Dear Parties:

A proposal for decision (PFD) was issued in this case on December 4, 2023. Highland Lakes Midlothian I, LLC (Applicant), Staff of the Executive Director (ED) of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ or Commission), and City of Midlothian and Ellis County (Protestants) filed exceptions and Applicant filed a reply.

Applicant and the ED both support the PFD. Applicant excepts to the PFD only because it does not mention that Cassie Gibson presented testimony. The ALJ notes that the PFD mentions only witnesses that testified in person and who were subject to cross-examination. Ms. Gibson's resume and testimony were admitted as Applicant's Exs. 17 and 18, but she did not appear at the hearing because she was waived for cross-examination. The ALJ considered Ms. Gibson's testimony when issuing the PFD. No change is required based on Applicant's exceptions.

The substance of Protestants' exceptions were extensively presented at the hearing and in closing arguments and were duly considered by the ALJ when **Exceptions Letter**
