Dear Mr. Keel,

In the TCEQ response to GEAA's Hays Commons MUD application comments dated February 12, 2024, you wrote:

"While GEAA alleges that it has multiple members who will be affected, no names or supporting evidence is provided to bolster this claim. Therefore, GEAA has failed to satisfy the requirement of 30 TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 55.252(a)(1). Because a group or association must satisfy all three requirements of TEX. ADMIN. CODE § 55.252, the Executive Director recommends finding that GEAA is not an affected person."
