Rules Review of 30 TAC Chapter 318 Non-Rule Project No. 2023-043-318-OW

What the adopted action would do:

This action will approve the rules review of Chapter 318, and readopt the chapter.

This action constitutes a determination by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ), after opportunity for public review and comment, that the initial reasons for adopting the rules of this chapter continue to exist.

Applicable law:

The review of the rules is authorized under the requirements of Texas Government Code, §2001.039; and the General Appropriations Act, Article IX, §9-10.13, 76th Texas Legislature, 1999, which require state agencies to review and consider for readoption each of their rules every four years.

Reason rules are needed:

Executive director's staff conducted a review of the rules in Chapter 318 and determined that the reasons for adopting these rules continue to exist. The rules in Chapter 318 are required to implement Texas Water Code, Chapter 18 by establishing an expedited permitting process for the discharge of treated marine seawater and waste resulting from the desalination of marine seawater.

Commission on State Emergency Communications

Title 1, Part 12

The Commission on State Emergency Communications (CSEC) has concluded the statutory review of its Chapter 255 rules conducted in accordance with Government Code §2001.039. CSEC's notice of intent to review Chapter 255 was published in the February 10, 2023, issue of the *Texas Register* (48 TexReg 719.)

No comments were received regarding CSEC's notice of review.

CSEC's review assessed and determined that the original reasons and justifications for adopting each rule in Chapter 255 continue to exist, reflect current legal and policy considerations, and the rules are within the agency's legal authority as certified by legal counsel.

Based on its review, CSEC readopts Chapter 255 without amendment. This notice concludes CSEC's review of its Chapter 255 rules.

Texas Commission on Environmental Quality Chapter 318, Marine Seawater Desalination Discharges Non-Rule Project No. 2023-043-318-OW

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ or commission) has completed its Rule Review of 30 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) Chapter 318, Marine Seawater Desalination Discharges, as required by Texas Government Code (TGC), §2001.039. TGC, §2001.039, requires a state agency to review and consider for readoption, readoption with amendments, or repeal each of its rules every four years. The commission published its Notice of Intent to Review these rules in the April 7, 2023, issue of the *Texas Register* (48 TexReg 1857).

The review assessed whether the initial reasons for adopting the rules continue to exist and the commission has determined that those reasons exist. Chapter 318 implements Texas Water Code, Chapter 18 by establishing an expedited permitting process for the discharge of treated marine seawater and waste resulting from the desalination of marine seawater.

Public Comment

The public comment period closed on May 8, 2023. The commission did not receive comments on the rules review of this chapter.

As a result of the review the commission finds that the reasons for adopting the rules in 30 TAC Chapter 318 continue to exist and readopts these sections in accordance with the requirements of Texas Government Code, §2001.039.
