AGREED ORDER DOCKET NO. 2024-0774-AIR-E

I. JURISDICTION AND STIPULATIONS

On	, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality ("the
Commission" or "7	CEQ") considered this agreement of the parties, resolving an enforcement
action regarding L	onestar Fiberglass Components of Texas, LLC (the "Respondent") under the
authority of Tex. H	EALTH & SAFETY CODE ch. 382 and TEX. WATER CODE ch. 7. The Executive
Director of the TC	EQ, through the Enforcement Division, and the Respondent together stipulate
that:	-

- 1. The Respondent owns and operates a fiberglass pool production plant located at 7150 North Interstate Highway 35 in New Braunfels, Comal County, Texas (the "Plant"). The Plant consists or consisted of one or more sources as defined in Tex. Health & Safety Code § 382.003(12).
- 2. The Executive Director and the Respondent agree that the TCEQ has jurisdiction to enter this Order pursuant to Tex. Water Code §§ 7.002, 7.051, and 7.073, and that the Respondent is subject to TCEQ's jurisdiction. The TCEQ has jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to Tex. Water Code § 5.013 because it alleges violations of Tex. Health & Safety Code ch. 382 and the rules of the TCEQ.
- 3. The occurrence of any violation is in dispute and the entry of this Order shall not constitute an admission by the Respondent of any violation alleged in Section II ("Allegations"), nor of any statute or rule.
- 4. An administrative penalty in the amount of \$99,750 is assessed by the Commission in settlement of the violations alleged in Section II ("Allegations"). On or about December 19, 2024, the Respondent filed a petition for bankruptcy relief pursuant to Chapter 11 of the United States Code. The automatic stay imposed by the Bankruptcy Code does not apply to the commencement or continuation of an action or proceeding by a governmental unit to enforce such governmental unit's police or regulatory power, by virtue of the exception set out at 11 USC § 362(b)(4). Accordingly, the TCEQ (a governmental unit as defined under 11 USC § 101(27)) is expressly excepted from the automatic stay in pursuing enforcement of the State's environmental protection laws and in seeking to enter a monetary judgment for such violations. However, so long as the automatic stay is in effect in the Respondent's bankruptcy proceedings, the TCEQ will not seek to execute upon any monetary judgment obtained without first approaching the United States Bankruptcy Court where the Respondent's bankruptcy

cases are pending, as necessary. The amount of \$19,950 is deferred contingent upon the Respondent's timely and satisfactory compliance with all the terms of this Order. Any deferred amount shall be waived only upon full compliance with all the terms and conditions contained in this Order. If the Respondent fails to timely and satisfactorily comply with any of the terms or requirements contained in this Order, the Executive Director may assess all or part of the deferred penalty.

- 5. The Executive Director and the Respondent agree on a settlement of the matters alleged in this enforcement action, subject to final approval in accordance with 30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE § 70.10(a). Any notice and procedures, which might otherwise be authorized or required in this action, are waived in the interest of a more timely resolution of the matter.
- 6. The Executive Director may, without further notice or hearing, refer this matter to the Office of the Attorney General of the State of Texas ("OAG") for further enforcement proceedings if the Executive Director determines that the Respondent has not complied with one or more of the terms or conditions in this Order.
- 7. This Order represents the complete and fully integrated agreement of the parties. The provisions of this Order are deemed severable and, if a court of competent jurisdiction or other appropriate authority deems any provision of this Order unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall be valid and enforceable.
- 8. This Order shall terminate five years from its effective date or upon compliance with all the terms and conditions set forth in this Order, whichever is later.

II. ALLEGATIONS

During an investigation at the Plant conducted on February 29, 2024, an investigator documented that the Respondent:

- 1. Failed to maintain records containing the information and data sufficient to demonstrate compliance with the permit, in violation of 30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE §§ 116.115(b)(2)(E)(i) and (c) and 122.143(4), New Source Review ("NSR") Permit No. 159174, Special Conditions ("SC") No. 11, Federal Operating Permit ("FOP") No. 04216, General Terms and Conditions ("GTC") and Special Terms and Conditions ("STC") Nos. 6 and 8, and Tex. Health & Safety Code § 382.085(b). Specifically, the Respondent did not provide requested records of the permit compliance certification ("PCC"); deviation reports; emission fees paid; emissions inventories; daily usage of materials; daily hours of operation; monthly summaries that reflect volatile organic compounds ("VOC") emissions as daily averages and in tons per year; compliance for the introduction of any new materials; performance tests, design, and evaluations; materials used for dry abrasive cleaning; total solvent makeup and usage for degreasing units; hours of fuel oil firing; resin and acetone usage; maintenance, start-up, and shutdown activities; operating hours for portable and emergency engines; and engine maintenance, hours of operation, and fuel hydrogen sulfide ("H2S") content for stationary engines.
- 2. Failed to submit a deviation report no later than 30 days after the end of each reporting period, in violation of 30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE §§ 122.143(4) and 122.145(2)(C), FOP No. O4216, GTC, and Tex. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE § 382.085(b). Specifically, the deviation reports for the January 1, 2023 through June 30, 2023 and July 1, 2023 through

December 31, 2023 reporting periods were due by July 30, 2023 and January 30, 2024 respectively, but were not submitted.

3. Failed to certify compliance with the terms and conditions of the permit for at least each 12-month period following initial permit issuance and failed to submit a PCC within 30 days of any certification period, in violation of 30 Tex. ADMIN. CODE §§ 122.143(4) and 122.146(1) and (2), FOP No. O4216, GTC and STC No. 9, and Tex. Health & Safety Code § 382.085(b). Specifically, the PCC for the January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023 certification period was due by January 30, 2024, but was not submitted.

III. DENIALS

The Respondent generally denies each allegation in Section II ("Allegations").

IV. ORDERING PROVISIONS

NOW, THEREFORE, THE TEXAS COMMISSION ON ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ORDERS that:

1. The Respondent is assessed a penalty as set forth in Section I, Paragraph No. 4. The assessment of this penalty and the Respondent's compliance with all of the requirements set forth in this Order resolve only the allegations in Section II. The Commission shall not be constrained in any manner from requiring corrective action or penalties for violations which are not raised here. Penalty payments may be made payable to "TCEQ" and sent with the notation "Re: Lonestar Fiberglass Components of Texas, LLC, Docket No. 2024-0774-AIR-E" to:

- 2. The Respondent shall undertake the following technical requirements:
 - a. Within 30 days after the effective date of this Order:
 - i. Submit the complete records of the PCC; deviation reports; emission fees paid; emissions inventories; daily usage of materials; daily hours of operation; monthly summaries that reflect VOC emissions as daily averages and in tons per year; compliance for the introduction of any new materials; performance tests, design, and evaluations; materials used for dry abrasive cleaning; total solvent makeup and usage for degreasing units; hours of fuel oil firing; resin and acetone usage; maintenance, start-up, and shutdown activities; operating hours for portable and emergency engines; and engine maintenance, hours of operation, and fuel H2S content for stationary engines;
 - ii. Submit the deviation reports for the January 1, 2023 through June 30, 2023 and July 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023 reporting periods;

- iii. Submit the PCC for the January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023 certification period; and
- iv. Implement procedures designed to ensure that the PCCs are submitted in a timely manner.
- b. Within 45 days after the effective date of this Order, submit written certification, and include detailed supporting documentation including photographs, receipts, and/or other records to demonstrate compliance with Ordering Provision No.
 2.a. The certification shall be signed by the Respondent and shall include the following certification language:

"I certify under penalty of law that I have personally examined and am familiar with the information submitted and all attached documents, and that based on my inquiry of those individuals immediately responsible for obtaining the information, I believe that the submitted information is true, accurate and complete. I am aware that there are significant penalties for submitting false information, including the possibility of fines and imprisonment for knowing violations."

- 3. All relief not expressly granted in this Order is denied.
- 4. The duties and provisions imposed by this Order shall apply to and be binding upon the Respondent. The Respondent is ordered to give notice of this Order to personnel who maintain day-to-day control over the Plant operations referenced in this Order.
- 5. The Executive Director may grant an extension of any deadline in this Order or in any plan, report, or other document submitted pursuant to this Order, upon a written and substantiated showing of good cause. All requests for extensions by the Respondent shall be made in writing to the Executive Director. Extensions are not effective until the Respondent receives written approval from the Executive Director. The determination of what constitutes good cause rests solely with the Executive Director. Extension requests shall be sent to the Enforcement Division at the address listed above.
- 6. This Order, issued by the Commission, shall not be admissible against the Respondent in a civil proceeding, unless the proceeding is brought by the OAG to: (1) enforce the

terms of this Order; or (2) pursue violations of a statute within the Commission's jurisdiction, or of a rule adopted or an order or permit issued by the Commission under such a statute.

- 7. This Order may be executed in separate and multiple counterparts, which together shall constitute a single instrument. Any page of this Order may be copied, scanned, digitized, converted to electronic portable document format ("pdf"), or otherwise reproduced and may be transmitted by digital or electronic transmission, including but not limited to facsimile transmission and electronic mail. Any signature affixed to this Order shall constitute an original signature for all purposes and may be used, filed, substituted, or issued for any purpose for which an original signature could be used. The term "signature" shall include manual signatures and true and accurate reproductions of manual signatures created, executed, endorsed, adopted, or authorized by the person or persons to whom the signatures are attributable. Signatures may be copied or reproduced digitally, electronically, by photocopying, engraving, imprinting, lithographing, electronic mail, facsimile transmission, stamping, or any other means or process which the Executive Director deems acceptable. In this paragraph exclusively, the terms: electronic transmission, owner, person, writing, and written, shall have the meanings assigned to them under Tex. Bus. Org. Code § 1.002.
- 8. The effective date of this Order is the date it is signed by the Commission. A copy of this fully executed Order shall be provided to each of the parties.
