Violation Information

- 1. Failed to renew a previously issued UST delivery certificate by submitting a properly completed UST registration and self-certification form at least 30 days before the expiration date. Specifically, the previous delivery certificate expired on January 31, 2022 [30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE § 334.8(c)(4)(A)(vii) and (c)(5)(B)(ii)].
- 2. Failed to make available to a common carrier a valid, current TCEQ delivery certificate before accepting delivery of a regulated substance into the USTs. Specifically, the Respondent accepted 19 fuel deliveries over a total of 13 months during February 2022 through May 2022, August 2022 through November 2022, January 2023, and August 2023 through November 2023, without a valid, current TCEQ delivery certificate [30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE § 334.8(c)(5)(A)(i) and Tex. WATER CODE § 26.3467(a)].
- 3. Failed to conduct the walkthrough inspections of the spill prevention and the release detection equipment every 30 days [30 Tex. Admin. Code § 334.48(h)(1)(A)(i) and (ii) and Tex. Water Code § 26.3475(c)(1) and (c)(2)].
- 4. Failed to monitor the UST in a manner which will detect a release at a frequency of at least once every 30 days by using interstitial monitoring for tanks installed on or after January 1, 2009. Specifically, the UST was installed on February 9, 2012, and the Respondent was not monitoring it using interstitial monitoring [30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE § 334.50(b)(1)(B) and Tex. WATER CODE § 26.3475(c)(1)].



I. JURISDICTION AND STIPULATIONS

On	, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality ("the
Commission" or "TCE	Q") considered this agreement of the parties, resolving an enforcement
action regarding Basti	op Independent School District (the "Respondent") under the authority of
TEX. WATER CODE chs.	7 and 26. The Executive Director of the TCEQ, through the Enforcement
Division, and the Resp	oondent, together stipulate that:

- 1. The Respondent owns and operates, as defined in 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 334.2(78) and (75), an underground storage tank ("UST") system and a fleet refueling facility located at 755 State Highway 21 West in Cedar Creek, Bastrop County, Texas (the "Facility"). The UST system at the Facility is not exempt or excluded from regulation under the Texas Water Code or the rules of the Commission, and contains or contained a regulated petroleum substance as defined in the rules of the TCEQ.
- 2. The Executive Director and the Respondent agree that the TCEQ has jurisdiction to enter this Order pursuant to Tex. Water Code §§ 7.002, 7.051, and 7.073, and that the Respondent is subject to TCEQ's jurisdiction. The TCEQ has jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to Tex. Water Code § 5.013 because it alleges violations of Tex. Water Code ch. 26 and the rules of the TCEQ.
- 3. The occurrence of any violation is in dispute and the entry of this Order shall not constitute an admission by the Respondent of any violation alleged in Section II ("Allegations"), nor of any statute or rule.
- 4. An administrative penalty in the amount of \$14,375 is assessed by the Commission in settlement of the violations alleged in Section II ("Allegations"). The Respondent paid \$11,500 of the penalty and \$2,875 is deferred contingent upon the Respondent's timely and satisfactory compliance with all the terms of this Order. The deferred amount shall be waived only upon full compliance with all the terms and conditions contained in this Order. If the Respondent fails to timely and satisfactorily comply with any of the terms or requirements contained in this Order, the Executive Director may demand payment of all or part of the deferred penalty amount.
- 5. The Executive Director and the Respondent agree on a settlement of the matters alleged in this enforcement action, subject to final approval in accordance with 30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE § 70.10(a). Any notice and procedures, which might otherwise be authorized or

required in this action, are waived in the interest of a more timely resolution of the matter.

- 6. The Executive Director may, without further notice or hearing, refer this matter to the Office of the Attorney General of the State of Texas ("OAG") for further enforcement proceedings if the Executive Director determines that the Respondent has not complied with one or more of the terms or conditions in this Order.
- 7. This Order represents the complete and fully integrated agreement of the parties. The provisions of this Order are deemed severable and, if a court of competent jurisdiction or other appropriate authority deems any provision of this Order unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall be valid and enforceable.
- 8. This Order shall terminate five years from its effective date or upon compliance with all the terms and conditions set forth in this Order, whichever is later.
- 9. The Executive Director recognizes that the Respondent submitted a properly completed UST registration and self-certification form and obtained a valid, current TCEQ delivery certificate on November 27, 2023.

II. ALLEGATIONS

During an investigation at the Facility conducted on November 8, 2023, an investigator documented that the Respondent:

- 1. Failed to renew a previously issued UST delivery certificate by submitting a properly completed UST registration and self-certification form at least 30 days before the expiration date, in violation of 30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE § 334.8(c)(4)(A)(vii) and (c)(5)(B)(ii). Specifically, the previous delivery certificate expired on January 31, 2022.
- 2. Failed to make available to a common carrier a valid, current TCEQ delivery certificate before accepting delivery of a regulated substance into the USTs, in violation of 30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE § 334.8(c)(5)(A)(i) and Tex. WATER CODE § 26.3467(a). Specifically, the Respondent accepted 19 fuel deliveries over a total of 13 months during February 2022 through May 2022, August 2022 through November 2022, January 2023, and August 2023 through November 2023, without a valid, current TCEQ delivery certificate.
- 3. Failed to conduct the walkthrough inspections of the spill prevention and the release detection equipment every 30 days, in violation of 30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE § 334.48(h)(1)(A)(i) and (ii) and Tex. Water Code § 26.3475(c)(1) and (c)(2).
- 4. Failed to monitor the UST in a manner which will detect a release at a frequency of at least once every 30 days by using interstitial monitoring for tanks installed on or after January 1, 2009, in violation of 30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE § 334.50(b)(1)(B) and Tex. WATER CODE § 26.3475(c)(1). Specifically, the UST was installed on February 9, 2012, and the Respondent was not monitoring it using interstitial monitoring,

III. DENIALS

The Respondent generally denies each allegation in Section II ("Allegations").

IV. ORDERING PROVISIONS

NOW, THEREFORE, THE TEXAS COMMISSION ON ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ORDERS that:

1. The Respondent is assessed a penalty as set forth in Section I, Paragraph No. 4. The payment of this penalty and the Respondent's compliance with all of the requirements set forth in this Order resolve only the allegations in Section II. The Commission shall not be constrained in any manner from requiring corrective action or penalties for violations which are not raised here. Penalty payments shall be made payable to "TCEQ" and shall be sent with the notation "Re: Bastrop Independent School District, Docket No. 2024-0167-PST-E" to:

- 2. The Respondent shall undertake the following technical requirements:
 - a. Within 30 days after the effective date of this Order:
 - i. Begin conducting the walkthrough inspections of the spill prevention and release detection equipment at least once every 30 days, in accordance with 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 334.48; and
 - ii. Implement interstitial monitoring release detection for the UST at the Facility, in accordance with 30 Tex. Admin. Code § 334.50.
 - b. Within 45 days after the effective date of this Order, submit written certification, and include detailed supporting documentation including photographs, receipts, and/or other records to demonstrate compliance with Ordering Provision No.
 2.a. The certification shall be signed by the Respondent and shall include the following certification language:

"I certify under penalty of law that I have personally examined and am familiar with the information submitted and all attached documents, and that based on my inquiry of those individuals immediately responsible for obtaining the information, I believe that the submitted information is true, accurate and complete. I am aware that there are significant penalties for submitting false information, including the possibility of fines and imprisonment for knowing violations."

- 3. All relief not expressly granted in this Order is denied.
- 4. The duties and provisions imposed by this Order shall apply to and be binding upon the Respondent. The Respondent is ordered to give notice of this Order to personnel who maintain day-to-day control over the Facility operations referenced in this Order.
- 5. The Executive Director may grant an extension of any deadline in this Order or in any plan, report, or other document submitted pursuant to this Order, upon a written and substantiated showing of good cause. All requests for extensions by the Respondent shall be made in writing to the Executive Director. Extensions are not effective until the Respondent receives written approval from the Executive Director. The determination of what constitutes good cause rests solely with the Executive Director. Extension requests shall be sent to the Enforcement Division at the address listed above.
- 6. This Order, issued by the Commission, shall not be admissible against the Respondent in a civil proceeding, unless the proceeding is brought by the OAG to: (1) enforce the terms of this Order; or (2) pursue violations of a statute within the Commission's jurisdiction, or of a rule adopted or an order or permit issued by the Commission under such a statute.
- 7. This Order may be executed in separate and multiple counterparts, which together shall constitute a single instrument. Any page of this Order may be copied, scanned, digitized, converted to electronic portable document format ("pdf"), or otherwise reproduced and may be transmitted by digital or electronic transmission, including but not limited to facsimile transmission and electronic mail. Any signature affixed to this Order shall constitute an original signature for all purposes and may be used, filed, substituted, or issued for any purpose for which an original signature could be used. The term "signature" shall include manual signatures and true and accurate reproductions of manual signatures created, executed, endorsed, adopted, or authorized by the person or persons to whom the signatures are attributable. Signatures may be copied or reproduced digitally, electronically, by photocopying, engraving, imprinting, lithographing, electronic mail, facsimile transmission, stamping, or any other means or process which the Executive Director deems acceptable. In this paragraph exclusively, the terms: electronic transmission, owner, person, writing, and written, shall have the meanings assigned to them under Tex. Bus. Org. Code § 1.002.

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8. The effective date of this Order is the date it is signed by the Commission. A copy of this fully executed Order shall be provided to each of the parties.
