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Violation Information

- 1. Failed to dispose of all screenings and grit in an approved manner. Specifically, the container used to store the screenings did not have a lid [30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE § 317.4(b)(4)].
- 2. Failed to ensure the Facility and all of its systems of collection, treatment, and disposal are properly operated and maintained. Specifically, the clarifier and chlorine contact chamber contained an excessive amount of floating solids and plastics [30 Tex. Admin. Code § 305.125(1) and (5) and Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System ("TPDES") Permit No. WQ0010645001, Operational Requirements No. 1].
- 3. Failed to comply with permitted effluent limitations. Specifically, the chlorine residual, collected during the investigation, exceeded the effluent maximum limit of 4.0 milligrams per liter ("mg/L") with a reading of 4.8 mg/L [30 Tex. Admin. Code § 305.125(1), Tex. Water Code § 26.121(a)(1), and TPDES Permit No. WQ0010645001, Effluent Limitations and Monitoring Requirements No. 2].
- 4. Failed to report to the TCEQ in writing, any effluent violation which deviates from the permitted effluent limitation by more than 40% within five working days of becoming aware of the non-compliance. Specifically, the Respondent did not submit non-compliance notifications for dissolved oxygen ("DO") below the minimum for the monthly monitoring periods of August and September 2022 [30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE § 305.125(1) and (9)(A) and TPDES Permit No. WQ0010645001, Monitoring and Reporting Requirements No. 7.c].
- 5. Failed to assure the quality of all measurements through the use of blanks, standards, duplicates, and spikes. Specifically, the standard chlorine analyses were not performed on a 10% basis. Additionally, pH was analyzed weekly during July, November, and December 2022, however calibration of the pH meter was conducted only once per month [30 Tex. Admin. Code §§ 305.125(1) and 319.6 and TPDES Permit No. WQ0010645001, Monitoring and Reporting Requirements No. 2].
- 6. Failed to test the reduced-pressure backflow assemble ("RPBA") annually. Specifically, the Respondent did not conduct RPBA testing from 2022 through 2023 [30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE § 317.4(a)(8)].
- 7. Failed to properly maintain records of monitoring activities. Specifically, the identity of the person who performed the monitoring activities was not listed on daily operation records from July 2022 to February 2023, including flow readings and effluent analyses for pH, DO, and total chlorine residual [30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE § 305.125(1) and (11)(C)(ii) and TPDES Permit No. WQ0010645001, Monitoring and Reporting Requirements No. 3.c.ii].

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- 8. Failed to employ or contract with one or more licensed wastewater treatment facility operators or wastewater system operations companies holding a valid Class C license or higher. Specifically, the only operator for the Facility continued to operate after his license expired on July 7, 2022 [30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE §§ 30.350(d) and 305.125(1) and TPDES Permit No. WQ0010645001, Other Requirements No. 1].
- 9. Failed to maintain calibration records at the Facility and make them readily available for review by a TCEQ representative for a period of three years. Specifically, for the months of January 2022 to February 2023 the Respondent did not maintain calibration records for the DO meter, and there was no record of pH meter calibrations in September 2022 [30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE § 305.125(1) and TPDES Permit No. WQ0010645001, Monitoring and Reporting Requirements No. 3.b].

Technical Requirements:

- 1. The Order will require the Respondent to implement and complete a SEP (see SEP Attachment A).
- 2. The Order will also require the Respondent to:
- a. Within 30 days:
- i. Properly store bar screenings in a container with a lid;
- ii. Employ an operator with a valid Class C license or higher to operate the Facility for a minimum of five days per week;
- iii. Remove floating solids and plastics from the clarifier and chlorine contact chamber;
- iv. Test the RPBA at the Facility by a licensed tester; and
- v. Develop and implement procedures and conduct employee training to ensure that:
- a. Non-compliance notifications for effluent exceedances are submitted;
- b. Calibration records for the DO meter and pH meter are maintained at the Facility and made readily available for review;
- c. Standard chlorine analyses are performed on a 10% basis and the pH meter is calibrated each day that samples are analyzed; and

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- d. Monitoring records include the identity of the individual completing the daily operations records, flow readings and monitoring activities.
- b. Within 45 days, submit written certification of compliance with a..
- c. Within 130 days, submit written certification to demonstrate compliance with the permitted effluent limitations of TPDES Permit No. WQ0010645001 demonstrating at least three consecutive months of compliance with all permitted effluent limitations.

I. JURISDICTION AND STIPULATIONS

On	, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality ("the
Commission" or "TCI	EQ") considered this agreement of the parties, resolving an enforcement
action regarding the	City of Mart (the "Respondent") under the authority of TEX. WATER CODE chs.
7 and 26. The Execu	tive Director of the TCEQ, through the Enforcement Division, and the
Respondent together	stipulate that:

- 1. The Respondent owns and operates a wastewater treatment facility located at 1 Old Oil Mill Road in McLennan County, Texas (the "Facility"). The Facility is near or adjacent to water in the state as defined in Tex. Water Code § 26.001(5).
- 2. The Executive Director and the Respondent agree that the TCEQ has jurisdiction to enter this Order pursuant to Tex. Water Code §§ 7.002, 7.051, and 7.073, and that the Respondent is subject to TCEQ's jurisdiction. The TCEQ has jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to Tex. Water Code § 5.013 because it alleges violations of Tex. Water Code ch. 26 and the rules of the TCEO.
- 3. The occurrence of any violation is in dispute and the entry of this Order shall not constitute an admission by the Respondent of any violation alleged in Section II ("Allegations"), nor of any statute or rule.
- 4. An administrative penalty in the amount of \$36,920 is assessed by the Commission in settlement of the violations alleged in Section II ("Allegations"). The amount of \$7,384 is deferred contingent upon the Respondent's timely and satisfactory compliance with all the terms of this Order and shall be waived only upon full compliance with all the terms and conditions of this Order. If the Respondent fails to timely and satisfactorily comply with any of the terms and conditions contained in this Order, the Executive Director may demand payment of all or part of the deferred penalty amount.

Pursuant to Tex. Water Code § 7.067, \$29,536 of the penalty shall be conditionally offset by the Respondent's timely and satisfactory completion of a Supplemental Environmental Project ("SEP") as defined in the attached SEP Agreement ("Attachment A", incorporated herein by reference). The Respondent's obligation to pay the conditionally offset portion of the penalty shall be discharged upon full compliance with all the terms and conditions of this Order, which includes the timely and satisfactory completion of all provisions of the SEP Agreement, as determined by the Executive Director.

- 5. The Executive Director and the Respondent agree on a settlement of the matters alleged in this enforcement action, subject to final approval in accordance with 30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE § 70.10(a). Any notice and procedures, which might otherwise be authorized or required in this action, are waived in the interest of a more timely resolution of the matter.
- 6. The Executive Director may, without further notice or hearing, refer this matter to the Office of the Attorney General of the State of Texas ("OAG") for further enforcement proceedings if the Executive Director determines that the Respondent has not complied with one or more of the terms or conditions in this Order.
- 7. This Order represents the complete and fully integrated agreement of the parties. The provisions of this Order are deemed severable and, if a court of competent jurisdiction or other appropriate authority deems any provision of this Order unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall be valid and enforceable.
- 8. This Order shall terminate five years from its effective date or upon compliance with all the terms and conditions set forth in this Order, whichever is later.

II. ALLEGATIONS

During an investigation at the Facility conducted on March 9, 2023, an investigator documented that the Respondent:

- 1. Failed to dispose of all screenings and grit in an approved manner, in violation of 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 317.4(b)(4). Specifically, the container used to store the screenings did not have a lid.
- 2. Failed to ensure the Facility and all of its systems of collection, treatment, and disposal are properly operated and maintained, in violation of 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 305.125(1) and (5) and Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System ("TPDES") Permit No. WQ0010645001, Operational Requirements No. 1. Specifically, the clarifier and chlorine contact chamber contained an excessive amount of floating solids and plastics.
- 3. Failed to comply with permitted effluent limitations, in violation of 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 305.125(1), Tex. Water Code § 26.121(a)(1), and TPDES Permit No. WQ0010645001, Effluent Limitations and Monitoring Requirements No. 2. Specifically, the chlorine residual, collected during the investigation, exceeded the effluent maximum limit of 4.0 milligrams per liter ("mg/L") with a reading of 4.8 mg/L.
- 4. Failed to report to the TCEQ in writing, any effluent violation which deviates from the permitted effluent limitation by more than 40% within five working days of becoming aware of the non-compliance, in violation of 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 305.125(1) and (9)(A) and TPDES Permit No. WQ0010645001, Monitoring and Reporting Requirements No. 7.c. Specifically, the Respondent did not submit non-compliance notifications for dissolved oxygen ("DO") below the minimum for the monthly monitoring periods of August and September 2022.
- 5. Failed to assure the quality of all measurements through the use of blanks, standards, duplicates, and spikes, in violation of 30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE §§ 305.125(1) and 319.6 and TPDES Permit No. WQ0010645001, Monitoring and Reporting Requirements No. 2. Specifically, the standard chlorine analyses were not performed on a 10% basis.

Additionally, pH was analyzed weekly during July, November, and December 2022; however, calibration of the pH meter was conducted only once per month.

- 6. Failed to test the reduced-pressure backflow assemble ("RPBA") annually, in violation of 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 317.4(a)(8). Specifically, the Respondent did not conduct RPBA testing from 2022 through 2023.
- 7. Failed to properly maintain records of monitoring activities, in violation of 30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE § 305.125(1) and (11)(C)(ii) and TPDES Permit No. WQ0010645001, Monitoring and Reporting Requirements No. 3.c.ii. Specifically, the identity of the person who performed the monitoring activities was not listed on daily operation records from July 2022 to February 2023, including flow readings and effluent analyses for pH, DO, and total chlorine residual.
- 8. Failed to employ or contract with one or more licensed wastewater treatment facility operators or wastewater system operations companies holding a valid Class C license or higher, in violation of 30 Tex. Admin. Code §§ 30.350(d) and 305.125(1) and TPDES Permit No. WQ0010645001, Other Requirements No. 1. Specifically, the only operator for the Facility continued to operate after his license expired on July 7, 2022.
- 9. Failed to maintain calibration records at the Facility and make them readily available for review by a TCEQ representative for a period of three years, in violation of 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 305.125(1) and TPDES Permit No. WQ0010645001, Monitoring and Reporting Requirements No. 3.b. Specifically, for the months of January 2022 to February 2023 the Respondent did not maintain calibration records for the DO meter, and there was no record of pH meter calibrations in September 2022.

III. DENIALS

The Respondent generally denies each allegation in Section II ("Allegations").

IV. ORDERING PROVISIONS

NOW, THEREFORE, THE TEXAS COMMISSION ON ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ORDERS that:

1. The Respondent is assessed a penalty as set forth in Section I, Paragraph No. 4. The payment of this penalty and the Respondent's compliance with all of the requirements set forth in this Order resolve only the allegations in Section II. The Commission shall not be constrained in any manner from requiring corrective action or penalties for violations which are not raised here. Penalty payments shall be made payable to "TCEQ" and shall be sent with the notation "Re: City of Mart, Docket No. 2023-0668-MWD-E" to:

2. The Respondent shall implement and complete the SEP as set forth in Section I, Paragraph No. 4. The amount of \$29,536 of the assessed penalty is conditionally offset based on the Respondent's implementation and completion of the SEP pursuant to the terms of the SEP Agreement, as defined in Attachment A. Penalty payments for any

portion of the SEP deemed by the Executive Director as not complete shall be paid within 30 days after the date the Executive Director demands payment.

- 3. The Respondent shall undertake the following technical requirements:
 - a. Within 30 days after the effective date of this Order:
 - i. Properly store bar screenings in a container with a lid, in accordance with 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 317.4;
 - ii. Employ an operator with a valid Class C license or higher to operate the Facility for a minimum of five days per week, in accordance with 30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE § 30.350 and TPDES Permit No. WQ0010645001, Other Requirements No. 1;
 - iii. Remove floating solids and plastics from the clarifier and chlorine contact chamber;
 - iv. Test the RPBA at the Facility by a licensed tester, in accordance with 30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE § 317.4; and
 - v. Develop and implement procedures and conduct employee training to ensure that:
 - a. Non-compliance notifications for effluent exceedances are submitted in accordance with TPDES Permit No. WQ0010645001, Monitoring and Reporting Requirements, No. 7;
 - b. Calibration records for the DO meter and pH meter are maintained at the Facility and made readily available for review in accordance with TPDES Permit No. WQ0010645001, Monitoring and Reporting Requirements, No. 5;
 - c. Standard chlorine analyses are performed on a 10% basis and the pH meter is calibrated each day that samples are analyzed, in accordance with 30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE § 319.6; and
 - d. Monitoring records include the identity of the individual completing the daily operations records, flow readings and monitoring activities in accordance with TPDES Permit No. WQ0010645001, Monitoring and Reporting Requirements, No. 7.
 - b. Within 45 days after the effective date of this Order, submit written certification of compliance with Ordering Provision Nos. 3.a.i through 3.a.v, as described in Order Provision No. 3.d below.
 - c. Within 130 days after the effective date of this Order, submit written certification, to demonstrate compliance with the permitted effluent limitations of TPDES Permit No. WQ0010645001, including specific corrective actions that were implemented at the Facility to achieve compliance and copies of the most current self-reported discharge monitoring reports, demonstrating at least three consecutive months of compliance with all permitted effluent limitations.

d. The certifications for Ordering Provision Nos. 3.b and 3.c shall be signed by the Respondent and shall include the following certification language:

"I certify under penalty of law that I have personally examined and am familiar with the information submitted and all attached documents, and that based on my inquiry of those individuals immediately responsible for obtaining the information, I believe that the submitted information is true, accurate and complete. I am aware that there are significant penalties for submitting false information, including the possibility of fines and imprisonment for knowing violations."

- 4. All relief not expressly granted in this Order is denied.
- 5. The duties and provisions imposed by this Order shall apply to and be binding upon the Respondent. The Respondent is ordered to give notice of this Order to personnel who maintain day-to-day control over the Facility operations referenced in this Order.
- 6. The Executive Director may grant an extension of any deadline in this Order or in any plan, report, or other document submitted pursuant to this Order, upon a written and substantiated showing of good cause. All requests for extensions by the Respondent shall be made in writing to the Executive Director. Extensions are not effective until the Respondent receives written approval from the Executive Director. The determination of what constitutes good cause rests solely with the Executive Director. Extension requests shall be sent to the Enforcement Division at the address listed above.
- 7. This Order, issued by the Commission, shall not be admissible against the Respondent in a civil proceeding, unless the proceeding is brought by the OAG to: (1) enforce the terms of this Order; or (2) pursue violations of a statute within the Commission's jurisdiction, or of a rule adopted or an order or permit issued by the Commission under such a statute.
- 8. This Order may be executed in separate and multiple counterparts, which together shall constitute a single instrument. Any page of this Order may be copied, scanned, digitized, converted to electronic portable document format ("pdf"), or otherwise reproduced and may be transmitted by digital or electronic transmission, including but not limited to facsimile transmission and electronic mail. Any signature affixed to this

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Order shall constitute an original signature for all purposes and may be used, filed, substituted, or issued for any purpose for which an original signature could be used. The term "signature" shall include manual signatures and true and accurate reproductions of manual signatures created, executed, endorsed, adopted, or authorized by the person or persons to whom the signatures are attributable. Signatures may be copied or reproduced digitally, electronically, by photocopying, engraving, imprinting, lithographing, electronic mail, facsimile transmission, stamping, or any other means or process which the Executive Director deems acceptable. In this paragraph exclusively, the terms: electronic transmission, owner, person, writing, and written, shall have the meanings assigned to them under Tex. Bus. Org. Code § 1.002.

9. The effective date of this Order is the date it is signed by the Commission. A copy of this fully executed Order shall be provided to each of the parties.

Texas Commission on Environmental Quality ("the Commission" or "TCEQ") agrees to offset the administrative Penalty Amount assessed in this Agreed Order in exchange for Respondent's performance of a Supplemental Environmental Project ("SEP"). The SEP Offset Amount is set forth above and such offset is conditioned upon completion of the project in accordance with the terms of this Attachment A.

Respondent is a Local Government that qualifies under Texas Water Code § 7.067 to apply the SEP Offset Amount set forth above to correct violations at its wastewater treatment facility (the "Facility") which are described in this Agreed Order. This Agreed Order cites violations at Respondent's Facility.

1. Project Description

A. Project

Respondent shall hire a contractor to purchase and install two pumps for their lift station and replace an aerator at the Facility. Specifically, the SEP Offset Amount shall be used for materials, supplies, and equipment for two lift station pumps and an aerator (the "Project"). Respondent shall solicit bids from qualified contractors to perform the Project. Any advertisement or invitation for bids, including publication, related to the SEP must include the enforcement statement as stated below in Section 6, Publicity. The SEP will be performed in accordance with all federal, state, and local environmental laws and regulations, including permits that may be required prior to commencement of the SEP. The Commission's approval and issuance of this Agreed Order shall not itself be construed to authorize any activity for which Respondent is required by statute or rule to obtain authorization from the Commission.

Respondent shall use the SEP Offset Amount only for the direct cost of implementing the Project, including supplies, materials, and equipment rentals, as listed below in Subsection C. Minimum Expenditure, Estimated Cost Schedule. No portion of the SEP Offset Amount shall be spent on administrative costs, including operating costs, reporting expenses, handling of expenses, project coordination, liability, or equipment breakdowns.

Respondent's signature affixed to the attached Agreed Order certifies that Respondent has no prior commitment to perform this Project and that the SEP is being performed solely as part of the terms of settlement in this enforcement action.

B. Environmental Benefit

This SEP will provide a discernible environmental benefit by improving the quality of wastewater effluent being released into the environment. Inadequately treated effluent can carry bacteria, viruses, protozoa (parasitic organisms), helminths (intestinal worms), and bioaerosols (inhalable molds and fungi). The diseases they may cause range in severity from mild gastroenteritis to life-threatening ailments such as cholera, dysentery, infectious hepatitis,

and severe gastroenteritis. Additional risks include occurrences of low dissolved oxygen, fish kills, algal bloom, and bacterial contamination in waterways.

C. Minimum Expenditure

Respondent shall spend at least the SEP Offset Amount to complete the project described above in Section 1.A and comply with all other provisions of this SEP. Respondent understands that it may cost more than the SEP Offset Amount to complete the Project. Costs in excess of the SEP Offset Amount shall not be grounds to relieve Respondent of its obligations to perform this SEP.

2. Performance Schedule

Within 30 days after the effective date of this Agreed Order, Respondent shall begin implementation of the SEP. Respondent shall have completed the SEP in its entirety within 130 days after the effective date of this Agreed Order.

Executive Director ("ED") staff may grant an extension to any deadline for Respondent's performance of the SEP described herein, upon a written and substantiated showing of good cause. All requests for extensions must be made by Respondent and shall be made in writing to ED staff. Extensions are not effective until Respondent receives written approval from ED staff. 3. Records and Reporting

A. Progress Report

Within 30 days after the effective date of this Agreed Order, Respondent shall submit a Notice of Commencement to TCEQ describing actions performed to date to implement the Project. Within 90 days after the effective date of this Agreed Order, Respondent shall submit a report detailing the progress made and all actions completed on the Project during the previous 60-day period and setting forth a schedule for achieving completion of the Project within the 130-day timeframe set forth above in Section 2, Performance Schedule.

B. Final Report

Within 130 days after the effective date of the Agreed Order, or within 30 days after completion of the SEP, whichever is earlier, Respondent shall submit a Final Report to TCEQ, which shall include the following:

- 1. An itemized list of expenditures and total cost of the Project;
- 2. Copies of invoices or receipts corresponding to the itemized list in paragraph 3.B.1., above;
- 3. Copies of cleared checks or payment records corresponding to the itemized list in paragraph 3.B.1., above;
- 4. Copies of proof of advertisement of invitation for bids, if applicable;
- 5. A certified statement of SEP completion and document authentication;
- 6. A detailed map showing the specific location of the project site(s);
- 7. Copies of all engineering plans related to work performed pursuant to the Project, if applicable;
- 8. Dated photographs of the purchased materials and supplies; before and after work being performed during the Project; and of the completed Project; and
- 9. Any additional information Respondent believes will, or that is requested by TCEQ to demonstrate compliance with this Attachment A.

C. Submittals

Respondent shall submit all SEP reports and any additional information as requested to the SEP Coordinator at the address provided above.

4. Additional Information and Access

Respondent shall provide additional information as requested by TCEQ staff and shall allow access to all records related to the SEP Offset Amount. Respondent shall also allow representatives of TCEQ access to the site of any work being financed in whole or in part by the SEP Offset Amount. This provision shall survive the termination of this Agreed Order.

5. Failure to Fully Perform

If Respondent does not perform its obligations under this Attachment A, including full expenditure of the SEP Offset Amount and submittal of the required reporting described above in Sections 2 through 4, the ED may require immediate payment of all or part of the SEP Offset Amount as set forth in the attached Agreed Order.

In the event the ED determines that Respondent failed to fully implement and complete the Project, Respondent shall remit payment for all or a portion of the SEP Offset Amount, as determined by the ED, and as set forth in the attached Agreed Order. After receiving notice of failure to complete the SEP, Respondent shall include the docket number of the attached

Agreed Order and a note that the enclosed payment is for reimbursement of a SEP, shall make the check payable to "Texas Commission on Environmental Quality," and shall mail it to the SEP Coordinator at the address provided above.

6. Publicity

Any public statements concerning this Project made by or on behalf of Respondent must include a clear statement that **the Project was performed as part of the settlement of an enforcement action brought by TCEQ**. Such statements include advertising, public relations, and press releases.

7. Recognition

Respondent may not seek recognition for this project in any other state or federal regulatory program.

8. Other SEPs by TCEQ or Other Agencies

The SEP Offset Amount identified in this Attachment A and in the attached Agreed Order has not been, and shall not be, included as a SEP for Respondent under any other Agreed Order negotiated with TCEQ or any other agency of the state or federal government.
