and TPDES Permit No. WQ0010140001, Effluent Limitations and Monitoring Requirements No. 1 and Monitoring and Reporting Requirements Nos. 1 and 2. Specifically, Respondent was monitoring for fecal coliform instead of *E. coli* and reporting the fecal coliform results for the *E. coli* parameter on the September 2018 through September 2019 DMRs;
- h. Failed to assure the quality of all measurements through the use of blanks, standards, duplicates, and spikes, in violation of 30 Tex. Admin. Code §§ 305.125(1), 319.6, and 319.9(d) and TPDES Permit No. WQ0010140001, Monitoring and Reporting Requirements No. 2.a. Specifically, quality was not assured for pH (bracketing with buffer solutions), dissolved oxygen (standard and duplicate), and total chlorine residual (standard and duplicate);
- Failed to inspect the Facility five times per week by a certified operator and maintain at the Facility a record of these inspections, in violation of 30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE § 305.125(1) and TPDES Permit No. WQ0010140001, Other Requirements No. 3. Specifically, the certified operator was only onsite two to three times per week and did not maintain records of inspections; and
- j. Failed to take all reasonable steps to minimize or prevent any discharge that has a reasonable likelihood of adversely affecting human health or the environment, in violation of Tex. Water Code § 26.121(a)(1), 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 305.125(1) and (4), and TPDES Permit No. WQ0010140001, Permit Conditions No. 2.d. Specifically, a large accumulation of sludge was observed in the railroad ditch around the Outfall No. 001 discharge pipe. Sample results indicated elevated levels of ammonia

nitrogen (20.7 milligrams per liter ("mg/L")), ortho phosphates (18.1 mg/L), total phosphates (18.0 mg/L), and total kjeldahl nitrogen (24.9 mg/L).

III. DENIALS

Respondent generally denies each Allegation in Section II.

IV. ORDERING PROVISIONS

NOW, THEREFORE, THE TEXAS COMMISSION ON ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ORDERS that:

1. Respondent is assessed an administrative penalty as set forth in Section I, Paragraph 4. The payment of this penalty and Respondent's compliance with all of the requirements set forth in this Order resolve only the Allegations in Section II. The Commission shall not be constrained in any manner from requiring corrective actions or penalties for violations which are not raised here. Penalty payments shall be made payable to TCEQ and shall be sent with the notation "Re: City of Agua Dulce, Docket No. 2020-0179-MLM-E" to:

- 2. All relief not expressly granted in this Order is denied.
- 3. The duties and provisions imposed by this Order shall apply to and be binding upon Respondent. Respondent is ordered to give notice of this Order to personnel who maintain day-to-day control over the Facility operations referenced in this Order.
- 4. The Executive Director may grant an extension of any deadline in this Order or in any plan, report, or other document submitted pursuant to this Order, upon a written and substantiated showing of good cause. All requests for extensions by Respondent shall be made in writing to the Executive Director. Extensions are not effective until Respondent receives written approval from the Executive Director. The determination of what constitutes good cause rests solely with the Executive Director.
- 5. This Order, issued by the Commission, shall not be admissible against Respondent in a civil proceeding, unless the proceeding is brought by the OAG to: (1) enforce the terms of this Order, or (2) pursue violations of a statute within TCEQ's jurisdiction or of a rule adopted or an order or permit issued by the TCEQ under such a statute.
- 6. This Order may be executed in separate and multiple counterparts, which together shall constitute a single instrument. Any page of this Order may be copied, scanned, digitized, converted to electronic portable document format ("pdf"), or otherwise reproduced and may be transmitted by digital or electronic transmission, including but not limited to facsimile transmission and electronic mail. Any signature affixed to this Order shall constitute an original signature for all purposes and may be used, filed, substituted, or issued for any purpose for which an original signature could be used. The term "signature" shall include manual signatures and true and accurate reproductions of manual signatures created, executed, endorsed, adopted, or authorized by the person or persons to whom the signatures are attributable. Signatures may be copied or reproduced digitally, electronically, by photocopying, engraving, imprinting, lithographing, electronic mail, facsimile transmission, stamping, or any other means or process which the Executive Director deems acceptable. In this paragraph exclusively, the terms: electronic transmission, owner, person, writing, and written, shall have the meanings assigned to them under Tex. Bus. Org. Code § 1.002.
