DESCRIPTION OF MATTER:

Arkansas Electric Cooperative Corporation (Applicant) has submitted an application seeking an Authorization to Construct (ATC) from the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ or Commission) regarding its new wastewater treatment plant. According to the Applicant, the ATC is necessary as the new wastewater treatment plant must be constructed first to construct other aspects of their operation.

APPLICANT: Arkansas Electric Cooperative Corporation

TYPE: Authorization to Construct

The Executive Director recommends that the Commission grant the Applicant's request for an Authorization to Construct the wastewater treatment facility.

BACKGROUND:

Applicant proposes to operate the new Naples Power Plant and submitted its application for an Authorization to Construct on August 18, 2025. The Applicant submitted an application for new TPDES Permit No. WQ0004589000 on May 14, 2025, seeking authorization to discharge treated wastewater on an intermittent and flow-variable basis via Outfall 001. On May 22, 2025, the Water Quality Division declared the

application administratively complete. The application is currently under technical review.

Proposed Facility and Wastewater

The Applicant owns land located approximately 0.33 miles southeast of the intersection of State Highway 77 and County Road 4314, near the City of Naples, Morris County, Texas 75571, where the Applicant proposes to build the new Naples Power Plant, a proposed power generation facility with two dual-fuel (natural gas and fuel oil) simple cycle combustion turbines. The proposed facility's wastewater system will consist of: multimedia filters to treat raw water from on-site wells; a potable water system for sanitary use and the service/fire water storage tank for electric generating operations; multimedia filters that will intermittently generate a backwash wastestream routed to stormwater/wastewater collection sumps; an on-site septic tank and drain field system; an oil water separator; and an on-site pond.

Proposed Discharge Route

The Applicant proposes to discharge treated effluent into Segment No. 0303 of the Sulphur River Basin. According to its application, Segment No. 0303 is not listed as an impaired segment on the State's Clean Water Act § 303(d) List.

If the draft permit is issued, the effluent will be discharged into Mary Lees Branch, then to White Oak Creek, and then to Sulphur/South Sulphur River in Segment No. 0303 of the Sulphur River Basin. The unclassified receiving water uses are limited aquatic life use for Mary Lees Branch (intermittent with perennial pools) and high aquatic life uses for Mary Lees Branch (perennial). The designated uses for Segment No. 0303 are primary contact recreation and high aquatic life use.

Summary of Applicant's Request

According to its application, Applicant has requested an Authorization to Construct the proposed wastewater treatment facility before the issuance of a permit because construction of the proposed facility is set to start in November 2025. The Applicant

states the proposed Naples Power Plant will have an underground oil water separator, which is one of the first pieces of equipment that will need to be installed prior to the issuance of the pending TPDES permit. The Applicant further states that this authorization is necessary to prevent delay in construction of the entire site, which would further delay its ability to begin producing electricity that contributes to the overall power grid in the State of Texas.

COMPLIANCE HISTORY:

The Water Quality Division prepared a Compliance History Report on July 25, 2025. According to the report, the Applicant currently has a Customer and Regulated Entity Rating of Not Applicable.²

AUTHORITY:

Pursuant to Tex. Water Code § 26.027(c), a person may not commence construction of a treatment facility until the commission has issued a permit to authorize the discharge of waste from the facility, except with the approval of the Commission. Under Tex. Water Code § 26.019, the Commission is authorized to issue orders and make determinations necessary to effectuate the purposes of Texas Water Code, Chapter 26.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S RECOMMENDATION:

The Executive Director recommends that Applicant's request for an Authorization to Construct the wastewater treatment facility be approved. The Applicant has provided a sufficient justification for obtaining authorization to construct the wastewater treatment facility by explaining that the authorization is necessary for reasonable and efficient construction startup and operation of its planned facility according to its proposed schedule for its overall site construction. In its application, Applicant explained that it intends to install an underground oil water separator that necessitates the requested authorization to prevent the delay in commencing construction of the entire site, which would further delay its ability to begin producing electricity that contributes to the overall power grid in the State of Texas.

The Executive Director finds that allowing construction of the proposed wastewater treatment facility in coordination with other construction at the site to be a reasonable request. TCEQ has not received any public comments or requests for a contested case hearing on the Applicant's pending TPDES application. All timely public comments and hearing requests on this application will be considered by the Commissioners at a later date in accordance with TCEQ's rules in 30 Tex. Admin. Code Chapter 55.

The Executive Director is not aware of any public comments or hearing requests concerning this application at this time,³ but notes that if the Applicant's TPDES application is referred to the State Office of Administrative Hearings for a contested case hearing, it would significantly extend the permitting process, thereby preventing the coordination of construction activities for the wastewater treatment facility and the ongoing construction of the non-wastewater treatment aspects of the proposed facility.

As noted in the attached draft Order, allowing construction of the wastewater treatment facility to begin prior to the issuance of a TPDES permit does not authorize operation of, or discharge from, the proposed treatment facility until the Commission has issued a permit authorizing the discharge. Nor does approval of the ATC bind the Commission on the issuance or terms of a final permit; therefore, the Applicant proceeds with construction of the treatment facility at its own risk.

AN ORDER

Granting the Request by Arkansas Electric Cooperative Corporation for an Order Authorizing Commencement of Construction; TCEQ Docket No. 2025-1527-IWD

On MONTH DAY, 202X, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (Commission of TCEQ) considered Arkansas Electric Cooperative Corporation's (Applicant) request for an Order authorizing commencement of construction under §§ 26.019 and 26.027(c) of the Texas Water Code (TWC). Applicant has applied for new Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (TPDES) Permit No. WQ0004589000 to authorize the discharge of evaporative cooler blowdown, plant and equipment washdown, multimedia filter backwash, treated secondary containment stormwater, and stormwater from industrial area on an intermittent and flow variable basis via Outfall 001.

The Applicant owns land approximately 0.33 miles southeast of the intersection of State Highway 77 and County Road 4314, near the City of Naples, Morris County, Texas 75571, where it proposes to build the wastewater treatment facility. The facility will serve the Naples Power Plant, a proposed power generation facility with two dualfuel (natural gas and fuel oil) simple cycle combustion turbines. The proposed wastewater treatment facility will consist of multimedia filters to treat raw water from on-site wells, a potable water system for sanitary use and the service/fire water storage tank for electric generating operations, multimedia filters that will intermittently generate a backwash waste stream routed to stormwater/wastewater collection sumps, an on-site septic tank and drain field system, an oil water separator, and an on-site pond.

The Applicant seeks authorization to commence construction of the wastewater treatment facility while the application for the TPDES permit is pending before the Commission. A copy of the request for Authorization to Construct (ATC) is attached as Exhibit A. Having considered the evidence, the Commission finds that the request by Arkansas Electric Cooperative Corporation should be granted.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On May 15, 2025, Arkansas Electric Cooperative Corporation submitted an application for new TPDES Permit No. WQ0004589000, seeking authorization to

discharge treated wastewater on an intermittent and flow-variable basis via Outfall 001.

- 2. Arkansas Electric Cooperative Corporation submitted a written request on August 18, 2025, for authorization to construct a new wastewater treatment facility.
- 3. Arkansas Electric Cooperative Corporation owns land located approximately 0.33 miles southeast of the intersection of State Highway 77 and County Road 4314, near the City of Naples, Morris County, Texas 75571, where it proposes to build a wastewater treatment facility to serve the Naples Power Plant, a proposed power generation facility with two dual-fuel (natural gas and fuel oil) simple cycle combustion turbines.
- 4. Arkansas Electric Cooperative Corporation requested an Authorization to Construct (ATC) while its application for the TPDES permit is pending before the Commission. The Applicant requested this ATC to allow reasonable and efficient construction startup, and operation of its planned facility according to proposed schedules for its overall site construction.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. TWC § 26.027(c) prohibits a person from commencing construction of a treatment facility until the Commission has issued a permit authorizing the discharge of waste from the facility, unless the Commission has approved the construction.
- 2. TWC § 26.019 authorizes the Commission to issue orders and make determinations necessary to effectuate the purposes of TWC Chapter 26.
- 3. The Findings of Fact above provide sufficient justification to issue this Order under TWC § 26.027.
- 4. This Order will effectuate the purposes of TWC Chapter 26.
- 5. This Order does not authorize operation of, or a discharge from, the wastewater treatment facility to be constructed under this Order before obtaining a permit or other authorization from the Commission.

THEREFORE, THE TEXAS COMMISSION ON ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ORDERS THAT:

- 1. Arkansas Electric Cooperative Corporation is authorized to commence construction of its proposed wastewater treatment facility located approximately 0.33 miles southeast of the intersection of State Highway 77 and County Road 4314, near the City of Naples, Morris County, Texas 75571
- 2. Arkansas Electric Cooperative Corporation is authorized to commence construction under this Order at its own risk. Any draft permit limitations or constraints contained in TCEQ Permit No. WQ0004589000 may change during the internal review process, the public comment process, or the contested case hearing process.

- 3. Arkansas Electric Cooperative Corporation shall not operate or discharge effluent from the facility to be constructed under this Order until it obtains a permit from the Commission.
- 4. This Order shall not constrain, bind, or commit the Commission in its decision on any proceeding or matter before the Commission relating to TCEQ Permit No. WQ0004589000.
- 5. This Order does not convey any property rights in either real or personal property, or any exclusive privileges; nor does it obviate the necessity of (1) complying with any applicable Federal, State, or local laws or regulations; and (2) obtaining Federal, State, or local permits or authorizations required by law for the activities otherwise authorized by this Order.
- 6. The Chief Clerk of the Commission is directed to forward a copy of this Order to Arkansas Electric Cooperative Corporation, the Executive Director of the Commission, and the Public Interest Counsel of the Commission, and to issue the Order and cause it to be recorded in the files of the Commission.
