RE: SOAH Docket No. 582-22-1016; TCEQ Docket No. 2021-1214-MWD; Application of AIRW 2017-7, L.P., for Proposed Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit No. WQ0015878001, in Williamson County, Texas.

The above-referenced matter is scheduled to be considered by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality on **November 16, 2022 at 9:30 A.M.** in Room 201S, Building E, 12100 Park 35 Circle, Austin, Texas. Due to the ongoing pandemic, the agenda meeting may be held in person in Room 201S of Building E at the Commission's offices located at 12100 Park 35 Circle in Austin, Texas, virtually, or both in person and virtually. 30 TAC §80.263 provides as follows:

In proceedings where a judge has held a public hearing and has issued a proposal for decision or other report to the commission, all oral presentations before the commission shall be limited to five minutes each, excluding time for answering questions, unless the chairman or general counsel establishes other limitations. Before the commission meeting, the general counsel may allot time for oral presentations. Oral presentations and responses to questions shall be directed to the commission.

The General Counsel has directed me to extend the time for oral argument to **10 minutes** for the Applicant, **5 minutes** for Jonah Water SUD, **10 minutes** for the City of Georgetown, **5 minutes** for the Executive Director; and **5 minutes** for the Office of Public Interest Counsel. The Applicant may save part of its time for rebuttal, as it bears the burden of proof. Parties should present their arguments on the Proposal for Decision during their allotted oral argument time.

Furthermore, if the Commissioners need additional information, they may ask questions of the parties after oral argument is completed. In light of the oral argument time periods previously found sufficient in complex matters and given the Commissioners' ability to question the parties to clarify any issues, the General Counsel has determined that the time periods provided should be sufficient.
