RE: Formal Opposition to TPDES Permit No. WQ0016513001 - Rainbow's End Park, Inc.

Dear Commissioners,

I am submitting this formal **opposition** to the Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (TPDES) **Permit No. WQ0016513001** for **Rainbow's End Park, Inc.**, due to significant environmental and public health concerns. As a property owner in Livingston, TX, I am directly affected by this permit, and I request that the commission **deny its approval** or, at minimum, **grant a contested case hearing** to address unresolved issues.

Objections to the Permit

1. Threat to Local Water Quality

The proposed discharge site poses a high risk of water pollution, particularly affecting the Trinity River Basin and surrounding waterways. Effluent discharge may introduce harmful contaminants, excessive nutrients, and hazardous chemicals that degrade water quality over time.

- 2. Impact on Public Health and Safety The increased pollutant load from wastewater discharge could create unsafe conditions for drinking water and recreational use. The long-term effects of bacteria, nitrates, and phosphates from treated effluent pose a risk to residents and local wildlife.
- 3. Failure to Adequately Assess Environmental Impact The environmental review process has not sufficiently evaluated the full ecological consequences of this permit. A detailed hydrological study is necessary to determine the long-term effects on the aquifer, local wells, and surface water runoff.
- 4. Economic and Property Value Damage Pollution risks and environmental degradation may lower property values in the affected area, negatively impacting local homeowners. The approval of this permit could set a dangerous precedent for future wastewater projects in Livingston.

Request for Action

Given these serious concerns, I formally request that the TCEQ:

- **Deny the permit application** based on environmental risks and public interest considerations.
- **Conduct additional environmental studies** to assess water quality impacts more thoroughly.
- Grant a contested case hearing to allow further examination of the permit's effects.
- **Require the applicant to submit enhanced pollution mitigation measures** before any reconsideration.

Conclusion

The approval of this permit would pose an **unnecessary risk to local ecosystems, residents, and water sources**. I urge the commission to **deny this application** and protect Texas waterways from harmful wastewater discharge. I appreciate your attention to this urgent matter and request that my opposition be included in the **official record** for the **public meeting on June 18, 2025**.
