





This is one of 4 developments seeking approval from the same petitioner, and when added to the 2 PIDs already under construction will create high volumes of water in to the same creek(s). A comprehensive flood study to include Boggy Branch, Armstrong Creek, Cottonwood Creek, and North Chambers Creek should be conducted downstream and to the City of Maypearl. 3. There are no LOMRs provided to build around the 100 year flood plain. 4. FIRM maps presented are not adequate to determine flooding (per Map) 5. I contest the following regarding the petition: The development is located within the water certificate of convenience and necessity ("CCN") held by Mountain Peak SUD. The development has the option to be serviced by Trinity River Authority, Mountain Creek Regional Wastewater System, which services the Cities of Venus and Midlothian. The Applicant already has partnered with the City of Venus and has constructed a municipal wastewater treatment plant (WQ0010883002) which could accept,( or expand as the city has stated) to receive the proposed waste, Water, Sewer and electric, are already available to this development without the necessity of creating a MUD. FEMA has not determined a Base Flood Elevation for Boggy Branch or Armstrong Creek in these Flood Plane Areas. There are no flow meters up stream or downstream from the proposed MUDs and their sewer plants. It would be impossible for any engineer to determine the increased flooding potential without a comprehensive flood study to include this MUD and the other3 proposed MUDs with their sewer plants. Knowing that the continuously flowing stream likely contains these contaminants will affect my family's enjoyment of the creek. Ellis County already has permitting regulations that allow building on larger lots that accommodate individual onsite septic systems and reduces stormwater runoff. 





Full access is limited by the presence of Cottonwood (aka East Fork of Chambers) and North Fork of Chambers Creeks. If flooding is exacerbated by MUDs on Armstrong Creek, my ability to lease my land for hay production will be harmed. Riparian buffer contracts are in place on both creeks where hay production is not feasible. Flood studies have not been updated to reflect the impact of MUDs on my 2 creeks and acres. Sewer effluent safety and storm water volume should both be considered in the studies.





Miskimon Management III, LLC and Buffalo Hills Development, LLC are applying to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (the "TCEQ") for creation of a new Brahman Ranch Municipal Utility District of Ellis County and Johnson County, located partially within the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the City of Midlothian. The City opposes the creation of the proposed district.

The City is an "affected person" entitled to a contested case hearing on issues raised in this hearing request because the City has interests related to legal rights, duties, privileges, powers, or economic interests affected by the application that are not common to the general public and is an affected person under 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 55.256. The proposed municipal utility district will be located partially within the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the City. The City does not consent to its creation. Pursuant to Texas Water Code § 54.016(a), land within the City's extraterritorial jurisdiction cannot be included within the boundaries of a municipal utility district without the City's consent. For this and additional reasons, local governments, such as the City, with authority under state law over issues contemplated by an application, may be considered affected persons under 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 55.256(b). The City has authority to protect the public health and safety within its extraterritorial jurisdiction and to regulate development within its extraterritorial jurisdiction. Tex. Loc. Gov't Code § 42.001, 212.044. Various city functions and services —

including water and sewer services, emergency services, and health and safety concerns – may be affected by the creation of the district and are not taken into account by the application.

As a regional water and sewer service provider, the City has an interest to ensure that new development in its extraterritorial jurisdiction regionalizes with the existing system to the greatest extent possible in order to protect the public health, safety, and welfare of its citizens, customers, and future customers. See Texas Water Code § 26.081(a). The City therefore has an interest in ensuring the creation and operation of the proposed municipal utility district is protective of the public health and safety within its extraterritorial jurisdiction. Thus, the City has authority under state law over the issues contemplated by this application, has interests not common to the general public, and is therefore an affected person. 30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE § 55.256(b).

For these reasons, the City requests that the Commission find that the City is an affected person and grant its request for a contested case hearing.
