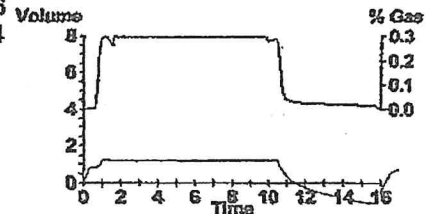
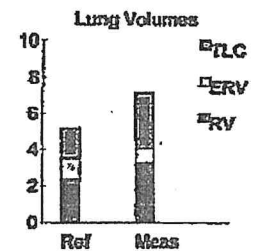
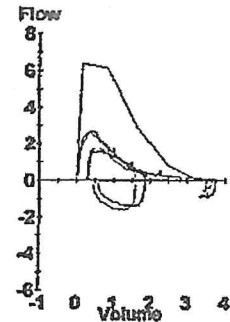

Interpretation:

There is a severe obstructive lung defect. The airway obstruction is confirmed by the decrease in flow rate at peak flow and flow at 25%, 50% and 75% of the flow volume curve. An obstructive lung defect is confirmed by an increased RV and an increased TLC. Diffusion capacity is within normal limits. This is interpreted as an insignificant response to bronchodilator. Albuterol sulfate given prior to post study. Test was performed under ATS guidelines.

Straight off the TCEQ laws on batch plants, Logan X cannot make concrete, has to have a wastewater system, but they are making concrete then coming back and dumping the waste out of their trucks straight on the ground, defying the TCEQ. Our property is 68 yards away from Logan X and the environment has already been changed. There used to be wildlife on our property and since Logan X has been making concrete the wildlife has all but vanished. Deer, rabbits, ducks, birds, and skunks have disappeared. Since Logan X has been making concrete, the air always has a chemical smell around our property. The noise and light pollution affect our sleeping and our dogs. Our horses will be adversely affected by breathing the air pollution created by this plant. We have a tank that our horses drink out of which will be polluted if this plant is allowed. All day there is noise and night time their lights light up our entire property. The Meyer household disputes all the comments made by the Executive Director. I guarantee if this plant was to be put close to one of the commissions houses it would be denied. - Exposed compared to unexposed subjects had higher blood or urinary concentration of heavy metals and of a marker of renal damage.

Not one resident in our community wants this plant next to them. Keith Meyer has a petition signed by all the residents that will be attached.

I am writing this petition with a deeply personal stake as one of the many residents living within 480 yards of the Logan X ready mix concrete batch plant. Not one among us, the 'affected persons,' supports the operation of this plant. Our collective opposition is rooted in legitimate concerns over health, safety, and environmental consequences.

Firstly, the health implications are undeniable. Concrete batch plants release harmful dust particles and emissions, which contribute to respiratory issues and other health problems.
