AGREED ORDER DOCKET NO. 2022-0739-MLM-E

I. JURISDICTION AND STIPULATIONS

On	, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality ("Commission" or
"TCEQ") considered	this agreement of the parties, resolving an enforcement action regarding Mary
Richbourg ("Respor	ident") under the authority of Tex. Water Code ch. 7 and Tex. Health & Safety
CODE chs. 361 and 3	82. The Executive Director of the TCEQ, represented by the Litigation Division,
and Respondent tog	gether stipulate that:

- 1. Respondent owned and operated a portable air curtain incinerator ("ACI") located on Farmto-Market Road 1314 approximately 1500 feet north from the intersection of Farm-to-Market Road 242 and Farm-to-Market Road 1314 near Conroe, Montgomery County, Texas (the "Site"). The Site involved the management of municipal solid waste ("MSW"), as defined in Tex. Health & Safety Code ch. 361. The Site consisted of one or more sources as defined in Tex. Health & Safety Code § 382.003(12).
- 2. The Executive Director and Respondent agree that TCEQ has jurisdiction to enter this Order pursuant to Tex. Water Code §§ 7.002, 7.051, and 7.073, and that Respondent is subject to TCEQ's jurisdiction. The TCEQ has jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to Tex. Water Code § 5.013 because it alleges violations of Tex. Health & Safety Code chs. 361 and 382, and the rules of the TCEQ.
- 3. The occurrence of any violation is in dispute and the entry of this Order shall not constitute an admission by Respondent of any violation alleged in Section II ("Allegations"), nor of any statute or rule.
- 4. An administrative penalty in the amount of \$24,945 is assessed by the Commission in settlement of the violations alleged in Section II. Respondent paid \$24,945 of the penalty.
- 5. The Executive Director and Respondent agree on a settlement of the matters addressed in this Order, subject to final approval in accordance with 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 70.10(a). Any notice and procedures which might otherwise be authorized or required in this action are waived in the interest of a more timely resolution of the matter.
- 6. The Executive Director may, without further notice or hearing, refer this matter to the Office of the Attorney General of the State of Texas ("OAG") for further enforcement proceedings if the Executive Director determines that Respondent has not complied with one or more of the terms or conditions contained in this Order.
- 7. This Order represents the complete and fully-integrated agreement of the parties. The provisions of this Order are deemed severable, and, if a court of competent jurisdiction or other appropriate authority deems any provision of this Order unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall be valid and enforceable.
- 8. This Order shall terminate five years from its effective date or upon full compliance with all the terms and conditions set forth in this Order, whichever is later.

9. The Executive Director recognizes that Respondent achieved compliance on June 13, 2022, and no longer owns or operates the Site as of April 30, 2025.

II. ALLEGATIONS

- 1. During an investigation conducted on January 20, 2022, an investigator documented that Respondent:
 - a. Failed to ensure that material is not added to the ACI in such a manner as to be stacked above the air curtain and failed to ensure that the length of the trench does not exceed the length of the air blower manifold, in violation of Tex. Health & Safety Code § 382.085(b), 30 Tex. Admin. Code §§ 106.496(c)(3)(C) and (d)(2) and 122.143(4), Permit by Rule ("PBR") Registration No. 153904L001, and Federal Operating Permit ("FOP") No. 04096/General Operating Permit ("GOP") No. 518, Qualification Criteria No. (a)(5) and Terms and Conditions No. (b)(8)(B)(vi). Specifically, on January 20, 2022, TCEQ staff observed ACI Serial No. T30FD18797 operating with material stacked over the top of the trench and the air blower manifold folded inward, away from the trench, and therefore not providing an air curtain for the material burning in the trench:
 - b. Caused, suffered, allowed, or permitted outdoor burning within the State of Texas, in violation of Tex. Health & Safety Code § 382.085(b) and 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 111.201. Specifically, on January 20, 2022, TCEQ staff documented that approximately 22 cubic yards of MSW consisting of vegetative waste from land-clearing activities were burned at the Site;
 - c. Failed to maintain a copy of each PBR, all PBR conditions, and any operating instructions at the Site, followed by owners or operators, and made available at the request of personnel from the commission, in violation of Tex. Health & Safety Code § 382.085(b), 30 Tex. Admin. Code §§ 106.8(c)(1) and (c)(2)(B), 106.496(h)(4)(C), and 122.143(4), PBR Registration No. 153904L001, FOP No. O4096/GOP No. 518, Qualification Criteria No. (a)(2)(B) and Terms and Conditions Nos. (b)(8)(B)(iii) and (vi). Specifically, a copy of the PBR for ACI Serial No. T30FD18797 was not available at the Site;
 - d. Failed to obtain authorization prior to constructing or modifying a source of air contaminants, in violation of Tex. Health & Safety Code §§ 382.0518(a) and 382.085(b) and 30 Tex. Admin. Code §§ 106.496(h)(2)(A) and 116.110(a). Specifically, on January 20, 2022, TCEQ staff observed an unmarked ACI operating on the Site and registration records were not provided;
 - e. Caused, suffered, allowed, or permitted the unauthorized disposal of MSW, in violation of 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 330.15(a) and (c). Specifically, on January 20, 2022, TCEQ staff documented that approximately 22 cubic yards of MSW consisting of vegetative waste were disposed of at the Site; and
 - f. Failed to prevent nuisance smoke conditions, in violation of Tex. Health & Safety Code § 382.085(a) and (b) and 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 101.4. Specifically, on January 20, 2022, TCEQ staff observed smoke emissions from an active burn pile leave the Site, travel across State Highway 242, and impact off-site receptors, resulting in the confirmation of nuisance smoke conditions.

III. DENIALS

Respondent generally denies each Allegation in Section II.

IV. ORDERING PROVISIONS

NOW, THEREFORE, THE TEXAS COMMISSION ON ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ORDERS that:

- 1. Respondent is assessed an administrative penalty as set forth in Section I, Paragraph 4. The payment of this penalty and Respondent's compliance with all of the requirements set forth in this Order resolve only the Allegations in Section II. The Commission shall not be constrained in any manner from requiring corrective actions or penalties for violations which are not raised here.
- 2. All relief not expressly granted in this Order is denied.
- 3. The duties and provisions imposed by this Order shall apply to and be binding upon Respondent.
- 4. The Executive Director may grant an extension of any deadline in this Order or in any plan, report, or other document submitted pursuant to this Order, upon a written and substantiated showing of good cause. All requests for extensions by Respondent shall be made in writing to the Executive Director. Extensions are not effective until Respondent receives written approval from the Executive Director. The determination of what constitutes good cause rests solely with the Executive Director.
- 5. If Respondent fails to comply with any of the Ordering Provisions in this Order within the prescribed schedules, and that failure is caused solely by an act of God, war, strike, riot, or other catastrophe, Respondent's failure to comply is not a violation of this Order. Respondent shall have the burden of establishing to the Executive Director's satisfaction that such an event has occurred. Respondent shall notify the Executive Director within seven days after Respondent becomes aware of a delaying event and shall take all reasonable measures to mitigate and minimize any delay.
- 6. This Order, issued by the Commission, shall not be admissible against Respondent in a civil proceeding, unless the proceeding is brought by the OAG to: (1) enforce the terms of this Order, or (2) pursue violations of a statute within TCEQ's jurisdiction or of a rule adopted or an order or permit issued by the TCEQ under such a statute.
- 7. This Order may be executed in separate and multiple counterparts, which together shall constitute a single instrument. Any page of this Order may be copied, scanned, digitized, converted to electronic portable document format ("pdf"), or otherwise reproduced and may be transmitted by digital or electronic transmission, including but not limited to facsimile transmission and electronic mail. Any signature affixed to this Order shall constitute an original signature for all purposes and may be used, filed, substituted, or issued for any purpose for which an original signature could be used. The term "signature" shall include manual signatures and true and accurate reproductions of manual signatures created, executed, endorsed, adopted, or authorized by the person or persons to whom the signatures are attributable. Signatures may be copied or reproduced digitally, electronically, by photocopying, engraving, imprinting, lithographing, electronic mail, facsimile transmission, stamping, or any other means or process which the Executive Director deems acceptable. In this paragraph exclusively, the terms: electronic transmission, owner, person, writing, and written, shall have the meanings assigned to them under Tex. Bus. Org. Code § 1.002.
- 8. The effective date of this Order is the date it is signed by the Commission. A copy of this fully executed Order shall be provided to each of the parties.
