Texas Conservation Alliance (TCA), a nearly-fifty-year-old conservation organization focused on protecting wildlife habitat and water resources, requests a contested case hearing on WRPERM 13404, applied for by the City of Wichita Falls, to construct a reservoir on the Little Wichita River to be called Lake Ringgold, divert and use up to 65,000 acre-feet of water per year, and use the bed and banks of the Little Wichita River (Lake Arrowhead) to transport water.

TCA has members who will be directly affected by construction of the reservoir. Emry Birdwell and Deborah Clark of the Birdwell and Clark Ranch, 578 N. Bryant Edwards Road, Henrietta, TX 76365, are life members of Texas Conservation Alliance. If built, the proposed Lake Ringgold will inundate an estimated 1,200 to 2,000 acres of the Birdwell and Clark Ranch. An arm of the lake will cut their ranch into two sections, significantly impacting their ability to conduct the time-managed grazing on which their ranch income is based.

Texas Conservation Alliance's reasons for contesting the permit for Lake Ringgold include, but are not limited to, the following:

1. The City of Wichita Falls does not need Lake Ringgold to meet the projected demand for water for its residents and customers anytime between now and 2070. The firm yield of Wichita Falls' current water supply lakes, plus its established indirect reuse program, meet the City's projected

demands for 2070 with a significant safety margin. Wichita Falls lost population in the last decade and its water use is projected in the Initially Prepared Plan of the 2021 Region B Water Plan (Region B IPP) to increase by just over 3% in the next fifty years.

2. As justification for building Lake Ringgold, the permit applicant (the City of Wichita Falls) does not use the usual procedure for determining the city's available water supply. The standard procedure for assessing water supply employs the concept of firm yield, which is the amount of water which could be withdrawn from a water supply reservoir during a repeat of the historical worst drought of record (for this region the drought of 2011-2015). Firm yield assumes a repeat of the hydrological conditions during the drought of record. Firm yield is the usual definition of water supply and the only one that corresponds to historical reality.

If the City of Wichita Falls counted its water supply as the firm yield of Lakes Kickapoo and Arrowhead, plus the City's share of the firm yield of Lake Kemp, along with the supply from WF's established reuse program, the City's water supply would easily meet its current and projected water needs without additional water supplies. In its application for a permit to build Lake Ringgold, however, Wichita Falls uses a different method of counting its available water.

The applicant refers to "climate uncertainty" and its water supply methodology assumes that future climatic conditions will be significantly drier than the historical norms. In anticipation of this change in climate conditions, the applicant has explored multiple definitions of water supply — conditional reliability assessment, one-year safe yield, two-year safe yield, and 20% reserve capacity. Each of these methodologies adjusts Wichita Falls' historical water supply downward, reflecting the assumed drier future. Of these, the City has selected the 20% reserve capacity method for its permit application - the method that results in the lowest assessment of available future water supply and the one that makes the case for additional water seem the most urgent.

Whether use of the 20% reserve capacity is a reasonable method for assessing water supply, and whether it justifies the expenditure of hundreds of millions of dollars, is precisely what is at issue. It is the position of Texas Conservation Alliance that the circumstances assumed under this method do *not* justify construction of Lake Ringgold.

3. Wichita Falls' permit application also refers to "demand uncertainty".

The future is always uncertain, but "uncertainty" doesn't justify a specific conclusion. Climate change models predict that some areas will be drier, but others will be wetter. The demand might wind up going down.

The Region B IPP projects that Wichita Falls' demand for water, including what it sells to other cities and other entities, will go from a 2020 figure of 31,329 acre-feet per year (AFY) to a 2070 demand of 32,306 AFY (an increase of 3.118%). Wichita Falls is proposing to spend hundreds of millions of dollars of its water customers' money on the possibility that demand might go up beyond what Wichita Falls current firm yield would supply. It is the position of Texas Conservation Alliance that this expenditure, projected in the IPP to be \$443 million, is not warranted. Even the lower price tag projected three years ago in the City's application, \$322 million, is not warranted.

- 4. The section of the Lake Ringgold application dealing with alternatives references the City's Long-Range Water Supply Plan, and states that "both short-term and long-term strategies were identified and evaluated". However, the full list of strategies and how they were evaluated is not explicitly stated in the application. The application simply concludes, "Based on the strategy evaluations, the long-term strategy that provides the greatest potential for reliable water supply at a reasonable cost to the City is Lake Ringgold." (Section 3.3).
  - Texas Conservation Alliance has reviewed the alternatives in the Long-Range Water Supply Plan and it is our finding that the list of alternatives in the study omits some of the most promising alternatives and the evaluation criteria are not applied appropriately. TCA will be presenting our analysis of alternatives and their evaluation in the contested case hearing.
- 5. According to the Region B IPP, the cost of constructing Lake Ringgold and its attendant pump stations and pipelines has risen substantially, from the \$322,520,000 submitted to TCEQ in the permit application to \$442,867,000. By the time interest is paid on the loan and the operating costs are added, the total cost will be more than a billion dollars. For a service area of roughly 150,00 people, such a crippling debt is detrimental to the public welfare. Since Wichita Falls' reuse program could in principle meet virtually all of its non-consumptive uses, construction of Lake Ringgold becomes primarily for such consumptive uses as lawn and landscape watering. Such a high price tag for a less-than-essential use is unjustifiable.
- 6. The environmental impacts of constructing Lake Ringgold would be enormous.
  - a. More than 1,000 acres of the land to be inundated is native tallgrass prairie that has never been plowed, one of the most endangered ecosystems in the country. Scientists estimate that only about 1% of the country's original tallgrass prairie remains.
  - b. The area to be impacted by Lake Ringgold is primarily grassland with wooded river and stream bottomlands. Most of the trees in this area are in the river and creek bottoms that will be inundated. Since the Little Wichita River is the dominant watershed in Clay County, Lake Ringgold will destroy a substantial percentage of the trees in the county.
  - c. More than half the inflows to Lake Ringgold will be lost to evaporation. These evaporative losses will reduce stream flows downstream in the Little Wichita and Red Rivers. Because the Little Wichita River is one of the few streams in the area with fresh water, it will degrade water quality in the Red River and Lake Texoma.
  - d. Loss of 24,000 acres of wildlife habitat, including native tallgrass prairie and a significant percentage of the wooded bottomlands in the county, will be a significant impact on the resident wildlife, migratory birds, and aquatic organisms that live on or use these lands. The habitat is a potential migration stop-over for the severely-endangered whooping crane and known habitat for two state-listed species, the Texas horned lizard and Texas kangaroo rat. It is important habitat for quail, dove, turkey, deer, ducks, and other wildlife which attract hunters and generate economic activity for the county and its residents. According to Quail Coalition, the native prairie that would be inundated is the optimal landscape for quail, which have been declining in recent decades. Texas Parks and Wildlife Department has

identified 112 Species of Greatest Conservation Need in the Cross Timbers ecoregion. Loss of habitat is the primary contributing factor to most of these species being at risk for becoming endangered.

7. The economic impacts on rural Clay County will be significant and should be part of the public welfare calculation. Clay County has already lost land from its tax rolls for Lake Arrowhead, Wichita Falls' primary water supply reservoir. If Lake Ringgold is built, the county will lose the tax revenues from 24,000 acres at the lake site and an estimated additional 17,000 acres for mitigation of the project. County officials estimate substantial increases in cost for road maintenance and law enforcement.

Part of the justification for Lake Ringgold offered by the City of Wichita Falls is to support economic development in the city. Countering that hypothetical gain is the lost economic activity of taking more than 40,000 acres out of production in Clay County.

Texas Conservation Alliance also requests that TCEQ hold a public comment hearing in the City of Wichita Falls, so that area citizens may learn about the project and comment on it.

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on this permit application. Texas Conservation Alliance reiterates its request for a contested case hearing on WRPERM 13404, by the City of Wichita Falls.



This is a **REQUEST FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING** on the application by the City of Wichita Falls No. 13404 because the proposed actions have significant potential to cause adverse impacts to the interests of the NWF and its members in a manner not common to the general public.

NWF is a national, nonprofit organization that dedicates itself to protecting natural resources and the right of the people to use and enjoy them. Further, NWF is a member of the Texas Living Waters Project (TLWP), a collaboration of conservation groups working to ensure healthy waterways for wildlife, the economy, and the future. Through its South Central Regional Center

in Austin and its participation in the TLWP, NWF works to ensure adequate protection of stream and river flows to support fish and wildlife resources in Texas. NWF has over 18,000 members in Texas. Many of these NWF members use and enjoy Texas' water, fish, and wildlife resources both recreationally and for their businesses.

The application by the City of Wichita Falls for Permit No. 13404 has the potential to adversely affect the Little Wichita River, Red River Basin, the fish and wildlife resources the river supports, and a large swath of ecologically fragile native prairie - one of the nation's most endangered ecosystems. The proposed actions would permanently inundate wooded river and creek bottoms and the rare native tallgrass prairie. Further, the requested diversion of 65,000 acre-feet of water per year from the proposed reservoir would also reduce flows in the Little Wichita River in the Red River Basin and Lake Texoma. It is NWF's mission to protect these important natural resources within the State of Texas.

These river and creek bottoms and prairie lands that would be inundated by Lake Ringgold are habitat for fish, quail, ducks, deer, songbirds and other wildlife that will be negatively impacted by the proposed actions. The City of Wichita Falls conducted a study prepared by Freese and Nichols, Inc. that identified one federally listed species, the interior least tern (Sterna antillarum athalassos), and two state listed species, the Texas kangaroo rat (Dipodomys elator) and the Texas horned lizard (Phrynosoma cornutum), that each have habitat located in Clay County. Reports have indicated that the state-listed species have habitat within the footprint of the proposed reservoir site. Further, reduced flows may adversely impact numerous aquatic and aquatic dependent species. Preserving rare prairie lands, ensuring adequate stream flows, and protecting sensitive threatened and endangered species are critical components of NWF's mission in the state.

NWF members will also be adversely impacted by the proposed actions. One NWF member that will be directly impacted by the proposed actions is Deborah Clark. Deborah Clark is a ranch owner, who runs the Birdwell and Clark Ranch with her husband Emry Birdwell, located at 578 N. Bryant Edwards Road, Henrietta, TX 76365. The Birdwell and Clark Ranch spans 14,000 acres and was honored for outstanding environmental stewardship by the National Cattlemen's Beef Association in 2018. Their intensive grazing management techniques have increased plant diversity and the resulting health of their land has led to the success of their ranch. If built, Lake Ringgold will inundate a substantial portion of the Birdwell and Clark Ranch, estimated between 1,200 and 2,000 acres. Further, an arm of the lake will cut their ranch into two sections. If the proposed actions move forward, the ability for Ms. Clark and Mr. Birdwell to conduct intensive grazing on their ranch will be significantly impacted. This will lead directly to loss of productivity of their ranch, causing Ms. Clark to suffer significant economic damage.

In addition to these adverse impacts, we believe a request for a Contested Case Hearing should be approved for the following reasons:

- 1. The City of Wichita Falls does not need Lake Ringgold to meet the projected demand for water for its residents and customers anytime between now and 2070. The firm yield of Wichita Falls' current water supply lakes, plus its established indirect reuse program, meet the City's projected demands for 2070 with a significant safety margin. Wichita Falls lost population in the last decade and its water use is projected in the Initially Prepared Plan of the 2021 Region B Water Plan to increase by just over 3% in the next fifty years. This shows that additional water supply is not a priority for the City of Wichita Falls and potential end users of the project.
- 2. As justification for building Lake Ringgold, the permit applicant (the City of Wichita Falls) does not use standard procedure for determining the city's available water supply. The standard procedure for assessing water supply employs the concept of firm yield, which is the amount of water which could be withdrawn from a water supply reservoir during a repeat of the historical worst drought of record (for this region the drought of 2011-2015). Firm yield is the usual definition of water supply and the only one that corresponds to historical reality.

If the City of Wichita Falls counted its water supply as the firm yield of Lakes Kickapoo and Arrowhead, plus the City's share of the firm yield of Lake Kemp, along with the supply from Wichita Falls' established reuse program, the City's water supply would easily meet its current and projected water needs without constructing Lake Ringgold. In its application for a permit to build Lake Ringgold, however, Wichita Falls uses a different method of counting its available water.

The City refers to "climate uncertainty" and its water supply methodology assumes that future climatic conditions will be significantly drier than the historical norms. In anticipation of this change in climate conditions, the City explored multiple definitions of water supply – conditional reliability assessment, one-year safe yield, two-year safe yield, and 20% reserve capacity. Each of these methodologies adjusts Wichita Falls' historical water supply downward, reflecting an assumed drier future. Of these, the City has selected the most stringent calculation, the 20% reserve capacity method, for its permit application. This method that results in the lowest assessment of available future water supply, which makes the case for additional water seem the most urgent.

Whether use of the 20% reserve capacity is a reasonable method for assessing water supply, and whether it justifies the expenditure of hundreds of millions of dollars, is precisely what is at issue. It is the position of NWF that the circumstances assumed under this method do not justify construction of Lake Ringgold.

3. Wichita Falls' permit application relies on "demand uncertainty" as justification for Lake Ringgold at the cost of taxpayer resources. The future is always uncertain, and we believe it is important to consider future climatic changes when planning for water supply. However, this uncertainty must be weighed against various costs associated with the project.

The Initially Prepared Plan of the Region B Water Plan (IPP) projects that Wichita Falls' demand for water, including what it sells to other cities and other entities, will go from a 2020 figure of 31,329 acre-feet per year (AFY) to a 2070 demand of 32,306 (an increase of 3.118%). Wichita Falls is proposing to spend hundreds of millions of dollars of its water customers' money on the possibility that demand might go up beyond what Wichita Falls' current firm yield would supply. It is the position of NWF that this expenditure (projected in the IPP to be \$443 million) is not warranted. Even the lower price tag projected three years ago in the City's application, \$322.520 million, is not warranted.

As described above, NWF's organizational interest in protecting Texas' natural resources would be adversely affected if this application is granted. The economic interests of individual members of our organization would also be adversely impacted if this application were to be approved. Further, we contend that the City of Wichita Falls' justifications for Lake Ringgold, which relies heavily on "demand uncertainty" and the "20% reserve capacity," are not sufficient to overcome the economic and ecological costs associated with the project. Accordingly, NWF requests a contested case hearing on the application and a public meeting to be held in the City of Wichita Falls.

#### Ladies and Gentlemen:

We are Deborah Clark and Emry Birdwell, partners in the Birdwell and Clark Ranch. We request a contested case hearing on WRPERM 13404, the application by the City of Wichita Falls for a large water right, use of the bed and banks of the Little Wichita River, and the construction of the proposed Lake Ringgold.

The physical address for the ranch is 578 N. Bryant Edwards Road, Henrietta, Texas. Our ranch is located on the south side of the proposed Lake Ringgold and includes both sides of the East Fork of the Little Wichita River and portions of the southern bank of the Little Wichita Fiver. Approximately fourteen (14) tracts of our ranch would be negatively impacted with the flooding of the reservoir.

This request for a contested case hearing is based on the following:

- Between 1200 2000 acres of our ranch would be inundated by the Conservation Pool; a significant amount of acreage would be subject to the 100 Year Flood Elevation; it is difficult to determine the acreage from available maps.
- Flooded portions on the east side of the East Fork of the Little Wichita would inundate the only
  road into the center of the ranch at three different locations. Travel from Highway 82 to the
  working pens and barn in the center of the ranch would not be possible. A five minute commute
  would turn into a 20 minute commute to the working pens. A new road would have to be built.
- Inundation of the East Fork would divide the ranch into two or more pieces. We would not be
  able to seamlessly graze the ranch as one property as currently practiced. This limitation would
  require an entirely different management structure, limit production capacity, and negatively
  impact revenue.
- A secondary source of income from hunting leases would be greatly diminished due to the loss of habitat and the reduction in wildlife populations.

- Most of the original tallgrass prairie in the country has been eliminated; Lake Ringgold would inundated at least 1,000 more acres.

We also request that a public comment meeting on the proposed project be held in Wichita Falls. There are a number of issues that need to be addressed:

The arrogance of the City of Wichita Falls in using the name "Lake Ringgold" for the proposed lake is noted. It is bad enough to try to impose this burden on Clay County and its citizens, but to name a lake after a shrinking town several miles away and located completely in another county is the height of arrogance.

Please note that Wichita Falls does not have any water supply lake located in Wichita County. Where is Lake Kickapoo? Where is Lake Kemp? Where is Lake Arrowhead? Wichita Falls should get its water in its own backyard. Wichita Falls has already imposed enough on Clay County with Lake Arrowhead.

### Prior Experience - Lake Arrowhead

Clay County cannot ignore the negative prior experience that Wichita Falls imposed on Clay County with its Lake Arrowhead project. Clay County has prior experience dealing with Wichita Falls lake property. Lake Arrowhead was constructed by Wichita Falls about 50 - 60 years ago. Lake Arrowhead is also on the Little Wichita River upstream from proposed "Lake Ringgold." At the outset, Wichita Falls acquired ownership of much of the waterfront property at Lake Arrowhead and offered long term leases hoping to develop a residential area around the lake. It attempted to annex the lake and adjacent land to the City of Wichita Falls. Defeated in court multiple times, Wichita Falls finally accomplished the annexation. The protracted litigation taught them how to annex.

Several years later lake area residents petitioned Wichita Falls to either provide promised and legally required services and roads or de-annex the property. Wichita Falls did de-annex the area and shirked its duty to its citizens and lot holders in the previously annexed area around the lake. That dumped that responsibility on Clay County. As a result, law enforcement and some road maintenance fell to Clay County. This substantially increased Clay County's burden to provide both adequate roads and law enforcement. Lake Arrowhead has not been a good experience for Clay County.

#### **Reduction of Tax Base**

Clay County is largely agricultural. Its tax base is land and related personal property such as livestock. Taking the land for a lake removes that property and the livestock it now supports, from the tax base which will likely require increased taxes on other county property and will burden Clay County's citizens only to benefit Wichita Falls.

### **Burden on Clay County Law Enforcement**

The only law enforcement agency in Clay County is the Clay County Sheriff. The Sheriff

This will impair law enforcement to our citizens.

#### **Increased Road Maintenance**

During construction, existing county roads will be seriously damaged. Additional roads will likely be required to access the proposed "Lake Ringgold" at various places around the proposed lake. Based on prior experience, we expect that expense burden to fall on Clay County. It should be a burden on Wichita Falls.

The area to be inundated by proposed "Lake Ringgold" abounds with native wildlife. Turkey specifically. Clay County hosts an annual "Turkey Fest." It is known both nationally and internationally. Hunting teams come from all over, many from out of state. Most teams film their activity in our county and those films are shown on television nationwide emphasizing our turkey population and making Clay County known for its friendliness and hunting opportunities. Multiple Clay County ranches will be inundated and that property lost for hunting. Proposed "Lake Ringgold" will handicap our hunting of turkey and other wildlife and maybe destroy Clay County's Turkey Fest.

Dove Salute is an annual hunt for personnel at Sheppard Air Force Base. It is hosted by several Clay County ranchers. About two hundred (200) air force personnel are provided an opportunity to hunt dove in the area of proposed "Lake Ringgold" and nearby ranches. The hunting day is followed by a steak feed at the Birdwell-Clark Ranch. All this is free to our Sheppard AFB personnel and is praised by the folks at Sheppard.

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### **Upstream Flooding**

Dry Fork and East Fork are tributaries flowing into the Little Wichita River downstream from Henrietta. There is a commercial area developed along U S Highway 287 South of Henrietta and a residential area on SH 148 South. Businesses and homes in those areas suffer from flooding from time to time. That flooding is expected to increase and be more severe if the proposed "Lake Ringgold" is constructed. Likely, if the proposed "Lake Ringgold" is full and there is exceptional rain in the area, Red River will also be at flood stage and it will be difficult to empty enough water out of proposed "Lake Ringgold" to prevent back up water from flooding upstream. This increased flooding will impact the areas along US 287 and SH 148 South. In addition, impoundment of the lake area north of Henrietta will likely cause significant reconstruction of FM 1197, north of Henrietta. The residential area known as Country Club may be impacted by this increased flooding.

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The Feasibility Study for Proposed Lake Ringgold, Clay County, Texas, October 2013, addresses endangered species and cultural resources in the area to be inundated by proposed "Lake Ringgold." This is a near seven year old study. It states:

"There are two state-listed threatened species that have a moderate potential to be impacted. These include the Texas horned lizard and the Texas kangaroo rat. Both of these species are known to be present in the region and habitat types at the reservoir could be favorable for their presence. Field surveys would be needed to confirm if these species or their preferred habitats are present within the footprint of the proposed reservoir." See page ES-2.

"The proposed Lake Ringgold site does have a moderate to high potential for the presence of cultural resources. The site is located in an area with known American Indian activities. The archeological potential analysis shows approximately two-thirds of the reservoir site with high potential for cultural resources. A cultural resource survey would need to be conducted to determine the number and frequency of historic and pre-historic sites." See page ES-2.

It is noted that the study states that surveys would be needed to confirm the endangered species presence in the area. Clearly this has not been done. The survey also says surveys

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### **Summary**

Clay County opposes the construction of this lake. The additional water supply is not needed in Wichita Falls. The Wichita Falls water users, the rate payers, if they are properly informed, will not be willing to bear that additional financial burden caused by the proposed lake. We expect Wichita Falls to escape the burden of submitting a bond issue to its voters as it likely cannot convince those voters to sign up for that huge tax bill. Instead, they will likely borrow the money from the SWIFT fund, or other sources, and increase water rates to its water users to foot the bill for the \$442,000,000.00 dollar project. The cost may well increase substantially before the project is shovel ready.

We in Clay County have had enough with mishandled Lake Arrowhead. We do not want another large lake in Clay County to be mishandled as Lake Arrowhead has been.

We in Clay County do not want our wildlife adversely impacted by this unnecessary proposed "Lake Ringgold."

We in Clay County do not believe this permit should be granted with the uncertainty of the impact of the proposed "Lake Ringgold" on endangered species and historic and prehistoric sites.

This letter is for the record for the hearing scheduled for Tuesday, August 25, 2020. I represent Clay County, Texas. We oppose the construction of the proposed "Lake Ringgold."

The City Council and/or the staff at the City of Wichita Falls ("City") are perpetrating a scam on the City's citizens and ratepayers.

The proposed Lake Ringgold first surfaced more than 60 years ago. To build it, the City of Wichita Falls had to vote a bond issue. The Wichita Falls voters did not like that long term debt and the bond election failed. A bond election would fail again if there was going to be a bond election for the proposed Lake Ringgold. But the water ratepayers of Wichita Falls and its customer cities won't get to vote on whether to build the lake. They will just be saddled with the \$443 million or more of debt – all for a reservoir they don't actually need. The City's end around a vote may be legal, but being legal does not make it right.

A Feasibility Study for the Proposed Lake Ringgold done for Wichita Falls by Freese and Nichols in October, 2013, says the total capital cost for the Lake Ringgold reservoir and dam is estimated to be approximately \$229 million. Now, not quite seven years later, the City's estimated cost is \$443 million. [See the December 2019 Region B 2021 Initially Prepared Plan]. The projected cost has nearly doubled in that short time.

Russell Schreiber, Wichita Falls Director of Public Works, says the average water bill would only increase by \$8 a month. [See report, Shatanya Clarke for Channel 3 News, February 28, 2020.] What Mr. Schreiber failed to mention is that if Lake Ringgold *isn't* built, the average water bill would go *down* when current obligations are paid off. The cost of proposed Lake Ringgold is that \$8 (if that is accurate) per month *plus* the amount the water bill does not go down.

Wichita Falls predicts the project will be completed in 2040 - 20 years down the road. What will be the cost then? If the increase mirrors the increase in the last seven years, it could reach \$1.3 billion. What will that huge debt do to water bills?

According to Schreiber, Wichita Falls expects to bypass a bond election, which means the citizens

and the ratepayers will not get a chance to decide whether to take on this huge debt. [See Claire Cowlick, Wichita Falls Times Record News, reporting on February 18, 2020]. In the same report Russell Schreiber says one possibility for financing the Ringgold project is certificates of obligation that would be funded by water-user rates. Possible funding could come from a loan through the Texas Water Development Board's State Water Implementation Fund or a federal loan. Either loan would have to be paid off by the people of Wichita Falls and its customer cities. State or federal loans or certificates of obligation do not require a vote of the citizens as a bond issue does. The attitude seems to be "build it, but don't let those who have to pay for it have a say." Schreiber also says the City's experts who now predict the cost of the lake at \$443 million are just wrong. He says it can be built for \$300 million. [See Trish Choate, Wichita Falls Times Record News, reporting on August 24, 2020] Why does he know better than his hired experts?

There is an abundance of information that augers against the building of the proposed Lake Ringgold.

Wichita Falls current water supply, even during the worst drought of record, is significantly more than the amount of water the City and its customer cities are projected to need anytime in the next fifty years. The City's water demand for right now is 31,329 acre-feet per year ("AFY"). The projected demand for water in 2070 goes up by less than 3% to 32,306 AFY. In contrast, the current supply is more than 40,000 AFY. Lakes Arrowhead and Kickapoo provide 31,770 AFY. The City's wonderful reuse project adds 9,000 AFY of water that is absolutely reliable – what many water plans refer to as "drought proof." There is additional water available from Lake Kemp. Only a portion of that available water is being used, so the actual water supply totals well over 40,000 AFY to meet the demand of just over 30,000 AFY. Perhaps this clear lack of need for this additional water will impact the City's ability to acquire the land by eminent domain.

The of City of Wichita Falls' has done an outstanding job of developing adequate water for our region, especially the recycling of waste water. The total supply including the recycling project means that the proposed Lake Ringgold is not needed at least in the next 50 years.

It is important to articulate the detriments of the proposed Lake Ringgold. Lake Ringgold has many negative aspects that significantly impact the people of the region; for example:

- The \$443 million price tag would be about \$3,000 for every man, woman, and child in Wichita Falls and its customer cities. And that's just the beginning. Once the interest on the loan and the operating costs are added, the price tag reaches nearly \$700 million.
- 16,000 acres of productive grassland will be permanently flooded and 8,000 more flooded part time. This is ranch land, wildlife land, land where the people of Clay County live. The proposed reservoir will handicap hunting of turkey, deer, and other wildlife.
- The effect on wildlife species and cultural resources will be significant. Approximately twothirds of the reservoir's site is identified as high potential for cultural resources; mostly the Native American Indians.

- Over 1,000 acres of this land is tallgrass prairie that's never been plowed land that's just like it was when Native Americans chased buffalo here. Tallgrass prairie is one of the most endangered wildlife habitats in the country destroying over 1,000 acres of it is a huge environmental impact.
- More than 40 families will be forced to sell land. Most people think Wichita Falls has already bought the land, but the City owns only 6,662 acres of the 41,000 acres that will be impacted the rest is private land.
- The economy of Clay County will be hugely impacted as this land is taken off the tax rolls and the costs of law enforcement and road repair go up.
- The people of Wichita Falls and its customer cities, the rate payers, will have high water rates for 40 years to pay for the proposed Lake Ringgold.

The primary consideration for the citizens of the City of Wichita Falls, and its water customers, is the cost of the proposed Lake Ringgold. They are the ones who must pay for it. Possible use of loans to cover this cost keeps the voters from having a say. Why would they do that? Because, if given a choice, the voters would never vote for this huge unnecessary expense to them and other rate payers.

The City should inform its citizens and ratepayers with complete and accurate information about this unnecessary expense that is about to be imposed on them by the City.

The permit the City requests should be denied. At the very least TCEQ should require the City to accurately inform the citizens/ratepayers and then receive input from them and carefully evaluate the propriety of this project.







Texas and Southwestern Cattle Raisers Association (TSCRA) requests a contested case hearing on WRPERM 13404, the application by the City of Wichita Falls for a large water right, use of the bed and banks of the Little Wichita River, and the construction of the proposed Lake Ringgold.

TSCRA is a 143-year-old trade association and is the largest and oldest livestock organization based in Texas. TSCRA has more than 17,500 beef cattle operations, ranching families and businesses as members. These members represent approximately 55,000 individuals directly involved in ranching and beef production who manage 4 million head of cattle on 76 million acres of range and pastureland, primarily in Texas, Oklahoma and throughout the Southwest.

The proposed site of Lake Ringgold will primarily impact a part of Clay County that is mostly rural and heavily agrarian. According to the USDA Census of Agriculture, Clay County is home to more than 1,300 agricultural producers and more than 77,500 cattle.

The proposed project will have drastic impacts on our members and every agricultural producer living in the area. For generations, cattle producers and property owners have made their homes and living on land that is now slated for condemnation. Many of these properties will cease to exist, and much of the rangeland taken out of production.

This loss of rangeland will not only have devastating effects for these farmers and ranchers, but also for the numerous businesses that supply their agricultural operations, and for the many consumers who rely on their outputs. The land proposed for Lake Ringgold is also home to numerous wildlife species. Property owners and ranchers frequently derive much-needed supplemental income and enjoyment from wildlife activities on their property.







As taxpayers in the County for 100 years, we adamantly feel that Lake Ringgold is not needed. Existing water sources and further conservation are more than adequate to meet the needs served by the City of Wichita Falls. The population of the City of WF is projected to remain flat into the future and beyond the next fifty years. I can personally attest growing up in the area that the population has not changed significantly in my 65 years. The cost

of the project is prohibitive. Now, estimated to cost approximately \$443 million and perhaps much higher, this project would be a huge burden on taxpayers. A substantial portion of our land would be inundated by Lake Ringgold as proposed. In addition, a residence, multiple barns, and equipment are located less than one mile from the proposed Lake Ringgold dam. Finally, four generations of the Staley family have enjoyed the unique qualities of a living river with intentions of future generations to enjoy.

My name is Jay Stine, and I am Executive Director of Quail Coalition. On behalf of Quail Coalition, I request a contested case hearing on WRPERM 13404, the application by the City of Wichita Falls for a large water right, use of the bed and banks of the Little Wichita River, and the construction of the proposed Lake Ringgold. I represent over 4,000 members across the State of Texas, including members who would be directly affected by the proposed Lake Ringgold, and we are deeply concerned about the impact on quail habitat in the proposed impact area.

There are several factors contributing to the decline of bobwhite quail populations, and one of the most troubling is the loss of habitat suitable for sustainable quail populations. As I understand it, the Lake Ringgold Project would remove roughly 16,000 acres of habitat suited for bobwhite quail, much of which is native prairie pasture that is the most optimal landscape for quail to thrive in. I am a native of Clay County, and I am worried about the impact of this project on quail and other wildlife in our area. I grew up hunting some of the land impacted with my father in the 1980s, and it provided some of the most productive quail hunting in my lifetime. It would be a shame to lose yet more pristine quail habitat for a project that may not even be a necessity.

I also request a public hearing to be held in Wichita Falls, which will allow both sides to share their concerns for analysis. With a project of this magnitude, it is critical to take the time to explore all factors, and their impacts at the epicenter of the land use change. These comments are submitted on behalf of the Laura and Diaz Murray family ("Murray Family") within Clay County Texas. The Murray's property would be bisected with inundation if under the current proposed plans for Lake Ringgold. The proposed plans for Lake Ringgold would forever alter significant portions of Clay County, including the Murray Family property which is a working cattle ranch. We simply ask that a hearing be held on this Application to explore the serious factual questions that remain with respect to this Application.

The City of Wichita did a good job investing in the indirect potable water project. The City also has available to it other measures that would address the projected needs for water for the City. The proposed Lake Ringgold far exceeds the projected needs in 2070. The projected additional water needs for Wichita Falls is 2040 are 5,134, but the Lake Ringgold supply is projected as 23,450.

The proposed project would heavily burden Clay County but is not projected to be necessary to satisfy the water needs of Clay County. In fact, the projected water need is largely dependent on a projected irrigation demand that far exceeds the current water used for irrigation in Wichita County.

The Region B plans show that more than 73% of the projected water needs relate to irrigation. It is not sound public policy to burden Clay County Residents and the ratepayers of the City of Wichita water system with the physical and financial costs of the proposed project.

In addition, review of the Application shows that the projected need is based, in part, on the OklaUnion AEP plant which is scheduled to be shutdown. Yet, AEP has announced, and the Electric Reliability Council of Texas (ERCOT) has recognized AEP's plans to remove this plant from service. We ask you to scrutinize each projected use in this plan before recommending support for Lake Ringgold.

To the extent this project is justified on the drought conditions in 2011-2015, this proposed lake comes from the same water source as the sources that dried up in prior years.

The 12 water supply alternatives identified and investigated in the 2015 Long-Range Water Supply Plan were:

This table does not show consideration for the CANAL CONVERSION TO PIPELINE ALTERNATIVE which the Region B 2021 Initially Prepared Plan the following water availability and costs identified in the charts below. With Canal Conversion to Pipeline option over the Lake Ringgold option, the water shortfall is lessened during the 15-25 years it takes to build Lake Ringgold and water needs are met and surpassed with a cost savings of over half a billion dollars.
