I request a contested case hearing for Petition D-08222022-044, petitioned by Steve Selinger, for the creation of Shankle Road Municipal Utility District of Ellis County.

I am an affected person entitled to a contested case hearing on the issues raised in this hearing request. My property is located at 560 Chmelar Rd. Fourmile Creek runs across my entire property.

The creation of this Utility District uniquely and adversely affects me in the following way(s):

1. The identified creek at the site location is actually not a creek, but a watershed slope and overflow from uphill ponds. The potential for 500,000 gallons per day discharge is actually being dumped into the road drainage ditch, which eventually will find its way to the more defined "Fourmile Creek" approximately .5 miles away.

2. The immediate property across the road and down hill from the site is owned by Charlie Pouzar. The property will not shed the water from the development but rather become a muddy boggy pasture which will breed a massive mosquitoe population in the spring and summer.

3. In the event the sewer treatment system fails, it will dramatically affect the livestock and horses in the area downstream from the development site and cause sewer odor. Livestock that drink contaminated water can easily develop Leptospirosis, Pythiosis, Fusobacterium, Campylobacter, and Anthrax. There is a residence 300ft from the Charlie Pouzar property line and will be affected by the odors, mosquitoes, and potential dieseases also.

4. Fourmile creek is a water shed and normally is dry year round. The lay of the land does not support this slow water drainage supply and will environmentally change "Fourmile Creek" into a virus and bacteria breeding ground with stagnent water. It will depend upon a 2" plus rainfall to wash out the stagnant water and then the process will start all over again. An Extensive Regional Impact Study and hydraulic analysis regarding adequate water volume and flow throughout the region should be demanded from the Petitioner.

5. An extensive drainage plan should be demanded for the entire drainage/flooding inclusive of the entire path through Ellis County. My barn and shop could be affected with fast runoff from the streets without water retention ponds. "Fourmile Creek" which is a normally dry creek will respond entirely different to a 3" per hr. rainfall event and will not act as a retention creek.

 An Extensive Environmental Impact Study should be demanded regarding the effects of the excessive water generated by development and effects of crop contamination downstream.

7. Developing property with such a high density of housing creates excessive amounts of trash, debris and clutter throughout the surrounding properties. The petitioner has not addressed the negative impact of excessive waste on surrounding properties and debris to the landfill.

8. This development will also forcibly relocate predatory animals such as coyotes to surrounding properties burdening the landowners with additional protection necessary for chickens, ducks, geese, birds, pets, and livestock. An extensive wildlife impact study should be provided and demanded from the Petitioner.

I request a contested case hearing for Petition D-08222022-044, petitioned by Steve Selinger, for the creation of Shankle Road Municipal Utility District of Ellis County.

I am an affected person entitled to a contested case hearing on the issues raised in this hearing request.

Prior to the issuance of this Petition, this Petitioner filed an application for a permit to treat and discharge municipal wastewater. I and others submitted comments to TCEQ for this permit application WQ0016103001 for the wastewater treatment facility (WWTF) that is proposed for this Shankle Road MUD for the purposes of treating municipal wastewater generated within the MUD. Notice was not made to the general public in our community per TNRCC Chapter 39-Public Notice, but after requesting records from this Chief Clerk's Office, it was discovered that notices had been published in the "Waxahachie Daily Light", a publication not commonly subscribed to by people in our neighborhood, that is, no one saw it. Our local publication is the "Ennis News".

Also pursuant to TNRCC Chapter 39 – Public Notice, within the WWTF Permit Application, the names and addresses of the affected landowners contained numerous errors, and this was pointed out in my comments. Adequate notice of the intention to install and operate a WWTF was not given to all affected landowners.

The WWTF Permit Application was filed at the Ennis Public Library for a period of only 30 days and then discarded as being "out of date" before the comment period ended. It has been the ONLY document received at the Ennis Public Library and displayed for public viewing. Even though notice was mailed to the affected landowners and commenters that a draft permit was being issued, no permit application, no Executive Director's Preliminary Decision, and no draft permit were made available for public viewing at the Ennis Library as stated in the Notice issued on July 22, 2022.

I have not yet received a response to comments made for WQ0016103001, and the lack of timeliness makes it very difficult to know what comments are valid for Petition D-08222022-044.

Due to these notification issues, TCEQ should consider denying or rescinding the final approval of WQ0016103001.

The only notices made to the public for Petition D-08222-022-044 was published in "Ennis News" on Sundays, December 4 and 11. As of December 20, 2022, no document of any kind for the Shankle Road MUD is at the Ennis Library for public view during this comment period. Adequate notice of the intention to form a Shankle Road MUD and information has not been provided.

Per Section 54, the Applicant has not demonstrated that the creation of the District will not have a negative effect on natural run-off rates and drainage. In fact, run-off and drainage from the District will increase substantially and have a negative impact on downstream landowners. My own calculations using the EPA National Stormwater Calculator shows that runoff will increase from 13% on the current property to 68% on the property if developed as proposed with a housing density of approximately five homes per acre (see Exhibit 1). The Applicant should prepare and make available reports on how the current natural run-off rate will be affected, where the excess run-off will be diverted for discharge, and the expected run-off rates. In addition, the Applicant plans to discharge a WWTF stream of up to average 500,000 gallons per day through the same channel as used for storm drainage. The Applicant has not demonstrated that this combined flow will not produce a negative impact on downstream landowners. In fact, it is expected to cause excessive erosion through the existing natural flow path which is currently only an uneroded, well-vegetated depression, causing loss of acreage and ability to perform ranching operations.

The proposed District is situated on unimproved land which has not been heavily grazed, plowed or otherwise disturbed; it is likely that you would find the big five of the native prairie grasses of the Kachina Prairie on this property (switchgrass, big bluestem, little bluestem, indiangrass and sideoats grama). These grasses all can be found in isolated areas and roadsides within one mile of the District, but are increasingly rare and should be protected or relocated to a prairie preserve.

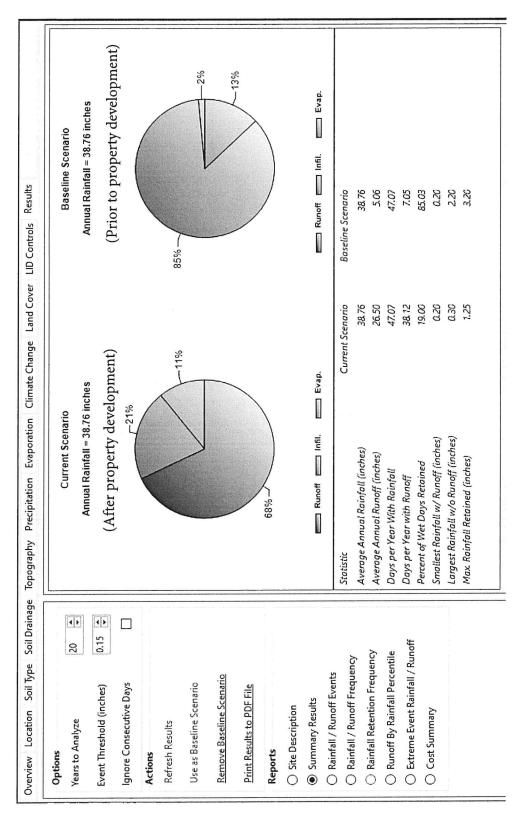


Exhibit 1: Runoff after property development of 1106 Shankle Rd. versus baseline (natural unimproved land).

PROPERTY DESCRIPTION:

Our property is located at 1013 Shankle Road, directly across Shankle Road from the Selinger property and downstream of the proposed stormwater and treated wastewater stream discharge point, see Exhibit A. Our family has lived on and farmed the property since 1908.

The creation of this Utility District uniquely and adversely affects us in the following ways:

According to Section 11.086 of the Texas Water Code, no person may divert or impound the
natural flow of surface waters in this state, or permit a diversion or impounding by him to
continue, in a manner that damages the property of another by the overflow of the water
diverted or impounded.

The Unnamed Tributary (Exhibit B, photo 1) is a normally dry, vegetated depression that travels in a southerly direction until it joins Four-Mile Creek, which is also a normally dry, vegetated swale (Exhibit B, photo 2). Storm water currently collects on the north side of Shankle Road and then flows through a 4' diameter culvert located in front of the Selinger property. It travels over our pastureland, joins with Four-Mile Creek, and crosses under Trojacek Road via a 6' diameter culvert. The land gradient is approximately 0.5% and the soil is heavy clay, making drainage slow and creating a large floodplain (Exhibit B, photo 3, several hours post storm). Land use is for cattle grazing.

Selinger's property is currently raw land well-vegetated with grasses, forbs and trees. A 181-acre housing development with a density of five homes per acre will greatly increase storm runoff. Estimated results using the EPA National Stormwater Calculator show that runoff is 13% from the unimproved land and will increase to 68% runoff after the development is built out as planned. In addition, the proposed MUD's Wastewater Treatment Facility will discharge an average of 500,000 gallons daily when at full capacity into the Unnamed Tributary.

Pouzar Contested Hearing Request

This housing development will alter the historical surface water drainage pattern by increasing runoff and adding a treated wastewater stream, which will damage our property in these ways:

- a) The flood plain downstream of the development district will enlarge and affect property use and value. Before any changes are made that affect existing drainage flow rates, a detailed hydrology study should be conducted to ensure that our structures will not be flooded.
- b) The grassy swales that are Unnamed Tributary and Four-Mile Creek will become heavily eroded due to the continuous moisture and increased flows. The erosion will undermine existing fencing. The erosion and continuous flow will divide the grazing land in two and cattle will not be able to cross the eroded and flowing tributary, resulting in loss of grazing acreage. In addition, as ranchers, we will not be able to cross the creek either. The flow and erosion will cause hardship in maintaining fence and pastureland, resulting in rancher's expense to construct new fenced areas and elevated crossings to enable rotation of cattle for grazing.
- c) Twenty-one pecan trees are planted on either side of Four-Mile Creek, the flow path, that take advantage of frequent floods for natural irrigation. Harvesting of the pecans for human consumption will be affected, as treated wastewater cannot be used for irrigation of food crops.
- d) Our stock tank collects stormwater from the current drainage through the Unnamed Tributary, and it is used for fishing and watering cattle. We are concerned that the discharge from the MUD will damage the integrity of the dam and prevent consumption of fish from the pond.
- e) The flow path crosses over a 20" natural gas pipeline and erosion will expose this pipeline and its adjacent cathodic protection system (Exhibit B, photo 4), requiring mitigation on our property by pipeline owner Energy Transfer.
- f) The increased flow and housing will greatly increase the amount of trash and debris that is carried onto our grazing land. Curious cattle are not discriminatory about what they eat and we will expect to experience cattle deaths due to their ingesting garbage that is carried onto our property during the construction phase and afterwards. If this district petition is approved, we will need to immediately replace the electric fencing with a new 6-strand barbed wire fence with gates and trash rack along Shankle Road that will prevent trash from washing and blowing into the pasture (cost estimated to be \$20,000).
- 2. Our neighborhood is serviced by local Volunteer Fire Departments which will do not have resources to adequately protect a neighborhood of dense housing, in addition to the many square miles of housing and acreage currently protected. The preliminary plat ignores fire protection and does not include a fire station. Existing resources will not be available if more than one structure or location requires emergency assistance at any time.

The Petitioner's preliminary plat shows two entrances spaced 220-feet apart, both accessed from the single-lane Shankle Road. Both entrance roads cross the gas pipeline, so in event of a pipeline emergency, there can be no evacuation from the neighborhood nor will there be access for emergency vehicle entry. The Petitioner should submit an emergency response plan for review and approval.

The Petitioner is a residential property developer and has not demonstrated that he is experienced in the operation and maintenance of wastewater systems/treatment facilities. Ellis County has regulations in place for rural areas not served by centralized wastewater facilities that limit the smallest lot size to 1 acre, with each home having an individual septic system, which is in keeping with the rural atmosphere, but would still allow for the construction of about 150 homes with no off-site discharge of treated wastewater.

Shankle is a single-lane, chip-and-seal road that sees little traffic. At last count there are only 24 homes on all of Shankle Road, so adding another 811 will drastically change our quiet country life into a city life, adding noise, traffic, crowds, litter, and all the other negatives that we avoid by living here. If we wanted a city life, we'd live in the city. We suggest that this property and any other located within the County's jurisdiction be developed using the reasonable local standards which protect our quality of life and respect the existing neighbors' property rights.

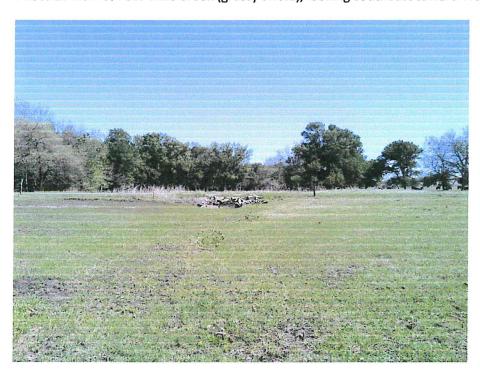


Photo 3: Typical flooding of Pouzar property

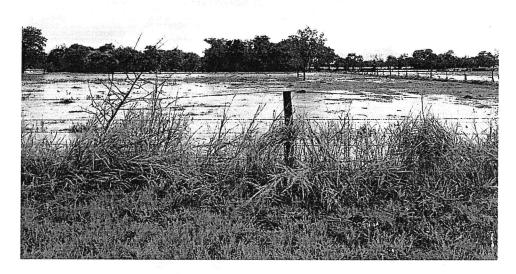
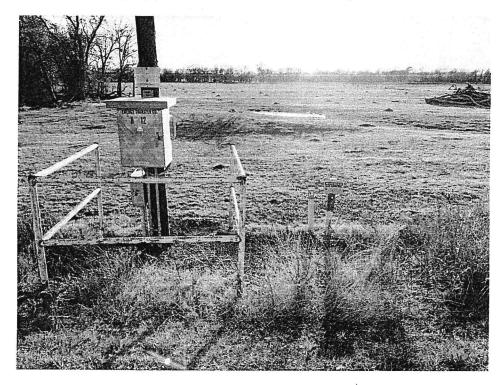


Photo 4: Natural gas pipeline and cathodic protection system at Shankle Road

Thank you for hosting the informative public meeting for the Shankle Road WWTP permit application held on Thursday, April 27th.

During the question portion of the meeting, I had asked a question concerning the location of the Applicant's proposed Outfall, which was ambiguous in the application documents. I also noted that the location of the receiving tributary was incorrect in the application documents.

After the public meeting's conclusion, I spoke briefly with Brittany Lee, aquatic scientist from the Water Quality Division. Brittany showed me the copy of the application that she had brought with her. Brittany's copy held a <u>revised</u> copy of the Affected Landowner's Map that I had never seen before. The map had been corrected to show the correct locations of the Outfall and the receiving Unnamed Tributary and corrected affected landowner list.

Yesterday I visited the Ennis Public Library to see if any updated information had arrived there. The applicant's environmental engineer had reissued original Revision 0 of the application and preliminary permit that had already been issued in 2022. I have attached the transmittal letter received at the library on March 1, 2023, as well as the unrevised Affected Landowner Map page within the document.

Why were we not given access to a <u>revised</u> copy of the WWTP application prior to the Public Meeting? My questions and comments would have been different had up-to-date information been available prior to the Public Meeting.

Is it possible that your office can scan a copy of the revised application package and draft permit (if also revised) and email it to me? Even though the comment period has ended, I and others would like to have the latest information available.

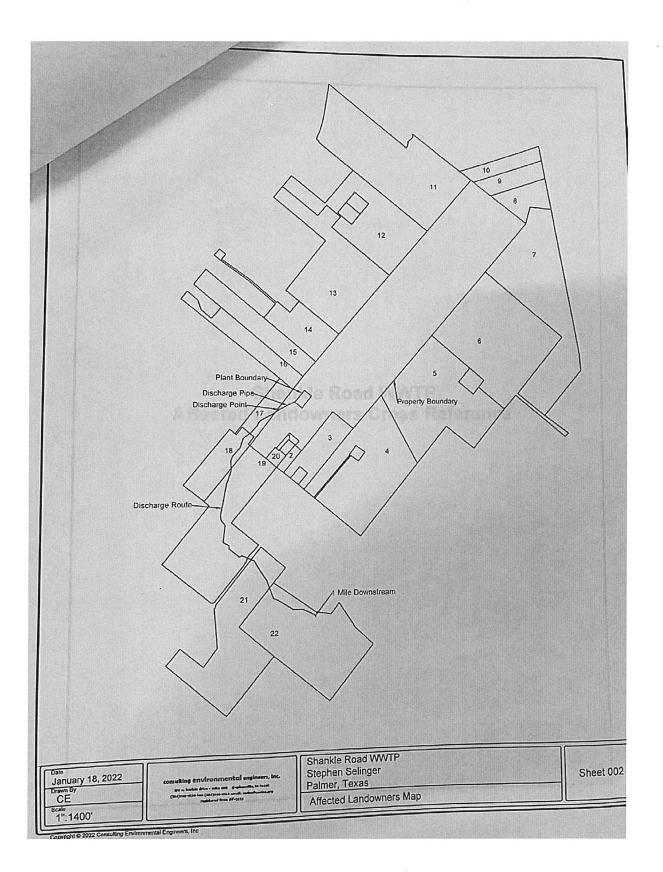

Being that the proposed site of this Utility District is directly NE from my homestead, with no wind block, the probability of putrid smells and odors from the sewer treatment plant, with the amount of wind out here, is unacceptable. The submitted plans by the petitioner, Steve Selinger, are inadequate for the proposed development particularly considering the possibility/probability of additional developments that could be added to the District at a later date. The amount of land is insufficient for a project of this magnitude, and an Extensive Environmental Impact Study regarding the effects of the excessive sewer water that will be generated by this development as well as the effects of contamination to the crops downstream is demanded.
- 2. The majority of the land in this proposed Utility District is currently and has historically been a habitat for wildlife. In this area, ducks, geese, waterfowl are regularly seen. The vast ponds, trees and brush cover are used by the wildlife and the natural vegetation is a roosting area for migratory and local bird populations. This habitat provides protection for wildlife from heat, drought and heavy rain. This habitat will not be relocated, but destroyed by the developer, which will also forcibly relocate the large number of coyotes, bobcast, hogs and other predators to surrounding properties, unduly burdening the landowners, such as myself, with having to provide additional protection for chickens, ducks, geese, pets and livestock. MEMORANDUM OPINION

Before Justices Bridges, Whitehill, and Nowell Opinion by Justice Whitehill

This is an appeal from an order sustaining the City of McKinney's plea to the jurisdiction and dismissing appellants' lawsuit.

Appellants are Nancy L. Dail, who owns land in the City's extraterritorial jurisdiction, and Stephen Richard Selinger, a would-be developer of that land. They sued the City, alleging that the City unlawfully denied Selinger's subdivision plat application because he wouldn't agree to pay a sum certain (roughly \$482,000) if the City ever extended its water and sewer lines to the subdivision. Appellants

asserted several claims, but their main thrust is that the City's conduct constituted an uncompensated regulatory taking of their property. The City's plea to the jurisdiction challenged appellants' pleadings on several grounds, chief among them lack of ripeness and, as to Selinger, lack of standing. On appeal, the City has added a mootness challenge.

As to ripeness, we conclude that the appellants pled enough facts to constitute an exaction—a governmental demand for action as a condition of permitting a proposed development—that is ripe for challenge in a takings lawsuit.

As to standing, we conclude that appellants pled enough facts to show that the denial of Selinger's plat after he spent money to prepare and submit it is an injury that is actual, concrete, and particularized enough to give him standing to sue.

As to mootness, we conclude that the submission of a new plat application by a nonparty limited liability company does not affect or obviate the injuries alleged by appellants in this lawsuit, even if the company is controlled by Selinger. Thus, this case is not moot.

We generally agree with appellants on their other issues as well. Appellants do not challenge the dismissal as to one specific request for attorney's fees, so we affirm the dismissal to that extent but otherwise reverse and remand for further proceedings.

I. BACKGROUND

A. Factual Allegations

We draw these allegations from appellants' live pleading:

Dail owns a tract of land situated entirely within Collin County and the City's extraterritorial jurisdiction (ETJ). Selinger contracted to buy that tract for development.¹

Selinger proposed to subdivide the tract into approximately 331 lots, and he submitted his plan to City authorities. The City's water and sewer services don't serve that part of its ETJ, and the City has no plans to extend those services to it. Accordingly, Selinger's development plan included construction of necessary sewer infrastructure including a package plant. Selinger also reached an agreement with the North Collin Special Utility District to supply water to the subdivision. These were permanent solutions to the subdivision's water and sewer needs.²

Appellants alleged that Selinger's plat complied with all City standards except the requirement to pay an exaction³ and connect to City water and sewer facilities. While attempting to negotiate a facilities agreement, the parties reached an impasse

¹ Although appellants pled that Selinger had "a legally binding contract to purchase the property," their counsel conceded at oral argument that it was an option contract.

² At oral argument, the City took the position that it had the power to compel the subdivision to use the City's water and thus that its developer had no legal right to obtain water elsewhere. But this argument was not part of the City's jurisdictional plea or raised in the City's appellate briefs, so we do not address it.

³ An exaction occurs if a governmental entity requires an action by a landowner as a condition to obtaining government approval of a requested land development. *City of Carrollton v. RIHR Inc.*, 308 S.W.3d 444, 449 (Tex. App.—Dallas 2010, pet. denied); *see also infra* at Part IV.B.1.

over the City's insistence that Selinger pay the City about \$482,000 if and when the City's water and sewer transmission lines were extended to the development.

Because Selinger would not agree to the \$482,000 fee, the City Council denied Selinger's plat application.

B. Procedural History

Ten days after the City Council denied Selinger's application, Selinger sued the City.

The City answered and included a plea to the jurisdiction.

Dail joined the case as a plaintiff in the first amended petition. Appellants filed three more amended petitions, and their fourth amended petition was their live pleading when the trial court rendered final judgment.

Their live pleading asserted six counts: (i) inverse condemnation and/or unconstitutional taking, (ii) taking under Government Code Chapter 2007, (iii) declaratory judgment that the City's subdivision ordinance was unconstitutional and violated Local Government Code § 212.904, (iv) violation of Local Government Code § 212.904, (v) appeal under Local Government Code § 212.904, and (vi) due process violations.

The City answered appellants' fourth amended petition and again included a plea to the jurisdiction. The City also filed a brief supporting its plea. Appellants responded to that brief.

After a hearing, the trial judge granted the City's plea and dismissed the lawsuit "with prejudice for want of subject matter jurisdiction." Appellants timely appealed.

C. Postjudgment Events

The City's appellate brief asserts that the same day appellants filed their notice of appeal they also submitted a new subdivision plat that was substantially the same as the old one except that it did not request any variances, it agreed to comply with the City's water and sewer connection requirements, and it agreed to pay required impact fees. The City further asserts that these developments moot the appeal.

Appellants' reply brief disputes the City's mootness argument, arguing that the City's own supporting appendix shows that the new subdivision application was submitted by Norhill Energy LLC.

The City submitted a supplemental brief with evidence attached purporting to show that Selinger is a manager of Norhill Energy LLC. Appellants also submitted a supplemental brief.

II. ISSUES PRESENTED

The "Issues Presented" section of appellants' opening brief recites that "[s]everal issues are presented, including the following" It then recites four issues. However, the City's jurisdictional plea presented seven arguments, and the argument section of appellants' opening brief addresses each of them under a

separate heading. Focusing on appellants' argument, we construe their brief to raise the following seven issues:

- 1. Appellants' claims were ripe.
- 2. Selinger had standing to sue.
- 3. The City failed to show a jurisdictional defect regarding appellants' Government Code Chapter 2007 claims.
- 4. The City failed to show a jurisdictional defect regarding appellants' federal takings claims.
- 5. The City failed to show a jurisdictional defect regarding appellants' Local Government Code § 212.904 claims.
- 6. Appellants are entitled to avail themselves of the Declaratory Judgments Act's attorney's fee provisions.
- 7. The City failed to show a jurisdictional defect regarding appellants' due process claims.

III. STANDARD OF REVIEW

We review an order granting a jurisdictional plea de novo. *See Tex. Dep't of Parks & Wildlife v. Miranda*, 133 S.W.3d 217, 228 (Tex. 2004).

The City's plea was a pleadings challenge. Thus, we construe the pleadings liberally in appellants' favor and look to their intent. *See id.* at 226. If the pleadings don't contain sufficient facts to affirmatively demonstrate the trial court's jurisdiction but also don't affirmatively demonstrate incurable jurisdictional defects, "the issue is one of pleading sufficiency and the plaintiffs should be afforded the opportunity to amend." *Id.* at 226–27. If the pleadings affirmatively negate

jurisdiction, then a jurisdictional plea may be granted without allowing the plaintiffs an opportunity to amend. *Id.* at 227.

IV. ANALYSIS

A. Jurisdictional Challenges, Generally

Jurisdiction means a court's power, under the constitution and laws, to determine a dispute's merits and render judgment. *Ysasaga v. Nationwide Mut. Ins.*Co., 279 S.W.3d 858, 864 (Tex. App.—Dallas 2009, pet. denied); see also Univ. of Tex. Sw. Med. Ctr. at Dallas v. Loutzenhiser, 140 S.W.3d 351, 359 (Tex. 2004) ("The failure of a jurisdictional requirement deprives the court of the power to act (other than to determine that it has no jurisdiction), and ever to have acted, as a matter of law.").

Before a court may proceed to resolve a case's merits, it must have jurisdiction over (i) the parties or the property at issue, (ii) the suit's subject matter, (iii) authority to enter the requested judgment; and (iv) capacity to act as a court. *Miranda*, 133 S.W.3d at 226 (citing *State Bar of Tex. v. Gomez* 891 S.W.2d 243, 245 (Tex. 1994)). Although there are some instances where questions concerning a court's jurisdiction and the case's merits are intertwined, *see id.* at 230, a court ordinarily must not proceed on a case's merits until legitimate challenges to its jurisdiction are decided, *id.* at 228.

This case involves an array of subject matter jurisdiction challenges concerning the justiciability of Selinger's and Dail's claims. Justiciability includes

the mootness, standing, and ripeness doctrines. See Patterson v. Planned Parenthood of Houston & Se. Tex., Inc., 971 S.W.2d 439, 442 (Tex. 1998).

These jurisdictional justiciability doctrines arise from the constitutional separation of powers rule against courts' rendering advisory opinions. *Id.* at 442–43. Stated differently, to avoid issuing unconstitutional advisory opinions, courts must first determine that the subject claims present a non-advisory, justiciable controversy.

The City asserts all three justiciability doctrines here. Although much of the parties' debate concerns the case's underlying merits, we can resolve all three of the City's subject matter jurisdiction challenges without reaching the case's merits, over which we express no opinions. For the reasons explained below, none of the City's challenges defeats the trial court's or our power to determine Selinger's and Dail's substantive claims.

B. Issue One: Did appellants plead ripe takings claims?

Yes. They alleged that the City denied Selinger's plat because he refused to agree to a contingent \$482,000 payment as a condition of plat approval. Those facts amount to an exaction, so appellants' takings claims were ripe.

This section discusses ripeness and not standing, which we discuss later in Part IV.C.

1. The Law of Ripeness and Exaction Takings

Ripeness is a component of subject matter jurisdiction. Sw. Elec. Power Co. v. Lynch, 595 S.W.3d 678, 682 (Tex. 2020). Ripeness concerns whether the facts are sufficiently developed so that an injury has occurred or is likely to occur rather than being contingent or remote. Id. at 683. If a claimant's injury is based on hypothetical facts or events that haven't happened yet, the case isn't ripe, and the court lacks subject matter jurisdiction. Id.

Under the federal and Texas constitutions, the government must compensate a property owner for taking his property for a public use. *See* U.S. CONST. amends. V, XIV; Tex. Const. art. I, § 17.

The government commits a "regulatory taking" if it imposes restrictions that either deny a property owner all economically viable use of his property or unreasonably interfere with his right to use and enjoy his property. *City of Carrollton v. RIHR Inc.*, 308 S.W.3d 444, 449 (Tex. App.—Dallas 2010, pet. denied).

And a distinct kind of regulatory taking occurs when the government conditions approval of a permit or some other type of approval on an exaction from the property owner. *Id.* Specifically, an exaction occurs if a governmental entity requires an action by a landowner as a condition to obtaining government approval of a requested land development. *Id.*

An exaction is a compensable taking unless the government imposed condition (i) bears an essential nexus to substantially advancing some legitimate government interest and (ii) is roughly proportional to the proposed development's proposed impact. *Town of Flower Mound v. Stafford Estates Ltd. P'ship*, 135 S.W.3d 620, 634 (Tex. 2004). In *Town of Flower Mound*, for example, the supreme court held that a potentially compensable exaction occurred when a town conditioned plat approval on the developer's rebuilding a nearby road at its expense. *Id.* at 623–24, 634–43.

Moreover, an exaction can occur even if the owner refuses to agree to the condition. In *City of Carrollton*, the city refused to issue building permits unless the property owner reimbursed the city about \$40,000 for repairing a collapsed retaining wall not located on the owner's property. 308 S.W.3d at 446–48. Instead of paying, the owner sued the city for an unconstitutional taking and won. *Id.* at 448. We rejected the city's argument that no exaction occurs if the property owner doesn't acquiesce in the condition, reasoning that the exaction is the government's demand of some fee, reward, or other compensation by the landowner. *Id.* at 450–51; *see also Koontz v. St. Johns River Water Mgmt. Dist.*, 570 U.S. 595, 612, 619 (2013) ("monetary exactions" must satisfy nexus and proportionality requirements even when government ultimately denies the permit).

2. Applying the Law to the Facts

The City argues that appellants' claims aren't ripe because (i) the \$482,000 fee has not been imposed and (ii) even if Selinger approved the facilities agreement he would not have to pay the \$482,000 unless and until the City extends its water and sewer lines to the property. Appellants argue that they were injured, and their claims ripened, when the City denied Selinger's plat because he wouldn't agree to pay \$482,000 in the event City water and sewer lines were built to the property.

We agree with appellants.

As we have said, an exaction occurs if a governmental entity requires a land owner to take an action as a condition to obtaining government approval for a requested land development. *City of Carrollton*, 308 S.W.3d at 449.

Logically, any demand for an action the land owner is not already legally required to take might qualify as an exaction. *See id.* at 451 (noting that one meaning of "exaction" is "A fee, reward, *or other compensation* arbitrarily or wrongfully demanded") (emphasis supplied; other emphasis omitted). The definition of exaction is broad enough to include a demand that the owner assume a contingent liability. And we find no cases holding a government's demand for land owner action qualifies as an exaction only if the demand is for a present monetary payment or land dedication. Thus, we conclude that demanding Selinger's commitment to pay \$482,000 under certain circumstances—a commitment that would be recorded against the property (according to appellants' pleading)—as a condition of plat

approval constituted an exaction and a sufficient injury for ripeness purposes even though the demanded payment was contingent rather than definite.

We sustain appellants' first issue.4

C. Issue Two: Did Selinger adequately plead standing?

Yes, because he pled that the City caused him actual, concrete, and particularized injuries in the form of his allegedly unlawfully denied plat and the money he spent to prepare and submit it.

1. Applicable Law

Standing, like ripeness, is a threshold issue implicating subject matter jurisdiction. *Patterson v. Planned Parenthood of Houston & Se. Tex., Inc.*, 971 S.W.2d 439, 442 (Tex. 1998). Ripeness examines when an action may be brought, while standing focuses on who may bring an action. *Id*.

The general test for standing is whether there is a real controversy between the parties that will be actually be determined by the judicial declaration sought. *Tex. Ass'n of Bus. v. Tex. Air Control Bd.*, 852 S.W.2d 440, 446 (Tex. 1993). Unless a statute confers standing, the plaintiff generally must show that he possesses an interest in the conflict distinct from the general public's interest, such that the defendant's actions have caused the plaintiff some particular injury. *Williams v. Lara*, 52 S.W.3d 171, 178 (Tex. 2001). That is, "[f]or standing, a plaintiff must be

⁴ Appellants' first issue also asks us to grant a summary judgment motion that they filed but the trial court never ruled on. We decline.

personally aggrieved; his alleged injury must be concrete and particularized, actual or imminent, not hypothetical." *DaimlerChrysler Corp. v. Inman*, 252 S.W.3d 299, 304–05 (Tex. 2008) (footnotes omitted).

"A plaintiff does not lack standing simply because he cannot prevail on the merits of his claim; he lacks standing because his claim of injury is too slight for a court to afford redress." *Id.* at 305; *accord Farmers Tex. Cty. Mut. Ins. Co. v. Beasley*, 598 S.W.3d 237, 241 (Tex. 2020) ("[T]he mere fact that a plaintiff may ultimately not prevail on the merits of the lawsuit does not deprive the plaintiff of standing.").

2. Applying the Law to the Facts

The question is whether appellants' live pleading alleges facts that, if true, show an actual controversy between Selinger and the City in the sense that the City has caused him a particular injury that sets him apart from the general public. A commonsense reading of appellants' live pleading shows that the answer is yes.

Appellants alleged that Selinger possessed multiple rights that were impaired, diminished, or nullified by the City's "unlawful actions." Specifically, they alleged that Selinger was injured in (i) his rights under his contract with Dail, (ii) his right to have the City consider his subdivision application without violating the state or federal constitutions, and (iii) his expenses incurred in the form of application fees and engineering, planning, and legal costs. Setting aside the merits of Selinger's

claims, which are not before us in a standing inquiry, these are concrete and particularized injuries sufficient to survive a pleadings challenge.

The City, however, argues that (i) Selinger has only an option to buy Dail's land and (ii) an option contract isn't sufficient to confer standing under two Texas appellate decisions. *See City of Harlingen v. Obra Homes, Inc.*, No. 13-02-268-CV, 2005 WL 74121 (Tex. App.—Corpus Christi–Edinburg Jan. 13, 2005, no pet.) (mem. op.); *Chambers Cty. v. TSP Dev., Ltd.*, 63 S.W.3d 835 (Tex. App.—Houston [14th Dist.] 2001, pet. denied). We conclude, however, that those cases are distinguishable.

The *Chambers County* case involved claims under the Private Real Property Rights Preservation Act, Texas Government Code Chapter 2007. 63 S.W.3d at 837. That statute limits standing to property owners who possess "legal or equitable title," and the court of appeals held that a potential buyer under an option contract did not qualify as an "owner." *Id.* at 840. Here, however, appellants pled that Selinger had "a legally binding contract to purchase the property" and pled no facts suggesting he held only an option contract. Given this case's posture, our analysis is limited to the pleadings. Thus, *Chambers County* is distinguishable.⁵

The *City of Harlingen* case is also distinguishable. Developer Obra Homes had an option to buy some undeveloped land and attempted to have that land rezoned

⁵ However, appellants admitted at oral argument that Selinger's contract was in fact an option contract, so this issue could be revisited in the trial court.

for single family homes. However, its rezoning efforts failed, the option contract expired, and Obra Homes never acquired the property. Nevertheless, Obra Homes sued the City of Harlingen on takings and due process claims, and it obtained a judgment against the city after a jury trial. On appeal, the court of appeals held that Obra Homes lacked standing to sue, but only after concluding from the pleadings and trial record that Obra Homes had sued *solely* for loss of use and enjoyment of the property itself—not for injuries to its earnest money contract or expenses in seeking rezoning. 2005 WL 74121, at *4–5. Accordingly, the court of appeals considered only whether Obra Homes had standing to sue for a taking of the real property itself, and because Obra Homes held only an option the court held it did not. *Id.* at *4–5, 8.

Here, by contrast, Selinger has claimed that the City injured his rights in his plat application and the money he spent to prepare and submit the application, not just property rights in the property itself. For standing purposes, the question is not whether these are recoverable damages items on the merits but only whether Selinger has alleged a concrete, particularized injury from the City's conduct. *See DaimlerChrysler Corp.*, 252 S.W.3d at 304–05 (test for standing); *see also City of Carrollton*, 308 S.W.3d at 452–54 (upholding award of expenses incurred during exaction period). Selinger's allegation that the City unlawfully denied his plat after

he incurred expenses in preparing and submitting it asserts a concrete and particularized injury. We conclude it suffices to give him standing.⁶

We sustain appellants' second issue.

D. Issue Three: Did appellants plead sufficient facts to satisfy Government Code § 2007.003?

Yes. The City concedes as much in its appellee's brief.

Appellants pled statutory claims under Government Code Chapter 2007, also known as the Private Real Property Rights Preservation Act. *See Chambers Cty.*, 63 S.W.3d at 837. Chapter 2007 provides that sovereign immunity to suit and liability is waived to the extent of liability created under that chapter. Tex. Gov't Code § 2007.004(a). However, as to municipalities, Chapter 2007 applies only to an action "that has effect in the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the municipality, excluding annexation, and that enacts or enforces an ordinance, rule, regulation, or plan that does not impose identical requirements or restrictions in the entire extraterritorial jurisdiction of the municipality." *Id.* § 2007.003(a)(3), (b)(1).

In its jurisdictional plea, the City argued that jurisdiction was lacking over appellants' Chapter 2007 claims because the City imposes the same restrictions throughout its ETJ. However, appellants correctly argue that their live pleading expressly alleged that the City does not impose its restrictions uniformly, naming

⁶ Given our disposition, we express no opinion whether an option holder has standing to assert a takings claim based solely on his rights in the property itself.

another property in the ETJ that allegedly did not have the same requirements imposed on it.⁷ The City's appellate brief concedes that this is sufficient to defeat this ground in the City's jurisdictional plea. We agree.

We sustain appellants' third issue.

E. Issue Four: Did appellants plead sufficient facts to show that their federal takings claims are ripe?

Yes. The City concedes that appellants' federal takings claims are ripe based on recent Supreme Court authority. *See Sw. Elec. Power Co.*, 595 S.W.3d at 682 (ripeness is a component of subject matter jurisdiction).

The City's jurisdictional plea argued that appellants' federal takings claims were not ripe because Texas state law provides an adequate procedure for seeking just compensation—specifically, an inverse condemnation action under Texas Constitution article I, § 17. For support, the City relied on authorities grounded in a subsequently overruled Supreme Court's decision. *See Williamson Cty. Reg'l Planning Comm'n v. Hamilton Bank of Johnson City*, 473 U.S. 172 (1985), overruled by Knick v. Township of Scott, Pa., 139 S. Ct. 2162 (2019).

Knick holds that a property owner has an actionable Fifth Amendment takings claim when the government takes his property without paying for it and that he need

⁷ Appellants assert both that their pleading was sufficient to satisfy § 2007.003 and that the City's argument goes to the merits rather than to jurisdiction. We express no opinion regarding the latter premise.

not first obtain a state court denial of a state law just compensation claim. 139 S. Ct. at 2167–68. The City concedes that its position is untenable in *Knick*'s wake.

Appellants agree that their federal claim is ripe under *Knick*, although they also argue that the Texas Supreme Court already allowed federal takings claims to proceed alongside state claims. *See Town of Flower Mound*, 135 S.W.3d at 646 (indicating that federal and state claims may be brought in the same action).

Because we agree with the parties that appellants' federal takings claims are ripe, we sustain appellants' fourth issue.

F. Issue Five: Did appellants plead sufficient facts to show jurisdiction over their Local Government Code § 212.904 claims?

Yes. Appellants pled sufficient facts to make out § 212.904 claims and declaratory judgment claims that the City's subdivision ordinance is invalid under the Texas Constitution and § 212.904.

1. Additional Background

We begin with the statute. Texas Local Government Code § 212.904 is entitled "Apportionment of Municipal Infrastructure Costs." Tex. Loc. Gov't Code § 212.904. The statute establishes these rules and procedures:

• If a municipality requires as a condition of approving a property development project that a developer must bear some of the costs of municipal infrastructure improvements, "the developer's portion of the costs may not exceed the amount required for infrastructure improvements that are roughly proportionate to the proposed development as approved by a professional engineer who holds a license issued under Chapter 1001, Occupations Code, and is retained by the municipality." *Id.* § 212.904(a).

- If the developer disputes the determination made under § 212.904(a), it may appeal to the municipality's governing body, which shall make its determination within thirty days after the developer finishes presenting any testimony or other evidence. *Id.* § 212.904(b).
- If the developer disputes the governing body's determination, it may appeal that determination to county or district court within thirty days. *Id.* § 212.904(c).
- A developer who prevails in a § 212.904 appeal is entitled to recover costs and reasonable attorney's fees, including expert witness fees. *Id.* § 212.904(e).
- A municipality may not require a developer to waive its right to a § 212.904 appeal as a condition of approving a development project. *Id.* § 212.904(d).

Next, we summarize appellants' § 212.904 claims.

First, count three sought a declaratory judgment that the City's subdivision ordinance, on which the proposed facilities agreement was predicated, was invalid under the Texas Constitution and Local Government Code § 212.904.

Second, count four alleged that the City violated § 212.904(a) "by failing to make the determination" required by that subsection and thus prevented appellants from appealing to the City Council under § 212.904(b). They sought a judgment that (i) the City's \$482,000 demand was not roughly proportionate and (ii) awarded them costs and attorney's fees under § 212.904(e).

Third, in count five they alleged in the alternative that the City Council's denial of Selinger's plat was a ruling on a § 212.904(b) appeal and this lawsuit should be treated as a § 212.904(c) appeal of that ruling's rough proportionality

determination. They again sought a judgment that the City's \$482,000 demand was not roughly proportionate and a recovery of costs and attorney's fees under \$212.904(e).

The City's jurisdictional plea asserted the following:

The court does not have subject matter jurisdiction over Plaintiffs' declaratory judgment claims seeking an interpretation of Texas Local Government Code Section 212.904 . . . as Plaintiffs have asserted no viable claim under Section 212.904, and have asserted no appeal under Section 212.904, which appeal is required in order to invoke the provisions of Section 212.904. As Plaintiffs have failed to exhaust their administrative remedies under Section 212.904, this court lacks jurisdiction to hear such claims at this time.

The City's appellee's brief clarifies that it intended to assert two points: (i) appellants failed to state a § 212.904 claim and (ii) appellants failed to exhaust administrative remedies by appealing under § 212.904(c).

2. Applying the Law to the Facts

a. Declaratory Judgment Claims (Count Three)

Although appellants' briefing is sketchy, it sufficiently argues that they pled declaratory judgment claims that the City's subdivision ordinance is invalid because it violates the Texas Constitution and Local Government Code § 212.904.8 See St. John Missionary Baptist Church v. Flakes, 595 S.W.3d 211, 213–14 (Tex. 2020) (per curiam) (appellate courts should be reluctant to conclude that issues are waived for inadequate briefing). A claim that an ordinance is invalid is cognizable under

⁸ Appellants do not dispute that the City's "failure to plead a viable § 212.904 claim" argument is jurisdictional, so we assume without deciding that it is.

the Declaratory Judgments Act. See Tex. Civ. Prac. & Rem. Code §§ 37.004(a), 37.006(b).

We conclude that appellants sufficiently pled a declaratory judgment claim challenging the City's subdivision ordinance's validity.

b. Claims for § 212.904 Relief (Counts Four and Five)

As to counts four and five, appellants argue that these are pleadings in the alternative: either (i) the City violated § 212.904(a) because the \$482,000 demand was not approved by a professional engineer as roughly proportionate to the proposed development (count four) or (ii) if the demand was approved by a professional engineer, this lawsuit is an appeal of the City Council's determination adhering to that demand (count five). They further argue that they pled sufficient facts to show subject matter jurisdiction over these claims.⁹

The City responds that appellants haven't pled enough facts to make out a § 212.904 claim or show administrative exhaustion because they didn't plead that they actually requested an appeal before the City Council or received a determination from the City Council sufficient to support a judicial appeal under § 212.904(c).

We agree with appellants. Appellants have pled that the City Council's decision denying the plat because Selinger wouldn't agree to the \$482,000 contingent payment was the Council's determination of appellants' appeal and was

⁹ Appellants do not dispute that compliance with § 212.904's procedures is a jurisdictional prerequisite, so we assume without deciding that it is.

erroneous because it was either (i) made without the required engineer's approval under § 212.904(a) or (ii) exceeded an amount roughly proportionate to the proposed development. Section 212.904 does not require any particular procedure for an appeal to the municipality's governing body, nor does it prescribe a specific form for that body's appealable determination. *See* Loc. Gov't Code § 212.904(b), (c); *cf. Mira Mar Dev. Corp. v. City of Coppell, Tex.*, 421 S.W.3d 74, 80–81 (Tex. App.—Dallas 2013, pet. denied) (describing § 212.904 procedures used in that case). We find no authority showing that appellants' alleged facts don't satisfy § 212.904. We conclude that appellants adequately pled facts showing jurisdiction over counts four and five.

3. Conclusion

We sustain appellants' fifth issue.

G. Issue Six: Did appellants plead facts showing jurisdiction over their claims for attorney's fees under the Declaratory Judgments Act?

Yes. As discussed above regarding issue five, appellants sufficiently pled declaratory judgment claims seeking to invalidate the City's subdivision ordinance.

The City's jurisdictional plea included a broad assertion that the trial court lacked jurisdiction over all of appellants' claims for attorney's fees, regardless of the legal theory, because (i) Texas Constitution Article I, § 17 doesn't authorize a fee recovery and (ii) appellants invoked the Declaratory Judgments Act solely as a vehicle to recover attorney's fees.

Appellants don't dispute that fees aren't recoverable for a Texas Constitution takings claim, so we affirm the dismissal as to those fees.

However, appellants argue that they properly invoked the Declaratory Judgments Act, which authorizes the trial court to award fees. *See* TEX. CIV. PRAC. & REM. CODE § 37.009. Specifically, they argue that they invoked § 37.004(a) to test the City's subdivision regulations on which the City based its exaction from appellants.

The City repeats its trial court argument that appellants' declaratory judgment claims are improper because they afford appellants no greater remedy than their substantive takings claims.¹⁰ See City of Carrollton, 308 S.W.3d at 454–55.

We agree with appellants. Their live pleading included declaratory judgment claims seeking to invalidate the City's subdivision ordinance as invalid under the Texas Constitution and Local Government Code § 212.904. A claim that an ordinance is invalid is cognizable under the Declaratory Judgments Act. *See* Tex. CIV. PRAC. & REM. CODE §§ 37.004(a), 37.006(b). That relief is distinct from the other relief appellants seek. Thus, the trial court had jurisdiction to entertain appellants' declaratory judgment related fee claims.

We sustain appellants' sixth issue as to their declaratory judgment fee claims.

¹⁰ Again appellants don't dispute that the City's argument raises a jurisdictional defect, so we assume without deciding that it does.

H. Issue Seven: Did appellants plead facts showing jurisdiction over their due process claims?

Yes. The district court is presumed to have subject matter jurisdiction, and the City's argument that there is no damages remedy for violating the Texas Constitution's due process clause doesn't identify a jurisdictional defect.

Appellants' last count was for damages resulting from a denial of their due process rights. They did not specify whether they were invoking federal or state constitutional due process rights, although they cited a passage from *City of Harlingen* addressing federal due process.

The City's jurisdictional plea argued that there was no jurisdiction over appellants' state law due process claims because no damage remedy is available under the Texas Constitution's due process clause.

Appellants' opening brief argues only that the availability of damages under the Texas Constitution's due process clause is a merits question, not a jurisdictional defect. We construe this to mean appellants have abandoned (or never intended to assert) any federal due process claims.¹¹

The City's appellate brief reiterates that damages are unavailable for state constitutional violations, but it cites no authority for the premise that this is a jurisdictional defect. In the City's principal authority, the supreme court held that

¹¹ Appellants' reply brief says that Selinger expressly asserted "his federal rights" in the trial court, but we don't consider arguments made for the first time in a reply brief. *See Sanchez v. Martin*, 378 S.W.3d 581, 590 (Tex. App.—Dallas 2012, no pet.) ("[W]e cannot consider matters raised for the first time in a reply brief.").

there is no private damages cause of action under the Texas Constitution's free speech and assembly rights. *See City of Beaumont v. Bouillion*, 896 S.W.2d 143, 149–50 (Tex. 1995). But the court then rendered a take nothing judgment against the claimants, never suggesting that the defect was jurisdictional.

We agree with appellants. Courts of general jurisdiction, such as Texas's district courts, are presumed to have subject matter jurisdiction absent a contrary showing. *See In re Entergy Corp.*, 142 S.W.3d 316, 322 (Tex. 2004) (orig. proceeding). A showing that a claim is legally meritless does not mean the trial court lacks jurisdiction to render such a judgment. *See City of Port Isabel v. Pinnell*, 161 S.W.3d 233, 241 (Tex. App.—Corpus Christi–Edinburg 2005, no pet.) ("Failure to state a claim is a defect which should be challenged by special exceptions, not by a plea to the jurisdiction."); *see also* Tex. R. Civ. P. 91a.

We sustain appellants' seventh issue.

V. MOOTNESS

Finally, we consider the City's mootness argument. We conclude the case is not moot because the City's treatment of the new plat application will not affect this controversy.

A case becomes moot if there ceases to be a justiciable controversy between the parties, whether because the issues presented are no longer "live" or the parties lack a legally cognizable interest in the outcome. *Glassdoor, Inc. v. Andra Grp., LP*,

575 S.W.3d 523, 527 (Tex. 2019). If a case becomes moot, the court must vacate all prior orders and judgments and dismiss the case for want of jurisdiction. *Id*.

Here, appellants' claims are predicated on the City's denying Selinger's plat after he refused to agree to pay roughly \$482,000 in water and sewer impact fees if City water and sewer lines were ever extended to the property. Appellants claim to have been injured by this denial. They assert, for example, that the City's conduct is an exaction that "reduce[d] the value of the property by at least 25%." They also seek costs and attorney's fees under various laws.

The City's mootness argument relies on evidence that a new plat for the same property was submitted at the same time appellants appealed in this case. Specifically, Norhill Energy, LLC submitted the plat. The City has submitted evidence to us showing that Selinger is Norhill's organizer and manager. The City's evidence also shows that Norhill has sued the City over its plat on claims unrelated to appellants' claims in this case. The City argues that the attempted "do over" plat moots the claims arising from the first plat.

Appellants make several responses, including: (i) they are not Norhill, which is a separate entity, (ii) they are suing for damages that have already accrued, regardless of what happens to Norhill's plat, (iii) Norhill's plat proposes to connect to the City's water and sewer, but that doesn't mean that the City didn't mishandle Selinger's plat, which did not contain such a proposal, and (iv) the City's treatment of Norhill's plat cannot undo its wrongful actions on Selinger's plat.

We agree with appellants. A limited liability company is a legal entity

separate from its members. Sherman v. Boston, 486 S.W.3d 88, 94 (Tex. App.—

Houston [14th Dist.] 2016, pet. denied). The fact that Norhill has filed a new plat

fails to establish that appellants did not suffer the damages they claim from the City's

treatment of Selinger's plat. Nor does it affect appellants' claims that the City's

conduct violated statutes and constitutional provisions or that the City's subdivision

ordinance is itself illegal and unconstitutional. See City of Harlingen, 2005 WL

74121, at *3-4 (developer's claims against city for zoning decisions not mooted

when developer's right to buy property expired).

We reject the City's mootness argument.

VI. DISPOSITION

We affirm the trial court's order granting the City's plea to the jurisdiction to

the extent it dismissed appellants' claims for attorney's fees regarding their takings

claims under the Texas Constitution. In all other respects, we reverse the order

granting the plea to the jurisdiction. We remand the case for further proceedings

consistent with this opinion.

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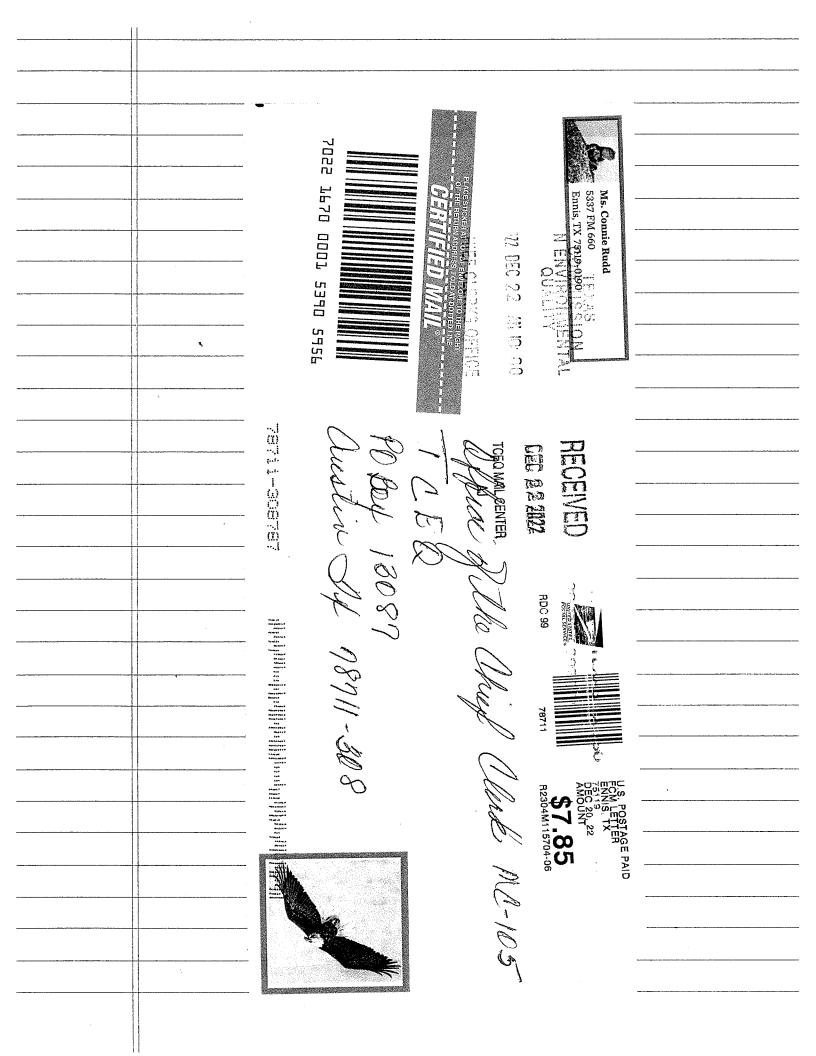

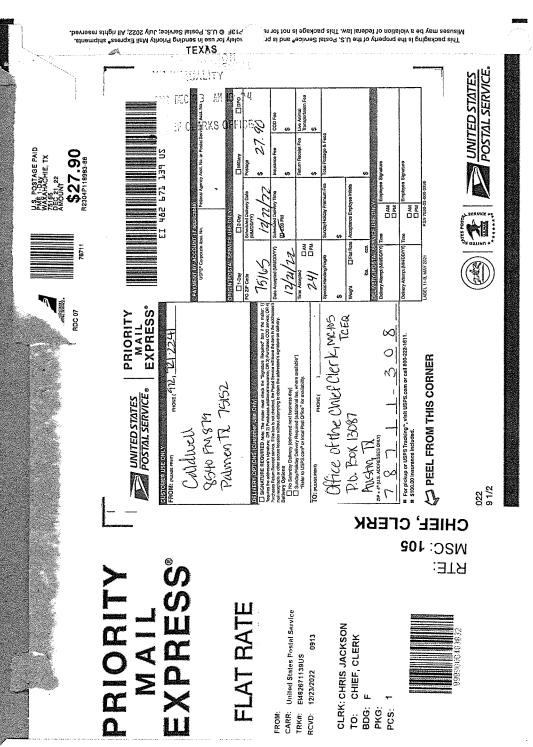

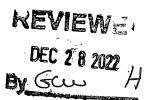

- Potential disruption to the pipeline running through the property is a danger to me and all other nearby residents and property owners.

The creation of the Shankle Road Municipal Utility District (MUD) is deeply concerning to me as property owner. The creation of a commercial waste facility directly impacts the value of my property as a direct result of the proximity to my residence. Per the guidelines outlined in The Texas Water Code (Title 4, Chapter 54. Municipal Utility Districts) I also have concerns that the following provisions have not been met:

- Per Sec. 54.015 the estimated costs of the project are unrealistic given an insufficient water plan
 for the proposed community and the enormity of building a viable run off that does not flood
 the surrounding home owners.
- Per the guidelines of Sec. 54.021 (b) (2) the reasonableness of projected construction costs cannot be evaluated as access to water for Shankle Road (MUD) has not been determined. The Garret and Rice rural water providers do not have sufficient water resources to provide to an 800 home MUD community. Providing water to a new development compromises the existing communities' access to water.
- Per 54.021 (d) the current roadways of FM 879, FM 660, US Hwy 34 and Shankle road cannot support additional traffic. The State and County have not sufficiently demonstrated the ability to maintain either roadway with the existing amount of traffic.

In closing, Mr. Selinger has hired a firm to protect his interest in this property and skirt by your requirements by doing the bare minimum without any real care or thought to how this will affect our farming community. They do not care if the air quality is compromised, the odors, or the increased flooding that this Municipal Utility District will create.

The rural water providers do not have sufficient water resources to provide to an 800 home MUD community. Providing water to a new development compromises the existing communities' access to water
- ☐ Per 54.021 (d) the current roadways of FM 660, FM 879 and Shankle road cannot support additional traffic.

The State and County have not sufficiently demonstrated the ability to maintain either roadway with the existing amount of traffic.

The creation of this Utility District uniquely and adversely affects us in the following ways:

Odors from the proposed sewer treatment plant: the submitted plans are inadequate for the proposed development and additional developments the developer may add to the District. An extensive Environmental Impact Study should be completed as to effects of the effluent discharge to surrounding areas and crop contamination downstream.

Water runoff and flooding concerns for all Ellis County residents: An extensive drainage plan should be demanded for the entire drainage/flooding inclusive of the entire path through Ellis County.

Inadequate water supply: The East Garrett Water Supply Corporation does not have an adequate water supply to supply the proposed development, which impacts the current residents supplied by East Garrett Water Supply Corp. There are already intermittent issues with decreased water pressure and interruptions in service with the current customer base. An Extensive Regional Impact Study and hydraulic analysis regarding adequate water volume and flow throughout the region should be demanded from the Petitioner. Drilling wells to supply the development should not be an option, considering the impact to natural springs throughout the area.

Impact to wildlife habitat: Removal of trees and natural vegetation will negatively impact both native wildlife and migratory bird populations and force the relocation of predatory animals with potential for endangerment of livestock and pets. An extensive Wildlife Impact Study should be demanded from the petitioner.

Impact on traffic: Farm Road 879 east of Interstate 45 is a two lane road with many curves and hills with minimal shoulder area on the periphery, that is already experiencing increased traffic. The proposed development with the addition of so many homes, thereby increasing amount of vehicle traffic would certainly impact the safety of commuting along this route as well as Shankle Road.

Strain on Emergency Services for the unincorporated areas of Ellis County: The addition of a development of this size in Eastern Ellis County will certainly impact the ability for prompt response of first responders of our Ellis County Sheriff Department, EMS responders and rural fire departments. I request a contested case hearing for Petition D-08222022-044, petitioned by Steve Selinger, for the creation of Shankle Road Municipal Utility District of Ellis County.

I am an affected person entitled to a contested case hearing on the issues raised in this hearing request. My property is located at 527 Novy Road, Ennis, TX 75119. I am the land owner and have a 3700 square foot home constructed in 2014. Our house is 3.18 miles (as the crow flies) from the proposed Shankle Road MUD.

The creation of this Utility District uniquely and adversely affects me in the following ways:

Flooding Due to New Waste Water Discharge:

The single observation of Four Mile creek flowing January, 2022 is misleading in report. Our property is at the southern end of the Four Mile Creek approximately 1 mile below where it crosses under TX 660. While Four Mile creek – normally has very little flow – however in heavier rains of 4" to 5" or more, the water flows out of its bank. Flood levels at our property reached approximately 80 to 90 percent of the projected 100-year flood plain levels. Decks of three local bridges on Novy Road crossing over Four Mile creek, just beyond our property, were underwater and closed for traffic this year. The confluence of three major creeks just south of TX 34 in the Telico area creates a backup of storm water up Four Mile Creek. Any significant increase of volume of water flow due to the discharge of a waste water treatment facility will prompt more extensive flooding all through the existing drainage creeks. Our subdivision in particular will experience higher flood plain levels and cause moderate to significant inundation of our properties and structures.

Environmental:

Several areas have low ponding spots where standing water in the creek promotes mosquito growth. Effluent of any 'strength' will make the mosquito situation even more problematic and potentially dangerous. Four Mile creek creates a 'pathway' and refuges for wildlife to live and move safely near and through inhabited areas.

Storm Water Flooding:

If the 181 acres of the prosed development does not adequately detain or retain storm water runoff from its pre-development flow, the increase in storm water runoff from the development will exacerbate the fragile flooding conditions along Four Mile Creek and other streams downstream from the development.

Air Quality:

Being approximately three miles south of the proposed development, our location appears to be in the highest concentration of airborne contaminants.

Traffic:

Novy road connects TX 660 and Tx 34 is a narrow primarily single lane asphalt road. We would anticipate additional traffic causing more damage to the road surface and creating more dangerous conditions for children who live along Novy Road. Trash dumping is a problem now, we would anticipate significant increase with completion of MUD. The County appears to have limited resources for maintain the road and to help with littering problems.

The intersection of Novy Road and TX 34 (which is heavily traveled by sand and gravel trucks) has experienced a number of accidents with at least one fatality in the last two years.

Additional factors of concern:

- 1) Density is very concerning. The proposed development would have the density of a very small town without all the elements of a free standing and self-supporting community.
- 2) Is the quality of development in keeping with the future potential growth of Ennis and Ellis County? Will the value of homes compare to current existing land owners? The site plan does not show any Fire station(s), parks, schools (are all children expected to be transported to various schools nearby?), police station, and no community buildings. The plan shows only entry/exit for the development and proposed 800 + lots/homes.
- 3) Untenable burdens on the surrounding services and infrastructure. This proposed MUD will require the support of local fire, water, police, of the County. Under current circumstances these agencies are already stretched to provide basic levels of service. This development would require the addition of services well beyond the developments capacity to acquire. The tax base would need to increase significantly to current land owners to provide an equivalent level of service currently provided. The day-to-day levels of service generated by this development would disproportionally spread the geographic coverage area. The demand for services compared to existing rural demand would be difficult, if not impossible to sustain with current and projected resources.

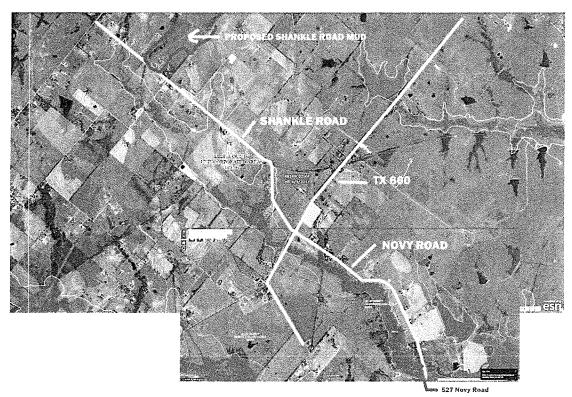

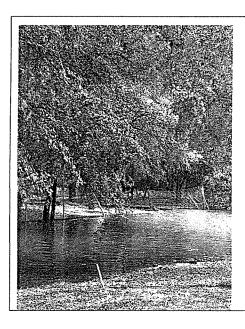

The water runoff is a concern for all surrounding property owners as an inadequate drainage plan was submitted by the Petitioner. This would drastically impact my land, animals, and family.

Flooding and drainage inadequacies are a major concern. My land is just west of Shankle Road, and there is no submitted drainage plan. An extensive drainage plan should be demanded for the entire drainage/flooding inclusive of the entire path through Ellis County.

Odors from a sewer treatment plan would drastically affect my family's quality of life. The submitted plans by the Petitioner are inadequate for the proposed development and additional developments the developer may add to the District. An Extensive Environmental Impact Study should be demanded regarding the effects of the excessive water generated by development and effects of crop contamination downstream.

The proposed development is and historically has been a nesting ground for wildlife due to the extensive number of trees, brush cover and ponds used by the wildlife in the area. The trees and natural vegetation are also a roosting area for migratory and local bird populations. All species of duck, geese, and waterfowl are regularly seen on the property. The Developer has shown that he will remove and destroy this entire habitat. This habitat provides protection for wildlife from heat, drought, and heavy rain. An extensive wildlife impact study should be provided from the Petitioner. This development will also forcibly relocate predatory animals such as coyotes to surrounding properties burdening the landowners with additional protection necessary for chickens, ducks, geese, birds, pets, and livestock.

Developing property with such a high density of housing creates excessive amounts of trash, debris and clutter throughout the surrounding properties. The petitioner has not addressed the negative impact of excessive waste to surrounding properties and debris to the landfill.

The development will create congestion on all surrounding roads. Eight hundred homes equals approximately 1600 additional cars every day on roads that were not meant to support this number of people. The traffic and congestion would greatly affect my family's quality of life as well as create additional expense for road maintenance. The additional households will create an estimated 1040 students for the Palmer ISD which only has two elementary schools. This creates a huge burden on all property owners in Palmer ISD.

The flow of the waste water through this creek from the sewage treatment plant will be a costly detriment to the operation, use, and enjoyment of my farm. This creek is normally dry with no water flowing through the creek. I regularly drive across this creek with my tractors and ATV in order to access both sides of my farm. With the flow of the waste water, I will no longer be able to do so without the expense of installing a bridge to cross the creek.

Worse still, my cows also graze this creek and regularly cross the creek in order to graze pastures located on opposite sides of the creek. I do not want my cows drinking the sewage water that will be flowing in the creek. This will necessitate me installing fencing on both sides of the creek to keep them out of the creek and drinking the sewage water. This will be a very costly expense.

I know from personal experience from serving as a Director of Rice Water Supply and Sewer Service Corporation and Hardin County WCID that raw sewage sometimes escapes waste treatment plants and enters into the discharge streams. I do not want this contamination flowing through my creek.

I request that and extensive drainage plan for all affected streams and creeks in Ellis County be provided before this development is approved. This should include a study of the negative effects that approval of this Utility District that will result if approval is granted.

The creation of this sub-division and Municipal Utility District uniquely and adversely affects me as a property owner and heir to additional land that is connected to the petitioned property. I will be directly affected in the following ways:

-An adequate Drainage Plan was NOT submitted by Petitioner. Water runoff is a major concern for flooding. The submitted drainage plan DOES NOT address excessive runoff and drainage for adjacent and downstream landowners. The submitted Drainage Plan by the Petitioner does not allow any solution for excessive runoff and potential flooding to all properties located south and east of the proposed Development. This development creates an unmanageable flow of water onto our property and adjoining property owners due to the amount of concrete covering the now natural terrain and landscape. The lack of a Regional Drainage plan for all properties affected in all directions including but not limited to all properties located downstream that will have to accept the additional flow of water in all named and unnamed creeks and rivers must be demanded, completed, and approved prior to ANY Petition approval. This development runoff creates health concerns due to unknown contaminated material and chemicals creating an environmental hazard not addressed by the Petitioner. An extensive Hazmat Study should be required to address this environmental concern.

- -Smell/ odor from sewer treatment plant is a daily concern to persons as well as wildlife and livestock. Ingestion of toxic substances is a major health concern that could cause serious illness and or death. A separate and Specific Environmental Impact study must be required for the safety and effects of the Plant prior to any approval of the MUD permit.
- -Water supply will be affecting current residents due to the sheer number of structures and number of household occupants. A potential lack of water is a major concern for existing residents that currently reside in the immediate and surrounding areas. An extensive Study and approved water plan are and should be demanded by all local, county and state entities prior to any Petition approval. Water quality should be a top priority. Although water wells are commonly drilled for additional supply- drilling in this area would deplete and destroy surrounding underground springs which are currently located on our property.

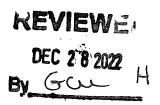

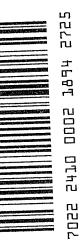

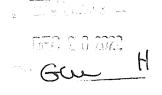

The proposed MUD includes a request to discharge an average of 500,000 thousand gallons of water a day into Four-mile Creek will change this from a dry creek to a creek that always contains water. Being that the proposed site of this Utility District is directly NE from my homestead, with no wind block, the probability of putrid smells and odors from the sewer treatment plant, with the amount of wind out here, is unacceptable. The submitted plans by the petitioner, Steve Selinger, are inadequate for the proposed development particularly considering the possibility/probability of additional developments that could be added to the District at a later date. The amount of land is insufficient for a project of this magnitude, and an Extensive Environmental Impact Study regarding the effects of the excessive sewer water that will be generated by this development as well as the effects of contamination to the crops downstream is demanded.
- 2. The majority of the land in this proposed Utility District is currently and has historically been a habitat for wildlife. In this area ducks, geese, waterfowl are regularly seen. The vast ponds, trees and brush cover are used by the wildlife and the natural vegetation is a roosting area for migratory and local bird populations. This habitat provides protection for wildlife from heat, drought and heavy rain. This habitat will not be relocated, but destroyed by the developer, which will also forcibly relocate the large number of coyotes, bobcats, hogs and other predators to surrounding properties, unduly burdening the landowners with having to provide additional protection for chickens, ducks, geese, pets and livestock. An extensive wildlife impact study should be provided and demanded from the Petitioner.
- 3. This housing development will be located in the Palmer Independent School District, which is a small, rural school system. 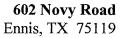

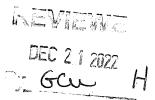

My husband (Lawrence Mireles) and I (Kim Mireles) request a contested case hearing for Petition D-08222022-044, petitioned by Steve Selinger, for the creation of Shankle Road Municipal Utility District of Ellis County.

I am an affected person entitled to a contested case hearing on the issues raised in this hearing request. My property is located at 602 Novy Road, less than 3 miles South of the Petitioners property requested for creation of the Shankle Road Municipal Utility District.

The creation of this Utility District uniquely and adversely affects me in the following way(s):

First and foremost, the creeks flowing in this area overflow and flood frequently. We do not need additional water runoff flowing through these creeks. The drainage plan submitted by the Petitioner is inadequate. We demand an extensive drainage plan for the entire drainage area inclusive of the entire path through Ellis County. Residents in this area could be heavily impacted by this new District and proposed large-scale development project.

The proposed development area will impact native and migratory wildlife. This area is a nesting ground for wildlife based on the brush cover, ponds and number of trees. This natural vegetation is a roosting area for migratory and local bird populations. I have witnessed large numbers of geese and other birds flying, landing and using the area all along Shankle and Novy Road in their flight and temporary roosting patterns as well as other ducks and waterfowl and Road Runners. An extensive Wildlife Impact Study must be required from Petitioner prior and potentially foregoing approval of this MUD. As nearby property owners, we are also concerned that coyotes, wild hog and other predatory animals will be forced to relocate closer to our homes where our pets, livestock, chickens, etc. will require additional protections.

In addition to the above studies, a thorough Environmental Impact Study should be required regarding the effects of the excessive and potentially contaminated water generated by the MUD and development project to determine potential impacts to crops, farm land, hay fields, cattle grazing lands downstream of the project. As stated, this area receives significant water run-off as a result of heavy rains. We must know how this project can potentially impact our homes and surrounding area, the types and magnitude of potential contamination.

As a nearby landowner, I am also heavily concerned about the proposed MUD's ability and potential to acquire additional property in this area at its discretion. I am aware that most MUD's commonly acquire additional land beyond their original boundaries. We are concerned about the additional traffic congestion on all surrounding roads with the current proposed boundaries. We have been impacted already by the hundreds, if not thousands of sand and gravel trucks on HWY 34, south of our property, and now we will be impacted from the other direction with additional traffic and construction/development from this proposed Shankle MUD project if it is allowed to proceed. This is an area where we (me, children, families) currently ride bicycles and horses, walk

and appreciate country living. A low housing development project will bring additional dangers to this area and almost no possibility of continued bicycling or walking due to the congested roadways and construction, as well as crime concerns from low income housing. Low cost housing creates additional threats of theft, vandalism, and additional crimes that will threaten the residents on Shankle Road, Novy Road and surrounding communities as well as for the Ellis County Sheriff's Dept. This is a major concern for all residents of Ellis County.

Other concerns include inadequate emergency response, lack of adequate fire protection, handling and disposal of additional and excessive amounts of waste, trash, debris and clutter. The Petitioner has not addressed the negative impact of excessive waste to surrounding properties and debris to the landfill. Adding 800 homes will create an estimated 1040 students and a huge burden to all property owners in the Palmer ISD to add additional schools.

In conclusion, I request a hearing and the above studies be conducted to address extensive concerns we have about this project.

An Extensive Environmental Impact Study should be demanded regarding the effects of the excessive water generated by development and effects of crop contamination downstream. This should be considered for the crops that people eat, and crops that are fed to their livestock.

This MUD will impact my rural country neighborhood with ranchers and farmers. This MUD will impact our wildlife, cattle and food sources.

· *Wildlife Impact*- The proposed development is and historically has been a nesting ground for wildlife due to the extensive number of trees, brush cover and ponds used by the wildlife in the area. The trees and natural vegetation are also a roosting area for migratory and local bird populations.

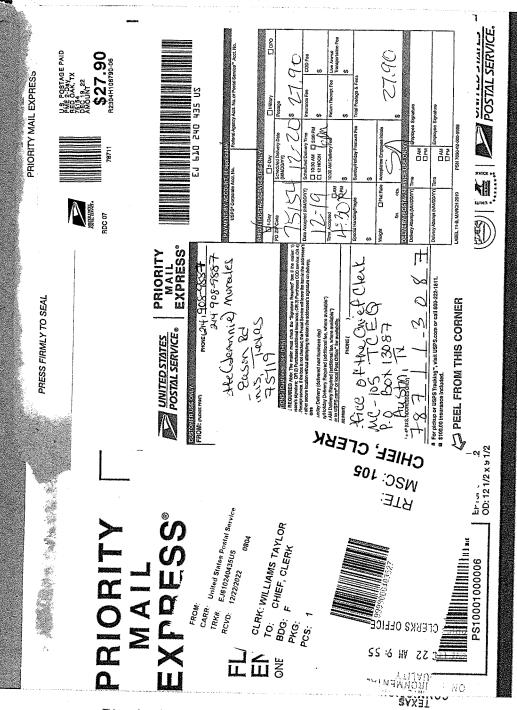

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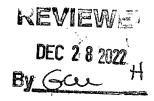

COMMENTS: I request denial of the creation of Shankle Road MUD and request a contested case hearing. The creation of this MUD serves to negatively impact my family's property which would share a boundary with the proposed development, and the adverse effects of the Shankle Road MUD would continue to extend to much of the surrounding area. This development serves to increase the amount of litter and trash along roadsides, waterways and drainage ditches, and the encroachment of the trash into surrounding properties which poses a hazard to livestock and other

wildlife. The area affected by this MUD in both proximity and throughout the proposed drainage area is predominately agricultural, with land used for hay, crop, and livestock production. Litter and trash, such as plastic bottles and food containers, aluminum cans, and foam containers have a substantial negative impact as they can become hidden in tall crops and grasses and inadvertently baled and mixed into animal feeds, which poses a hazard if ingested. In addition, the litter and trash inevitably generated by this development clogs culverts and other drainage infrastructure, causing flooding which damages roads and property, and only continues to pollute land and property further along the drainage path. The proposed construction of a wastewater treatment plant brings concern of odors and other airborne contaminants which serve to negatively impact the health and overall quality of life of those around and downwind of the facility. Additional concerns are sewage spills and contamination of land and groundwater from wastewater overflow and mismanagement. The drainage and runoff from this wastewater treatment plant would also serve to increase flooding and erosion along the flow path. An extensive Environmental Impact Study should be provided as well as and extensive Drainage Plan regarding the flow path throughout the entirety of Ellis County. The Shankle Road MUD would displace approximately 180 acres of vegetation, wildlife, and ecological diversity. As uncultivated land with pasture/native prairie grasses and trees, the land serves as a habitat for local and migratory bird populations, armadillos, opossums, rabbits, and other wildlife. With the displacement of these animals would come the displacement of predatory animals, such as coyotes, to the surrounding area, posing a threat to cattle and house pets. An Environmental and Ecological Impact Study as well as a Wildlife Impact Study should be provided. The Shankle Road MUD would only increase the deterioration of Shankle Road as well as FM 660 and FM 879 as the proposed 800 houses/dwellings would equate to approximately 1600 additional vehicles traveling these roads. The rural roads around this area are not meant nor constructed to handle that capacity of vehicles on a regular basis and this only leads to increased traffic, accidents, and undue burdens on the county to continually maintain and upkeep these roads, especially Shankle Road. This proposed development having such a high density of housing is cause for concern in the case of emergencies such as fire. The small lot sizes and proximity of each present the issue of fire containment as one house fire could ignite the adjacent one and so on. With only rural volunteer fire departments in the area, the resources and response time are not available for adequate fire protection and containment of fire in a development as dense as the Shankle Road MUD is proposed to be. A fire within this development also threatens surrounding homes, agricultural land, pastures, and animals. This area regularly experiences drought conditions and 800 additional homes only serve to exacerbate the threat of fire and possibilities of its spread into wildfires. This high density housing also strains other emergency services such as the Ellis County Sheriff's Department as an increase in crime, theft, and vandalism cannot be discounted when considering the potentially large amount of homes and people in the proposed development.

COMMENTS: To Whom this may concern at the TCEQ, I request the denial of the creation of the Shankle Road MUD. As a resident living near this property on Shankle Rd my biggest concern will be the character of people that this will bring into this peaceful quiet neighborhood. This is nothing but a glorified apartment/townhome property or possibly a manufactured home development. These units will end up being lease or rental units with people moving in and out all the time. This will not end up as a true Homeowners Association with rules and guidelines that will need to be followed

if you live in this development. This will end up turning into a low rent area and will bring the value of my property down over time. The traffic that this will create on Shankle Road will be unimaginable. I cannot fathom the traffic jams that will be created on the road when these people are trying to get to FM 660 or FM 879. Please note that this is a small narrow rural road and cannot handle the influx of traffic this will create. With the amount of traffic that will be up and down Shankle Rd on a given day or week, this will weaken and destroy the integrity of this road and I really don't think that Ellis County will want to continually maintain this road and if they have too, this will continually increase our taxes each year due to road maintenance. My family has pastureland that backs up to this property and I am concerned with the welfare of our livestock that will be grazing in this pasture. Our property is located at 3631 FM 85 Ennis TX 75119, approximately 7 acres bordering the south side of the Burns Branch watershed, and adjacent to the drainage courses immediately impacted by the proposed development.

The creation of this Utility District uniquely and adversely affects us in the following way(s):

We have concern that the petition fails to adequately address the potential damaging impact of water runoff on neighboring properties as well as those downstream from the proposed development together with any potential additional load from any future adjoined and / or unadjoined additions to the development, whether natural runoff or water discharged from storm collection systems and sewage treatment plants.

Water runoff from recent high-density housing developments in the area has resulted in extensive erosion of watercourses, creek banks, roads and rights-of-ways. Soils removed by the various forms of runoff from these once stable landscapes are clogging creeks, silting-in drainage channels and spreading debris across open lands and water courses.

We are specifically concerned that the water runoff from the proposed development and potential expansions of the project will directly impact the watershed that drains our property as it merges with the downstream properties in the Telico drainage system.

We therefore request comprehensive hydrological drainage and environment impact studies be required of the petitioner addressing these concerns.

I request a denial of Petition D-08222022-044, petitioned by Steve Selinger, for the creation of Shankle Road Municipal Utility District of Ellis County. If TCEQ gives approval of the Petition, then I request a contested hearing.

My property is located at 1013 Shankle Road, directly across Shankle Road from the Selinger property and downstream of the proposed stormwater and treated wastewater stream discharge point. My family has lived on and farmed the property continuously since 1908.

In previous comments for the Wastewater Permit WQ0016103001 and for this Petition D-08222022044, I stated that the new treated wastewater stream and increased stormwater runoff will alter the natural nature of the Unnamed Tributary and Four-mile Creek in ways that are detrimental to my ranching livelihood. Both tributaries are currently shallow, well-vegetated depressions in the terrain, and they will become eroded ravines with this added water flow. The soil is a blackland prairie type which is a gooey morass when wet. The attached photo shows the Unnamed Tributary natural flow path.

I am submitting these comments because my previous comments did not detail the extent of the hardship that will be imposed upon me. Please refer to attached Exhibit A, which shows the location of my affected ranch facilities and pastures, and the route of Unnamed Tributary and Four-mile Creek.

My 167-acre property is bisected by the Four-mile Creek and Unnamed Tributary, with 25 acres on one side and 132 acres on the other. At my homestead, shown in the inset detail, are my equipment shed, feed barn, maintenance shop, and corral. These facilities are on the 25 acre side and serve two herds: heifers and mature cattle. I do not have duplicate facilities on the other side of the tributaries.

The total 167 acres is divided into multiple pastures with each pasture separated with fencing and gates. Cattle are regularly rotated into different pastures for grazing, in order to prevent overgrazing and to maintain healthy, productive land.

The quarantine pasture is used to treat sick cattle or to quarantine newly purchased cattle before they join one of my existing herds.

If the Petition is approved, both herds will be cut off from my facilities:

- I will have no way to vaccinate, medically treat, or load my cattle into a trailer for sale if my cattle cannot get to the feed barn and corral.
- My cattle will not be able to cross the flowing stream without getting bogged down in the mud and drowning.
- My tractors and farm equipment will not be able to cross a muddy ravine.

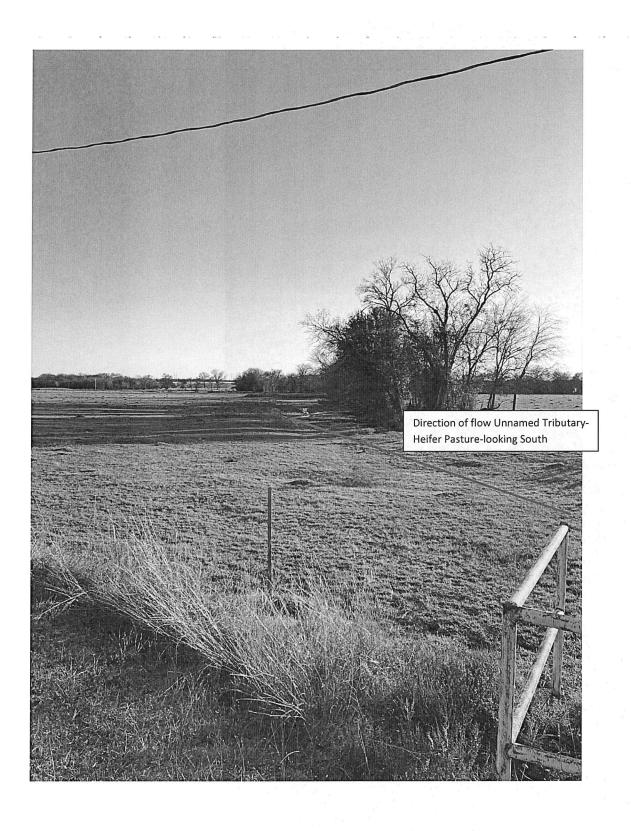
- The new stream will bisect my ranch, with the bulk of my acreage separated from my barns, specialized pens and corral. I will be unable to corral and load my cattle for sale.
- The heifer pasture will be bisected, causing the heifers to loose grazing acreage.

Building duplicate facilities on the other side of the creek and reconfiguring the existing pastures would be a hardship and great expense. If done, the new facilities would permanently cause more manhours to be expended in daily cattle care since I would lose the convenience of having the facilities in my backyard where the cattle can be closely watched.

Also, the watershed from the proposed District provides a water supply that will be tainted with chemical fertilizers, pesticides, and herbicides after development, and the treated domestic wastewater stream will be contaminated with medicines and household chemicals. The watershed flows into stock tanks and will be ingested by downstream cattle.

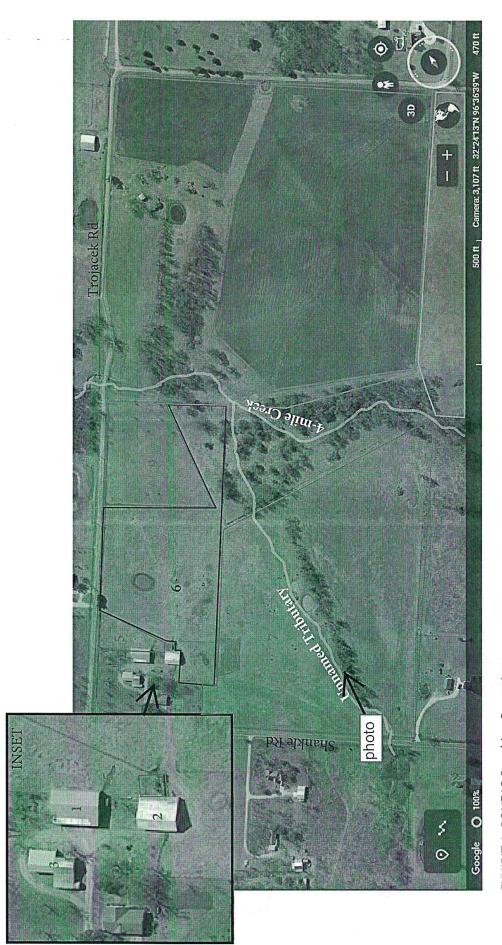

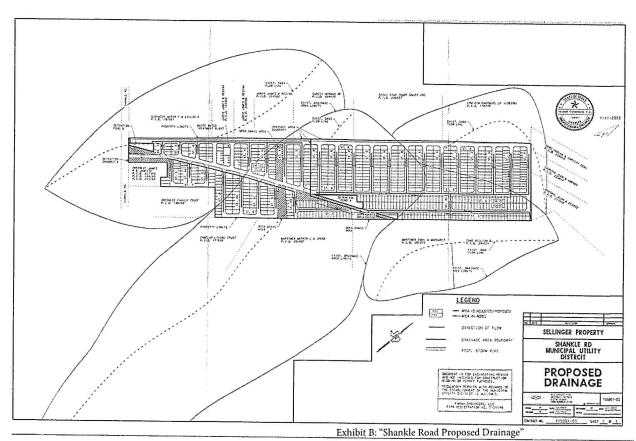
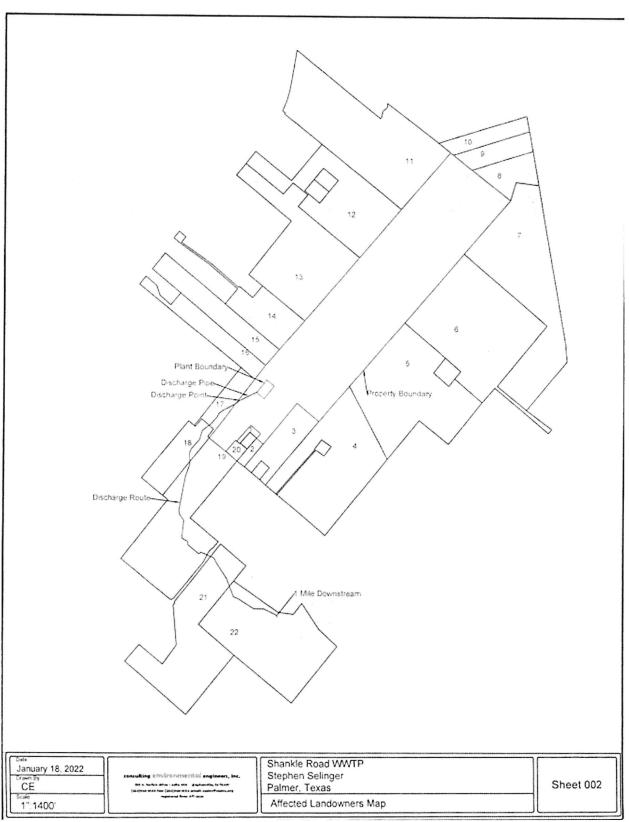


Exhibit A: Proposed Drainage

Exhibit B: USGS Topo watershed





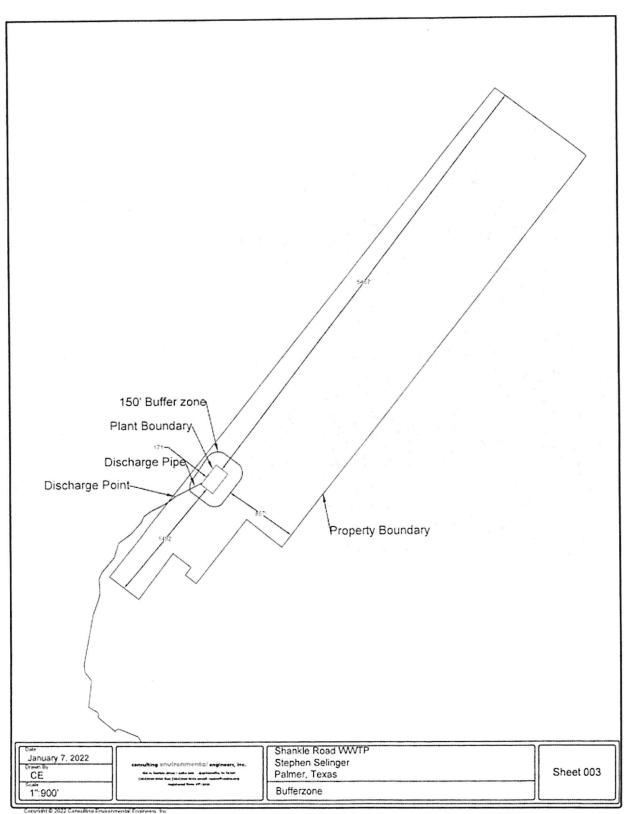

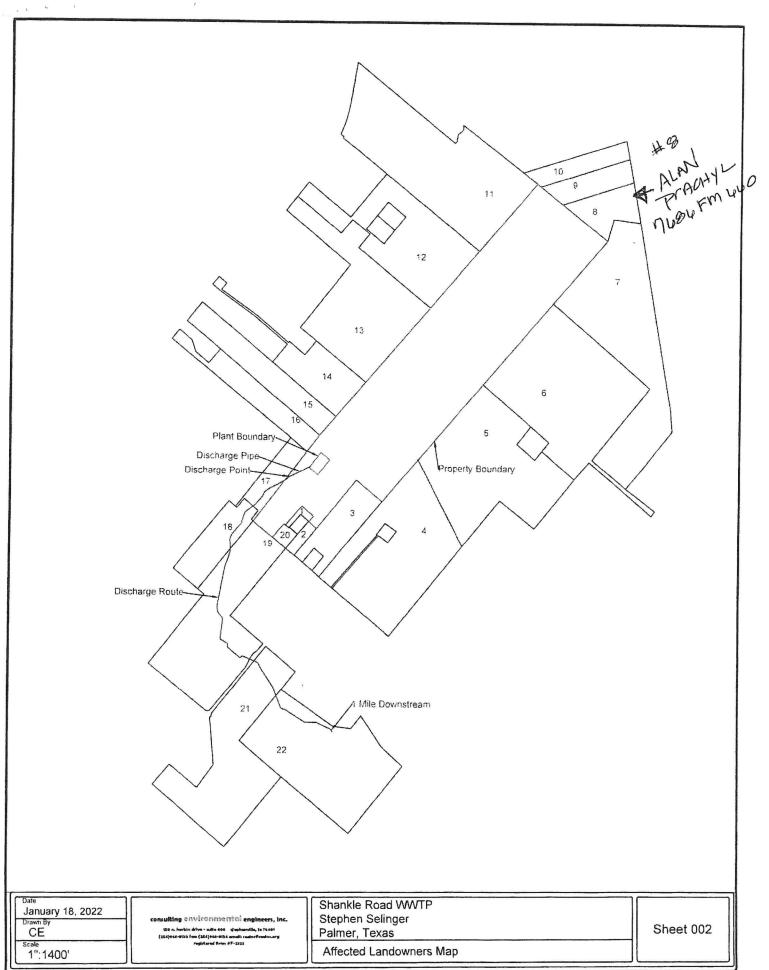
The creation of this Utility District uniquely and adversely affects me in the following ways:

My property sits at a much lower grade to the proposed Utility District. Eight hundred proposed homes with the extensive paving and of coverage of the natural topography would mean excess run off on to my property and unnamed creek a few yards from the east boundary of the proposed Utility District. The majority of my property is already a flood plain and the run off would be devastating for my acreage, creek and not least of all, my home. I want an expected "drainage plan study" done for the entire path thru this area and the entirety Ellis County.

My property currently sits in water many times after heavy rains because we are on a low lying area that higher surrounding properties drain to on the way to the creek. The unnamed creek that wraps a few yards from the back border with the proposed Utility District around to the south side of my property where the creek then runs under FM 660 and continues on. We have had flooding within 30 feet of our house as it is. It has taken days to drain with retained areas of water for weeks. With the additional run off, I foresee much worse flooding due to increased drainage flow issues. Any debris that hangs up in the fence lines and culvert causes more of a drainage problem. Being down country from this Utility District would certainly mean more trash debris.

The Utility District is proposing a waste water management system that can/will cause odor issues for all of the surrounding homeowners. This small area with this amount of houses packed in will certainly not be odor free is potentially a huge issue. The smell would devalue my property and our enjoyment of our outdoor spaces including a large porch, green house and garden. Septic water and normal yard run off containing weed control or fertilizing products from yards for eight hundred homes would most certainly be in the water expected to drain down to my lower elevation and creek. I don't believe the

proposal adequately shows water treatment responsibility for all people involved. I also want an environmental impact study of the waste water and the results it will have on the effected creeks, flood plains and crop contamination in the fields surrounding and downstream.

We currently are home to nesting owls. We have seen deer, bobcats, raccoons and wild turkey in our wooded pasture. I don't believe that will continue with eight hundred homes on 180 acres just yards from our property and from the fouling of the creek where these animals drink and hunt. I also want a wildlife study done especially for the migratory birds that we see on our property and the proposed utility district land. An entire habitat would be destroyed by this utility district.

The amount of trash and debris created by this many houses packed into this 180 acres will not be inconsequential. As custom home owners this creates a major issue and devalues all we have worked to have with our property. This neighborhood like many others before it will become more and more neglected by time. It is detrimental to all of us surrounding this proposed utility district to be subject to something that devalues our properties just so that a developer not from our community/town/county can build numerous small with minimal budget houses and no plans to regulate or maintain the utility district.

This proposed Utility District sits on a narrow two lane county road that runs between other county roads that have to be accessed by the houses in the Utility District. I have seen nothing that says these roads will be maintained by the District. It will certainly be an issue to maintain the roads in and out of the district by our county without significant tax increases to all of us. Our county tax dollars are already stretched thin.

As close as I am to this proposed Utility District, I also am very concerned about the crime and vandalism this kind of neighborhood could spark and about the emergency services for this many concentrated houses in my county. It is overwhelming to build this Utility District with the current county services we now have. I know it would negatively impact all of us in Ellis County with police, fire and ambulance coverage for starters. There is no county trash service. What is the developers plan for this? Burning? There are frequent burn bans making the burning of trash not an option. Even without a ban, burning would negatively impact the whole area and is hazardous. I see no restrictions in place for maintaining trash pickup. Our schools would certainly be impacted with the addition of this many people so quickly. This would be overwhelming to Palmer ISD and their bus service and unfair to the children involved. The school tax would also be raised for this reason.

Overall, the negative effects for this Utility District are extensive. I see no positives for Ellis County residents. As a homeowner with a border to this property, I demand studies for drainage, environmental waste and run off water and wildlife impact directly effecting mine and my neighbor's properties. Other studies on our roads, schools, fire, police, ambulance and trash also need independent research done to fully comprehend what this developer is trying to build.

I request a contested case hearing for Petition D-08222022-044, Petitioned by Steve Selinger, for the creation of Shankle Road Municipal Utility District of Ellis County.

I am an affected person entitled to a contested case hearing on the issues raised in this hearing request. My property is located at 7686 FM 660. My property has a direct connection on the East side of the above listed proposed Utility District. We have a shared property line. I have enclosed your map with my property notated.

The creation of this Utility District uniquely and adversely affects me in the following ways:

My property sits at a much lower grade to the proposed Utility District. Eight hundred proposed homes with the extensive paving and of coverage of the natural topography would mean excess run off on to my property and unnamed creek a few yards from the east boundary of the proposed Utility District. The majority of my property is already a flood plain and the run off would be devastating for my acreage, creek and not least of all, my home. I want an expected "drainage plan study" done for the entire path thru this area and the entirety Ellis County.

My property currently sits in water many times after heavy rains because we are on a low lying area that higher surrounding properties drain to on the way to the creek. The unnamed creek that wraps a few yards from the back border with the proposed Utility District around to the south side of my property where the creek then runs under FM 660 and continues on. We have had flooding within 30 feet of our house as it is. It has taken days to drain with retained areas of water for weeks. With the additional run off, I foresee much worse flooding due to increased drainage flow issues. Any debris that hangs up in the fence lines and culvert causes more of a drainage problem. Being down country from this Utility District would certainly mean more trash debris.

The Utility District is proposing a waste water management system that can/will cause odor issues for all of the surrounding homeowners. This small area with this amount of houses packed in will certainly not be odor free is potentially a huge issue. The smell would devalue my property and our enjoyment of our outdoor spaces including a large porch, green house and garden. Septic water and normal yard run off containing weed control or fertilizing products from yards for eight hundred homes would most certainly be in the water expected to drain down to my lower elevation and creek. I don't believe the

proposal adequately shows water treatment responsibility for all people involved. I also want an environmental impact study of the waste water and the results it will have on the effected creeks, flood plains and crop contamination in the fields surrounding and downstream.

We currently are home to nesting owls. We have seen deer, bobcats, raccoons and wild turkey in our wooded pasture. I don't believe that will continue with eight hundred homes on 180 acres just yards from our property and from the fouling of the creek where these animals drink and hunt. I also want a wildlife study done especially for the migratory birds that we see on our property and the proposed utility district land. An entire habitat would be destroyed by this utility district.

The amount of trash and debris created by this many houses packed into this 180 acres will not be inconsequential. As custom home owners this creates a major issue and devalues all we have worked to have with our property. This neighborhood like many others before it will become more and more neglected by time. It is detrimental to all of us surrounding this proposed utility district to be subject to something that devalues our properties just so that a developer not from our community/town/county can build numerous small with minimal budget houses and no plans to regulate or maintain the utility district.

This proposed Utility District sits on a narrow two lane county road that runs between other county roads that have to be accessed by the houses in the Utility District. I have seen nothing that says these roads will be maintained by the District. It will certainly be an issue to maintain the roads in and out of the district by our county without significant tax increases to all of us. Our county tax dollars are already stretched thin.

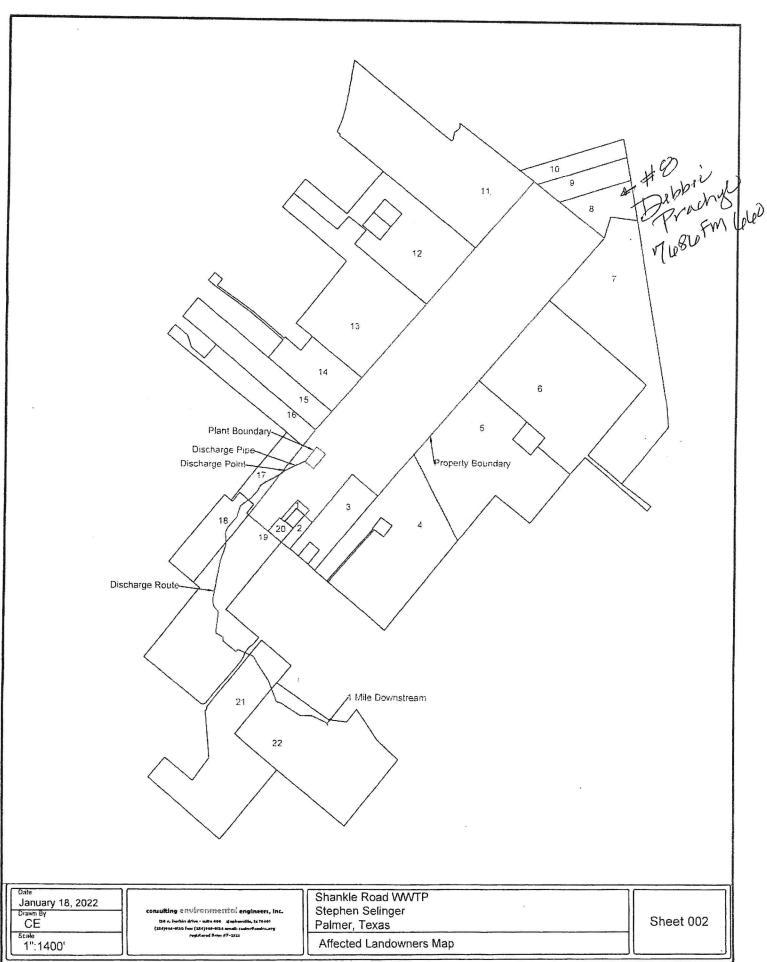
As close as I am to this proposed Utility District, I also am very concerned about the crime and vandalism this kind of neighborhood could spark and about the emergency services for this many concentrated houses in my county. It is overwhelming to build this Utility District with the current county services we now have. I know it would negatively impact all of us in Ellis County with police, fire and ambulance coverage for starters. There is no county trash service. What is the developers plan for this? Burning? There are frequent burn bans making the burning of trash not an option. Even without a ban, burning would negatively impact the whole area and is hazardous. I see no restrictions in place for maintaining trash pickup. Our schools would certainly be impacted with the addition of this many people so quickly. This would be overwhelming to Palmer ISD and their bus service and unfair to the children involved. The school tax would also be raised for this reason.

Overall, the negative effects for this Utility District are extensive. I see no positives for Ellis County residents. As a homeowner with a border to this property, I demand studies for drainage, environmental waste and run off water and wildlife impact directly effecting mine and my neighbor's properties. Other studies on our roads, schools, fire, police, ambulance and trash also need independent research done to fully comprehend what this developer is trying to build.

As a rancher myself, the below points greatly affect my family, my neighbors, and our rural community, and my livestock. Please note that my family has lived on this property for several generations.

This MUD will affect the environment that my family, friends and rural community live. The creation of this Utility District uniquely and adversely affects me in the following way(s):

-WATER RUNOFF- should be a concern to all surrounding property owners as an inadequate drainage plan was submitted by the Petitioner. It did not consider any drainage/water runoff to the East and South affected landowners.

·FLOODING/DRAINAGE - should concern all landowners downstream from Shankle Road to Novy Road to 4-mile creek to Village Cr to Telico and on to the Trinity River.

An Extensive Drainage Plan should be demanded for the entire drainage/flooding inclusive of the entire path through Ellis County.

 \cdot SMELLS/ODORS FROM SEWER TREATMENT PLANT – submitted plans by Petitioner are inadequate for the proposed development.

An Extensive Environmental Impact Study should be demanded regarding the effects of the excessive water generated by development and effects of crop contamination downstream. This should be considered for the crops that people eat, and crops that are fed to their livestock.

This MUD will impact my rural country neighborhood with ranchers and farmers. This MUD will impact our wildlife, cattle and food sources.

· Wildlife Impact- The proposed development is and historically has been a nesting ground for wildlife due to the extensive number of trees, brush cover and ponds used by the wildlife in the area. The trees and natural vegetation are also a roosting area for migratory and local bird populations.

All species of duck, geese, and waterfowl are regularly seen on the property. The Developer has shown that he will remove and destroy this entire habitat. This habitat provides protection for wildlife from heat, drought, and heavy rain.

An extensive wildlife impact study should be provided and demanded from the Petitioner. This development will also forcibly relocate predatory animals such as coyotes to surrounding properties burdening the landowners with additional protection necessary for chickens, ducks, geese, birds, pets, and livestock.

We are affected persons in ways not common to the general public and entitled to a contested case hearing on the issues raised in this hearing request.

PROPERTY DESCRIPTION:

Our property is located at 1128 Shankle Rd, Ennis, Texas, and is adjacent to the Selinger property, sharing a fence line on our east (see Exhibit A: "Location of Stiff Property in Relation to Selinger Property"). My homestead is 1.2 acres in size.

The creation of this Utility District uniquely and adversely affects us in the following ways:

- 1. According to Section 11.086 of the Texas Water Code,
 - (a) No person may divert or impound the natural flow of surface waters in this state, or permit a diversion or impounding by him to continue, in a manner that damages the property of another by the overflow of the water diverted or impounded.
 - (b) A person whose property is injured by an overflow of water caused by an unlawful diversion or impounding has remedies at law and in equity and may recover damages occasioned by the overflow.

The natural flow of the Unnamed Tributary currently does not travel over our property, but does travel over the Selinger property before reaching Shankle Road (see Exhibit A for current flow path). Selinger needs to provide hydrology reports and drainage plans that ensure that the natural flow will not be rerouted to travel over our property, eroding our yard and fence, saturating our septic field, and rendering our home uninhabitable. This is a concern to us since the proposed Wastewater Treatment Facility (TCEQ permit application WQ-0016103001), if approved, would discharge up to an average of 500,000 gallons per day into this same Tributary in addition to stormwater. The combined flows will worsen the existing flooding that currently occurs in the Shankle Road drainage ditch during average storm events. Due to the large volume

- of water discharged, heavy erosion along the new flow path would certainly occur and flooding of my home may occur during storm events, whereas my home is not currently in a floodplain.
- 2. My family will be subjected to heavy construction traffic and noise for years to come, along with the nuisance of wind-driven trash on my property. All homeowners on Shankle Road and surrounding areas have minimum 1 acre lots that meet the Ellis County requirements. Most homes are situated on more than 10 acres. Traffic to and from the Shankle Road MUD property will pass in front of our home, as it is the most efficient route to metropolitan areas. It will become excessive, stressful, and change my quality of life and destroy the pastoral atmosphere, the reason we live here.

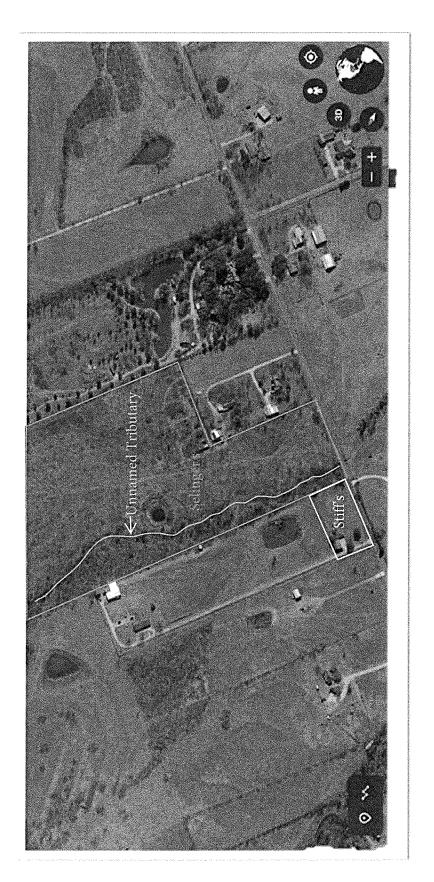


EXHIBIT A: Location of Stiff property in relation to Selinger property

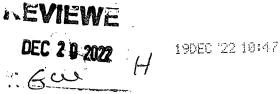

I am an affected person entitled to a contested case hearing on the issues raised in this hearing request. My property is located at 561 Novy Rd., Ennis, TX 75119.

The creation of this Utility District uniquely and adversely affects me in the following way(s):

- 1. Water Runoff Our property located on Novy Road already has substantial water runoff issues, worsened during any rainstorm. An inadequate drainage plan was submitted by the Petitioner. We are very concerned about the compound drainage issues this will cause on our property on Novy Road.
- 2. Flooding Our home is not currently in the flood plain, but the back of our property is. We have never had issues with flooding and drainage so severe that it has affected our home, but we are concerned that this development will do so. The back 2 or 3 acres of our property frequently floods during any substantial rainstorm, and is much worse in certain seasons. Water already sits for weeks and sometimes months at a time in the spring on our property and all down Novy Road. Bridges are closed several times a year due to the flooding, leave some people's home inaccessible. Fortunately, up until this point, the bridge flooding on Novy Road has never reached our home; however, our home last year was only 50 yards from the flooding. We are concerned that this development will increase the flooding on our property and may affect our home. Again, an adequate drainage plan was not submitted for this development, and we request a plan inclusive of its entire path in Ellis County.
- 3. Smells and Odors We are very concerned we will have malodorous smells from the sewer treatment plant. Our home is only 5 years old and is valued at half a million dollars. First, we should not have to deal with these smells, as we would not have selected Novy Road to build our house on had this treatment plant already been in the works. Second, Our home value is over half a million dollars. The county should be required to take into consideration surrounding home values prior to allowing such a development. Is the county going to give us a break on our property taxes due the unsightly smells, and therefore decrease in home value, that this plant will bring?
- 4. Wildlife Impact When searching for our perfect property to build our dream home, the wild nature of the Novy Road area was so appealing to us. We loved the overgrowth of the trees and the free-roaming wildlife. We are concerned that this development will affect both of the things we love most about our surrounding land. We don't want nature to be destroyed with an overpopulated development and treatment plant.
- 5. Traffic As development continues down the 45 corridor and highway 34, traffic congestion has become out of control. We are two working parents with 3 small children. We both have to get all 3 of our children to different schools and day care each day and then to work on time. The congestion at highway 34 and 45 is already severe. This area cannot handle a barrage of new vehicular traffic,

- equivalent to 800 homes. Until traffic congestion is resolved on this side of the county, no new housing developments should be permitted.
- 6. Emergency Services The local volunteer emergency services are not equipped to deal with 800 new homes. The Garrett, Bristol and Telico volunteer fire departments are already bogged down with the new individual houses popping up all over. Until a plan is made for emergency services in this area, no new housing developments should be permitted.

PETITION. Steve Selinger, (Petitioner) filed a petition for creation of Shankle Road Municipal Utility District of Ellis County (District) with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ). The petition was filed pursuant to Article XVI, §59 and Article III, §52 of the Constitution of the State of Texas; Chapters 49 and 54 of the Texas Water Code; 30 Texas Administrative Code Chapter 293; and the procedural rules of the TCEQ.

The petition states that: (1) the Petitioner holds title to a majority in value of the land to be included in the proposed District; (2) there are no lienholders on the property to be included in the proposed District; (3) the proposed District will contain approximately 181.5664 acres located within Ellis County, Texas; and (4) none of the land within the proposed District is within the corporate limits or extraterritorial jurisdiction of any city.

The territory to be included in the proposed District is depicted in the vicinity map designated as Exhibit "A," which is attached to this document.

The petition further states that the proposed District will: (1) purchase, construct, acquire, improve, or extend inside or outside of its boundaries any and all works, improvements, facilities, plants, equipment, and appliances necessary or helpful to supply and distribute water for municipal, domestic, and commercial purposes; (2) collect, transport, process, dispose of and control domestic, and commercial wastes; (3) gather, conduct, divert, abate, amend, and control local storm water or other local harmful excesses of water in the proposed District; (4) design, acquire, construct, finance, improve, operate, and maintain macadamized, graveled, or paved roads and turnpikes, or improvements in aid of those roads; and (5) purchase, construct, acquire, improve, or extend inside or outside of its boundaries such additional facilities, systems, plants, and enterprises as shall be consonant with all of the purposes for which the proposed District is created. Additionally, the proposed District will be granted road powers.

According to the petition, a preliminary investigation has been made to determine the cost of the project, and it is estimated by the Petitioners that the cost of said project will be approximately \$21,490,000 (\$12,925,000 for water, wastewater, and drainage and \$8,565,000 for roads).

CONTESTED CASE HEARING. The TCEQ may grant a contested case hearing on this petition if a written hearing request is filed within 30 days after the newspaper publication of this notice.

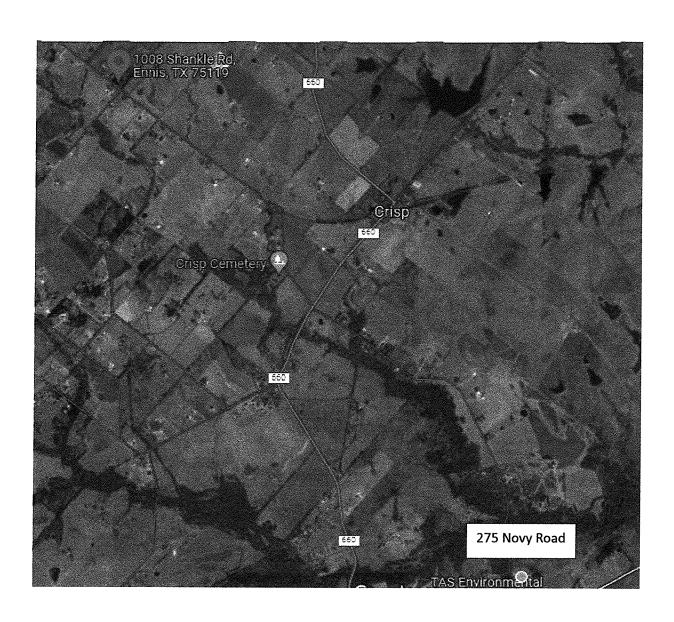

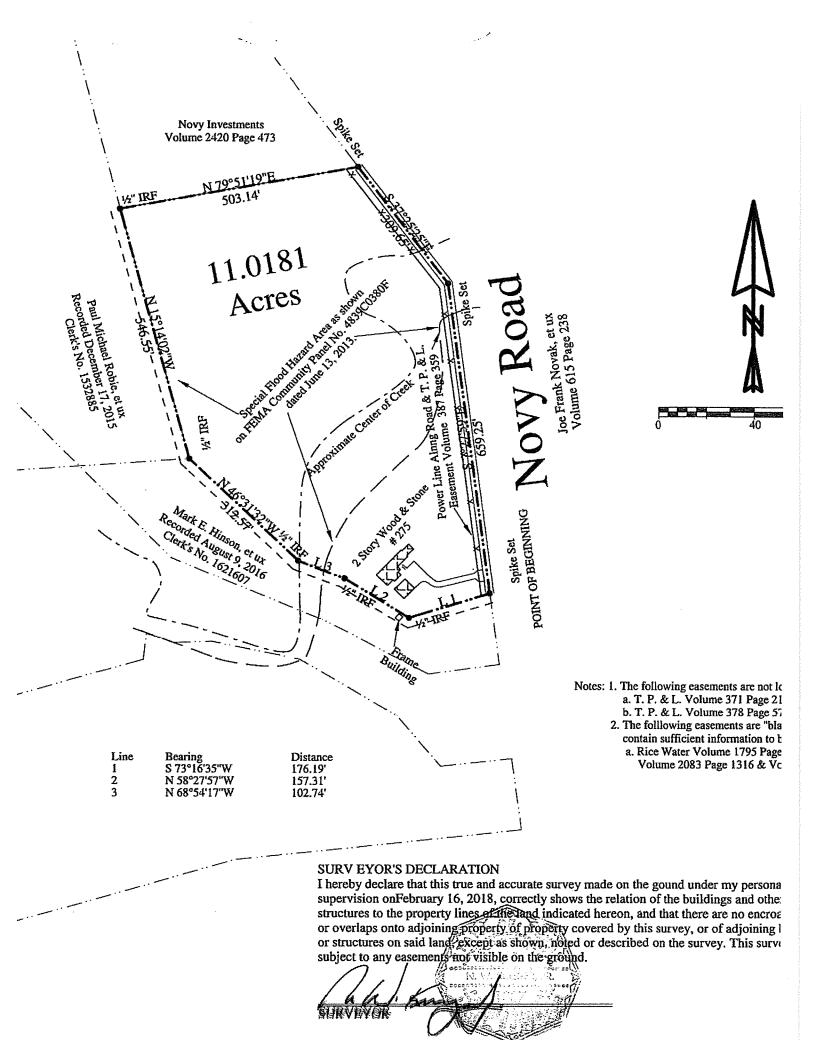

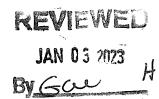

I am an affected person entitled to a contested case hearing on the issues raised in this hearing request. My property is located at 317 Shankle Road, Ennis, TX 75119.

The creation of this Utility District uniquely and adversely affects me in the following ways:

- Water runoff- This is a concern for all surrounding property owners in the area due to an inadequate drainage plan that was submitted by the Petitioner. This is a big concern for my property. I am located South of this District that is trying to be created. The apparent plan is to drain into the creek across Shankle Road from the property. With being said, the runoff will dump into Four Mile Creek. The creek runs south of the property parallel to Shankle Road. Four Mile Creek runs on my property on the south end and is connected to Crisp Cemetery. This is a big concern that will affect the land and surrounding areas. How much drainage/water runoff will affect the area? This is 100% concern to the surrounding area that was not considered in this project.
- Flooding/drainage- When it rains it floods. My property is the drain for all Shankle Road. All the water from flooding dumps into FOUR MILE CREEK and drains downstream under FM 660 and travels further down all the way to Telico and then the Trinity River. As you can see, FOUR MILE CREEK goes through my property. When there is any type of flooding this plays a huge factor to my property. I am not happy that the plan is to dump water and the sewer treatment plant into this creek. Overall, this will be a big concern for my property and my family. With being said, all the dumping from this District, on top of heavy rain becomes a big concern. The flooding of both combined will create a problem for my property. Heavy rain already plays a big factor in destroying the environment with wash out. Now, you have sewer, odors, chemicals come into play that will affect my property long term. The flooding already affects the process of me

cutting of (hay). I process hay for myself and other farmers in the area. Some flooding already takes away some of the hay process. Now, with the adding of sewage being dumped into the creeks, on top of flooding it will affect one quarter to half of my land. My land is considered majority a flood zone, so with the dumping up stream it will start to affect the grasses, trees and outcome of keeping my property contained. Not only, does this affect my property, but my property is next to the Crisp cemetery where this creek flows. On top of the drainage of the sewage plant and flooding water it will destroy the cemetery as well. The Cemetery is made for people to rest in peace. They're not made to be soaked in sewage. An extensive drainage plan should be demanded for the entire drainage/flooding inclusive of the entire path through Ellis County.

- Smells/Odor due to Sewer treatment plant- There are so many chemicals that come into play in controlling a sewer treatment plant. No matter what you do or how you do it, the smell is still going to be there. The smell from treatment plants can play a big factor for people living in the area. Respiratory symptoms, fatigue, and headache are main concerns for individuals living to close a sewer treatment plant. Not only does it play a major factor on humans, but animals as well. It will affect all the livestock in the area, including my property. Including my cattle on top of the surrounding properties that have livestock will be affected. Plans submitted by the Petitioner are inadequate for the proposed development and additional developments the developer may add to the District. An extensive environmental impact study should be demanded regarding the effects of the excessive water generated by development and effects of crop contamination downstream.
- Trash/Debris- Trash becomes a big concern for the area as well. With this amount of volume of people in one area creates an excessive amount of trash and clutter throughout surrounding properties. The Petitioner has not addressed the negative impact of how it will affect the area. It can also affect the creeks, livestock, smell/odor and the local landfill. There needs to be a study to see how the control of trash will be contained in this District.
- Traffic- The traffic concern to this much volume will be a concern to the area. The roads can't handle the current traffic that is controlled everyday now. The roads need to be repaired right now and still hasn't been done yet. These county roads aren't made for that many cars every day. Is the county going to keep an eye on the roads and keep them repaired daily for the commute for the everyday driver.
- Emergency Services- The Garrett and Bristol fire departments will not be equipped to handle the additional services, manpower and equipment needed for adequate fire protection for the additional developments. It already takes a good amount of time to have the services of Sheriffs Department to show up. Just with the experience of dealing with theft in the area. We do have the fire departments in the area, but a lot of individuals

are volunteer. We barely have enough individuals to cover the area now. Even if the Petitioner donates land for a new Fire Station (which he hasn't) additional equipment and manpower will be needed. Then current residents will have to pay for the additional cost.

• Safety/crime- The adding of low-cost housing developments usually creates additional threats of theft, vandalism, and additional crimes that will create more burdens for the Ellis County Sheriffs Dept. This becomes an issue for getting more security for local neighbors. It creates a threat for neighbors and surrounding landowners with worrying about your property while you aren't home. The Petitioner is trying to bring a District with as many people as possible to a rural area. This doesn't look good for the county and state.

Overall, the decision of this MUD District is something that needs to be overlooked well. All the details are not there and is going to play a big factor across the board for myself and the surrounding area. My property is one of the main concerns for this District. Everything that is drained from this property will be dumped into my backyard. The Petitioner is not taking it into consideration how much is going to be affected in the area. In this circumstance, if the county, state, congressmen or whoever has the final say so let's this stand, you have no care for the citizens that will be affected in the outcome. Take in consideration the amount of people in one area, especially a rural area. The amount of waste that will be dumped and damaging the environment because it will not be controlled. The affects on individuals due to trash/sewage smell. The affect on all livestock, wildlife in the area, the habitat for the animals. That also includes the threat to agricultural concerns for farmers who harvest hay for their livestock (myself included). PETITION. Steve Selinger, (Petitioner) filed a petition for creation of Shankle Road Municipal Utility District of Ellis County (District) with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ). The petition was filed pursuant to Article XVI, §59 and Article III, §52 of the Constitution of the State of Texas; Chapters 49 and 54 of the Texas Water Code; 30 Texas Administrative Code Chapter 293; and the procedural rules of the TCEQ.

The petition states that: (1) the Petitioner holds title to a majority in value of the land to be included in the proposed District; (2) there are no lienholders on the property to be included in the proposed District; (3) the proposed District will contain approximately 181.5664 acres located within Ellis County, Texas; and (4) none of the land within the proposed District is within the corporate limits or extraterritorial jurisdiction of any city.

The territory to be included in the proposed District is depicted in the vicinity map designated as Exhibit "A," which is attached to this document.

The petition further states that the proposed District will: (1) purchase, construct, acquire, improve, or extend inside or outside of its boundaries any and all works, improvements, facilities, plants, equipment, and appliances necessary or helpful to supply and distribute water for municipal, domestic, and commercial purposes; (2) collect, transport, process, dispose of and control domestic, and commercial wastes; (3) gather, conduct, divert, abate, amend, and control local storm water or other local harmful excesses of water in the proposed District; (4) design, acquire, construct, finance, improve, operate, and maintain macadamized, graveled, or paved roads and turnpikes, or improvements in aid of those roads; and (5) purchase, construct, acquire, improve, or extend inside or outside of its boundaries such additional facilities, systems, plants, and enterprises as shall be consonant with all of the purposes for which the proposed District is created. Additionally, the proposed District will be granted road powers.

According to the petition, a preliminary investigation has been made to determine the cost of the project, and it is estimated by the Petitioners that the cost of said project will be approximately \$21,490,000 (\$12,925,000 for water, wastewater, and drainage and \$8,565,000 for roads).

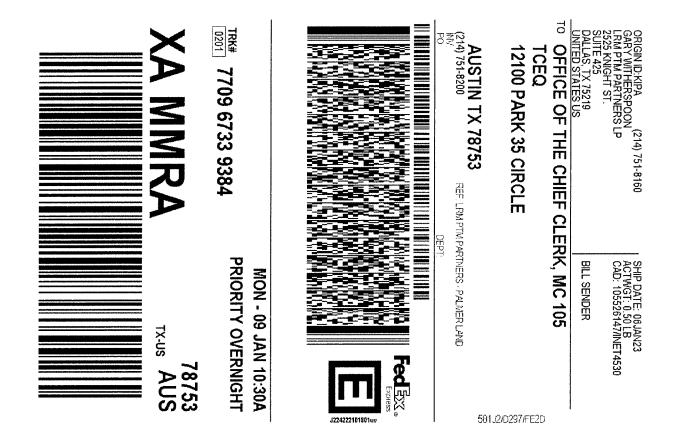
CONTESTED CASE HEARING. The TCEQ may grant a contested case hearing on this petition if a written hearing request is filed within 30 days after the newspaper publication of this notice.

To request a contested case hearing, you must submit the following: (1) your name (or for a group or association, an official representative), mailing address, daytime phone number, and fax number, if any; (2) the name of the Petitioners and the TCEQ Internal Control Number; (3) the statement "I/we request a contested case hearing"; (4) a brief description of how you would be affected by the petition in a way not common to the general public; and (5) the location of your property relative to the proposed District's boundaries. You may also submit your proposed adjustments to the petition which would satisfy your concerns. Requests for a contested case hearing must be submitted in writing to the Office of the Chief Clerk at the address provided in the information section below.

The Executive Director may approve the petition unless a written request for a contested case hearing is filed within 30 days after the newspaper publication of this notice. If a hearing request is filed, the Executive Director will not approve the petition and will forward the petition and hearing request to the TCEQ Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting. If a contested case hearing is held, it will be a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.

We are formally requesting a contested case hearing for the above referenced petition.

Our home is located at 7946 FM Rd 879, Palmer, TX 75152; 2 Shankle Estates- 10 Acres, Property ID 198321; Geographic 00.8260.000.002.00.110.

We purchased our home and property back in 1992 specifically because it was rural with surrounding attributes that were important to us. We have learned that there is the possibility of a Shankle Road Waste Water Treatment Plant and development of hundreds of low-cost homes behind our property. This is not a suitable area for such a development.

We are extremely concerned about the impact of a water treatment plant and the smells and odors it would create. We are demanding an EXTENSIVE ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STUDY regarding the effects of the excessive water generated by development and effects of crop contamination downstream.

Furthermore, we are very concerned as a property owner as an inadequate drainage plan was submitted by the Petitioner. It did not consider any drainage/water runoff to the East and South affected landowners.

We also worry about the Wildlife Impact. The Developer has shown that he will remove and destroy the entire habitat of the proposed development. This habitat provides protection for wildlife from heat, drought, and heavy rain. This area is and historically has been a nesting ground for wildlife due to the extensive number of trees, brush cover and ponds used by the wildlife in the area. The trees and natural vegetation are also a roosting area for migratory and local bird populations. All species of duck, geese, and waterfowl are regularly seen on the property. AN EXTENSIVE WILDLIFE IMPACT STUDY SHOULD BE PROVIDED AND DEMANDED FROM THE PETITIONER.

This development will also forcibly relocate predatory animals such as coyotes to surrounding properties burdening us and our neighbors with additional protection necessary for our chickens, ducks, geese, birds, pets and livestock.
