The proposed Avina facility's emissions **WILL** negatively impact local air quality, particularly at **Nueces County Park and Robstown High School**, both located within 1.5 miles of the plant. My family and I frequent both locations daily, spending hours outdoors for **sports practice, band practice, and recreational activities**. Nueces County Park is the **only** park in Robstown and serves as a vital community hub, regularly filled to capacity during holidays and major events such as Easter egg hunts, birthday parties, kickball and tee-ball games, and family gatherings.

Currently, our schools and parks are already exposed to agricultural chemicals due to their **proximity to crop fields and frequent crop dusting**. The addition of Avina's emissions will further degrade air quality, making it **even more hazardous** for my family and the community I live in.

The **long-term health risks** posed by Avina's pollution cannot be ignored. Exposure to industrial emissions has been linked to **cancer, respiratory issues, and a diminished quality of life**. My health, as well as my family, currently suffer from respiratory illness and Avina will compound and worsen our health now and in the long term.





THEREFORE, WE ARE IN THE DIRECT PATH OF ANY AIR CONTAMINANT EMISSIONS FROM THE FACILITY.


Our location is a generational family farmland and residence. Been here a long time and plan to stay and pass the land on to the next generation.

Nueces County Park is the **only** park in Robstown and serves as a vital community hub, regularly filled to capacity during holidays and major events such as Easter egg hunts, birthday parties, kickball and tee-ball games, and family gatherings.

Currently, our schools and parks are already exposed to agricultural chemicals due to their **proximity to crop fields and frequent crop dusting**. The addition of Avina's emissions will further degrade air quality, making it **even more hazardous** for my family and the community ~~(@2025)~~

The **long-term health risks** posed by Avina's pollution cannot be ignored. Exposure to industrial emissions has been linked to **cancer, respiratory issues, and a diminished quality of life**. I am submitting this letter to formally request reconsideration of the Executive Director's decision re: Permit # 174951. The proposed Avina facility's emissions WILL negatively impact local air quality, particularly at Wood River Elementary School, the Nueces River, and multiple neighborhoods all located within 2.5 miles of the plant. The long-term health risks posed by Avina's pollution cannot be ignored. Exposure to industrial emissions has been linked to cancer, respiratory issues, and a diminished quality of life. Moreover, our area lacks sufficient air quality monitoring stations, making it impossible to establish an accurate baseline for current conditions. Any air quality data used to justify this permit would be subjective and fail to account for our unique local factors: Frequent crop dusting, strong winds and dust flows, local smoke as well as heavy seasonal smoke from Mexico, proximity to other industrial emitters within 5 miles, frequent atmospheric inversion layer trapping pollutants near the ground, and the strong possibility of uncontrolled or catastrophic leaks or ruptures due to tropical cyclones.

Before any permits are approved, I urge the authorities to conduct comprehensive environmental impact studies and gather community input. Specifically, an accurate air quality assessment over several months must be conducted to ensure transparency and public safety. Without this data, no accurate or informed decision can be made. I ask that you prioritize public health and environmental integrity. Reconsider this permit for the well-being of our community. I respectfully urge the commission to reconsider and reverse the Executive Director's decision. Thank you.

Even though Avina claims to be a Green Industrial Plant, all industrial plants emit numerous air pollutants, including particulate matter, ammonia, hydrogen sulfide, methane, volatile organic compounds (“VOCs”), nitrogen oxides, and odors. These pollutants cause significant public health risks and environmental impacts. Ammonia and other pollutants, for example, irritate the respiratory system, and they can be fatal at high concentrations. As a result, workers in this proposed facility and neighboring communities can experience high levels of asthma-like symptoms, bronchitis, and other respiratory diseases. This can wreak havoc on those who enjoy the outdoors and often make use of the nearby parks baseball/softball fields with their families. Lung damage and death may occur after exposure to very high concentrations of ammonia. Some people with asthma may be more sensitive to breathing ammonia than others. My home is located at 4739 FM 1889, Robstown, TX 78380. I am a long term resident of this area. This has been a home site to my family for generations. My grandfather lived here and raised a garden, my parents lived here and raised a garden, my son grew up here working the garden, and I am now teaching my grandchildren (age 6 and 8) the things I learned from my grandfather while raising a garden. The garden provides fresh food to the communities of Robstown, Calallen, and beyond.. Food that is grown here locally, never sprayed with chemicals, picked fresh, and often eaten raw. I bring this up because my first objection is that the air born contaminants from this plant are going to impact our way of life and cause damage to my garden. This has never been an industrial area, it is not fair that an area that has been used as residential and farming for generations- specifically gardening be impacted by an ammonia plant. The proposed site is only 0.6 miles from the edge of my garden. I have great concern that the fresh food people eat raw from my garden will be polluted with the air-born contaminants from this proposed facility. My second objection is that danger such a facility poses and the proximity of a quickly growing number of residents very close to this site. Immediately next to my garden is a growing neighborhood filling with nice homes and good people who do not deserve to be this close to an ammonia plant. The number of schools within a 4 mile radius is alarming and an accident or disaster at the proposed site would be catastrophic to a lot of people. My third objection is the air born pollution from this plant contaminating the open water canal that is immediately adjacent to the proposed site. This is the drinking water for the city of Robstown and surrounding areas including the Rural Acres Water System. With it being an open canal there is no way to avoid pollution from contacting the water. I am writing to formally request a Contested Case Hearing regarding TCEQ Air Quality Permit #174951 for the proposed Avina Green Ammonia Plant and I live in very close proximity to the proposed Avina site.

The absence of local air monitoring fails to account for cumulative emissions from surrounding industries, agricultural activities, heavy traffic, and aviation emissions. Without adequate monitoring, the potential health and environmental impacts on me have been significantly underestimated.

All air permits granted essentially serve as permission to pollute my air. Prevailing winds will carry emissions into my neighborhood, affecting air quality and my overall well-being. This increased exposure will limit my outdoor activities, disrupt my daily routines, and exacerbate my allergies and other health concerns. Continuous exposure, even indoors, will have both immediate and long-term detrimental effects.

Additionally, accidental releases or emissions exceeding the permitted levels will pose further risks to my quality and quantity of life. These potential risks are unaccounted for in your modeling.

My prolonged exposure to ammonia, particulate matter, volatile organic compounds, and nitrogen oxides will undoubtedly increase my risk of developing worsening respiratory issues, immune system suppression, and other chronic health effects. The emissions from Avina will contribute to my long-term health deterioration, leading to increased medical needs and a reduced quality of life.

Because I live in the affected area, I will never be able to avoid constant exposure to the cumulative harmful emissions. Both the daily and long-term exposure will impact my health for the rest of my life. Furthermore, due to Avina's ongoing emissions, my property will experience heightened levels of chemicals, which will affect the eggs and chickens we raise for food.

Given these concerns and the additional reason on the next page, I respectfully request a Contested Case Hearing to thoroughly assess the potential risks associated with this facility.
