The Executive Director respectfully requests that the above-referenced item be scheduled for Commissioners' Agenda. Permit information is attached for your convenience. This is a contested Water Use Permit Application Matter.

The Executive Director received an application from Enbridge Ingleside Oil Terminal, LLC seeking a Water Use Permit pursuant to Texas Water Code § 11.121 and Texas Commission on Environmental Quality Rules Title 30 Texas Administrative Code §§ 295.151, *et seq.*

The application and fees were received on July 27, 2021. The application was declared administratively complete and accepted for filing with the Office of the Chief Clerk on August 11, 2021. Additional information was received on October 12 and December 2, 2022. Required notice was published and mailed to the water right holders of record in the San Antonio-Nueces Coastal Basin pursuant to Title 30 Texas Administrative Code §§ 295.152 and 295.153. The comment period and hearing request period for this application closed on April 17, 2023. The comment period was re-opened and a public meeting was held on February 29, 2024. Ingleside on the Bay Coastal Watch Association (IOBCWA) and multiple individuals requested a contested case hearing during the hearing request period, which closed on February 29, 2024.

The application is now technically complete and the staff has recommended that the application be granted based on the analysis in the technical review memos.

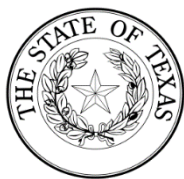

WHEREAS, Enbridge Ingleside Oil Terminal, LLC seeks a water use permit to divert and use not to exceed 500 acre-feet of water per year from a diversion reach on Corpus Christi Bay, San Antonio-Nueces Coastal Basin, at a maximum combined diversion rate of 222.8 cfs (100,000 gpm), for industrial purposes in San Patricio County; and

WHEREAS, the proposed upstream diversion point is located at Latitude 27.821405° N, Longitude 97.209573° W; and

WHEREAS, the proposed downstream diversion point is located at Latitude 27.820763° N, Longitude 97.203362° W; and

WHEREAS, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality finds that jurisdiction over the application is established; and

WHEREAS, this permit, if granted, is subject to requirements and orders of the South Texas Watermaster; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Director recommends special conditions be included in the permit; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has complied with the requirements of the Texas Water Code and Rules of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality in issuing this permit;

NOW, THEREFORE, this permit, designated Water Use Permit No. 13775, is issued to Enbridge Ingleside Oil Terminal, LLC subject to the following terms and conditions:

1. USE

Permittee is authorized to divert and use not to exceed 500 acre-feet of water per year from Corpus Christi Bay, San Antonio-Nueces Coastal Basin for industrial purposes in San Patricio County.

2. DIVERSION

A. Permittee is authorized to divert from a reach on Corpus Christi Bay with the upstream point being at Latitude 27.821405° N, Longitude 97.209573° W and the downstream point being at Latitude 27.820763° N, Longitude 97.203362° W in San Patricio County.

B. Permittee is authorized to divert at a maximum combined diversion rate of 222.8 cfs (100,000 gpm).

3. TIME PRIORITY

The time priority for the water right is August 11, 2021.

4. CONSERVATION

Permittee shall implement water conservation plans that provide for the utilization of those practices, techniques, and technologies that reduce or maintain the consumption of water, prevent or reduce the loss or waste of water, maintain or improve the efficiency in the use of water, increase the recycling and reuse of water, and prevent the pollution of water, so that a water supply is made available for future or alternative uses. Such plans shall include a requirement that in every water supply contract entered into on or after the effective date of this permit, including any contract extension or renewal, that each successive wholesale customer develop and implement conservation measures. If the customer intends to resell the water, then the contract for resale of the water shall have water conservation requirements so that each successive customer in the resale of the water will be required to implement water conservation measures.

5. SPECIAL CONDITIONS

A. Permittee shall implement reasonable measures in order to reduce impacts to aquatic resources due to entrainment or impingement. Such measures shall include, but shall not be limited to, the installation of screens at the diversion structure(s).

B. Permittee shall install and maintain a measuring device which accounts for, within 5% accuracy, the quantity of water diverted from the point(s) authorized above in Paragraph 2. DIVERSION and maintain measurement records.

C. Permittee shall allow representatives of the South Texas Watermaster reasonable access to the property to inspect the measuring device and records.

D. Permittee shall contact the South Texas Watermaster prior to diversion of water authorized by this permit.

This permit is issued subject to all superior and senior water rights in the San Antonio-Nueces Coastal Basin.

This permit is subject to the requirements and orders of the South Texas Watermaster.

Permittee agrees to be bound by the terms, conditions and provisions contained herein and such agreement is a condition precedent to the granting of this permit.

All other matters requested in the application which are not specifically granted by this permit are denied.

This permit is issued subject to the Rules of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality and to the right of continuing supervision of State water resources exercised by the Commission.



APPLICATION SUMMARY

Enbridge Ingleside Oil Terminal, LLC (Applicant) seeks a water use permit to divert 500 acre-feet of water per year from a reach on Corpus Christi Bay, San Antonio-Nueces Coastal Basin, at a maximum combined diversion rate of 222.8 cfs (100,000 gpm), for industrial purposes in San Patricio County.

WATER CONSERVATION REVIEW

Pursuant to Title 30 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §295.9(1), an application requesting to appropriate or to use water for industrial use requires the submittal of a water conservation plan.

The water conservation plan for industrial use was reviewed and found to be administratively complete per 30 TAC §288.3.

Requirements for Water Right Application under 30 TAC §288.7

Under 30 TAC §288.7, a water conservation plan submitted with a water right application for a new or additional appropriation of water must include data and information which:

- (1) supports the applicant's proposed use of water with consideration of the water conservation goals of the water conservation plan;
- (2) evaluates conservation as an alternative to the proposed appropriation; and
- (3) evaluates any other feasible alternative to new water development including, but not limited to, waste prevention, recycling and reuse, water transfer and marketing, regionalization, and optimum water management practices and procedures.

Consideration of Water Conservation Goals

Applicant stated the requested water will be used for firefighting and testing the firewater pump system for mechanical integrity and leaks. The target for water use efficiency is 98 percent of water will not be consumed and therefore returned as flow, with an estimated loss of 2 percent due to evaporation. Water diverted but not consumed shall be discharged into Corpus Christi Bay. Additionally, Applicant will monitor the pump system for potential leaks and will repair discovered leaks in a timely manner. The target for water savings proposed by limiting water use and fixing leaks is a savings of 5 percent for a five-year goal and 10 percent for a ten-year goal.

Conservation as an Alternative to the Proposed Appropriation

Applicant stated that the water will only be used as necessary to support required testing and for emergency use for firefighting should the need occur. Any unused water will be returned to the source so that there will be minimum consumption of water.

Feasible Alternatives to New Water Development

Applicant has taken conservation into account through the development of efficient use and reuse practices stated within the Water Conservation Plan. Due to the amount of water needed for emergency firewater pump system testing, no feasible alternatives exist to the proposed appropriation and the requested amount of appropriation is necessary and reasonable to ensure the facility has adequate water for testing and emergency situations.

Based on the information provided in the application and in the industrial water conservation plan, Resource Protection Staff has determined that these goals and strategies are reasonable.

Consistency with State and Regional Water Plans

The application is consistent with the 2021 Region N Water Plan and the 2022 State Water Plan because there is nothing in the water plans that conflicts with issuing this proposed permit.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Based on the analysis, Resource Protection staff has evaluated the application and determined that it meets the review requirements.

The following water conservation language should be included in the proposed permit, if granted:

Permittee shall implement water conservation plans that provide for the utilization of those practices, techniques, and technologies that reduce or maintain the consumption of water, prevent or reduce the loss or waste of water, maintain or improve the efficiency in the use of water, increase the recycling and reuse of water, and prevent the pollution of water, so that a water supply is made available

for future or alternative uses. Such plans shall include a requirement that in every water supply contract entered into on or after the effective date of this permit, including any contract extension or renewal, that each successive wholesale customer develop and implement conservation measures. If the customer intends to resell the water, then the contract for resale of the water shall have water conservation requirements so that each successive customer in the resale of the water will be required to implement water conservation measures.

These environmental flow standards are considered adequate to support a sound ecological environment (Title 30 TAC §298.410). This review is conducted in accordance with §11.147(e-3) of the TWC and Title 30 TAC Chapter 298 Subchapter F (Nueces River and Corpus Christi and Baffin Bays). The Applicant's proposed diversion reach is located on Corpus Christi Bay.

RECOMMENDATIONS

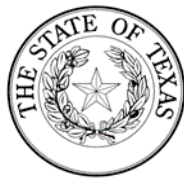

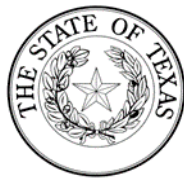

Enbridge Ingleside Oil Terminal, LLC busca un permiso de uso de agua para desviar 500 acres-pies de agua por año de un tramo en la Bahía de Corpus Christi, Cuenca Costera de San Antonio-Nueces, para fines industriales en el Condado de San Patricio. SOLICITUD.
