What the adopted action would do:

This action will approve the rules review of Chapter 25, and readopt the chapter.

This action constitutes a determination by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, after opportunity for public review and comment, that the initial reasons for adopting the rules of this chapter continue to exist.

Applicable law:

The review of the rules is authorized under the requirements of Texas Government Code, §2001.039; and the General Appropriations Act, Article IX, §9-10.13, 76th Texas Legislature, 1999, which require state agencies to review and consider for readoption each of their rules every four years.

Reason rules are needed:

Executive director's staff conducted a review of the rules in Chapter 25 and determined that the reasons for adopting these rules continue to exist. The rules provide the requirements for accreditation and certification of environmental testing laboratories. Texas Water Code (TWC), §5.134, requires, with certain exceptions, all environmental testing laboratory data and analyses used in commission decisions regarding any matter under the commission's jurisdiction relating to permits or other authorizations, compliance matters, enforcement action, or remedial action must be from an accredited environmental testing laboratory. The rules are specifically required by TWC, §5.802 which requires the commission to adopt rules for the voluntary environmental testing laboratory accreditation program.

A public hearing was not offered for this review. The comment period for the rules review closed on February 21, 2023. No comments were received.

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The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (commission) has completed its Rule Review of 30 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) Chapter 25, Environmental Testing Laboratory Accreditation and Certification, as required by Texas Government Code, §2001.039. Texas Government Code, §2001.039, requires a state agency to review and consider for readoption, readoption with amendments, or repeal each of its rules every four years. The commission published its Notice of Intent to Review these rules in the January 20, 2023, issue of the *Texas Register* (48 TexReg 230).

The review assessed whether the initial reasons for adopting the rules continue to exist and the commission has determined that those reasons exist. The rules in Chapter 25 are required because they provide the requirements for accreditation and certification of environmental testing laboratories. Texas Water Code (TWC), §5.134 requires, with certain exceptions, all environmental testing laboratory data and analyses used in commission decisions regarding any matter under the commission's jurisdiction relating to permits or other authorizations, compliance matters, enforcement action, or remedial action must be from an accredited environmental testing laboratory. The rules are specifically required by TWC, §5.802 which requires the commission adopt rules for the voluntary environmental testing laboratory accreditation program.

The rules are necessary to ensure the data used by the commission in its decisions are of known and documented quality.

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Public Comment

The public comment period closed on February 21, 2023. The commission did not receive comments on the rules review of this chapter.

As a result of the review the commission finds that the reasons for adopting the rules in 30 TAC Chapter 25 continue to exist and readopts these sections in accordance with the requirements of Texas Government Code, §2001.039.
