

All air permits granted essentially serve as permission to pollute my air. Prevailing winds will carry emissions into my neighborhood, affecting air quality and my overall well-being. This increased exposure will limit my outdoor activities, disrupt my daily routines, and exacerbate my allergies and other health concerns. Continuous exposure, even indoors, will have both immediate and long-term detrimental effects.

Marching band requires **rigorous outdoor training**, especially in the summer and early fall, when rehearsals take place for several hours a day in the Texas heat. The addition of industrial emissions from this facility will put **students**, **staff**, **and spectators at risk of respiratory issues**, **and long-term health complications**.

Many students I work with already struggle with asthma, allergies, and other respiratory conditions due to existing air quality issues from agricultural chemicals and crop dusting in the area. The introduction of new industrial pollutants will only worsen these problems. Prolonged exposure to air pollution has been linked to lung disease, heart conditions, and decreased lung function, all of which would make physical activities like marching band, football, and outdoor events significantly more dangerous.

Beyond human health concerns, this facility also threatens local wildlife and natural habitats. The Nueces County Park and surrounding green spaces are home to various plant and animal species that contribute to the ecological balance of our community. Increased industrial activity, emissions, and waste could disrupt local ecosystems, harm native species, and contribute to long-term environmental degradation.

Many students and families use the park and other green spaces as places for relaxation, recreation, and outdoor learning. Industrial development near these areas will diminish their natural beauty, reduce biodiversity, and discourage outdoor activities that promote well-being and community engagement.

Robstown is a **small but proud community**, and the addition of a large industrial facility will have lasting negative effects on the **livability and attractiveness of the area**. Students, parents, and band members spend **countless hours outdoors**—not just for practices and performances, but for social events, school activities, and everyday life.

Additionally, property values in the area will decline as **no one wants to buy a home next to an industrial plant**. Families looking to move into the area for educational or career opportunities may be discouraged, which could lead to **decreased school enrollment**, **lower funding for student programs**, and fewer economic opportunities overall.

Industrial facilities produce constant noise pollution from machinery, transport trucks, and processing operations. This noise will not only disrupt the peace of residential areas but also interfere with learning environments.

Band rehearsals require **focused listening and precision**, and excessive industrial noise could disrupt practice sessions, affecting **performance quality and student concentration**. Likewise, classrooms at Robstown Early College High School could be impacted, making it **harder for students to focus and teachers to maintain an effective learning environment**.

Robstown's schools, sports teams, and fine arts programs attract families, businesses, and investments to the area. Events like football games, marching band performances, and school tournaments generate revenue through ticket sales, local business sponsorships, and tourism from visiting teams and spectators.

If air pollution, noise disturbances, and safety concerns make it harder to host outdoor events, attendance and participation in these programs will decline, hurting local businesses, restaurants, hotels, and the overall economy.

Industrial plants come with an increased risk of chemical leaks, hazardous gas releases, fires, and explosions. Robstown's emergency infrastructure is not designed to handle a large-scale industrial accident, and nearby schools, parks, and homes could be placed in immediate danger. Outdoor activities, such as marching band rehearsals, football practices, and community gatherings, would be especially vulnerable, as these events take place in open areas with little protection from airborne toxins in the event of an accident. Without a clear emergency evacuation plan, thousands of students, teachers, athletes, and community members would be at risk.

At the end of the day, Robstown is not just a location—it is a community of hardworking families, students, and educators who deserve clean air, safe neighborhoods, and a healthy environment. Approving this facility would prioritize corporate profit over the well-being of the people who live here, and the long-term consequences would be irreversible.

I urge TCEQ to reconsider this permit and conduct further environmental and health impact studies before making a final decision. The risks to public health, environmental stability, and community prosperity far outweigh any potential benefits this facility may bring.

As a former city council member of Robstown and a deeply invested community member, I am writing to formally request reconsideration of the Executive Director's decision regarding Air Quality Permit No. 174951. I have spent years working to improve this city and ensure its residents have a safe, thriving, and sustainable place to call home. The proposed Avina facility threatens that progress, and I urge you to take into account the serious concerns many of us share.

Robstown is a proud community with deep roots, and we have worked hard to make it a place where families want to live, work, and raise their children. Industrial expansion near residential areas, schools, and public spaces directly threatens our quality of life and the aesthetic character of our town.

The introduction of a large industrial facility will **undoubtedly lower property values**, making it more difficult for homeowners to sell their properties or pass them on to future generations. Families looking to settle down will be discouraged by the presence of a **polluting**, **noisy**, and **high-traffic facility** so close to homes and schools. Over time, this could result in **declining investment in our neighborhoods**, reducing community resources and local tax revenue.

The constant operation of heavy machinery, trucks, and industrial equipment will create significant noise pollution, affecting residents' ability to enjoy their homes, parks, and public

Additionally, the increase in large commercial truck traffic will further burden our already strained roadways. Roads that were designed for local traffic will now have to withstand heavy industrial transport, leading to increased wear and tear, congestion, and safety concerns for residents, pedestrians, and school buses. Who will be responsible for maintaining these roads once they begin to deteriorate under the added pressure?

One of my greatest concerns is the lack of sufficient independent monitoring of this facility. The company has been granted the ability to self-monitor, which raises serious questions about transparency, accountability, and the reliability of the data they provide.

- Who will ensure that the company accurately reports its emissions?
- Will there be independent environmental oversight to ensure compliance?
- How often will air quality and emissions be monitored, and will the results be publicly available?

Another concern is that the air monitoring used to evaluate baseline emissions is not truly representative of our area. If monitoring stations outside the impacted zone are used, the results may fail to capture the actual pollution levels within Robstown.

I urge the Commission to require:

- Local air monitors placed within the affected areas rather than relying on distant monitoring stations.
- A comprehensive, long-term study of air quality before approving the project to ensure accurate baseline data.
- Independent verification of all monitoring data to ensure transparency and accountability.

Safety is a top concern for **Robstown residents**, **schools**, **and businesses**. Industrial facilities pose **inherent risks**, and the community deserves **clear answers** on the **emergency procedures in place in the event of an accident**.

- How will residents be notified in case of a chemical leak or explosion?
- What evacuation plans exist, and are local emergency responders properly equipped to handle an industrial disaster of this scale?
- What precedent exists for ammonia-related incidents at similar facilities, and how will this facility ensure it does not suffer the same fate?

Given the risks associated with industrial ammonia storage and emissions, the people of Robstown deserve a **thoroughly reviewed and publicly available emergency response plan** before this project moves forward.

Robstown, like many communities in Texas, has historically been subjected to industrial expansion without adequate regard for environmental justice. The residents who will be most affected by this project are the same ones who have had to bear the burden of pollution, environmental degradation, and declining property values for decades.

Approving this project without properly addressing these concerns would be yet another example of prioritizing corporate interests over the health and well-being of the very people who make this town what it is.

Robstown is a tight-knit, hardworking community that deserves better than becoming an afterthought in the name of industrial expansion. While economic growth is important, it must be balanced with the rights and well-being of the people who call this town home.

I strongly urge the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality to reconsider this permit, require additional environmental and safety assessments, and engage with local residents in a meaningful way before making a final decision. Robstown's future should not be dictated by corporate profit, but by the people who live, work, and raise families here.

Dear TCEQ,

I am writing to formally request a **Contested Case Hearing regarding TCEQ Air Quality** Permit #174951 for the proposed Avina Green Ammonia Plant and I live in very <u>close proximity</u> to the proposed Avina site.

The absence of local air monitoring fails to account for cumulative emissions from surrounding industries, agricultural activities, heavy traffic, and aviation emissions. Without adequate monitoring, the potential health and environmental impacts on me have been significantly underestimated.

All air permits granted essentially serve as permission to pollute my air. Prevailing winds will carry emissions into my neighborhood, affecting air quality and my overall well-being. This increased exposure will limit my outdoor activities, disrupt my daily routines, and exacerbate my allergies and other health concerns. Continuous exposure, even indoors, will have both immediate and long-term detrimental effects.

Additionally, accidental releases or emissions exceeding the permitted levels will pose further risks to my quality and quantity of life. These potential risks are unaccounted for in your modeling.

I am writing to formally request reconsideration of the Executive Director's decision regarding Air Quality Permit No. 174951 for the proposed Avina facility. As a business teacher at Robstown Early College High School and a council member, I have deep concerns about the negative effects this facility will have on air quality, public health, property values, and the overall well-being of our students and residents.

Every day, I witness firsthand how much our school, parks, and outdoor spaces mean to the students of Robstown. Many of our students come from hardworking families who take pride in their education and extracurricular activities. Schools like Robstown Early College High School, the Little League fields, and Nueces County Park serve as vital community spaces where students and families can come together.

As a business teacher, I help my students prepare for successful careers and futures, teaching them about economic responsibility and long-term planning. However, it is difficult to encourage them to invest in their futures when their own health, environment, and quality of life are at risk due to industrial expansion.

Our school is located just over a mile from the proposed facility, meaning our students will breathe in whatever pollutants this plant releases every single day—during their walks to school, outdoor PE classes, sports practices, and after-school events. Many of these students already suffer from asthma and allergies due to existing environmental factors like crop dusting, highway pollution, and Saharan dust. Adding another major source of emissions near their school will only make things worse.

The marching band, football team, softball and baseball teams, and other outdoor programs will be directly affected. These activities are more than just hobbies for our students—they are their passions, their outlets, and in some cases, their stepping stones to college scholarships and future careers. To place an industrial facility so close to their practice fields, performance spaces, and gathering areas is not just inconsiderate—it is irresponsible.

Beyond our students, the broader Robstown community will suffer as well. This facility will emit pollutants that have been linked to **respiratory illnesses and cancer**. Children, the elderly, and individuals with **preexisting health conditions** will be most affected. The potential release of **ammonia**, in particular, raises serious red flags, as it is known to **cause severe lung damage**, **eye and skin irritation**, **and long-term health complications**.

Our community is already struggling with limited healthcare access and high rates of respiratory issues. The addition of this facility will only exacerbate these challenges, putting more strain on families and our local healthcare system.

One of the things that makes Robstown special is its **strong sense of community**. Families take pride in their homes, and property owners invest in their futures here. However, large industrial developments like Avina **tend to decrease property values and drive families away**.

Who will want to buy a home near a facility that emits dangerous pollutants, produces unpleasant odors, and increases noise levels? What kind of message does it send to current and future residents when industrial interests are prioritized over public health and safety? Declining property values not only hurt homeowners but also impact our local economy, as lower property taxes mean fewer resources for schools and community development.

While some may argue that this facility will **bring jobs to the area**, we must ask: **at what cost?** Short-term job creation should not come at the expense of **long-term sustainability and the well-being of our residents**.

A thriving local economy depends on a healthy, vibrant community. If people begin moving away due to pollution concerns, we will lose students, lose businesses, and weaken the very economy this project claims to support. Robstown should be investing in clean industries, small businesses, and sustainable economic growth—not sacrificing its future for industrial expansion that primarily benefits outside investors.

Another major concern is safety. Industrial accidents involving ammonia and other chemicals have led to serious public health disasters in other parts of the country. If there were to be an accident at this facility, what is the evacuation plan for our students and residents? How would people be notified? Is our local emergency response system equipped to handle a large-scale chemical incident?

We must also consider the risk of chemical leaks, fires, and long-term exposure effects. Schools and residential areas should not have to live under constant fear of an industrial disaster.

Lastly, this project raises serious environmental justice issues. Historically, lower-income communities and communities of color are disproportionately affected by industrial pollution. The people of Robstown deserve the same clean air, safe neighborhoods, and quality of life as any other community in Texas. We should not have to bear the burden of industrial pollution while decision-makers, executives, and shareholders benefit from a facility that does not affect their daily lives.

Robstown is a town filled with hardworking people, dedicated educators, ambitious students, and families who want a safe place to call home. We should be investing in our schools, parks, and businesses—not making our environment less livable for future generations.

I strongly urge the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality to reconsider this permit, conduct additional environmental and health impact studies, and engage with the community before making a final decision. The well-being of our students, families, and future generations should come before corporate profits.

While the pursuit of green energy initiatives is commendable, the location of such a facility must be carefully considered to ensure the safety and well-being of our residents and the integrity of our community infrastructure. The proposed site poses significant risks and potential hazards, including but not limited to: 1. **Public Health and Safety**: The proximity of the plant to schools, nursing homes, and residential areas raises serious concerns about the potential for hazardous emissions and accidental releases. I am submitting this letter to formally request reconsideration of the Executive Director's I strongly urge reconsideration of this decision for the following reasons:

The proposed Avina facility's emissions WILL negatively impact local air quality, particularly at Nucces County Park and Robstown High School, both located within 1.5 miles of the plant. My family and I frequent both locations daily, spending hours outdoors for sports practice, band practice, and recreational activities. Nucces County Park is the only park in Robstown and serves as a vital community hub, regularly filled to capacity during holidays and major events such as Easter egg hunts, birthday parties, kickball and tee-ball games, and family gatherings.

Currently, our schools and parks are already exposed to agricultural chemicals due to their **proximity to crop fields and frequent crop dusting**. The addition of Avina's emissions will further degrade air quality, making it **even more hazardous** for my family and the community I live in.

The long-term health risks posed by Avina's pollution cannot be ignored. Exposure to industrial emissions has been linked to cancer, respiratory issues, and a diminished quality of life. My health, as well as my family, currently suffer from respiratory illness and Avina will compound and worsen our health now and in the long term.

Moreover, our area lacks sufficient air quality monitoring stations, making it impossible to establish an accurate baseline for current conditions. Any air quality data used to justify this permit would be subjective and fail to account for key local factors such as:

- Frequent crop dusting
- · Strong winds and dust flows
- Smoke haze locally and from Mexico
- Proximity to other industrial emitters within five miles

Before any permits are approved, I urge the authorities to conduct comprehensive environmental impact studies and gather community input. Specifically, an accurate air quality assessment over several months must be conducted to ensure transparency and public safety. Without this data, no accurate or informed decision can be made.

There is a reason smoking indoors has been outlawed—to protect people from secondhand carcinogens. The same principle applies here. We should not be forced to breathe in harmful industrial emissions in our homes, schools, and parks.

I ask that you prioritize **public health and environmental integrity**. Reconsider this permit for the well-being of our community.

Given these concerns, I respectfully urge the commission to reconsider the Executive Director's decision. I request that my concerns, along with those of other community members, be given full consideration before a final determination is made.

I am writing to formally request reconsideration of the Executive Director's decision regarding Air Quality Permit No. 17495 for the following reasons.

The proposed Avina facility's emissions will **significantly degrade local air quality**, affecting not only **Nucces County Park and Robstown Early College High School** but also **Robstown Little League fields and the school's outdoor sports facilities**. These locations are essential gathering places for families, students, and community members who rely on them for sports, recreation, and school events.

I frequently attend softball, baseball, and football games, as well as band performances at these outdoor venues. These spaces are not just fields and parks—they are a core part of our community, where children and students come together for practices, games, school events, and extracurricular activities. These facilities are regularly filled with young children and students, many of whom rely on them as a safe, supportive environment when they are not at home.

To introduce industrial emissions into these spaces would be absolutely devastating. It would force children and families to breathe in harmful pollutants while engaging in their hobbies and passions, whether it be sports, music, or simply spending time with their peers. These activities are more than pastimes—they provide structure, growth, and a sense of belonging. To take this away from them is to take away a vital part of their lives and community.

The approval of this facility would worsen air quality in an area that is already exposed to agricultural chemicals due to nearby crop fields and frequent crop dusting. The emissions from the Avina facility will add to this pollution, further increasing the risk of respiratory illnesses, cardiovascular issues, and other long-term health concerns.

Many residents in our community, including my family, already suffer from asthma, allergies, and other respiratory conditions. Increased industrial emissions will only exacerbate these issues, disproportionately affecting children, the elderly, and individuals with preexisting health conditions. We should not be forced to endure further exposure to industrial pollutants that will negatively impact our health and overall quality of life.

Facilities of this nature require significant water resources, which could place a strain on local water supplies. Residents and agricultural operations rely on these water sources, and an increase in industrial demand could jeopardize the availability of clean water for the community.

Additionally, waste disposal from the facility must be closely regulated to prevent groundwater contamination and chemical runoff. Without clear safeguards and transparency regarding waste management practices, the risk of long-term environmental damage is too great to ignore.

The absence of local air monitoring fails to account for cumulative emissions from surrounding industries, agricultural activities, heavy traffic, and aviation emissions. Without adequate monitoring, the potential health and environmental impacts on me have been significantly underestimated.

All air permits granted essentially serve as permission to pollute my air. Prevailing winds will carry emissions into my neighborhood, affecting air quality and my overall well-being. This increased exposure will limit my outdoor activities, disrupt my daily routines, and exacerbate my allergies and other health concerns. Continuous exposure, even indoors, will have both immediate and long-term detrimental effects.

Additionally, accidental releases or emissions exceeding the permitted levels will pose further risks to my quality and quantity of life. These potential risks are unaccounted for in your modeling.

The proposed facility will generate particulate matter, hazardous air pollutants, carbon monoxide, nitrogen oxides, anhydrous ammonia, sulfur dioxide and organic compounds. I believe the proposed activities will have a negative impact and adversely affect the natural environments in my home and property.

I live at 4537 FM 1889 Robstown, Texas 78380. I reside at this residence full time with family and multiple pets.

I am an affected persons due to the proximity of my property to the proposed plant location. My property is approximately 30 feet from the proposed location. The air quality will impact the ability to use my property and affect daily activities that include fishing, hunting, gardening, ranching, baling hav, swimming in my pool, other recreational activities such as our annual family dove hunt and weekly BBQs. Additionally, I enjoy outdoor welding activities that could become more hazardous with increased particulate matter in the air, as fine particles can ignite from welding sparks, posing a serious fire risk. The continuous exposure will contribute to my long-term health deterioration as well as negatively affect the health of our grazing goats, chickens, fish, pig, dogs, and ducks.

I, Yolanda Morin, am writing to request a contest case hearing on the application of Axina Green Ammonia for proposed air quality permit number 174951. The proposed facility will generate particulate matter, hazardous air pollutants, carbon monoxide, nitrogen oxides, anhydrous ammonia, sulfur dioxide and organic compounds. I believe the proposed activities will have a negative impact and adversely affect the natural environments in my home and property.

I live at 4537 FM 1889 Robstown, Texas 78380. I reside at this residence full time with family and multiple pets.

I am an affected persons due to proximity of my property to the proposed plant location. My property is approximately 30 feet from the proposed location. The air quality will impact the ability to use my property and affect daily activities that include fishing, gardening, ranching, baling hay, swimming in my pool, family gatherings and weekly BBQs. The noise and light pollution will also affect my ability to stargaze at night and will disrupt my quality of sleep which will in turn negatively affect my mental health. The additional pollutants and particulate matter (PM) from the plant could significantly impact my well-being, increasing the frequency of medical visits due to my existing allergies and predisposition to cancer. More exposure to PM and other emissions raises the risk of respiratory issues and long-term health effects, potentially reducing my quality of life and even my life expectancy. The continuous exposure will contribute to my long-term health deterioration as well as negatively affect the health of our grazing goats, chickens, fish, pig, dogs, and ducks. The farmland and drinking water may become contaminated making it impossible to allow my animals to graze and drink healthy water.

We will also be impacted financially due to the inability to sell young goats (kids) and chicken eggs. The air, water and land pollution will lower the value of my property and make it hard to sell.

If the permit is granted, I will be breathing the pollution emitted from the facility while doing my daily perimeter walks for my cardiovascular health as well as my outdoor yoga and natural sun tanning. I do not want to spend time outside breathing known volatile organic compounds which are linked to cancer as well as the foul odor of sulfur dioxide.

It is also concerning that my home and livestock barn will not be protected in the event of a catastrophic failure and release of ammonia. We are downwind of the prevalent winds and would have no time to prepare and evacuate all of the lives on the property. In addition to my household, there are 13 other family members that live within one mile of the location. Any negative health impacts will create tragic consequences to our family lineage.



I ask that you please deny the permit or in the alternative postpone the decision so that our concerns may be evaluated thoroughly. Some of my concerns are as follows: *Avina states they "chose" the proposed location because it is a "no flood zone." I am attaching the survey of my property showing they are incorrect! It clearly states the surrounding area is indeed a flood zone. (See Attachment). *The water canal runs directly through our property. In 2016, my husband rented a water pump and decided to irrigate our property. We didn't think we were doing anything wrong considering that when we purchased the property, we were told we have water rights and thought we were free to water our land. Nope! The water department came out and instructed us to remove the pump immediately as this method of irrigating was not acceptable. The water department advised us that we were contaminating the water supply. Isn't it ironic how NOW it's ok to allow Avina to build so close to our water supply and emit pollutants into the air which will contaminate our water supply as well as allowing toxic wastewater to be dumped in our canal fully knowing the affects it will have to our drinking water. *On any given weekend you will see small children fishing from the canal and enjoying family time, and Avina will destroy that! *I have a man-made pond that provides water to our animals. The pond also acts as a refuge for ducks and birds as well as fish. The pollutants emitted by Avina will destroy this sanctuary. *We grow coastal grass and have farm animals who graze on this grass. I am submitting this letter to formally request reconsideration of the Executive Director's I strongly urge reconsideration of this decision for the following reasons:

The proposed Avina facility's emissions WILL negatively impact local air quality, particularly at Nueces County Park and Robstown High School, both located within 1.5 miles of the plant. My family and I frequent both locations daily, spending hours outdoors for sports practice, band practice, and recreational activities. Nueces County Park is the only park in Robstown and serves as a vital community hub, regularly filled to capacity during holidays and major events such as Easter egg hunts, birthday parties, kickball and tee-ball games, and family gatherings.

Currently, our schools and parks are already exposed to agricultural chemicals due to their proximity to crop fields and frequent crop dusting. The addition of Avina's emissions will further degrade air quality, making it even more hazardous for my family and the community I live in.

The long-term health risks posed by Avina's pollution cannot be ignored. Exposure to industrial emissions has been linked to cancer, respiratory issues, and a diminished quality of life. My health, as well as my family, currently suffer from respiratory illness and Avina will compound and worsen our health now and in the long term.

Moreover, our area lacks sufficient air quality monitoring stations, making it impossible to establish an accurate baseline for current conditions. Any air quality data used to justify this permit would be subjective and fail to account for key local factors such as:

- Frequent crop dusting
- Strong winds and dust flows
- Smoke haze locally and from Mexico
- Proximity to other industrial emitters within five miles

This increased exposure will limit my outdoor activities, disrupt my daily routines, and exacerbate my allergies and other health concerns. Continuous exposure, even indoors, will have both immediate and long-term detrimental effects.

Additionally, accidental releases or emissions exceeding the permitted levels will pose further risks to my quality and quantity of life. These potential risks are unaccounted for in your modeling.

My prolonged exposure to ammonia, particulate matter, volatile organic compounds, and nitrogen oxides will undoubtedly increase my risk of developing worsening respiratory issues, immune system suppression, and other chronic health effects. The emissions from Avina will contribute to my long-term health deterioration, leading to increased medical needs and a reduced quality of life.

Because I live in the affected area, I will never be able to avoid constant exposure to the cumulative harmful emissions. Both the daily and long-term exposure will impact my health for the rest of my life. Furthermore, due to Avina's ongoing emissions, my property will experience heightened levels of chemicals, which will affect <u>every aspect</u> of my outdoor activities.

Given these concerns and the additional reason listed below, I respectfully request a Contested Case Hearing to thoroughly assess the potential risks associated with this facility.

I am submitting this letter to formally request reconsideration of the Executive Director's decision re: Permit # 174951. The proposed Avina facility's emissions WILL negatively impact local air quality, particularly at Wood River Elementary School, the Nueces River, and multiple neighborhoods all located within 2.5 miles of the plant. The long-term health risks posed by Avina's pollution cannot be ignored. Exposure to industrial emissions has been linked to cancer, respiratory issues, and a diminished quality of life. Moreover, our area lacks sufficient air quality monitoring stations, making it impossible to establish an accurate baseline for current conditions. Any air quality data used to justify this permit would be subjective and fail to account for our unique local factors: Frequent crop dusting, strong winds and dust flows, local smoke as well as heavy seasonal smoke from Mexico, proximity to other industrial emitters within 5 miles, frequent atmoshpheric inversion layer trapping pollutants near the ground, and the strong possibility of uncontrolled or catostrophic leaks or ruptures due to tropical cyclones.

A reduction in quality of life and my life expectancy will be severally impacted, as the additional toxins from Avina will worsen my health conditions. I purposely stay away from anyone who smokes, as its know to cause cancer and worsen breathing conditions. Avina's flare, (or large cigarette) will compromise my already weakened immune system. My

labored breathing will become worse with every trip to the Doctors office, of with every flare emmission landing on may doorstep.

Due to increased emmission I will be forced to stay indoors to minimize my exposure. I will not be able to tend to my yard, or even just sit on my patio to relax and enjoy the evening breeze when tolerable.

The absence of local air monitoring fails to account for cumulative emissions from surrounding industries, agricultural activities, heavy traffic, and aviation emissions, crop dusting and crop dust storms that carry heavily fertilized PM. Without adequate monitoring, the potential health and **environmental impacts on me have been underestimated**.

Unpredictable winds, accidental Flares, and wind and humidity will carry emissions into my home, my neighborhood, affecting my air quality and overall well-being. Increased exposure will limit my outdoor activities, impacts my daily routines, and exacerbate my allergies and other health concerns. **Continuous exposure**—even indoors—raises concerns about both immediate and long-term effects. Additionally, unpredicted air releases pose further **risks to my quality of life and quantity of life, all of which which is not accounted for in your modeling.**

Because I live in the affected area, I will never be able to avoid consistent exposure to all the cumulative harmful emmission. The **daily exposure** and the **long term exposure** will affect me for the rest of my life.

Given these concerns, I respectfully request a Contested Case Hearing to fully assess the potential risks associated with this facility.

Dear TCEQ,

My name is Ruben Rodriguez, and I reside less than 1.5 miles away from the proposed Avina site. The recent heavy wind gusts have highlighted the severe risks this site poses to my health. The wind direction is directly towards my residence. On days like today, these high winds will bring emissions from the proposed facility directly to my front porch, and even indoors. Avina's emissions will generate particulate matter, hazardous air pollutants, carbon monoxide, nitrogen oxides, anhydrous ammonia, sulfur dioxide, and organic compounds. This air pollution will have both short-term and long-term negative impacts, adversely affecting my health, as well as the quality and quantity of my life. Additionally, the nearby fertilized and treated crop fields on two sides of my neighborhood exacerbate this issue, bringing more dust loaded with fertilizer and particulate matter into the air, further impacting my health indoors and outdoors.

I am a disabled military veteran and served my country for over 20 years, and I suffer from numerous health issues, many of which are related to my service. Due to my existing health conditions, even mild exposure to airborne pollutants like particulate matter (PM), ammonia, and chemicals from agricultural activities can significantly worsen my symptoms. The lack of local air quality monitoring in my area makes it impossible to establish a baseline of the air quality to assess the actual risk that I face.

Currently, there is no comprehensive air monitoring in place to track the cumulative impact of pollution in my area. TCEQ's air quality assessments do not adequately account for:

- Cumulative emissions from surrounding industries.
- Crop dusting chemicals that drift into residential areas.
- Emissions from aviation, due to nearby air traffic.
- · Dust storms carrying fertilized soil particles into our air.
- Heavy industrial vehicle traffic along FM 1889.

The current monitoring systems used in areas like Houston and Corpus Christi are not reflective of my unique situation. Since there are no air monitors close to my home, the air quality assessments **do not measure my actual exposure levels**, which are much higher than the predictions suggest. If Avina's operations are allowed to proceed without consideration of these additional sources of pollution, the resulting emissions could further degrade the already compromised air quality in my area to unsafe levels.

Furthermore, TCEQ's response seems to focus primarily on the acute (short-term) health effects of exposure to pollutants. However, I urge you to also consider the cumulative, long-term health effects of chronic, low-level exposure. The potential for ongoing exposure to harmful emissions, such as particulate matter, hazardous air pollutants, carbon monoxide, nitrogen oxides, anhydrous ammonia, sulfur dioxide, and organic compounds, will have serious and lasting health consequences for individuals like myself.

I suffer from autoimmune disorders, iron deficiency, high blood pressure, and chronic respiratory conditions, including severe allergies that trigger frequent coughing spells and excessive phlegm. The exposure to airborne pollutants, including particulate matter (PM), ammonia, and other emissions from Avina's operations, is highly likely to worsen these conditions. This can result in:

- More frequent medical visits, requiring steroid injections and increased medication use.
- Deterioration of my respiratory and ocular health, necessitating long-term medical intervention.
- Acute autoimmune flare-ups, resulting in further medication use and doctor visits.
- A reduced quality of life and a potential reduction in life expectancy.
- Inability to enjoy outdoor activities due to respiratory distress.

I spend approximately 3-4 hours a day outdoors, doing light yard work, maintaining my home, and engaging in other activities to improve my surroundings. However, because of my disabilities, even simple tasks often exacerbate my breathing difficulties. The addition of Avina's particulate matter and other emissions, will make it even more challenging for me to carry out these activities, ultimately affecting my overall health and well-being. The additional emissions from Avina will significantly restrict my outdoor activities, depriving me of a therapeutic outlet that is essential for maintaining my mental and physical health.

I worry that the long-term exposure to these pollutants will further exacerbate my existing conditions, leading to an overall decline in my health and a diminished quality of life.

While TCEQ's response focuses only the air permits immediate effects of exposure, it is essential to address the long-term risks of low-level air emissions, accidental releases, and other unforeseen contamination events. These ongoing air emissions will further elevate my exposure to harmful pollutants at levels that pose a serious threat to my health.

Outdoor activities are a crucial part of my routine that help reduce stress and improve my overall well-being. However, the pollution from Avina will limit my ability to engage in these activities, which in turn will negatively affect my physical health.

As an affected individual, I formally request a Contested Case Hearing to address these concerns and ensure that the health risks posed by this site are fully considered.

I implore TCEQ to account for the cumulative impacts of air pollution in our area and consider the long-term health effects on individuals like myself who are already vulnerable.

Dear Chief Clerk,

I am submitting this letter to formally request reconsideration of the Executive Director's I strongly urge reconsideration of this decision for the following reasons:

The proposed Avina facility's emissions WILL negatively impact local air quality, particularly at Nueces County Park and Robstown High School, both located within 1.5 miles of the plant. My family and I frequent both locations daily, spending hours outdoors for sports practice, band practice, and recreational activities. Nueces County Park is the only park in Robstown and serves as a vital community hub, regularly filled to capacity during holidays and major events such as Easter egg hunts, birthday parties, kickball and tee-ball games, and family gatherings.

Currently, our schools and parks are already exposed to agricultural chemicals due to their proximity to crop fields and frequent crop dusting. The addition of Avina's emissions will further degrade air quality, making it even more hazardous for my family and the community I live in.

The long-term health risks posed by Avina's pollution cannot be ignored. Exposure to industrial emissions has been linked to cancer, respiratory issues, and a diminished quality of life. My health, as well as my family, currently suffer from respiratory illness and Avina will compound and worsen our health now and in the long term.

Currently, there are no local air monitoring to establish a baseline for air quality in our area. The TCEQ's assessment of air pollution risks does not account for:

- Cumulative emissions from surrounding industries
- Crop dusting chemicals that drift into residential areas
- Aviation emissions from nearby air traffic
- Dust storms carrying fertilized soil particles
- Heavy industrial vehicle traffic along FM 1889

Without reliable downwind air quality monitoring, my actual exposure levels could be higher than predicted, and Avina's emissions could further degrade my air quality to unsafe levels.

Before any permits are approved, I urge the authorities to conduct comprehensive environmental impact studies and gather community input. Specifically, an accurate air quality assessment over several months must be conducted to ensure transparency and public safety. Without this data, no accurate or informed decision can be made.

There is a reason smoking indoors has been outlawed—to protect people from secondhand carcinogens. The same principle applies here. We should not be forced to breathe in harmful industrial emissions in our homes, schools, and parks.

I ask that you prioritize **public health and environmental integrity**. Reconsider this permit for the well-being of our community.

The absence of local air monitoring fails to account for cumulative emissions from surrounding industries, agricultural activities, heavy traffic, and aviation emissions. Without adequate monitoring, the potential health and environmental impacts on me have been significantly underestimated.

All air permits granted essentially serve as permission to pollute my air. Prevailing winds will carry emissions into my neighborhood, affecting air quality and my overall well-being. This increased exposure will limit my outdoor activities, disrupt my daily routines, and exacerbate my allergies and other health concerns. 

I am also posting questions about the permit that were not answered by TCEQ representatives during the meeting in addition to a few that have arose since. I am living and working within a three mile radius and am directly downwind of the proposed site approximately 70% of the time. Having to breathe in the MULTIPLE toxins that the permit itself states will be released into the air will have a dramatic effect of my health and will directly affect my running career. I am strongly opposed to the plant being built in a residential area. It bares repeating that your mission is to protect our air and public health. Please put our faith back into the governing bodies and abide by your mission and deny the permit. The questions I have about the Nueces Green Ammonia air permit are as follows: What will the emergency protocol be and how can you grant them a permit without knowing they have adequate protocols? How far will the particles travel in average wind speed in five min? Are you going to provide emergency response teams with adequate training for dealing with ammonia in the air? Will there be a communicative air quality investigation to determine air particulates and discharges with all current operating plants before granting this permit? Will you be updating regulations and standards for future permits qualifications and approvals to take into account the operating and already approved operational facilities? Will there be an independent investigation to verify the numbers and information posted by the applicant before granting the permit or is the TCEQ going to assume their calculations are correct without verification? I look forward to answers before the decision is made on this permit and I thank you for your time.

Any air quality data used to justify this permit would be subjective and fail to account for our unique local factors: Frequent crop dusting, strong winds and dust flows, local smoke as well as heavy seasonal smoke from Mexico, proximity to other industrial emitters within 5 miles, frequent atmoshpheric inversion layer trapping pollutants near the ground, and the strong possibility of uncontrolled or catostrophic leaks or ruptures due to tropical cyclones.

Before any permits are approved, I urge the authorities to conduct comprehensive environmental impact studies and gather community input. Specifically, an accurate air quality assessment over several months must be conducted to ensure transparency and public safety. Without this data, no accurate or informed decision can be made. I ask that you prioritize public health and environmental integrity. Reconsider this permit for the well-being of our community. I respectfully urge the commission to reconsider and reverse the Executive Director's decision. Thank you.

COMMENTS: I am opposed to Nueces Green Ammonia LLC permit #174951 and request a Contested Hearing. Their permit disclosed Ammonia particles smaller than 10 microns and some smaller than 2.5 microns that are too small for masks to stop from inhaling. The company had two other site locations that were not close to homes and schools but elected not to make even more money while at the same time expecting the Robstown ISD School Board to grant a tax abatement which they really cannot financially afford to grant. We mow and bale hay for our cousins, Thompsons, on County Road 44 that is only .8 miles away from the proposed Ammonia plant's location. Our tractor is old and has no cab for protection from the elements. We are in the open field when we are loading the round bales of hay for transport to the ranch. The proposed plant will have a 16-million-gallon tank of Ammonia. An Ammonia release will turn into a cloud and spread quickly since our region has strong winds year-round. According to their permit, item 1.2 Facility Overview claims the tank is not a source of regulated air pollutants. This is ammonia, a known potentially deadly chemical. Facilities around the world have experienced ammonia leaks with deadly results. Ammonia can liquify the skin, melt throats and lungs, blind eyes. My family owns the 100+ year old family home and farmland located 1.25 miles away from the proposed plant. The address is 1301 FM 1889. My brother mows the property regularly on a riding mower in a bee suit. There are wild honey bees on the property. My late father once had several huge hives of honey bees at home and we learned to respect and enjoy them and the honey they provided. Colony Collapse Disorder, extreme temperatures and people have killed many bees. If an ammonia leak travels just 1.25 miles, the precious honey bees will die. If my brother is mowing outside, his life is in danger too. The hazardous air pollutants do not care if they are considered minor or major, they can still kill. Also my late uncle Rudolf's property is only .75 miles down the road from the proposed plant location. TCEQ is behind the danger curve in it's obligation to protect the citizens of Texas. Your permitting process is too limited in scope. The state of Texas really needs to step up and start coordinating with the US Homeland Security who has established 16 critical infrastructure priorities. This permit should be vetted with US Homeland Security to secure the welfare of our nation. Otherwise, it is an excuse for a quick easy economic development paid for by the US taxpayers to a foreign owned company for 100% exported product that knowingly puts it's citizens in danger. Texas is giving our resources to include All Remaining Water in the Nueces Water Control Improvement and Development Board #3. However as of today 7.5 million gallons of water are designated for Agriculture and 3 million gallons of water are for the public. This means NC WICD 3 does not even legally have the water to sell until the board votes to modify the designation. The company plans on using 3.5 gigawatts of power. This should be used for new family homes not foreign entities reaping US Federal Funds at the citizen's expense. When did the state of Texas determine a foreign owned company has more rights to use the resources secured by the hard labor of it's citizens for over a century for a handful of jobs while endangering it's own citizens? This is a warped version of Economic Development that sacrifies Texans.

COMMENTS: I request the TCEQ seriously reconsider approving permit 174951 to Avina/Nueces Green Ammonia LLC for the proposed ammonia plant to protect the residents living within 6+ miles due to the known future exposure as provided by Avina/Nueces Green Ammonia LLC. They admitted 'The proposed facility will emit the following contaminants: anhydrous ammonia, carbon monoxide, hazardous air pollutants, nitrogen oxides, organic compounds, particulate matter including particulate matter of 10 microns or less, 2.5 microns or less and sulfer dioxide. Winds in this region of South Texas are variable and ever changing with the seasons. This means everybody in the cities of Robstown, NW Corpus Christi a.k.a. Calallen, TX as well as the homes next door to the property are exposed to the known contaminants. The site was provided by the local Economic Development entities some of which had not filed their IRS tax records in years. COMMENTS: I oppose the 'Green' Ammonia plant planned for the present location on FM 1889 in Nueces County, TX. It is my opinion our local elected officials have opted for potential economic growth over the wishes of their constituents. The officials were so aware the public would oppose the location some intentionally pled ignorance once it became known on social media. As a family who lives less than 2 miles north of the proposed site of the plant, we feel the location is NOT suitable due to its potential environmental hazards affecting air quality, water availability, and land. I personally suffered from a condition my pulmonary doctor referred to as "ground glass" affecting my lungs, and therefore my breathing, in 2016 due to environmental conditions. My condition improved, however, I am monitored to make sure it is under control. I would not want to repeat that experience again. 

I am submitting this letter to formally request reconsideration of the Executive Director's I strongly urge reconsideration of this decision for the following reasons:

The proposed Avina facility's emissions WILL negatively impact local air quality, particularly at Nueces County Park and Robstown High School, both located within 1.5 miles of the plant. My family and I frequent both locations daily, spending hours outdoors for sports practice, band practice, and recreational activities. Nueces County Park is the only park in Robstown and serves as a vital community hub, regularly filled to capacity during holidays and major events such as Easter egg hunts, birthday parties, kickball and tee-ball games, and family gatherings.

Currently, our schools and parks are already exposed to agricultural chemicals due to their proximity to crop fields and frequent crop dusting. The addition of Avina's emissions will further degrade air quality, making it even more hazardous for my family and the community I live in.

The long-term health risks posed by Avina's pollution cannot be ignored. Exposure to industrial emissions has been linked to cancer, respiratory issues, and a diminished quality of life. My health, as well as my family, currently suffer from respiratory illness and Avina will compound and worsen our health now and in the long term.

Moreover, our area lacks sufficient air quality monitoring stations, making it impossible to establish an accurate baseline for current conditions. Any air quality data used to justify this permit would be subjective and fail to account for key local factors such as:

- Strong winds and dust flows

- Proximity to other industrial emitters within five miles

COMMENTS: I would like to express my opposition to permit #174951 for Avina Green Ammonia, LLC. The proposed location for this plant is within 500 feet from residents of this community and nearby neighborhoods which have been in the area for decades. The pollutants emitted from the plant have the potential to cause many serious health issues for these residents. It could also adversely affect the migration of the many birds which fly through the area as the plant would be in the direct path. Over 400 species use this region during the autumn and spring migrations. Sudden changes can trigger early or even delayed migration affecting birds that are just passing by the area to recharge. Birds have narrow lung capillaries and higher breathing rates and spend considerable amount of time in open air. They are highly vulnerable to atmospheric particulate matter. Avian responses to air pollution include respiratory distress and illness, increased detoxification effort, elevated stress levels, immunosuppression, behavioral changes, and impaired reproductive success. Exposure to air pollution may furthermore reduce population density, species diversity and species richness in bird communities and negatively impacts the migration decisions of migrants. I request a comprehensive study be conducted on the effect of these pollutants on the birds.

The location of the Avina Green Ammonia plant is an opportunistic grab at a parcel of land with water rights to the Nueces River for a long time(greed and unlimited supply). Their stated needs are up to 10 million gallons a day, and unlimited if they give the water district 72 hours notice?? This could potentially put 2 large communities, Robstown and Calallen, in a position to suffer dangerous life altering effects in the event of a problem or leak, or worse, at the plant, and ammonia being released into the atmosphere. Ammonia emissions in Singapore noted over 25%, as high as 50% increase in ambient particle matter( such as anhydrous ammonia, carbon monoxide, nitrogen oxides, Sulfur dioxide) leading to premature mortalities, and also linked to death, heart disease, strokes, lung cancer and respiratory infections...30% to 70% higher than their baseline. Avina tries to sell the idea as green and safe, yet the plant is of a new yet untried design. Claims of safety are as yet without a proven track record. In my opinion, this plant should be in established industrial areas in Corpus Christi along the coast, NOT in the middle of a farming community, surrounded by 2 large residential areas with many elementary, middle and high schools... totaling 10, one senior center, 8 daycare and pre-schools and 3 rehab and nursing homes. ANY INDUSTRIAL ACCIDENT or release of ammonia at this location could have catastrophic consequences. It does not belong at this location. RE: Request for Reconsideration - Air Quality Permit # 174951 (Nueces Green Ammonia LLC)

I am submitting this letter to formally request reconsideration of the Executive Director's decision re: Permit # 174951. The proposed Avina facility's emissions WILL negatively impact local air quality, particularly at Wood River Elementary School, the Nueces River, and multiple neighborhoods all located within 2.5 miles of the plant. The long-term health risks posed by Avina's pollution cannot be ignored. Exposure to industrial emissions has been linked to cancer, respiratory issues, and a diminished quality of life. Moreover, our area lacks sufficient air quality monitoring stations, making it impossible to establish an accurate baseline for current conditions. Any air quality data used to justify this permit would be subjective and fail to account for our unique local factors: Frequent crop dusting, strong winds and dust flows, local smoke as well as heavy seasonal smoke from Mexico, proximity to other industrial emitters within 5 miles, frequent atmoshpheric inversion layer trapping pollutants near the ground, and the strong possibility of uncontrolled or catostrophic leaks or ruptures due to tropical cyclones.

Before any permits are approved, I urge the authorities to conduct comprehensive environmental impact studies and gather community input. Specifically, an accurate air quality assessment over several months must be conducted to ensure transparency and public safety. Without this data, no accurate or informed decision can be made. I ask that you prioritize public health and environmental integrity. Reconsider this permit for the well-being of our community. I respectfully urge the commission to reconsider and reverse the Executive Director's decision. Thank you.
