\*\*\*The proposed 'Max Midstream' crude oil export project in the Matagorda and Lavaca Bays is exactly what the Gulf of Mexico and our world do not need. That the TCEQ is even considering permitting this monstrosity is a measure of the madness that the cult of fossil fuels has brought upon our government. There exists no cost-benefit calculus by which another oil export terminal along the Gulf Coast could be found a net benefit to either the national interest, or to the health and welfare of individual Americans.
