Chapter 216, Water Quality Performance Standards for Urban Development

Rules Review of 30 TAC Chapter 216 Non-Rule Project No. 2023-083-216-OW

#### What the adopted action would do:

This action will approve the rules review of Chapter 216, and readopt the chapter.

This action constitutes a determination by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ), after opportunity for public review and comment, that the initial reasons for adopting the rules of this chapter continue to exist.

#### Applicable law:

The review of the rules is authorized under the requirements of Texas Government Code, §2001.039; and the General Appropriations Act, Article IX, §9-10.13, 76th Texas Legislature, 1999, which require state agencies to review and consider for readoption each of their rules every four years.

#### Reason rules are needed:

Executive director's staff conducted a review of the rules in Chapter 216 and determined that the reasons for adopting these rules continue to exist. Chapter 216 provides specific procedures and measures to implement Texas Water Code, §26.177. The rules and statute address the TCEQ's authority to require a city with a population of 10,000 or more and water pollution that is attributable to non-permitted sources to develop a water pollution control and abatement program. Non-permitted sources of water pollution are those not authorized by a valid permit, general permit, or rule pursuant to Texas Water Code, Chapter 26, the federal Clean Water Act, or other applicable state or federal law. Because Texas Water Code, §26.177 is still effective, Chapter 216 is still needed.

Texas Government Code, §2001.039, requires a state agency to review and consider for readoption, readoption with amendments, or repeal each of its rules every four years. TCEQ published its Notice of Intent to Review these rules in the July 28, 2023, issue of the *Texas Register* (48 TexReg 4135).

The review assessed whether the initial reasons for adopting the rules continue to exist and TCEQ has determined that those reasons exist. The rules in Chapter 216 are required because Chapter 216 provides specific procedures and measures to implement Texas Water Code, §26.177. The rules and statute address the TCEQ's authority to require a city with a population of 10,000 or more and water pollution that is attributable to non-permitted sources to develop a water pollution control and abatement program. Non-permitted sources of water pollution are those not authorized by a valid permit, general permit, or rule pursuant to Texas Water Code, Chapter 26, the federal Clean Water Act, or other applicable state or federal law. Because Texas Water Code, §26.177 is still effective, Chapter 216 is still needed.
