On ______, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality ("Commission" or "TCEQ") considered the Executive Director's Preliminary Report and Petition, filed pursuant to TEX. WATER CODE ch. 7 and TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE chs. 361 and 382, and the rules of the TCEQ, which requests appropriate relief, including the imposition of an administrative penalty against the respondent. The respondent made the subject of this Order is Kenny Hughes ("Respondent").

The Commission makes the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- Respondent owned and operated an unauthorized municipal solid waste ("MSW") site located at 198 Farm-to-Market Road 2663 in Latexo, Houston County, Texas (the "Site"). The Site consists of one or more sources as defined in Tex. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE § 382.003(12). The Site contains and/or involves the management of MSW as defined in Tex. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE ch. 361.
- 2. During an investigation conducted on April 15, 2021, an investigator documented that Respondent:
 - a. Caused, suffered, allowed, or permitted the unauthorized disposal of MSW. Specifically, approximately 25.92 cubic yards of MSW consisting of tree limbs, metal cans, paint buckets, wooden furniture, florescent light bulbs, cardboard, mattress springs, clothing and other unidentifiable materials were disposed of at the Site; and
 - b. Caused, suffered, allowed, or permitted outdoor burning within the State of Texas. Specifically, approximately 16.84 cubic yards of MSW consisting of tree limbs, metal cans, paint buckets, wooden furniture, florescent light bulbs, cardboard, mattress springs, clothing and other unidentifiable materials were burned at the Site.
- 3. The Executive Director recognizes that Respondent no longer owns/operates the Site as of December 3, 2021.
- 4. The Executive Director filed the "Executive Director's Preliminary Report and Petition Recommending that the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality Enter an Enforcement Order Assessing an Administrative Penalty Against Kenny Hughes" (the "EDPRP") in the TCEQ Chief Clerk's office on September 14, 2022.
- 5. By letter dated September 14, 2022, sent to Respondent's last known address via certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, the Executive Director served Respondent with notice of the EDPRP. According to USPS.com "Track & Confirm" delivery confirmation records, Respondent received notice of the EDPRP on September 22, 2022.

6. More than 20 days have elapsed since Respondent received notice of the EDPRP. Respondent failed to file an answer and failed to request a hearing.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 1, Respondent is subject to the jurisdiction of the TCEQ pursuant to TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE chs. 361 and 382 and the rules of the TCEQ.
- 2. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 2.a., Respondent caused, suffered, allowed or permitted the unauthorized disposal of MSW, in violation of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 330.15(a) and (c).
- 3. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 2.b., Respondent caused, suffered, allowed or permitted outdoor burning within the State of Texas in violation of Tex. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE § 382.085(b) and 30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE § 111.201.
- 4. As evidenced by Findings of Fact Nos. 4 and 5, the Executive Director timely served Respondent with proper notice of the EDPRP, as required by TEX. WATER CODE § 7.055 and 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 70.104(b)(1).
- 5. As evidenced by Finding of Fact No. 6, Respondent failed to file a timely answer as required by Tex. WATER CODE § 7.056 and 30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE § 70.105. Pursuant to Tex. WATER CODE § 7.057 and 30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE § 70.106, the Commission may enter a Default Order against Respondent and assess the penalty recommended by the Executive Director.
- 6. Pursuant to TEX. WATER CODE § 7.051, the Commission has the authority to assess an administrative penalty against Respondent for violations of state statutes within TCEQ's jurisdiction, for violations of rules adopted under such statutes, or for violations of orders or permits issued under such statutes.
- 7. An administrative penalty in the amount of eight thousand three hundred seventy-two dollars (\$8,372.00) is justified by the facts recited in this Order, and considered in light of the factors set forth in Tex. WATER CODE § 7.053.
- 8. TEX. WATER CODE §§ 5.102 and 7.002 authorize the Commission to issue orders and make determinations necessary to effectuate the purposes of the statutes within its jurisdiction.

ORDERING PROVISIONS

NOW, THEREFORE, THE TEXAS COMMISSION ON ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ORDERS that:

- 1. Respondent is assessed an administrative penalty in the amount of eight thousand three hundred seventy-two dollars (\$8,372.00) for violations of state statutes and rules of the TCEQ. The payment of this penalty and Respondent's compliance with all the requirements set forth in this Order resolve only the matters set forth by this Order in this action. The Commission shall not be constrained in any manner from requiring corrective actions or penalties for violations which are not raised here.
- 2. The penalty assessed by this Order shall be paid within 30 days after the effective date of this Order. All checks submitted to pay the penalty imposed by this Order shall be made out to TCEQ and shall be sent with the notation "Re: Kenny Hughes's; Docket No. 2021-1105-MLM-E" to:

3. The Executive Director does not recommend any corrective measures at this time.

- 4. All relief not expressly granted in this Order is denied.
- 5. The provisions of this Order shall apply to and be binding upon Respondent.
- 6. The Executive Director may grant an extension of any deadline in this Order or in any plan, report, or other document submitted pursuant to this Order, upon a written and substantiated showing of good cause. All requests for extensions by Respondent shall be made in writing to the Executive Director. Extensions are not effective until Respondent receives written approval from the Executive Director. The determination of what constitutes good cause rests solely with the Executive Director.
- 7. If Respondent fails to comply with any of the Ordering Provisions in this Order within the prescribed schedules, and that failure is caused solely by an act of God, war, strike, riot, or other catastrophe, Respondent's failure to comply is not a violation of this Order. Respondent shall have the burden of establishing to the Executive Director's satisfaction that such an event has occurred. Respondent shall notify the Executive Director within seven days after Respondent becomes aware of a delaying event and shall take all reasonable measures to mitigate and minimize any delay.
- 8. The Executive Director may refer this matter to the Office of the Attorney General of the State of Texas ("OAG") for further enforcement proceedings without notice to Respondent if the Executive Director determines that Respondent has not complied with one or more of the terms or conditions in this Order.
- 9. The provisions of this Order are deemed severable, and, if a court of competent jurisdiction or other appropriate authority deems any provision of this Order unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall be valid and enforceable.
- 10. This Order shall terminate five years from its effective date or upon compliance with all the terms and conditions set forth in this Order, whichever is later.
- 11. The Chief Clerk shall provide a copy of this fully executed Order to each of the parties. By law, the effective date of this Order shall be the date the Order is final, as provided by 30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE § 70.106(d) and Tex. GOV'T CODE § 2001.144.
