**Violation Information**

1. Failed to, as of investigation date October 4, 2020 through October 23, 2020, install and maintain best management practices at the Facility, which resulted in a discharge of pollutants into or adjacent to water in the state [TEX. WATER CODE § 26.121(a), 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 305.125(1), and Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (“TPDES”) Multi-Sector General Permit (“MSGP”) No. TXR05EL66, Part V, Section J, No. 5(b)].
2. Failed to, as of investigation date May 5, 2021:
  - a. Install and maintain best management practices at the Facility, which resulted in a discharge of pollutants into or adjacent to water in the state [TEX. WATER CODE § 26.121(a)(1), 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 305.125(1), and TPDES MSGP No. TXR05EL66, Part V, Section J, No. 5(b)]; and
  - b. Report an unauthorized discharge orally to the TCEQ Regional Office within 24 hours of becoming aware of the noncompliance, and in writing to the TCEQ Regional Office and the TCEQ Enforcement Division within five days of becoming aware of the noncompliance [30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 305.125(1) and TPDES MSGP No. TXR05EL66, Part III, Section E, No. 6(b)(1)].

**Corrective Actions/Technical Requirements**

**Corrective Action(s) Completed:**

1. Repaired the berm breach for the southernmost stormwater retention pond and ceased the unauthorized discharge of sediment-laden stormwater by October 23, 2020;
2. Orally notified the TCEQ Houston Regional Office by May 4, 2021, of the unauthorized discharge that began on May 2, 2021; and
3. Repaired the berm breach between the active mining area and the settling pond and ceased the unauthorized discharge of sediment laden stormwater by May 5, 2021.

**Technical Requirements:**

1. Within 30 days:
  - a. Prepare and submit a noncompliance notification (NCN) for the unauthorized discharge that began on May 2, 2021, to the TCEQ Houston Regional Office and the TCEQ Enforcement Division; and
  - b. Develop and implement procedures and conduct employee training to submit NCNs in a timely manner.
2. Within 45 days submit written certification to demonstrate compliance with Technical Requirement Nos. 1.a. and 1.b.

## **AGREED ORDER**

**DOCKET NO. 2021-0362-WQ-E**

### **I. JURISDICTION AND STIPULATIONS**

On \_\_\_\_\_, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality ("Commission" or "TCEQ") considered this agreement of the parties, resolving an enforcement action regarding TEXAS CONCRETE SAND AND GRAVEL ENTERPRISE INC ("Respondent") under the authority of TEX. WATER CODE chs. 7 and 26. The Executive Director of the TCEQ, represented by the Litigation Division, and Respondent together stipulate that:

1. Respondent operates a sand and gravel mining operation located at 3704 Farm-to-Market Road 1010 in Cleveland, Liberty County, Texas (the "Facility"). The Facility is near or adjacent to water in the state as defined in TEX. WATER CODE § 26.001(5).
2. The Executive Director and Respondent agree that TCEQ has jurisdiction to enter this Order pursuant to TEX. WATER CODE §§ 7.002, 7.051, and 7.073, and that Respondent is subject to TCEQ's jurisdiction. The TCEQ has jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to TEX. WATER CODE § 5.013 because it alleges violations of TEX. WATER CODE ch. 26 and the rules of the TCEQ.
3. The occurrence of any violation is in dispute and the entry of this Order shall not constitute an admission by Respondent of any violation alleged in Section II ("Allegations"), nor of any statute or rule.
4. An administrative penalty in the amount of eight thousand seven hundred fifty-one dollars (\$8,751.00) is assessed by the Commission in settlement of the violations alleged in Section II. Respondent paid four thousand three hundred seventy-six dollars (\$4,376.00) of the penalty. The remaining amount of four thousand three hundred seventy-five dollars (\$4,375.00) shall be paid in one (1) monthly payment of four thousand three hundred seventy-five dollars (\$4,375.00). The remaining payment shall be paid within 30 days after the effective date of this Order. If Respondent fails to timely and satisfactorily comply with the payment requirements of this Order, including the payment schedule, the Executive Director may, at his option, accelerate the maturity of the remaining installments, in which event the unpaid balance shall become immediately due and payable without demand or notice. In addition, Respondent's failure to meet the payment schedule of this Order and/or the acceleration of any remaining balance constitutes the failure by Respondent to timely and satisfactorily comply with all the terms of this Order.
5. The Executive Director and Respondent agree on a settlement of the matters addressed in this Order, subject to final approval in accordance with 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 70.10(a). Any notice and procedures which might otherwise be authorized or required in this action are waived in the interest of a more timely resolution of the matter.
6. The Executive Director may, without further notice or hearing, refer this matter to the Office of the Attorney General of the State of Texas ("OAG") for further enforcement proceedings if the Executive Director determines that Respondent has not complied with one or more of the terms or conditions contained in this Order.

7. This Order represents the complete and fully-integrated agreement of the parties. The provisions of this Order are deemed severable, and, if a court of competent jurisdiction or other appropriate authority deems any provision of this Order unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall be valid and enforceable.
8. This Order shall terminate five years from its effective date or upon full compliance with all the terms and conditions set forth in this Order, whichever is later.
9. The Executive Director recognizes that Respondent implemented the following corrective measures at the Facility:
  - a. Repaired the berm breach for the southernmost stormwater retention pond ("Waste Water Pit") and ceased the unauthorized discharge of sediment-laden stormwater by October 23, 2020;
  - b. Orally notified the TCEQ Houston Regional Office by May 4, 2021, of the unauthorized discharge that began on May 2, 2021; and
  - c. Repaired the berm breach between the active mining area and the settling pond and ceased the unauthorized discharge of sediment laden stormwater by May 5, 2021.

## II. ALLEGATIONS

1. During an investigation conducted on and around October 4, 2020, through October 23, 2020, an investigator documented that Respondent failed to install and maintain best management practices at the Facility, which resulted in a discharge of pollutants into or adjacent to water in the state, in violation of TEX. WATER CODE § 26.121(a), 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 305.125(1), and Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System ("TPDES") Multi-Sector General Permit ("MSGP") No. TXR05EL66, Part V, Section J, No. 5(b). Specifically, on October 23, 2020, a berm breach occurred in the Waste Water Pit, resulting in the discharge of sediment-laden stormwater into the East Fork of the San Jacinto River. Additionally, the investigator collected and analyzed water samples, revealing elevated levels of total dissolved solids ("TDS") and total suspended solids ("TSS"), as shown in the water sample results table below:

2. During an investigation conducted on and around May 5, 2021, an investigator documented that Respondent:
  - a. Failed to install and maintain best management practices at the Facility, which resulted in a discharge of pollutants into or adjacent to water in the state, in violation of TEX. WATER CODE § 26.121(a)(1), 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 305.125(1), and TPDES MSGP No. TXR05EL66, Part V, Section J, No. 5(b). Specifically, on May 2, 2021, the East Fork of the San Jacinto River flowed into the active mining area, and a berm breach occurred between the active mining area and the settling pond, resulting in the discharge of sediment-laden stormwater; and
  - b. Failed to report an unauthorized discharge orally to the TCEQ Regional Office within 24 hours of becoming aware of the noncompliance, and in writing to the TCEQ Regional Office and the TCEQ Enforcement Division within five days of becoming aware of the noncompliance, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 305.125(1) and TPDES MSGP No. TXR05EL66, Part III, Section E, No. 6(b)(1). Specifically, the unauthorized discharge began on May 2, 2021, and the oral and written noncompliance notifications ("NCNs") were not completed in a timely manner.

### III. DENIALS

Respondent generally denies each Allegation in Section II.

#### IV. ORDERING PROVISIONS

NOW, THEREFORE, THE TEXAS COMMISSION ON ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ORDERS that:

1. Respondent is assessed an administrative penalty as set forth in Section I, Paragraph 4. The payment of this penalty and Respondent's compliance with all of the requirements set forth in this Order resolve only the Allegations in Section II. The Commission shall not be constrained in any manner from requiring corrective actions or penalties for violations which are not raised here. Penalty payments shall be made payable to TCEQ and shall be sent with the notation "Re: TEXAS CONCRETE SAND AND GRAVEL ENTERPRISE INC, Docket No. 2021-0362-WQ-E" to:

2. Respondent shall undertake the following technical requirements:

- a. Within 30 days after the effective date of this Order:

- i. Prepare and submit an NCN for the unauthorized discharge that began on May 2, 2021, to the TCEQ Houston Regional Office and the TCEQ Enforcement Division; and
- ii. Develop and implement procedures and conduct employee training to submit NCNs in a timely manner.

- b. Within 45 days after the effective date of this Order, submit written certification to demonstrate compliance with Ordering Provision Nos. 2.a.i. and 2.a.ii. The certification shall be accompanied by detailed supporting documentation, including photographs, receipts, and/or other records, shall be signed by Respondent, and shall include the following certification language:

"I certify under penalty of law that I have personally examined and am familiar with the information submitted and all attached documents, and that based on my inquiry of those individuals immediately responsible for obtaining the information, I believe that the submitted information is true, accurate and complete. I am aware that there are significant penalties for submitting false information, including the possibility of fine and imprisonment for knowing violations."

3. All relief not expressly granted in this Order is denied.


4. The duties and provisions imposed by this Order shall apply to and be binding upon Respondent. Respondent is ordered to give notice of this Order to personnel who maintain day-to-day control over the Facility operations referenced in this Order.
5. The Executive Director may grant an extension of any deadline in this Order or in any plan, report, or other document submitted pursuant to this Order, upon a written and substantiated showing of good cause. All requests for extensions by Respondent shall be made in writing to the Executive Director. Extensions are not effective until Respondent receives written approval from the Executive Director. The determination of what constitutes good cause rests solely with the Executive Director. Extension requests shall be sent to the Enforcement Division at the address listed above.
6. If Respondent fails to comply with any of the Ordering Provisions in this Order within the prescribed schedules, and that failure is caused solely by an act of God, war, strike, riot, or other catastrophe, Respondent's failure to comply is not a violation of this Order. Respondent shall have the burden of establishing to the Executive Director's satisfaction that such an event has occurred. Respondent shall notify the Executive Director within seven days after Respondent becomes aware of a delaying event and shall take all reasonable measures to mitigate and minimize any delay.
7. This Order, issued by the Commission, shall not be admissible against Respondent in a civil proceeding, unless the proceeding is brought by the OAG to: (1) enforce the terms of this Order, or (2) pursue violations of a statute within TCEQ's jurisdiction or of a rule adopted or an order or permit issued by the TCEQ under such a statute.
8. This Order may be executed in separate and multiple counterparts, which together shall constitute a single instrument. Any page of this Order may be copied, scanned, digitized, converted to electronic portable document format ("pdf"), or otherwise reproduced and may be transmitted by digital or electronic transmission, including but not limited to facsimile transmission and electronic mail. Any signature affixed to this Order shall constitute an original signature for all purposes and may be used, filed, substituted, or issued for any purpose for which an original signature could be used. The term "signature" shall include manual signatures and true and accurate reproductions of manual signatures created, executed, endorsed, adopted, or authorized by the person or persons to whom the signatures are attributable. Signatures may be copied or reproduced digitally, electronically, by photocopying, engraving, imprinting, lithographing, electronic mail, facsimile transmission, stamping, or any other means or process which the Executive Director deems acceptable. In this paragraph exclusively, the terms: electronic transmission, owner, person, writing, and written, shall have the meanings assigned to them under TEX. BUS. ORG. CODE § 1.002.
9. The effective date of this Order is the date it is signed by the Commission. A copy of this fully executed Order shall be provided to each of the parties.


