My name is Donna Adair and my husband and myself live at 8002 Contrary Creek Rd, approximately 1 mile from the Wolf Hollow Power Plant in Hood County, Texas. This letter is concerning the request from Constellation Energy, owners of Wolf Hollow Power Plant II, to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) asking for permission (Proposed Permit. 175,173) to expand their operations from 4 Turbines to 8 Turbines for a total of 12 turbines – basically tripling the amount of air hazardous pollutants they are now emitting into the air.

Not to name all of the pollutants mentioned in the letter from TCEQ since I'm sure you already know, but the thought of triple the amounts of Carbon Monoxide, Nitrogen Oxide, Sulfur Dioxide, Sulfur Hexafluoride and Sulfuric Acid Mist is rather overwhelming to say the least.

The residents who live near Wolf Hollow Power Plant (isn't there supposed to be a 3-mile safety buffer surrounding power plants) not only have to deal with the pollutants coming directly from Wolf Hollow, but we also are having to deal with the noise, health, property value loss, etc. coming from the Marathon Digital Bitcoin Mining Plant adjacent to, and leasing from, said power plant. There has been a study done by Earthjustice that declares Wolf Hollow Power Plant was operating at 66% capacity before Marathon's Bitcoin began operating, and now they are at 99% capacity. They obviously need more power to continue to supply the Marathon Bitcoin Plant electricity as it is, and when it becomes larger, they will need much more power – hence the need for more Power Plants and turbines.

I am NOT against more electricity but I AM against more air pollutants, noise, etc. so that a company as life wrecking as Marathon Digital can continue to make our lives hell.

Thank you for your time and I pray your considerations will lead you to deny Permit #175,173.

SPEECH ON THE TEXAS COMMISSION ON ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY (TCEQ) REQUEST

I'm going to try and stick to this paper, because I definitely can go down rabbit trails and get lost.

I have submitted 2 pictures of the air contamination coming from the Wolf Hollow Power Plant. I can't be sure, but I think it was only coming from the two turbines at Wolf Hollow. We live about a mile away from this plant. I can't imagine the steam/air pollutants that would come from adding 8 more turbines!

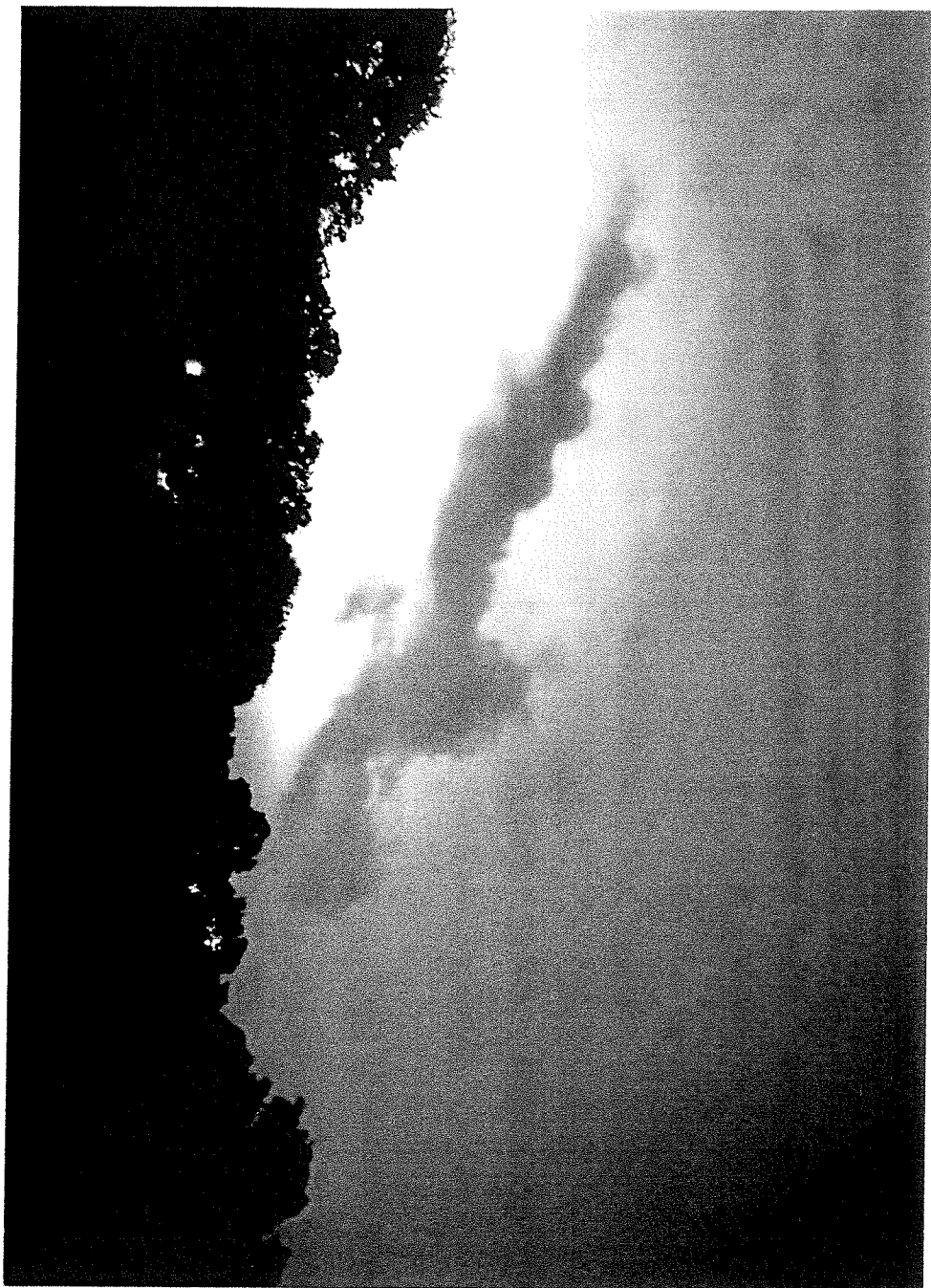
From what I understand the added air pollution, according to the TCEQ Notice of Application, mentions SIGNIFICANT amounts of Carbon Monoxide, Nitrogen Oxides, Sulfur Dioxide, Sulfur Hexafluoride, Organic Compounds, Particulate Matter, Greenhouse Gases and SULFURIC ACID MIST, will affect the people, animals, plants, pastures, fish and water for miles around. Not to mention the fact that if we become a designated non-attainment area it will affect our economy, from businesses to individuals, and I personally don't want to have to pay to have my cars tested for emissions.

I understand one of the reasons Wolf Hollow is requesting more turbines is due to having the Marathon Digital Bitcoin Mining Plant connected to them. One report by Earthjustice states they have gone from working at around 66% to 99% since the Bitcoin Plant was added. Initially Wolf Hollow was designed as a "peaker plant" only to be used at peak grid needs, it was not designed to run 24/7/365 and now it does. I know my electric bill has gone up substantially in the last couple of years. I can understand the need for reliable, plentiful electricity, but with 1/3rd of the power going to the Bitcoin Data plant, I don't really think adding 8 more turbines is fair to the people having to deal with all the added contaminants the plant will put out.

Even though I've been called a "radical leftist environmental type" – which I've been called worse – I'm just a concerned Christian conservative grandmother who wants to try and keep as much pollution down, as long as possible.

COMMENTS: My name is Donna Adair, I live at 8002 Contrary Creek Rd, Granbury, Texas, approximately 1 mile from the Wolf Hollow II Power plant. I would like it to be known that I vehemently oppose ANY MORE additions to this area, especially ones that will produce known air contaminants in any amount - much less a significant amount! Constellation Energy has applied to the Texas Energy Fund for a loan in order to build more gas burning electric generation units and there are already four fracked gas burning units, Wolf Hollow I and II, and the Marathon Digital Bitcoin mining plant. We already are dealing with these issues: Noise from the Bitcoin mine and the existing power plants; smells from the gas plants; visible pollution from the gas plants; and the threat of fires or explosions. The notice from the TCEQ itself says that SIGNIFICANT amounts of carbon monoxide, nitrogen oxides, hazardous air pollutants, organic compounds, sulfur dioxide, sulfur hexafluoride AND sulfuric acid mist will be released - along with greenhouse gases. I've researched this a little and what I've read on the epa.gov/pmcourse/what-particle-pollution says, in part: "Some particles can remain in the atmosphere for days to weeks! Consequently, particle pollution generated in one area can travel hundreds or thousands of miles and influence the air quality of regions far from the original source." "Because of their small size, fine particles outdoors can penetrate into homes and buildings. Therefore, high outdoor particle levels can elevate indoor particle pollution concentrations." I'm afraid Constellation Energy, who leases the land that Marathon Digital has their Bitcoin mines on, is wanting to construct more turbines so they can encourage more Bitcoin plants or other industrial businesses to our area. PLEASE, PLEASE we've already suffered so much dealing with the noise and health issues already going on around here, PLEASE don't approve their request to add more misery to our lives. To Whom It May Concern:

I request a contested case hearing against Wolf Hollow Power Plant III proposed Air Quality Standard Permit, No. 175173. I live at 8015 Contrary Creek Rd, which is within 1700 yards of this proposed facility. I am also requesting a public meeting on this proposed permit.

I am opposed to this permit application because of extreme noise pollution that flows with the wind. The prevailing wind direction comes from the south/southeast and the noise pollution from that facility flows unimpeded and therefore is an air contaminate.

1. I do not believe that Wolf Hollow will actually run at the threshold that they would need to in order to satisfy their minor source designation. There are no enforcement clauses or tools that ensure that they will run under 3500 hours a year.
2. There is an ongoing nuisance lawsuit from a bitcoin mining company that is itself a tenant, and Wolf Hollow should deal with resolving that suit before building a new natural gas plant (that may be providing energy for that mine).

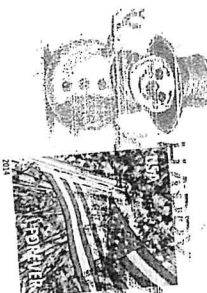

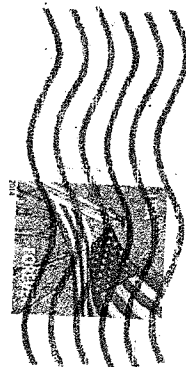

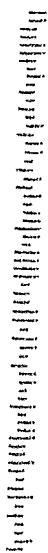

Hello,

I'm Mark Beatty. I live on Contrary Creek Rd, Granbury TX. I want to point out that I'm about .70 of a mile north of Wolf Hollow II and Marathon crypto facility and I live on a 10 acre mini-ranch. I also want to point out that I was well aware of the original Wolf Hollow II power facility when I purchased the property 7 1/2 years ago. Wolf Hollow gave off some noise and I was willing to tolerate it so I'm not a person that moves into a brand new housing complex next to an airport and then cries foul get rid of the airport. I am also not opposed to crypto mining if it is done responsibly. But it is not being done responsibly.

Here's where the rub gets very irritating. I have never had one piece of mail or one person come to my door or any other form of communication or communicator come and tell me they were thinking of putting in a new facility nor tell me that they want to expand the power plant from 2 turbines to 10. Not one warning was given! It would appear that Constellation, the owners of Wolf Hollow and lessor of the property to Marathon were going to go willy nilly on everyone that lived in the area. As I've alluded to, I am not totally opposed to Constellation making energy or wealth per se. But I'm now at my limit.

There is evidence of harmful activity near the Constellation facility that is affecting people of all walks of life in the surrounding area and it is happening now. That evidence is declining health and welfare of residents around that facility. It has no economic boundaries either. No age boundaries. Not even human boundaries because it's having an impact on pets! Could it be gasses/exhaust in the air and or pulsing sound waves. Is it compounds that are released into the air as I've learned recently, like mercury. How would we know? Are there any public documents released or testing currently being done?

There are explosions at random coming from Wolf Hollow. Very large and long lasting explosions! And it is happening more regularly. And the constant rumble of cooling apparatus is unreal! For me it is making me sick with tinnitus and hearing issues, stress-anxiety, head aches, insomnia, vertigo, chest palpitations, and lack of energy, on top of monetary losses of real estate value and theft of my right to enjoy my property as I am entitled to. I've learned it is doing similar things to neighbors and their animals at more extreme levels. I have no proof these issues are produced by the exhaust of the turbines or the rumble of the coolers at Marathon but it didn't occur in previous years and it has progressively increased

since the new equipment was put in and the explosions have increased at Wolf Hollow. And I can say there has been a reduction of some issues and I'm feeling some relief because they've turned these units off at least in my regards, but especially when known visitors approach which has been mentioned to me.

Frankly, I thought Constellation was just fixing their equipment and naively surmised they'd be done soon enough and things would go back to normal.

That Marathon is responsible for much of the bad effects and Wolf Hollow/ Constellation is asking them to correct those issues is not honest. Wolf Hollow has now got to own up to the environmental issues and not defer the blame. They are all in cahoots and Constellation, Wolf Hollow, and Marathon which are one in the same must be held responsible for the negative impacts in the rural occupied area.

I went to your web-site on July 29 and used a provided link to post a message to inquire about air and general environmental quality or lack of, regarding explosions that have occurred at Wolf Hollow. The July 23 Constellation explosion around 5:20am which made me think if my heart were to be weak I might have had a heart attack. TCEQ/Air Quality, you never responded!

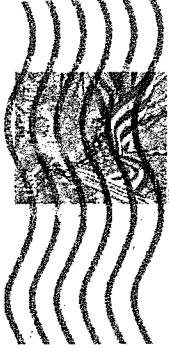

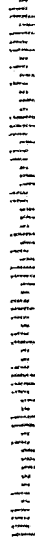

To: Whom it may concern:

I request a contested case hearing against the **Wolf Hollow Power Plant II** Proposed Air Quality Standard Permit, Registration No. 175173. I live at 2503 Pebble Dr., Granbury, TX 76048, which is within 6 miles of this proposed facility. I am also requesting a public meeting on this proposed permit.

I oppose this permit because:

- The natural gas used for the turbines has mercury in it which is not burned off by the turbines. This mercury will be in the exhaust and settles back onto the ground vegetation which is eaten by grazing livestock. It also settles into the Brazos River and into Lake Granbury, where people fish, then consume their catch.
- One major reason for their permit request is that they can provide power to meet an increased demand because of the data mining facility which is currently leasing land from Wolf Hollow.
- The Data mining facility is emitting harmful ultralow frequency noise (below the sound spectrum humans can hear) which I believe is causing health issues in area residents and their livestock.
- According to Dr. Mariana Alves-Pereira, who is the leading authority on how low frequency sound is an agent of disease, these low frequency sound waves present a much more serious health risk to humans and livestock than poor air quality does.
- She and her team have been researching vibroacoustic disease from infrasound/low frequency noise since 1980.
- Low frequency noise is classified by the World Health Organization as an inanimate mechanical force. This is a force below the frequencies which we can hear. This means that ultra-low frequency sound waves represent a mechanical impact to our cells and tissues.
- This means that low frequency sound is an agent of disease.
- The higher the frequency, the shorter the sound wave. The lower the frequency, the longer the sound wave.

- At 3000Hz the wavelength of airborne sound is 11 cm.
- At 500Hz the wavelength of airborne sound is 68 cm.
- At 100Hz the wavelength of airborne sound is 3.43 m.
- At 20Hz (the lowest sound frequency we can hear) the wavelength of airborne sound is 17.1 m.
- At 1 Hz, it is 343 M.
- These distances represent what the thickness which any insulation wall would need to be if Marathon decided to build such a barrier wall to shield area residents from the impact of these low frequency sound waves to prevent damage to human and livestock health. Make no mistake, this is a serious health problem. It is serious enough that any typical sound study performed using the decibel scale that usual sound studies use, would be invalid because such sound studies are conducted merely to detect sound waves within the range of normal human hearing, with the goal to protect people from hearing loss.
- Our bodies react to this inanimate mechanical impacting force by thickening our tissues. This means our bodies produce thicker walls in our arteries and veins to protect us from this. Our bodies also develop thicker membranes around our hearts, thicker membranes around our brains, increase tissue mass on our joints, and in livestock has proven to develop a thickening of the tendons and ligaments in their ankles and knees.
- We have residents near the Marathon data mining facility who have developed health issues at a much earlier age than these problems usually present themselves.
- One lady has developed heart problems which normally would not occur to someone her age.
- Another woman has a mass in her brain which has been examined by physicians and this mass has been shown to not be cancerous growth, and not the cause of a stroke. Nonetheless, the mass, or tumor (for lack of being able to correctly identify this invasive brain mass) is presenting significant health issues which we believe considering the information provided by Dr. Alves-Periera on low frequency sound—is quite possibly being caused by low frequency sound being emitted by Marathon's data mining facility.
- Other symptoms that area residents are experiencing which we believe are related to the low frequency noise emitted by the data harvesting facility are:

Permanent conduction hearing loss
 Nausea and gastrointestinal issues
 Headaches
 Sleep disturbances
 Heart palpitations
 Stress
 Shortness of breath
 Coughing
 Dizziness
 Fatigue

This video is just over 58 minutes, and it will enlighten you to the absolute necessity of conducting your sound study in a manner which will quantify the sound in terms of determining if the noise at the data mining facility is an agent of disease.

Lecture given in Slovenia about the effects of noise and sound waves on human and livestock health.

- She and her team have been researching vibroacoustic disease from infrasound/low frequency noise since 1980.
- Agent of disease, which is infrasound and low frequency noise.
- Sound waves, or noise, are classified by the World Health Organization as an inanimate mechanical force, which we may or not hear. This means that ultra-low frequency sound waves represent a mechanical impact to our cells and tissues.
- The higher the frequency, the shorter the sound wave.
- At 3000Hz the wavelength of airborne sound is 11 cm.
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- At 1 Hz, it's 343 M.
- These distances represent what the thickness requirement would be if Marathon decided to build an insulation wall to shield area residents from the impact of these low frequency sound waves to prevent damage to human and livestock health. Make no mistake, this is a serious health problem. It is serious enough that a sound study performed using the decibel scale that usual sound studies use would be invalid because such sound studies are designed merely to protect affected people from hearing loss.
- Our bodies react to this inanimate mechanical impacting force by thickening our tissues. This means our bodies produce thicker walls in our arteries and veins to protect us from this. Our bodies also develop thicker membranes around our hearts, thicker membranes around our brains and livestock has proven to develop a thickening of the tendons and ligaments in their ankles and knees.
- We have residents in close proximity to the Marathon data mining facility who have developed masses in their brains which have been examined by physicians and these masses have been shown to not be cancerous growth and not the cause of a stroke. Nonetheless, the mass, or tumor (for lack of being able to correctly

identify this invasive brain mass) is presenting significant health issues which we believe considering the information provided by Dr. Alves-Periera on low frequency sound—is quite possibly being caused by low frequency sound being emitted by Marathon's data mining facility.

"This is the problem with low frequency noise. It penetrates the buildings. It penetrates the earth."

- At a frequency of 1000 Hz we hear very well.
- Occupational hearing loss is defined as occurring at 4000 Hz.
- The human baby cries at about 3500 Hz.

These wavelength measurements represent the required thickness of what an insulation wall must be to protect us from the harmful effects of noise at these frequencies for human health. "The rule of thumb is that the thickness of the barrier must be on the order of the length of the wavelength."

Historically, we have concentrated our efforts on developing protection from noise only on our ears. An effort if you will, to protect our hearing. We have devised a system for measuring sound in decibels we call DBA. This system only measures the noise we can hear

It is the lower frequencies which are the most harmful to human health. This is the frequencies below which we can hear. And that noise, called infrasound, affects our biological tissue. It thickens the walls of our circulatory system. It thickens the walls of the membranes surrounding our heart, and the walls of the membranes surrounding our brain.

Dr Pereira also explains harmful issues found in livestock on ranches located in near proximity of wind turbines. These are very serious issues which cannot and should not be taken lightly. A simple google search asking how far low frequency sound waves will penetrate people, land and buildings yielded the answer of "**Hundreds of miles.**" This means that people living in the immediate vicinity of this data mining facility are not the only ones at risk. An improperly conducted sound study could fail to provide enough information to adequately protect the entire county. Please do not simply resign yourselves to being satisfied with Marathon's effort of switching to liquid cooling of the computer systems without conducting an adequate and worthwhile sound study, conducted using the proper equipment, or at the very least coordinating this test with a properly certified and well equipped team of experts to find what we are actually up against.

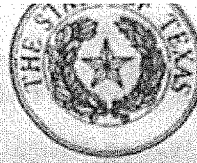

I am opposed to this permit because:

- The natural gas used for the turbines has mercury in it which is not consumed by the turbines. This mercury will be in the exhaust and settles back onto the ground which is then eaten by grazing livestock. It also settles into the Brazos River and ultimately into Lake Granbury, which is fished by locals who then consume their catch.
- One major reason for their permit request is so they can provide power to meet an increased demand because of the data mining facility which is currently leasing land from Wolf Hollow.

- The Data mining facility is emitting a lot of ultralow frequency noise (below the sound spectrum humans can hear) which I believe is causing health issues in area residents and their livestock.
- According to Dr. Mariana Alves-Pereira, who is the leading authority on how low frequency sound is an agent of disease, these low frequency sound waves present a much more serious health risk to humans and livestock than poor air quality does.
- She and her team have been researching vibroacoustic disease from infrasound/low frequency noise since 1980.
- Sound waves, or noise, are classified by the World Health Organization as an inanimate mechanical force. This is a force which we may or may not hear. This means that ultra-low frequency sound waves represent a mechanical impact to our cells and tissues.
- This means that low frequency sound is an agent of disease.
- The higher the frequency, the shorter the sound wave. The lower the frequency, the longer the sound wave.
- At 3000Hz the wavelength of airborne sound is 11 cm.
- At 500Hz the wavelength of airborne sound is 68 cm.
- At 100Hz the wavelength of airborne sound is 3.43 m.
- At 20Hz (the lowest sound frequency we can hear) the wavelength of airborne sound is 17.1 m.
- At 1 Hz, it's 343 M.

Dear TCEQ:

I request a contested hearing for Permit Number 175173 and for PSDTX 1636. I will be adversely effected by the combined air emissions of Wolf Hollow I, Wolf Hollow II, DeCordova Steam Electric Plant, and the proposed Wolf Hollow II expansion. I am 71 years old and am in poor health, making me more susceptible to the harmful effects of increased carbon monoxide, nitrogen oxides, particulate matter with diameters of 10 micros and 2.5 microns or less. The hazardous air pollutants, the organic compounds, sulfur dioxide, sulfur hexafluoride, and sulfuric acid mist will also adversely affect my health. I live 4.4 air miles from the proposed Wolf Hollow complexes of gas powered electric plants. My primary residence address is 9712 Bellechase Road, Granbury, TX 76049.

Constellation Energy, the owner of Wolf Hollow II and the proposed expansion has proven to be an irresponsible company in regards to the health and enjoyment of life to the community. In the last year, there have been four incidents of valve blowouts at Wolf Hollow II. After the last valve blowout on July 23rd at approximately 5:15 am, I contacted TCEQ to make a formal complaint on July 24th and spoke with Rebecca Molina in Austin who referred me to the Dallas Regional Air Complaint number. It took four phone calls over a two-week period to finally receive a call back from an environmental investigator, Patricia Chen. To date, there are still no investigation results of this incident. On September 5, 2024, a letter from Kimberly Fowler, the Air Section Manager, stated that the Executive Director would be investigating complaints. There were other complaintants in the community who were never contracted by TCEQ. Please do a thorough investigation of why there have been so many valve blowouts in a year. Since bit coin mining owned by MARA was fully energized, the blowouts began. Earth Justice states that Wolf Hollow II was running at 66% capacity and is not running at 99.5% capacity. The community questions if the bit coin mining computer usage of approximately one third of the power of Wolf Hollow II correlates with the blowouts. Please complete your investigation before considering new air permits for additional turbines. When Constellation Energy's Vice President and General Council of Health and Safety, Tamara Domeyer, was contacted with the concerns about the valve blowouts, she stated that on July 23, 2024, the blowout lasted five minutes and only involved one valve. Videos show four distinct valve blowouts and a two-hour time span before the steam cloud dissipated. When there is a blowout, the noise heard in the community is of an explosion followed by a loud hiss. What is being released into the air that is not going through pollution control equipment? All of this is very disturbing to residents in South Hood County and in Somervell County.

I am depending on the TCEQ to protect the residents around the Wolf Hollow gas powered plants from hazardous air contaminants. I consider existing operations hazardous to our community. Constellation Energy should be denied a permit for expansion based on sloppy operations and dishonest disclosure.

I am also concerned about the short stacks at Wolf Hollow II. The air emissions are going directly downwind of the plant. Constellation Energy should have stacks which are at least tall enough to disperse their air emissions over a larger area.

There is a preponderance of serious health issues in the community around Wolf Hollow II. These conditions include blood clots in lungs, heart problems, a brain tumor that is not cancerous, high blood pressure, vertigo, dizziness, nausea, non-febrile seizures in a child, ear infections (one child had seven), and hearing loss. These conditions did not exist before Constellation Energy allowed MARA to energize over 150 containers containing over 40,000 containers cooled by excessively loud fans. Constellation Energy, the landlord, has allowed the MARA operation to continue to date and MARA is adding even more computers. This shows the community that Constellation Energy's profits take precedence over the health and enjoyment of life of the surrounding community. The requested new air permits for Wolf Hollow II expansion should be denied.

I spoke at the TCEQ Public Meeting on September 9, 2024. I was not allowed to finish my comments and was advised to send them to you by September 11, 2024. My comments are as follows:

Why is this designated an industrial area? Have you been to Mitchell Bend to look at the plant and surrounding area? The only industrial activity is Wolf Hollow I and Wolf Hollow II.

We have a number of gas fired power plants in a small section of Hood County:

Wolf Hollow I – 730 MW

Wolf Hollow II – 1115 MW

DeCordova Steam Electric Station – 356 MW

Wolf Hollow II Expansion – 300 MW

Total will be 2500 MW

At the meeting, TCEQ said that facilities emitting similar pollutants as the proposed expansion within a 40 kilometer radius are included in the model. Can TCEQ provide a list of these facilities within the 40 kilometer radius?


At the meeting, TCEQ also explained that there is no monitoring for the emissions from the cluster of power plants in a small portion of Hood County. There is a regional air collection monitor in Midlothian, which is 56 miles away from Wolf Hollow. Why will there not be an air collection monitor near the cluster of gas-fired power plants in and near Wolf Hollow?

Do we even know how much mercury is in incoming gas streams? Is it measured? I was in the business of burning hazardous waste in cement kilns. Streams that had a mercury content of 2 parts per billion or more were rejected. Two parts per Billion. My understanding is that whatever gas comes down the pipeline, this plant will burn. So, in essence, they have no mercury limit.

This expansion layers more health problems on top of a community dealing with aural assault from Constellation's tenant, Marathon Digital. Please protect the residents near this expansion and deny this permit. A Contested Hearing is most assuredly needed, as I have already requested of TCEQ.

Additionally, the only public notice regarding this expansion was in the "Hood County News" in the classified section. There were no signs posted near the Wolf Hollow facility. This is in violation of public notice requirements. As residents, we recognize this as just one more example of Constellation's egregious attitude toward the community. What is TCEQ going to do about this?

First, please be advised that I am opposed to the issuance of a permit to pollute for Wolf Hollow II. I am very disappointed in the letter by TCEQ issued on July 30, 2024. The letter states that the proposed facility will emit these air contaminants in a significant amount: carbon monoxide, nitrogen oxides, particulate matter including particulate matter with diameters of 10 microns or less and 2.5 microns or less, hazardous air pollutants, organic compounds, sulfur dioxide, sulfur hexafluoride, sulfuric acid mist, and greenhouse gasses. The letter goes on to say that the emissions of air contaminants' from the proposed facility which are subject to PSD review will not violate any state or federal air quality regulations and will not have any significant impact on soils, vegetation, or viability. There is no mention of impact on humans or other living organisms. Does TCEQ's review include and add in emissions from other local power plant sources, including Wolf Hollow I (730MW), existing Wolf Hollow II (1115 MW), and DeCordova Steam Electric Station (356 MW)? Total generating capacity in a small portion of Hood County, Texas will be 2501 MW.

The eight open-cycle gas turbines that are in the permit for Wolf Hollow II are known to be less efficient than the existing combined-cycle turbines. They are more prone to emissions because exhaust gases are released directly into the atmosphere without utilizing waste heat, thereby leading to higher emissions of pollutants such as sulfur dioxide, carbon dioxide, and nitrogen oxides. Has TCEQ factored in the lower efficiency (and higher pollutants) of these units?

Living near the Wolf Hollow I, Wolf Hollow II, Wolf Hollow II expansion, and DeCordova Steam Electric Station may pose several potential long-term health risks that residents are rightly concerned about. Pollutants stated in the TCEQ letter referenced above may contribute to respiratory issues, asthma, and cardiovascular diseases. Proximity to these emissions has been linked to increased health risks, including cancer and neurological effects. Long-term health effects are also very concerning. Exposure to PM 2.5 is associated with increased mortality and health issues such as cardiovascular and respiratory diseases. Long-term exposure can lead to chronic conditions and elevated mortality rates, particularly among the elderly. This is especially concerning, given the age of residents around the plant. Has TCEQ collected

data on ages of people in the area and factored this information into the permit decision? Pecan Plantation, where I live, has a population of approximately 7500 people with over 60% over the age of 65.

General research provides additional cause for concern among residents. Air pollution can cause neural inflammation and contribute to neurodegenerative diseases. Components such as particulate matter, nitrogen oxides, and sulfur oxides are linked to these issues. Nitrogen dioxide and carbon monoxide has been associated with an increased risk of Alzheimer's disease and other forms of dementia, as well as oxidative stress and synaptic damage, which are major factors in cognitive decline.

And what about the children? Exposure to PM 2.5 has been associated with adverse effects on motor skills. Studies indicate that children exposed to higher levels of air pollution may experience delays in motor development.

I question how a permit can be issued without in-depth analysis of the near-by population and a thorough risk assessment for people in the area by age group. Is there a plan to periodically monitor the health of people in the area?

I would now like to raise the issue of mercury. Natural gas contains mercury. That is irrefutable. Mercury levels vary, but can be as high as 5500 ppm. The effects of mercury on humans, wildlife, and livestock is especially frightening. It is especially concerning in aquatic systems, such as the Brazos River, Lake Granbury, and Squaw Creek Reservoir. This expansion will be near all three aquatic systems and all have fishing activity. Health effects range from kidney damage and gastrointestinal problems in inorganic mercury to becoming a neurotoxin in methylmercury. Citing a power plant near waterways is especially dangerous. Has TCEQ done any forms of testing for mercury in any of the aquatic systems noted? Are natural gas streams entering the plant tested for mercury on a continuous basis?

I am especially concerned about the sound coming from the existing Wolf Hollow complex. Residents near the plant suffer from hearing loss, hypertension, migraine headaches, tinnitus, cardiac problems, anxiety, and stress. We have cases of children now wearing hearing aids. My wife and I have worked with residents and I can assure you these health issues are real and research shows they are caused by constant sound assault from the facility. Constellation Energy points to Marathon Digital, even though Marathon Digital is on the Constellation Energy property. In fact, Constellation Energy has profited by allowing the harmful sound to continue by using the decrease in land values to purchase property. I point this out to TCEQ in order for you to have an understanding of why the community is incensed over the thought of issuing a permit to such a cynical and deplorable company. Why would we ever think a company of such low character will honestly self report compliance issues?

I would like to request a contested case hearing for State Air Quality Permit Number 175173 and for PSD Air Quality Permit Number PSDTX1636. My name is John Highsmith, 9712 Bellechase Rd, Granbury, TX 76049. My telephone number is 832 335-9365. The applicant's name is Constellation Energy. I will be adversely affected by being exposed to emissions from the facility. My home is 4.4 air miles from the facility. I am retired, so I am at my home more frequently than if I was working. Also, I am 70 years old and part of a higher risk population. Please see contents of this letter for issues.

The Mitchell Bend Community and other areas in Precinct 2 of Hood County request a public hearing as to the issuance of permits allowing construction at 8787 Wolf Hollow Court. There are concerns about the construction of an additional generating plant at the Wolf Hollow complex. At present, there is Wolf Hollow I, Wolf Hollow II, and a Bitcoin mining operation owned by Marathon Digital. The residents in this part of Hood County have become sick ranging from hearing loss to hypertension and cardiac events that have required hospitalization. Effective resolution of this issue has been lacking.

Residents are concerned about the combined emissions from the three facilities in close proximity to one another that include products of incomplete combustion, dioxins, furans, nitrogen oxides, sulfur dioxide, sulfur hexafluoride, sulfuric acid mist, and particulates. During each quarter of 2023, violations were documented at the Wolf Hollow II complex. Residents do not have trust in operators at Wolf Hollow due to refusal to act on long standing noise that has caused health issues and violations documented by TCEQ. This warranted mistrust results in suspicion about any new pollution generating facility.

Residents request the following:

Stack test measurements for Wolf Hollow I and Wolf Hollow II since inception.

Readings from continuous emission monitoring for Wolf Hollow I and Wolf Hollow II.

Projected increase in emissions from the proposed project.

Dispersion modeling of emissions for existing Wolf Hollow I and Wolf Hollow II combined.
Dispersion modeling for existing Wolf Hollow I and Wolf Hollow II and proposed project combined.

Combustion temperature ranges of existing and proposed equipment.

Answers as to whether stack heights are adequate.

Test protocols and sampling of incoming combustion streams.

Are emissions being filtered/scrubbed?

The main purpose of this letter is to request a public meeting so that TCEQ and the applicant can provide residents a forum for their concerns and questions.

Dear Laurie Gharis, Chief Clerk:

I am requesting a reconsideration of the executive director's decision on the granting of Air Permits for Wolf Hollow II Power, LLC. In the Executive Director's Response to Public Comment 17, it states that there are no mercury emissions from natural gas-fired turbines. Please analyze the gas streams that will be feeding proposed Wolf Hollow III and the streams that are presently feeding Wolf Hollow II.

I am questioning whether emissions for mercury meet Mercury and Air Toxics Standards (MATS) set by EPA. Constellation advised that they test incoming natural gas streams for contractual parameters. They do this testing because of variability in the gas streams.

No mechanism is in place to assure that no mercury is present in incoming steams. I question the mercury level, because even a minute amount is hazardous to humans and all animals. I am requesting that in the air permits, limits be set for mercury emissions, thereby necessitating testing.

In response to the Executive Director's Response to Public Comment 10, residents near Wolf Hollow II have been telling Constellation for months about the damage being done by their tenant, MARA. Constellation has chosen to allow MARA to continue operations with no concern about the health damage coming from their site. Noise is a form of air pollution, because it propagates through the air and negatively impacts human health, wildlife, and quality of life. Organizations like the EPA and WHO classify noise as a significant environmental problem, second only to traditional air pollution in its health impacts. According to the Texas Administrative Code, Title 30, part 1, Chapter 101, Subchapter A, Rule 101.4:

"No person shall discharge from any source whatsoever one or more air contaminants or combinations thereof, in such concentration and of such duration as are or may tend to be injurious to or adversely affect human health or welfare, animal life, vegetation, or property, or as to interfere with the normal use and enjoyment of animal life, vegetation, or property."

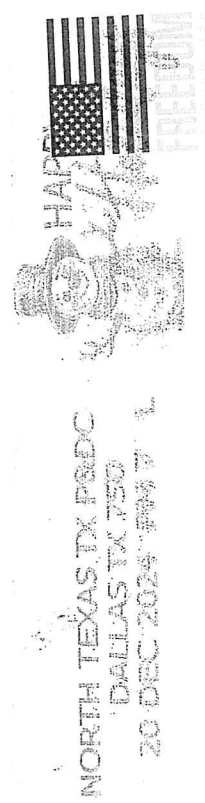
There is an ongoing nuisance lawsuit from damaged citizens against MARA, located on Constellation's Wolf Hollow property. Constellation should deal with resolving this lawsuit before building a new natural gas plant on the Wolf Hollow site.



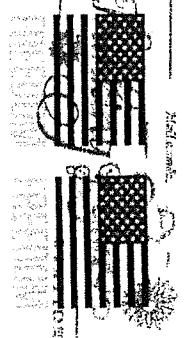

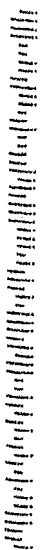

I am requesting a reconsideration of the executive director's decision on the granting of Air Permits for Wolf Hollow II Power, LLC. In the Executive Director's Response to Public Comment 17, it states that there are no mercury emissions from natural gas-fired turbines. Please analyze the gas streams that will be feeding proposed Wolf Hollow III and the streams that are presently feeding Wolf Hollow II.

I am questioning whether emissions for mercury meet Mercury and Air Toxics Standards (MATS) set by EPA. Constellation advised that they test incoming natural gas streams for contractual parameters. They do this testing because of variability in the gas streams.

No mechanism is in place to assure that no mercury is present in incoming streams. I question the mercury level, because even a minute amount is hazardous to humans and all animals. I am requesting that in the air permits, limits be set for mercury emissions, thereby necessitating testing.

In response to the Executive Director's Response to Public Comment 10, residents near Wolf Hollow II have been telling Constellation for months about the damage being done by their tenant, MARA. Constellation has chosen to allow MARA to continue operations with no concern about the health damage coming from their site. Noise is a form of air pollution, because it propagates through the air and negatively impacts human health, wildlife, and quality of life. Organizations like the EPA and WHO classify noise as a significant environmental problem, second only to traditional air pollution in its health impacts. According to the Texas Administrative Code, Title 30, part 1, Chapter 101, Subchapter A, Rule 101.4:

"No person shall discharge from any source whatsoever one or more air contaminants or combinations thereof, in such concentration and of such duration as are or may tend to be injurious to or adversely affect human health or welfare, animal life, vegetation, or property, or as to interfere with the normal use and enjoyment of animal life, vegetation, or property."

There is an ongoing nuisance lawsuit from damaged citizens against MARA, located on Constellation's Wolf Hollow property. Constellation should deal with resolving this lawsuit before building a new natural gas plant on the Wolf Hollow site.

My name is Cheryl Shadden, I live at 8405 Contrary Creek Road, Granbury, Tx 76048 in Hood County Texas, less than 1/4 miles away from the proposed Wolf Hollow gas/turbine plant that is planned and the additional 2 gas power plants currently existing on this same property.

I appreciate the opportunity to offer these comments. I am opposed to this facility being built and I urge TCEQ not to issue this permit.

I am concerned that building new gas units at this site will have a negative impact on my community and my quality of life.

I already live close to four fracked gas units. Wolf Hollow 1 and 2, and Marathon Digital Bitcoin Mine at this same property.

Let me add the animals that I have personally lost in this last year.

I don't understand why this plant should be built in a community that is already compromised from the pollution here. The company proposing these new units, Constellation Energy, is leasing land to Marathon Digital for the bitcoin mine, a huge consumer of energy. Is Constellation motivated by desire to attract more bitcoin mines or other heavy industrial users to this area?

I am also concerned about the additional pollution these new gas plants will bring to my community. The permit says the plant will emit fine particulate matter pollution,

also called "soot", "dust", or "PM2.5". Additional pollution includes- high ozone per readings in 2022, increases in carbon monoxide, sulfur dioxide, and greenhouse gases.

This pollution is dangerous to breathe in, and I am already suffering health impacts due to the existing plants.

I am also worried this additional pollution could make Hood County violate the Clean Air Act standard for particulate matter. This could have significant economic consequences to the county, impacting everything from road building to issuing more air pollution permits.

In conclusion, I encourage the applicant to withdraw this application and, if they will not, I encourage TCEQ not to grant this permit.

I would like to thank this senate committee for conducting this meeting and for allowing me the opportunity to speak to you.

My name is Cheryl Shadden. I'm a Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist. My home is directly across the road from Wolf Hollow II's two gas power plants and a cryptocurrency mine that is located on their property.

Wolf Hollow would like a low interest loan from the Texas Energy Fund to put in a third gas power plant with 8 more turbines. They have also requested a permit from TCEQ which would allow them to increase the air pollution in the area to dangerous levels by increasing ozone readings, particulate matter, carbon monoxide, sulfur dioxide, and greenhouse gases. With just the 2 turbines, visible gas clouds with noxious odors can be witnessed coming from Wolf Hollow. On four occasions last year, valves exploded sending large clouds of toxins into the air. Just last month at 0500, on July 23, 2024, between 4 to 6 valves exploded shaking our homes and rattling our windows. It sounded like bombs were going off. Clouds of pollutants hovered over our community for hours.

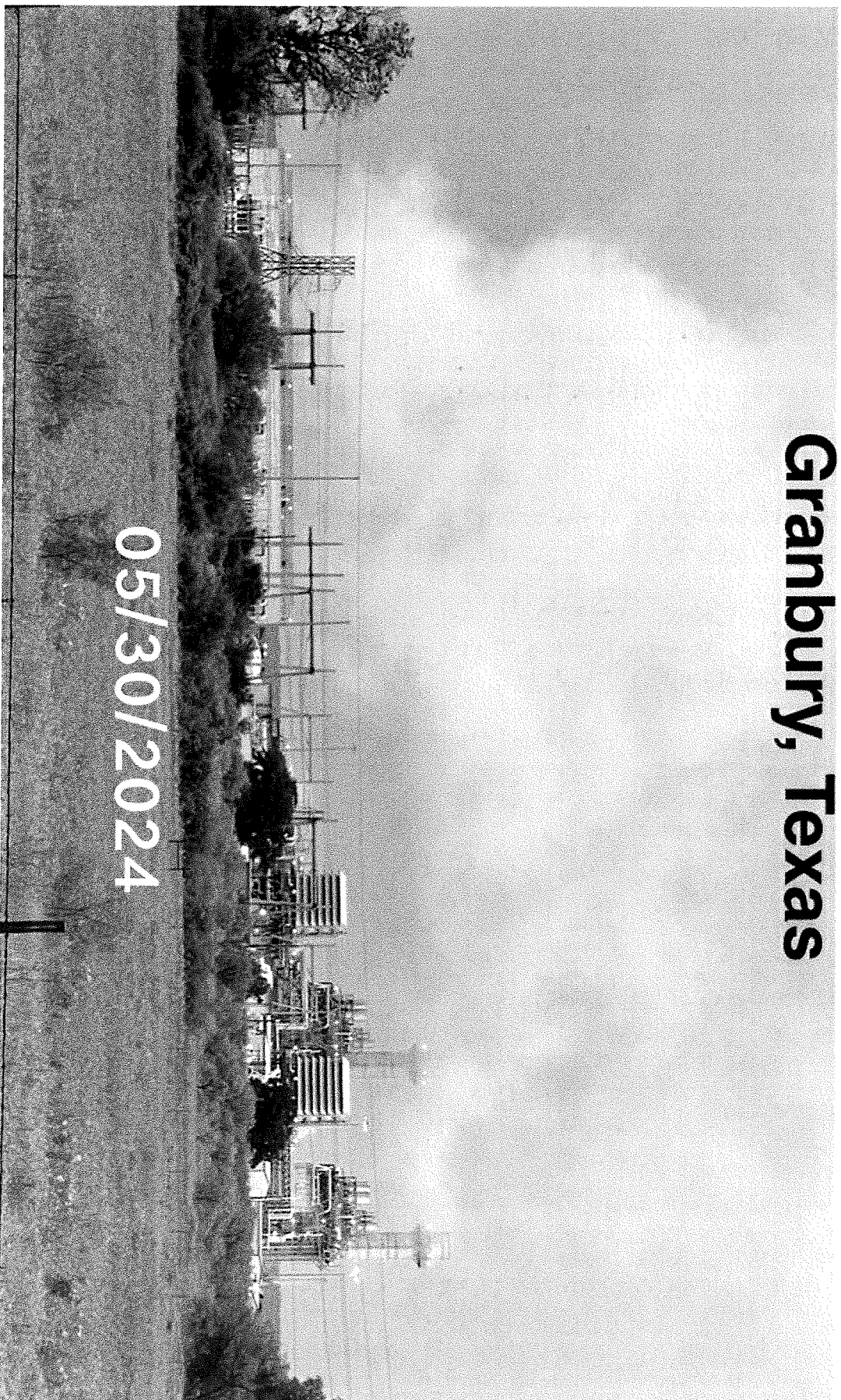
Within the past year, Wolf Hollow has leased their land to the cryptocurrency mine, Marathon Digital, a \$6 billion company. Before then, the plant ran at approximately 66% capacity. They now run at 99% capacity with the crypto mine drawing approximately 1/3 of the power that Wolf Hollow produces. Wolf Hollow's planned increase is directly related to Marathon's mine upcoming expansion - which operates behind the meter and never loses power even when residents do due to excessive temperatures.

The crypto mine has already caused great harm to the people and animal life in Hood and Sumervell Counties due to the extreme and incessant noise pollution. To add high levels of air pollution would further devastate the health of my community and surrounding areas.



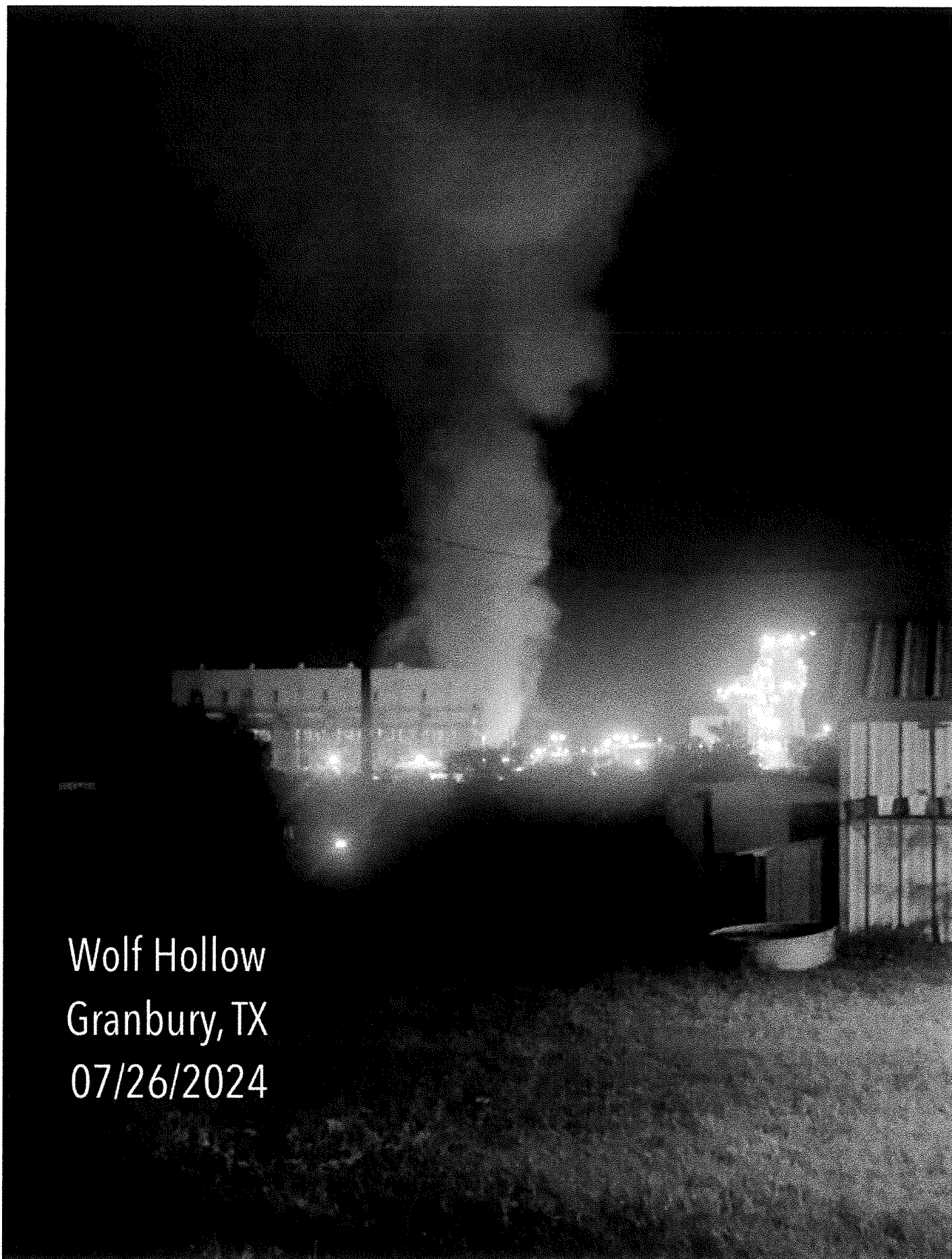

TCEQ Request For A Contested Hearing Regarding Permit 175173

My name is Cheryl Shadden, I live at 8405 Contrary Creek Road, Granbury, Tx 76048 in Hood County Texas, less than 1/4 miles away from the proposed Wolf Hollow gas/turbine plant that is planned and the additional 2 gas power plants currently existing on this same property.

I appreciate the opportunity to offer these comments. I am opposed to this facility being built and I urge TCEQ not to issue this permit.

I am concerned that building new gas units at this site will have a negative impact on my community and my quality of life.

I already live close to four fracked gas units. Wolf Hollow 1 and 2, and Marathon Digital Bitcoin Mine at this same property.

In my home and neighborhood, I have experienced the following issues that greatly concern me:

- Noise from the bitcoin mine
- Noise and noxious clouds coming from Wolf Hollow Power Plants
- Valves exploding emergently at Wolf Hollow 4 times this last year
- Visible pollution from the gas plants

These things that I have personally experienced made ill:

- Permanent conduction hearing loss
- Nausea and gastrointestinal issues
- Headaches
- Sleep disturbances
- Heart palpitations
- Stress
- Shortness of breath
- Coughing
- Dizziness
- Fatigue

Let me add the animals that I have personally lost in this last year.

I don't understand why this plant should be built in a community that is already compromised from the pollution here. The company proposing these new units, Constellation Energy, is leasing land to Marathon Digital for the bitcoin mine, a huge consumer of energy. Is Constellation motivated by desire to attract more bitcoin mines or other heavy industrial users to this area?

I am also concerned about the additional pollution these new gas plants will bring to my community. The permit says the plant will emit fine particulate matter pollution, also called "soot", "dust", or "PM2.5". Additional pollution includes high ozone per readings in 2022, increases in carbon monoxide, sulfur dioxide, and greenhouse gases.

This pollution is dangerous to breathe in, and I am already suffering health impacts due to the existing plants.

I am also worried this additional pollution could make Hood County violate the Clean Air Act standard for particulate matter. This could have significant economic consequences to the county, impacting everything from road building to issuing more air pollution permits.

In conclusion, I encourage the applicant to withdraw this application and, if they will not, I encourage TCEQ not to grant this permit.

I would additionally like to request a contested hearing regarding this issue.

I thank you in advance for the opportunity to provide written comments regarding the above-referenced air permits, as prior commitments prevent me from attending the scheduled Public Meeting on September 9, 2024. The applicant seeks the permits in order to expand their current operations by utilizing public funds by adding an additional 300-megawatts of power to their existing facility. The additional electrical power will supplant the 300-megawatts of power that the applicant is now providing to a collocated Bitcoin facility that enriches no one but themselves. These facilities, along with yet another adjoining power generating facility, have already exposed those living in close proximity to the facility to significant amounts of pollution. The Bitcoin facility has also produced excessive noise at levels health officials have determined to have adverse implications to public health. In addition to the noise levels, the Bitcoin facility has a large carbon footprint with its 300-megawatt capacity which runs 7x24. In light of the environment and public health implications, the permit should not be approved and the use of public funds should be viewed as inappropriate.

I am concerned that the TCEQ permitting process and a Public Meeting concept do not provide our citizens, community leaders and the press the opportunity to provide any meaningful participation in the process. The "technical review" has already been conducted and the Executive Director has already concluded that "... the issuance of a permit will not have any significant impact on soils, vegetation, or visibility." Further, a "draft" permit has already been prepared. Simply put, the technical review was conducted in a vacuum with input limited to the Applicant and members of your staff. In addition, confidentiality agreements between the applicant and TCEQ may prevent the public from knowing complete details and risks associated with the proposed Air Permit. Conducting business in this fashion creates an unnecessary adversarial relationship with the public.

The Federal Clean Air Act (CAA, 42 U.S.C. §7401 et seq.) is intended to protect the public and environment from harmful air pollution. The states have been tasked with implementing the CAA's permitting program and the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is responsible for overseeing state programs designed to implement the federal requirements. Public participation is a very important part of the CAA. However, the current TCEQ permitting process discourages public participation. After all, the

technical review has been conducted, a determination has been made and deciding officials have a "draft" permit in the works. The process also creates an artificial ledge for TCEQ's Executive Director. It is a ledge that may be difficult to walk back from. Why not hold any determination regarding the technical review and permitting until AFTER the Public Meeting and Public Hearing? Why not, indeed? If nothing else, this would at least provide the appearance of impartiality and inclusion.

It is also noted that the identified parameters of your technical review included ". . . significant impact on soils, vegetation, or visibility . . ." Conspicuously absent is any direct reference to public health. In fairness, adverse impacts on soils, vegetation and visibility ultimately have the potential to impact public health. However, TCEQ's Notice of Public Meeting states: "The proposed facility will emit the following air contaminants in a significant amount: carbon monoxide, nitrogen oxides, and particulate matter. . . . In addition, the facility will emit the following air contaminants: hazardous air pollutants, organic compound, sulfur dioxide, sulfur hexafluoride, and sulfuric acid mist. The proposed facility will also emit greenhouse gasses." These toxins, particularly in "significant" quantities, have the potential to adversely impact public health on a grand scale and yet there is no direct reference to their impact on public health. Have the direct health impacts been evaluated? Have threat assessments for ailments such as cancers, respiratory diseases and cardiovascular diseases been conducted and considered in your technical review?

The Wolf Hollow complex is now comprised of three separate entities. Wolf Hollow I, Wolf Hollow II and a 300-megawatt Bitcoin mining operation which is collocated with Wolf Hollow II. If the air permit is approved, Wolf Hollow III will be added to the mix. Each of these entities have an environmental impact and pose potential environmental risk to the surrounding area. Have these four entities been evaluated both independently and cumulatively? What is the level of combined air pollutants from Wolf Hollow I, Wolf Hollow II and, if approved, Wolf Hollow III? To what extent has the carbon footprint of the Bitcoin facility contributed to air pollution due to the continuous high-volume consumption of electricity which serves no purpose but to enrich the Bitcoin miners themselves and the applicant that sells them their electrical power? Has the compliance history of these entities been evaluated? Should any of the entities, to include Wolf Hollow I which is operated by a company separate from the applicant, wish to expand further, is there a presumption of approval or denial of their request? What is the tipping point where enough is simply enough?

I am certain that you are aware that the Wolf Hollow Bitcoin mining facility has inundated the area surrounding Wolf Hollow with excessive noise for an extended period of time. I am painfully aware that TCEQ refuses to consider excessive environmental noise, noise with far reaching health consequences, in the approval process of any permit. I am not suggesting that TCEQ should involve itself in noise levels equivalent to a nuisance. I am strongly suggesting that TCEQ expand its mission to include noise levels with an associated health risk. This is particularly important in unincorporated areas of Texas where entities such as Wolf Hollow I, Wolf Hollow II, and the Bitcoin mining operation tend to locate. If approved, Wolf Hollow III will join the mix. Governmental officials in unincorporated areas lack the jurisdictional authority to impose noise restrictions in unincorporated areas and our citizens are left at risk. In Texas, TCEQ is the guardian of our environment. TCEQ is responsible for protecting our land,

water and air. TCEQ needs to start focusing on environmental noise pollution as well. If the Wolf Hollow III permit is approved, what is the anticipated noise level associated with the combined Wolf Hollow I, Wolf Hollow II, Wolf Hollow III and the Bitcoin facility? Will TCEQ, the guardian of our environment, facilitate an environmental problem?

There is a clear need to expand the power grid in Texas. The critical issue is how we go about doing it. This June, Electric Reliability Council of Texas (ERCOT) officials testified before the Texas Senate that the power grid needs to almost double by 2030, just six years from now. ERCOT officials further testified that fifty percent of that growth will be attributable to cryptocurrency miners and datacenters. After the hearing, Lt. Governor Dan Patrick provided the following statement:

“Texans will ultimately pay the price. I’m more interested in building the grid to service customers in their homes, apartments, and normal businesses and keeping costs as low as possible for them instead of for very niche industries that have massive power demands and produce few jobs. We want data centers, but it can’t be the Wild Wild West of data centers and crypto miners crashing our grid and turning the lights off.”

I wholeheartedly support Lt. Governor Patrick’s leadership on this issue. If we do not change course, Texans will pay the price and they will pay in many ways.

In July, the Hood County Commissioners Court passed a resolution “seeking legislative action to address acoustical and noise pollution, destruction of property values, and the incredible demand on the Texas Energy grid caused by Cryptocurrency mining.” If the air permit is approved, Wolf Hollow III will be constructed and an additional 300-megawatts of electricity, along with additional noise and “significant” pollutants, will be brought online at Wolf Hollow. The question before TCEQ is do we unnecessarily expose our citizenry to “significant” amounts of pollutants merely to support an industry that enriches no one but themselves.

Today, the Bitcoin facility consumes 300-megawatts of electrical power, approximately twenty-five percent of the current capacity of the Wolf Hollow II facility. The applicant now applies for an air permit to supplant the 300-megawatt capacity used by the Bitcoin miner. It appears that the applicant intends to use public funds provided by the Texas Energy Fund (TEF) which is administered by the Public Utility Commission (PUC). TEF offers economic incentives for the construction and expansion of electric generating facilities. As a result, citizens in close proximity to Wolf Hollow will be funding their abusers. Rather than seeking a permit for expansion, the applicant could redirect the power back to the grid by cutting the cord on Bitcoin or suffer the consequences of their poor business decisions. By doing so, the residents in proximity of Wolf Hollow would not be exposed to additional “significant” amounts of pollution, excessive noise and the Texas grid would be enhanced. Bitcoin facilities simply do not belong in close proximity to our citizens and public funds should not be utilized in this fashion.

I realize that many of the issues that I have raised are beyond the purview of TCEQ. The issues reach across the Executive and Legislative branches of Federal and State government, private enterprise and the public. A broad approach is needed with participation of ALL stake holders. The question before

The Mitchell Bend Community and other areas in Precinct 2 of Hood County request a public hearing as to the issuance of permits allowing construction at 8787 Wolf Hollow Court. There are concerns about the construction of an additional generating plant at the Wolf Hollow complex. At present, there is Wolf Hollow I, Wolf Hollow II, and a Bitcoin mining operation owned by Marathon Digital. The residents in this part of Hood County have become sick ranging from hearing loss to hypertension and cardiac events that have required hospitalization. Effective resolution of this issue has been lacking.

Residents are concerned about the combined emissions from the three facilities in close proximity to one another that include products of incomplete combustion, dioxins, furans, nitrogen oxides, sulfur dioxide, sulfur hexafluoride, sulfuric acid mist, and particulates. During each quarter of 2023, violations were documented at the Wolf Hollow II complex. Residents do not have trust in operators at Wolf Hollow due to refusal to act on long standing noise that has caused health issues and violations documented by TCEQ. This warranted mistrust results in suspicion about any new pollution generating facility.

Residents request the following:

Stack test measurements for Wolf Hollow I and Wolf Hollow II since inception.

Readings from continuous emission monitoring for Wolf Hollow I and Wolf Hollow II.

Projected increase in emissions from the proposed project.

Dispersion modeling of emissions for existing Wolf Hollow I and Wolf Hollow II combined.
Dispersion modeling for existing Wolf Hollow I and Wolf Hollow II and proposed project combined.

Combustion temperature ranges of existing and proposed equipment.

Answers as to whether stack heights are adequate.

Test protocols and sampling of incoming combustion streams.

Are emissions being filtered/scrubbed?



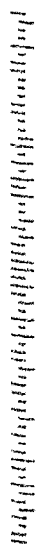

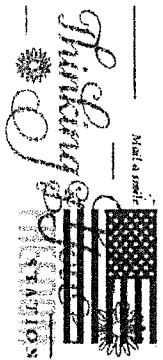

Dear Chief Clerk, TCEQ:

I thank you in advance for the opportunity to provide written comments regarding the above-referenced air permits, as prior commitments prevent me from attending the scheduled Public Meeting on September 9, 2024. The applicant seeks the permits in order to expand their current operations by utilizing public funds by adding an additional 300-megawatts of power to their existing facility. The additional electrical power will supplant the 300-megawatts of power that the applicant is now providing to a collocated Bitcoin facility that enriches no one but themselves. These facilities, along with yet another adjoining power generating facility, have already exposed those living in close proximity to the facility to significant amounts of pollution. The Bitcoin facility has also produced excessive noise at levels health officials have determined to have adverse implications to public health. In addition to the noise levels, the Bitcoin facility has a large carbon footprint with its 300-megawatt capacity which runs 7x24. In light of the environment and public health implications, the permit should not be approved and the use of public funds should be viewed as inappropriate.

I am concerned that the TCEQ permitting process and a Public Meeting concept do not provide our citizens, community leaders and the press the opportunity to provide any meaningful participation in the process. The "technical review" has already been conducted and the Executive Director has already concluded that "... the issuance of a permit will not have any significant impact on soils, vegetation, or visibility." Further, a "draft" permit has already been prepared. Simply put, the technical review was conducted in a vacuum with input limited to the Applicant and members of your staff. In addition, confidentiality agreements between the applicant and TCEQ may prevent the public from knowing complete details and risks associated with the proposed Air Permit. Conducting business in this fashion creates an unnecessary adversarial relationship with the public.

The Federal Clean Air Act (CAA, 42 U.S.C. §7401 et seq.) is intended to protect the public and environment from harmful air pollution. The states have been tasked with implementing the CAA's permitting program and the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is responsible for overseeing state programs designed to implement the federal requirements. Public participation is a very important part of the CAA. However, the current TCEQ permitting process discourages public participation. After all, the

technical review has been conducted, a determination has been made and deciding officials have a "draft" permit in the works. The process also creates an artificial ledge for TCEQ's Executive Director. It is a ledge that may be difficult to walk back from. Why not hold any determination regarding the technical review and permitting until AFTER the Public Meeting and Public Hearing? Why not, indeed? If nothing else, this would at least provide the appearance of impartiality and inclusion.

It is also noted that the identified parameters of your technical review included "... significant impact on soils, vegetation, or visibility . . ." Conspicuously absent is any direct reference to public health. In fairness, adverse impacts on soils, vegetation and visibility ultimately have the potential to impact public health. However, TCEQ's Notice of Public Meeting states: "The proposed facility will emit the following air contaminants in a significant amount: carbon monoxide, nitrogen oxides, and particulate matter. . . . In addition, the facility will emit the following air contaminants: hazardous air pollutants, organic compound, sulfur dioxide, sulfur hexafluoride, and sulfuric acid mist. The proposed facility will also emit greenhouse gasses." These toxins, particularly in "significant" quantities, have the potential to adversely impact public health on a grand scale and yet there is no direct reference to their impact on public health. Have the direct health impacts been evaluated? Have threat assessments for ailments such as cancers, respiratory diseases and cardiovascular diseases been conducted and considered in your technical review?

The Wolf Hollow complex is now comprised of three separate entities. Wolf Hollow I, Wolf Hollow II and a 300-megawatt Bitcoin mining operation which is collocated with Wolf Hollow II. If the air permit is approved, Wolf Hollow III will be added to the mix. Each of these entities have an environmental impact and pose potential environmental risk to the surrounding area. Have these four entities been evaluated both independently and cumulatively? What is the level of combined air pollutants from Wolf Hollow I, Wolf Hollow II and, if approved, Wolf Hollow III? To what extent has the carbon footprint of the Bitcoin facility contributed to air pollution due to the continuous high-volume consumption of electricity which serves no purpose but to enrich the Bitcoin miners themselves and the applicant that sells them their electrical power? Has the compliance history of these entities been evaluated? Should any of the entities, to include Wolf Hollow I which is operated by a company separate from the applicant, wish to expand further, is there a presumption of approval or denial of their request? What is the tipping point where enough is simply enough?

I am certain that you are aware that the Wolf Hollow Bitcoin mining facility has inundated the area surrounding Wolf Hollow with excessive noise for an extended period of time. I am painfully aware that TCEQ refuses to consider excessive environmental noise, noise with far reaching health consequences, in the approval process of any permit. I am not suggesting that TCEQ should involve itself in noise levels equivalent to a nuisance. I am strongly suggesting that TCEQ expand its mission to include noise levels with an associated health risk. This is particularly important in unincorporated areas of Texas where entities such as Wolf Hollow I, Wolf Hollow II, and the Bitcoin mining operation tend to locate. If approved, Wolf Hollow III will join the mix. Governmental officials in unincorporated areas lack the jurisdictional authority to impose noise restrictions in unincorporated areas and our citizens are left at risk. In Texas, TCEQ is the guardian of our environment. TCEQ is responsible for protecting our land,

water and air. TCEQ needs to start focusing on environmental noise pollution as well. If the Wolf Hollow III permit is approved, what is the anticipated noise level associated with the combined Wolf Hollow I, Wolf Hollow II, Wolf Hollow III and the Bitcoin facility? Will TCEQ, the guardian of our environment, facilitate an environmental problem?

There is a clear need to expand the power grid in Texas. The critical issue is how we go about doing it. This June, Electric Reliability Council of Texas (ERCOT) officials testified before the Texas Senate that the power grid needs to almost double by 2030, just six years from now. ERCOT officials further testified that fifty percent of that growth will be attributable to cryptocurrency miners and datacenters. After the hearing, Lt. Governor Dan Patrick provided the following statement:

“Texans will ultimately pay the price. I’m more interested in building the grid to service customers in their homes, apartments, and normal businesses and keeping costs as low as possible for them instead of for very niche industries that have massive power demands and produce few jobs. We want data centers, but it can’t be the Wild Wild West of data centers and crypto miners crashing our grid and turning the lights off.”

I wholeheartedly support Lt. Governor Patrick’s leadership on this issue. If we do not change course, Texans will pay the price and they will pay in many ways.

In July, the Hood County Commissioners Court passed a resolution “seeking legislative action to address acoustical and noise pollution, destruction of property values, and the incredible demand on the Texas Energy grid caused by Cryptocurrency mining.” If the air permit is approved, Wolf Hollow III will be constructed and an additional 300-megawatts of electricity, along with additional noise and “significant” pollutants, will be brought online at Wolf Hollow. The question before TCEQ is do we unnecessarily expose our citizenry to “significant” amounts of pollutants merely to support an industry that enriches no one but themselves.


Today, the Bitcoin facility consumes 300-megawatts of electrical power, approximately twenty-five percent of the current capacity of the Wolf Hollow II facility. The applicant now applies for an air permit to supplant the 300-megawatt capacity used by the Bitcoin miner. It appears that the applicant intends to use public funds provided by the Texas Energy Fund (TEF) which is administered by the Public Utility Commission (PUC). TEF offers economic incentives for the construction and expansion of electric generating facilities. As a result, citizens in close proximity to Wolf Hollow will be funding their abusers. Rather than seeking a permit for expansion, the applicant could redirect the power back to the grid by cutting the cord on Bitcoin or suffer the consequences of their poor business decisions. By doing so, the residents in proximity of Wolf Hollow would not be exposed to additional “significant” amounts of pollution, excessive noise and the Texas grid would be enhanced. Bitcoin facilities simply do not belong in close proximity to our citizens and public funds should not be utilized in this fashion.

I realize that many of the issues that I have raised are beyond the purview of TCEQ. The issues reach across the Executive and Legislative branches of Federal and State government, private enterprise and the public. A broad approach is needed with participation of ALL stake holders. The question before

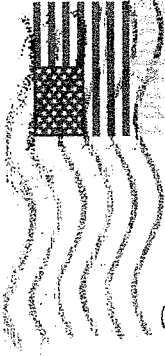

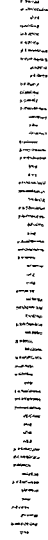

COMMENTS: TCEQ will not consider noise in their evaluation of an air permit, but will TCEQ knowingly facilitate or otherwise contribute to the commission of a crime? A State of Texas statute? Will TCEQ's actions put Texans in harm's way? The Wolf Hollow facility is currently occupied by Wolf Hollow I, Wolf Hollow II and Marathon Digital, a Bitcoin mining operation. All three facilities are in close proximity to one another and Marathon receives electrical power from Wolf Hollow II. Marathon Digital has recently been issued fifteen separate citations for violation of the Texas Penal Code Section 42.01, Disorderly Conduct. The noise levels coming from the facility frequently exceed 85-decibels, the statutory level for Disorderly Conduct, and the noise is continuous. There simply is no rest for those in proximity of Wolf Hollow and there are residences approximately 260 feet from the facility. This is not simply an inconvenience. There are far reaching health consequences. The Center for Disease Control (CDC) has determined that noise above 70-decibels over a prolonged period of time may start to damage your hearing. The CDC has also determined that in addition to hearing loss, repeated exposure to excessive noise can cause stress, anxiety, depression, high blood pressure, heart disease, and many other health problems. Additional power generators at Wolf Hollow II will certainly generate more noise and further exacerbate an untenable situation. I also have concerns relating to the potential combined pollutants coming from the existing Wolf Hollow I and Wolf Hollow II facilities coupled with the expansion project of Wolf Hollow II. Has a dispersion model been done? Are the stack heights adequate? I respectfully request a public meeting which would provide the community the opportunity to ask questions of TCEQ and the applicant regarding the expansion project.

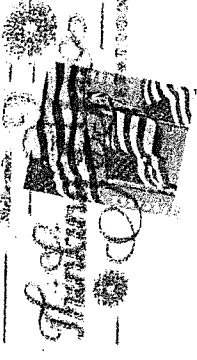

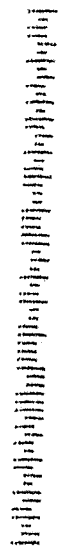

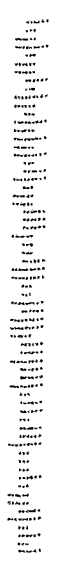

Dear TCEQ:

The Mitchell Bend Community and other areas in Precinct 2 of Hood County request a public hearing as to the issuance of permits allowing construction at 8787 Wolf Hollow Court. There are concerns about the construction of an additional generating plant at the Wolf Hollow complex. At present, there is Wolf Hollow I, Wolf Hollow II, and a Bitcoin mining operation owned by Marathon Digital. The residents in this part of Hood County have become sick ranging from hearing loss to hypertension and cardiac events that have required hospitalization. Effective resolution of this issue has been lacking.

Residents are concerned about the combined emissions from the three facilities in close proximity to one another that include products of incomplete combustion, dioxins, furans, nitrogen oxides, sulfur dioxide, sulfur hexafluoride, sulfuric acid mist, and particulates. During each quarter of 2023, violations were documented at the Wolf Hollow II complex. Residents do not have trust in operators at Wolf Hollow due to refusal to act on long standing noise that has caused health issues and violations documented by TCEQ. This warranted mistrust results in suspicion about any new pollution generating facility.

Stack test measurements for Wolf Hollow I and Wolf Hollow II since inception.

I'm Shannon Wolf, Republican Precinct 211 Chairwoman. Thank you for the important work that you do and thank you for allowing me the opportunity to speak to you on an urgent topic that impacts the people surrounding Wolf Hollow as well as the entirety of Hood County.

When I learned of the Texas Energy Fund and the Texas Senate's effort to provide a stable electrical grid for Texas based on reliable energy sources, I was supportive and I still am. What I'm not supportive of is for the Wolf Hollow II Power Plant to be allowed to increase production - going from 2 turbines to 10 - and the pollutants that will come with that. Wolf Hollow petitioned this agency to increase the air pollution to unsafe levels.

Wolf Hollow is NOT in an industrial area. It is located close to Lake Granbury and to Pecan Plantation. The power plant is surrounded by ranches, farms, homes, and churches. And an elementary school. With the exception of this power plant's property - this area is beautiful. Until recently, you could enjoy wildlife, including an endangered species.

Everyone in my area - including Pecan - received a notice from your agency alerting us to the petition and what that means for us. The air pollution would increase by "significantly."

The letter I received reads in part,

The proposed facility will emit the following air contaminants in a **significant** amount: carbon monoxide, nitrogen oxides, and particulate matter.

It goes on to say, "in addition, the facility will emit the following air contaminants in **significant** amounts: hazardous air pollutants, organic compounds, sulfur dioxide, sulfur hexafluoride, and sulfuric acid mix."

I teach Advanced Research to doctoral students and I am fluent in statistics. The word significant has a specific meaning. This letter is telling us that the amount of dangerous toxins is much greater than normal emissions from a power plant. And this is not all that will be coming from this plant.

Interestingly, the letter did not mention heavy metals including mercury and I found that puzzling as heavy metals are often found in natural gas.

Wolf Hollow produces energy based on natural gas and water. Depending on where the natural gas was harvested - and that will change every so often - will determine what pollutants will be released into the air. Mercury is a heavy metal that is commonly found in natural gas.

That pollution will not stay in precinct 2. That pollution will be in Granbury Lake. It will cover this city as well as the rest of Hood County, Somervell County, Johnson County, and perhaps further.

The ranches in this area sell their cattle to local meat markets. The grass that they eat will become contaminated. The soil that farmers grow crops in will be contaminated. Our lake where people fish and boat and swim will become contaminated.

I have two beautiful granddaughters ages 2 and 7 months. Their health will be impacted by the pollutants. Back in 2020 at the height of the Covid pandemic, I contracted the virus and contracted bilateral pneumonia. My lungs never fully recovered. I live about 3 miles from this plant. Your decision will directly impact my life. It will impact my grand babies' lives.

It will impact the lives of my community that is full of babies, children, families, elderly, and pets. It is a wonderful place to live. If you approve this petition, our homes will be devalued. In essence, this petition will rob us of our health and our financial security. And we will not be quiet and accepting of that.

Did you know that Granbury was named the best historic small town in American for 2 or 3 consecutive years? We now have the distinction of being the Celebration Capitol of Texas. We have a lot of festivals. The lake is only 2 blocks from the historic town square and the lake often plays a major role in these celebrations.

Many people vacation here. Tourism is a major source of income for Granbury and Hood CO. If you approve their petition, our historic town of Granbury will no longer have the designation of the Celebration Capitol of Texas. We will be the toxic wasteland of Texas.
