### EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S RESPONSE TO HEARING REQUESTS

#### I. INTRODUCTION

The Executive Director (ED) of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ or Commission) files this Response to Hearing Requests on a joinder petition to the revised petition by Restore the Grasslands, LLC (Petitioner) for the creation of Collin County Municipal Utility District No. 7 (District). The ED recommends that the Commission grant 25 hearing requests, take no action on 10 hearing requests, and deny the remaining 50 requests.

The District would contain 101.829 acres located within Collin County. It is located approximately 4 miles east of US Highway 75 and 2 miles north of FM 544, between the City of Parker and the City of Murphy, wholly within the City of Parker's extraterritorial jurisdiction (ETJ).

The Petition states that the general nature of the work to be done by the District is:

(1) the construction of a water supply and distribution system for domestic purposes; (2) the construction of a sanitary sewer conveyance and treatment system; (3) the control, abatement, and amendment of the harmful excess of waters and the reclamation and drainage of overflowed lands within the District; (4) the construction and financing of macadamized, graveled, or paved roads and turnpikes, or improvements in aid of those roads; and (5) such other construction, installation, maintenance, purchase, and operation of such other facilities, systems, plants, and enterprises as shall be consistent with the purposes for which the District is organized.

The District will be considered a "developer project" as defined by 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 293.44(a). Therefore, developer cost participation in accordance with 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 293.47 will be required.

Included with the ED's response are: Attachment A (map of the proposed District with hearing requestors numbered) and Attachment B (appendix of the hearing requestors).

#### II. PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The Petitioner filed an application with the TCEQ for the creation of the District and it was declared administratively complete on April 27, 2021. The Notice of District Petition was published in *The Wylie News*, a newspaper generally circulated in Collin County, where the District is proposed to be located, on January 19, 2022, and January 26, 2022. The Notice of District Petition was also posted on the bulletin board used for posting legal notices in the Collin County Courthouse on January 18, 2022. The TCEQ received approximately 20 comments opposing the creation of the district and approximately 100 requests for a hearing. Of these requests, 100 were from individuals who had not requested a contested case hearing during the comment period of the initial application. The initial period to request a contested case hearing ended on February 25, 2022.

This matter was initially heard by the Commission on July 20, 2022, and referred to SOAH for a contested case hearing. The preliminary hearing was held at SOAH on November 30, 2022. On September 22, 2023, the landowner and original Petitioner, Harrington/Turner Enterprises, LP (HTE), sold the property at the heart of this matter to Restore the Grasslands LLC (RTG). Notice of this sale was filed with SOAH on October 9, 2023. On October 11, 2023, HTE filed a motion for withdrawal and notice of appearance seeking to transfer Petitioner status to RTG¹. Protestants filed multiple responses in opposition to Applicant's Motion for Withdrawal, culminating in a Motion to Dismiss for Lack of Jurisdiction, filed by the City of Parker on October 18, 2023. At the prehearing hearing conference held on February 9, 2024, the ALJ remanded the application back to the ED for additional notice to reflect the change in ownership.

An amended Notice of District Petition was drafted that reflected the change in ownership. The Notice of District Petition was published in *The Collin County Commercial Record*, a newspaper generally circulated in Collin County, where the District is proposed to be located, on June 11 and 18, 2024, reopening the comment period. The Notice of District Petition was also posted on the bulletin board used for posting legal notices in the Collin County Courthouse on June 7, 2024. The TCEQ received approximately 29 comments opposing the creation of the district and approximately 85 timely requests for a hearing during the 2024 comment period. The period to request a contested case hearing ended on July 18, 2024. Two additional hearing requests were received after this date, along with one comment, but as they were untimely, they were not addressed in this document.

#### III. CREATION OF MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICTS

#### A. District Purpose

A municipal utility district (MUD) may be created under and subject to the authority, conditions, and restrictions of Article XVI, Section 59, of the Texas Constitution. TEX. WATER CODE § 54.011. The District in this case is proposed to be created and organized according to the terms and provisions of Article XVI, Section 59, of the Texas Constitution and Chapters 49 and 54 of the Texas Water Code.

A MUD may be created for the following purposes:

- (1). the control, storage, preservation, and distribution of its storm water and floodwater, the water of its rivers and streams for irrigation, power, and all other useful purposes;
- (2). the reclamation and irrigation of its arid, semiarid, and other land needing irrigation;
- (3). the reclamation and drainage of its overflowed land and other land needing drainage;
- (4). the conservation and development of its forests, water, and hydroelectric power;
- (5). the navigation of its inland and coastal water;
- (6). the control, abatement, and change of any shortage or harmful excess of water;
- (7). the protection, preservation, and restoration of the purity and sanitary condition of water within the state; and

(8). the preservation of all natural resources of the state.

TEX. WATER CODE § 54.012. The Commission has jurisdiction to hear this case and create the District. Tex. WATER CODE § 54.014.

#### B. Required Findings

The Commission must grant or deny a MUD creation application in accordance with Tex. Water Code § 54.021. In order to grant an application, the Commission must find that organization of the district as requested is feasible and practicable and is necessary and would be a benefit to the land to be included in the district. Tex. Water Code § 54.021(a); 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 293.13(b)(1). If the Commission fails to make these findings, it shall refuse to grant the petition. Tex. Water Code § 54.021(d); 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 293.13(a).

In determining if a project is feasible and practicable and if it is necessary and would be a benefit to the land included in the district, the Commission shall consider:

- (1). the availability of comparable service from other systems, including but not limited to water districts, municipalities, and regional authorities;
- (2). the reasonableness of projected construction costs, tax rates, and water and sewer rates; and
- (3). whether or not the district and its system and subsequent development within the district will have an unreasonable effect on the following:
  - (A) land elevation;
  - (B) subsidence;
  - (C) groundwater level within the region;
  - (D) recharge capability of a groundwater source;
  - (E) natural run-off rates and drainage:
  - (F) water quality: and
  - (G) total tax assessments on all land located within a district.

TEX. WATER CODE § 54.021(b).

The Commission, however, must exclude the areas that it finds would not be benefited by the creation of the district and must redefine the boundaries of the proposed district according to its findings. 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 293.13(b)(2); Tex. Water Code § 54.021(c).

#### C. City Consent

TCEQ regulations require all district creation applications to contain "a certified copy of the action of the governing body of any municipality in whose extraterritorial jurisdiction the proposed district is located, consenting to the creation of the proposed district, under Local Government Code, § 42.042." 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 293.11(a)(2). Commission Rules further state that "[i]f the governing body of any such municipality fails or refuses to grant consent, the petitioners must show that the provisions of Local Government Code, § 42.042, have been followed." *Id*.

MUDs are also subject to the city consent requirements of Tex. WATER CODE § 54.016, which states that "[n]o land within the corporate limits of a city or within the extraterritorial jurisdiction of a city, shall be included in a district unless the city grants its written consent, by resolution or ordinance, to the inclusion of the land

within the district in accordance with Section 42.042, Local Government Code, and this section." Tex. Water Code 54.016(a); Loc. Govt. Code § 42.042(a). If the city fails or refuses to give consent within 90 days after receipt of a written request, the land owners in the area "may petition the governing body of the city and request the city to make available to the land the water or sanitary sewer service contemplated to be provided by the district." Tex. Water Code § 54.016(b); Loc. Govt. Code, § 42.042(b). If the landowners and the city then fail to execute a "mutually agreeable contract" for the provisions of the requested services within 120 days after receipt of the petition, "the failure shall constitute authorization for the inclusion of the land in the district under the provisions of this section." Tex. Water Code § 54.016(c); Loc. Govt. Code § 42.042(c). The Texas Water Code goes on to state that:

If the city fails or refuses to grant permission for the inclusion of land in a district or to execute a mutually agreeable contract providing for the water or sanitary sewer service requested within the time limits contained within Subsection (b) or (c) of this section, the applicant may petition the commission for creation of the district or inclusion of the land in a district. The commission shall allow creation or inclusion of the land in a proposed district upon a finding that the city either does not have the reasonable ability to serve or has failed to make a legally binding commitment with sufficient funds available to provide water and wastewater service adequate to serve the proposed development at a reasonable cost to the landowner. The commitment shall provide that construction of the facilities necessary to serve the land shall be commenced within two years, and shall be substantially complete within four and one-half years from the date the petition was filed with the city.

TEX. WATER CODE § 54.016(d).

#### IV. EVALUATION PROCESS FOR HEARING REQUESTS

As the application was declared administratively complete after September 1, 1999, it is subject to the requirements of Title 30, Chapter 55, Subchapter G, Sections 55.250-55.256 of the Texas Administrative Code. The Commission, the Executive Director, the Petitioner, or affected persons may request a contested case hearing on this application. 30 Tex. ADMIN. Code § 55.251(a). The Commission must evaluate the hearing requests and may take one of the following actions:

- (1). determine that the hearing requests do not meet the rule requirements and act on the application;
- (2). determine that the hearing requests do not meet the rule requirements and refer the application to a public meeting to develop public comment before acting on the application;
- (3). determine that the hearing requests meet the rule requirements and refer the application to the State Office of Administrative Hearings ("SOAH") for a hearing; or
- (4). refer the hearing requests to SOAH for a hearing on whether the hearing requests meet the rule requirements.

30 Tex. Admin. Code § 55.255(a).

The regulations provide that a hearing request made by an affected person must be in writing and must be filed with the Office of the Chief Clerk within the time provided in the Notice of District Petition. 30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE § 55.251(b) and (d). These two

requirements are mandatory. The affected person's hearing request must also substantially comply with the following:

- (1). give the name, address, and daytime telephone number of the person who files the request;
- (2).identify the person's personal justiciable interest affected by the application, including a brief, but specific, written statement explaining in plain language the requestor's location and distance relative to the activity that is the subject of the application and how and why the requestor believes he or she will be affected by the activity in a manner not common to members of the general public;
- (3). request a contested case hearing; and
- (4) provide any other information specified in the public notice of application.
- 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 55.251(c).

An affected person's personal justiciable interest must be related to a legal right, duty, privilege, power, or economic interest affected by the application belonging to the requestor and not an interest common to members of the general public. 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 55.256(a). The regulations give the Commission flexibility to determine affected person status by considering any relevant factor, including the following:

- (1). whether the interest claimed is one protected by the law under which the application will be considered;
- (2). distance restrictions or other limitations imposed by law on the affected interest:
- (3). whether a reasonable relationship exists between the interest claimed and the activity regulated;
- (4).likely impact of the regulated activity on the health and safety of the person, and on the use of property of the person; and
- (5).likely impact of the regulated activity on use of the impacted natural resource by the person.
- (6). For governmental entities, their statutory authority over or interest in the issues relevant to the application.
- 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 55.256(c).

#### V. HEARING REOUESTS

#### A. Individuals Already Admitted as parties:

The following requestors timely submitted hearing requests during the initial comment period in 2022, were admitted as parties to the SOAH hearing, and then submitted additional timely hearing requests during the 2024 comment period: Andrew Malczewski, Carrolyn Jean Moebius, Katherine Calabria Harvey, Theodore Lane, Laura Hernandez, Ray Hemmig, Lindy (Buddy) Pilgrim, Don Wade Cloud, Angelique S. Loncar, and Emily Plummer. The ED recommends that the Commission take no action on these hearing requests as these individuals were named as parties to the contested case hearing. The Cities of Parker and Murphy are also parties to the ongoing SOAH proceeding, but did not submit new hearing requests.

## B. Individuals' Hearing Requests from the 2024 Comment Period that the ED Recommends Granting

The following requestors submitted individual, timely requests which each contained their name, address, and phone number pursuant to 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 55.251(c)(1).

Hal E. Camp, Lance Caughfield, Theresa Chen, Elizabeth Ann Cross, Jeffrey Neal Cross, Michele Floyd, Alesha R. Haynes, Michael Shaun Haynes, Anthony R. Hernandez, Jani and Miriam Jasadiredja, Brad Levy, Candy Levy, Linda G. Loop, Dianne Elizabeth Lundberg, Edwin D. Lundberg, Tom Marshall, Ann Stormer McCook, Zachary McCook, Lynne Anne Orozco, Vicki B. Pilgrim, Heather Mae Powell, Bonnie C. Shea, Nathan Shea, Joseph E. Stack, and Tracy Stack.

Each individual requested a contested case hearing pursuant to 30 Tex. Admin. Code  $\S$  55.251(c)(3). Each requestor also provided the internal control number as required in the notice and pursuant to 30 Tex. Admin. Code  $\S$  55.251(c)(4). Furthermore, he or she identified their personal justiciable interest pursuant to 30 Tex. Admin. Code  $\S$  55.251(c)(2), with each requestor raising issues ranging from natural run-off rates, availability of comparable service, water quality, to drainage, all of which are issues the Commission is directed to consider pursuant to TWC  $\S$  54.021(b). Each requestor also described where his or her property is situated in relation to the District and articulated how they are affected in ways uncommon to the general public.

Therefore, due to the location of these requestors' property relative to the proposed district and the concerns raised, the Executive Director recommends that the Commission find that each of these requestors is an affected person and grant his or her hearing request.

## C. Individuals' Hearing Requests from the 2024 Comment Period that the ED Recommends Denying

- 1. All remaining requestors submitted timely hearing requests but they failed to substantially comply with the procedural requirements of 30 TAC Chapter 55 Subchapter G. Specifically, they either:
  - a. did not raise any issues which are within the Commission's jurisdiction to consider during the review of a MUD creation petition;

- b. did not indicate that they own property in close proximity to the District and therefore did not demonstrate that they are affected persons with respect to this district creation, or their respective locations on the TCEQ-generated map indicated that they do not own property in close proximity to the District; or
- c. did not identify a personal justiciable interest and therefore did not demonstrate that they are affected persons with respect to this district creation. Each of these requestors raised concerns that are common to the general public.

#### VI. RECOMMENDATION

The Executive Director recommends that the Commission grant the hearing requests of the following individuals: Hal E. Camp, Lance Caughfield, Theresa Chen, Elizabeth Ann Cross, Jeffrey Neal Cross, Michele Floyd, Alesha R. Haynes, Michael Shaun Haynes, Anthony R. Hernandez, Jani and Mirian Jasadiredja, Brad Levy, Candy Levy, Linda G. Loop, Dianne Elizabeth Lundberg, Edwin D. Lundberg, Tom Marshall, Ann Stormer McCook, Zachary McCook, Lynne Anne Orozco, Vicki B. Pilgrim, Heather Mae Powell, Bonnie C. Shea, Nathan Shea, Joseph E. Stack, and Tracy Stack.

The Executive Director recommends that the Commission take no action on the hearing requests of the following individuals, as they are already admitted parties in this matter: Andrew Malczewski, Carrolyn Jean Moebius, Katherine Calabria Harvey, Theodore Lane, Laura Hernandez, Ray Hemmig, Lindy (Buddy) Pilgrim, Don Wade Cloud, Angelique S. Loncar, and Emily Plummer.

The Executive Director recommends that the Commission find that all other requestors are not affected persons and deny their hearing requests.

If the Commission chooses to deny the above hearing requests, the Executive Director recommends that the petition be referred back to SOAH to continue the contested case hearing process.


