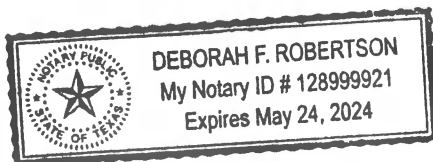

She was among five finalists who were given three minutes to make a prepared statement that included the answers to four questions agreed upon by the eight Board of Regents members.

Other finalists were Barbers Hill ISD principal Heron Thomas, retired dentist Yvonne Thomas, retired assistant city manager Kevin Troller and Mike Wilson, senior vice president at Texas First Bank.

The questions asked the applicants about their leadership experience; their opinions of the biggest risk and opportunities facing Lee College and the regents' role in those; their ability to make the required commitment to preparation for and attendance at meetings and other functions; and if they'd be willing, if needed, to run in a special November election if regents couldn't come up with one pick Thursday, and, if they were selected, would they run for re-election in 2025.

All five finalists answered affirmatively to the election question.

And it turned out, the possibility — and expense — of a special election in November was a factor in the final balloting.

And, if Lee College had all five finalists on the ballot, that would most assuredly require a runoff election and another \$153,000 expense.

This does not include the fees from Chambers County for the portion of Baytown in that jurisdiction.

The second ballot cast by regents after a 40-minute executive session following the candidates' speeches ended in a 4-4 tie between Warford and Heron Thomas, with a five-vote majority needed for election.

Regents Gilbert Santana, Judy Jirrels, Mark Himsel and Mark Hall voted for Warford and regents Susan Moore-Fontenot, Weston Cotten, Gina Guillory and Daryl Fontenot voted for Heron Thomas.

After that tie, regents adjourned the open session for a second 18-minute gathering behind closed doors.

When they returned to their seats in front of a larger-than-normal audience and voted a third time, Daryl Fontenot and Susan Moore-Fontenot flipped their votes.

Warford polled six votes to two for Heron Thomas.

"I felt equally strong about both candidates and I felt strongly about avoiding the cost of a special election," Daryl Fontenot said. "Therefore I decided

APPLICATION.

Exxon Mobil Corporation, P.O. Box 4004, Baytown, Texas 77522-4004, has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for an amendment to Air Quality Permit Number 102982, which would authorize a modification of the BOP-2X Unit at the Exxon Mobil Chemical Baytown Olefins Plant located at 3525 Decker Drive, Baytown, Harris County, Texas 77520. The existing facility will emit the following contaminants: ammonia, hazardous air pollutants, carbon monoxide, nitrogen oxides, organic compounds, particulate matter including particulate matter with diameters of 10 microns or less and 2.5 microns or less, sulfur dioxide, and sulfuric acid mist.

This application was submitted to the TCEQ on September 21, 2022. The executive director has completed the technical review of the application and prepared a draft permit which, if approved, would establish the conditions under which the facility must operate. The executive director has made a preliminary decision to issue the permit because it meets all rules and regulations. The permit application, executive director's preliminary decision, and draft permit will be available for viewing and copying at the TCEQ central office, the TCEQ Houston regional office, and at the Sterling Municipal Library, 1 Mary Elizabeth Wilbanks Avenue, Baytown, Harris County, Texas, beginning the first day of publication of this notice. The facility's compliance file, if any exists, is available for public review at the TCEQ Houston Regional Office, 5425 Polk Street, Suite H, Houston, Texas.

DIRECT REFERRAL.

The Notice of Application and Preliminary Decision was published, in English and Spanish, on December 22, 2022. On February 14, 2023, the Applicant filed a request for direct referral to the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH). Therefore, the chief clerk has referred this application directly to SOAH for a hearing on whether the application complies with all applicable statutory and regulatory requirements.

County OKs nearly per year ballfield bill

Samantha Humphrey, Economic Development Director, reported to the court that the Economic Development Department is managing approximately \$40 million in various grant projects.

Precinct 3 Commissioner Tommy Hammond presented an update on the proposed future Justice Center. Hammond told the court that the jail has 336 beds and that number cannot change. Carl Griffith, jail consultant, spoke to the court and said, "The number of beds will remain the same, but we are changing the layout to reduce the cost."

"We were not happy with the numbers from the reduction sessions in October," Hammond said, "so we came back in November and reduced the numbers to 200,000 square feet and cost of \$134 million." In July, commissioners learned the 260,000-square-foot Justice Center would cost \$214 million. With the addition of construction soft costs, furniture, fixtures and equipment, Architectural-Engineering, and testing, the estimated cost of the smaller Justice Center is expected to be \$135 million.

Commissioner Billy Combs (Precinct 4) brought up the type of financing the county may be allowed to use with the Public, Private, Partnership (P3) they have discussed and presented as the type of project delivery preferred for the Justice Center project. There could be a situation that removes the I&S (interest and sinking) option. In this case, the county will be required to use bonds to fund the project.

Griffith, former Sheriff and County Judge of Jefferson County, said, "The sheriff is willing to move forward with the bonds since the state is on us hard about our jail." A bond situation means that the project will be

on a ballot and in the hands of the citizens of Chambers County. It would be a 30-year bond. Combs said, "We have discussed this from the beginning and were told we would come out on the I&S side."

After a short discussion, Judge Jimmy Sylvia responded, "Let's see what these P3 options have to offer." Hammond said, "The bond option would not create a tax increase. The most positive thing about a bond deal is that it goes out to the voters and the voters would approve it or not."

Chambers County Commissioners Court honored victims of violent crimes again this year with the Tree of Angels Tradition. The Tree of Angels is a traditional ceremony held during commissioner's court in December to honor survivors and victims' families by placing an angel on a special tree in the courthouse's rotunda. The Tree of Angels ceremony is moving forward toward its 10th year.

Bob Pascasio spoke to the court and announced that he is returning as the CEO and Administrator of Chambers County Hospital District 1. The Hospital District serves Anahuac and Mont Belvieu. Pascasio served as director 10 years ago.

CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates) requested a special services contract with Chambers County in the amount of \$10,000. Combs proposed that the amount of the contract be changed to \$15,000. The motion passed unanimously.

Denise Hutter, County Tax Collector, elected by the residents of Chambers County and serving for the past 35 years, resigned effective Jan. 31. Hutter would be up for re-election next term. Commissioner's Court voted to accept applications to fill Hutter's job for the duration of her term.

Chambers County OKs nearly \$200,000 per year ballfield bill

Chambers County Commissioners approved \$198,400 per year – about half the annual pay of the president of the United States – for the upkeep of 12 baseball fields at Fort Anahuac park.

Still to be finalized is the Memorandum of Understanding that calls for Greenscapes Six, a golf course construction and maintenance company based in Mont Belvieu, to bring the ballfields up to ready condition,” Precinct 1 Commissioner Tommy Gore said.

The MOU would authorize extra money to pay Greenscapes Six for additional work to sod or install turf. AYSO President Trent Hart said his group’s board has given the county a list of concerns for the new facility at Fort Anahuac Park.

“We have invited the commissioners and other county officials involved with the facility to our next board meeting on Jan. 5,” Hart said. We are hopeful and confident that the MOU will be approved and comments addressed by the start of the season.

“We are grateful to the county for getting the facility built. Everyone in the community is excited to play on the new fields.”

B.J. Simon, Baytown-West Chambers County Economic Development Associate Director, asked the court to consider a 10-year term, 60% tax abatement for Sumika Semiconductor Materials Texas Inc.

Special Conditions

Permit Number 102982

1. This permit authorizes chemical manufacturing operations for a facility located at 3525 Decker Drive, Baytown, Harris County, Texas.
2. This permit covers only those sources of emissions listed in the attached table entitled "Emission Sources - Maximum Allowable Emission Rates" (MAERT), and those sources are limited to the emission limits and other conditions specified in that table.

Federal Applicability

3. These facilities shall comply with all applicable requirements of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regulations on Standards of Performance for New Stationary Sources promulgated in Title 40 Code of Federal Regulations Part 60 (40 CFR Part 60):
 - A. Subpart A, General Provisions.
 - B. Subpart Kb, Standards of Performance for Volatile Organic Liquid Storage Vessels (Including Petroleum Liquid Storage Vessels) for Which Construction, Reconstruction, or Modification Commenced After July 23, 1984.
 - C. Subpart VVa, Standards of Performance for Equipment Leaks of VOC in the Synthetic Organic Chemicals Manufacturing Industry for Which Construction, Reconstruction, or Modification Commenced After November 7, 2006;
 - D. Subpart NNN, Standards of Performance for Volatile Organic Compound (VOC) Emissions From Synthetic Organic Chemical Manufacturing Industry (SOCMI) Distillation Operations;
 - E. Subpart RRR, Standards of Performance for Volatile Organic Compound Emissions from Synthetic Organic Chemical Manufacturing Industry (SOCMI) Reactor Processes; and
 - F. Subpart IIII, Standards of Performance for Stationary Compression Ignition Internal Combustion Engines.
4. These facilities shall comply with all applicable requirements of EPA regulations on National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants in 40 CFR Part 61:
 - A. Subpart A, General Provisions.
 - B. Subpart J, National Emission Standards for Equipment Leaks (Fugitive Emission Sources) of Benzene;
 - C. Subpart V, National Emission Standards for Equipment Leaks (Fugitive Emission Sources); and
 - D. Subpart FF, National Emission Standard for Benzene Waste Operations.
5. These facilities shall comply with all applicable requirements of the EPA regulations on National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants for Source Categories in 40 CFR Part 63:
 - A. Subpart A, General Provisions.

- (4) 15 ppmvd ammonia (NH_3) corrected to 3 percent oxygen on a one-hour rolling average and 10 ppmvd NH_3 corrected to 3 percent oxygen on a 12-month rolling average.
 - E. Compliance with the limits in Special Condition Nos. 7.C and 7.D shall be demonstrated for the average of all operating furnaces, EPNs BOPXXFURNACE and XXIF01-ST, respectively, except as specified in Special Condition No. 21. (xx/xx)
 - F. Per Alternative Method of Control (AMOC) No. 183, compliance with the limit in 30 TAC § 117.310(c)(2)(B), 10 ppmvd NH_3 corrected to 3 percent oxygen on a 24-hour rolling average basis, shall be demonstrated for each operating furnace represented by EPN BOPXXFURNACE (EPNs XXAF01-ST, XXBF01-ST, XXCF01-ST, XXDF01-ST, XXEF01-ST, XXFF01-ST, XXGF01-ST and XXHF01-ST) except as specified in Special Condition No. 21. (xx/xx)
 - G. The requirements in this condition and the initial demonstration of compliance requirements in Special Condition No. 25 shall apply once the furnaces are operational after a shakedown period not to exceed 180 days.
8. During decoking events, cyclonic scrubbers shall achieve a particulate matter removal efficiency of at least 95%. There shall be no visible emissions exceeding 20 percent in any six-minute period as determined using U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Test Method 22.
- A. The decoking vents covered by this permit shall not operate unless control devices and associated equipment are maintained in good working order and operating. All decoking vents will be inspected for visible emissions once per day during decoking mode. Records shall be maintained of all inspections and maintenance performed on decoking drum cyclone and ductwork.
 - B. The minimum steam flow rate into each decoking drum shall be continuously monitored and be recorded at least once an hour during decoking mode. The minimum steam flow rate shall be 45,000 lb/hr.
 - C. The steam flow meter shall be calibrated at a frequency in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications, or equivalent, or at least annually, whichever is more frequent, and shall be accurate to within 10 percent.
9. The decoking facilities shall be evaluated to demonstrate compliance with the Special Conditions and MAERT prior to commencement of operation. The evaluation procedures shall be submitted for approval to the Office of Air, Air Permits Division.
10. The elevated flare (EPN FLAREXX1) shall be designed and operated in accordance with the following requirements:
- A. The flare system shall be designed such that the combined assist gas and waste stream to each flare meets the 40 CFR § 60.18 specifications of minimum heating value and maximum tip velocity under normal, upset, and maintenance flow conditions.

Flare testing per 40 CFR § 60.18(f) may be requested by the appropriate regional office to demonstrate compliance with these requirements.

If there is a bypass for the control device, comply with either of the following requirements:

- (1) Install a flow indicator that records and verifies zero flow at least once every fifteen minutes immediately downstream of each valve if opened would allow a vent stream to bypass the control device and be emitted, either directly or indirectly, to the atmosphere; or
- (2) Once a month, inspect the valves, verifying that the position of the valves and the condition of the car seals prevent flow out the bypass.

A bypass does not include authorized analyzer vents, highpoint bleeder vents, low point drains, or rupture discs upstream of pressure relief valves if the pressure between the disc and relief valve is monitored and recorded at least weekly. A deviation shall be reported if the monitoring or inspections indicate bypass of the control device when it is required to be in service.

- B. Records of the inspections required shall be maintained and if the results of any of the above inspections are not satisfactory, the permit holder shall promptly take necessary action.

12. The emergency generators shall be designed and operated in accordance with the following conditions: **(11/16)**

- A. The emergency generators (EPN DIESELXX) are each authorized to fire diesel fuel containing not more than 0.3 weight percent sulfur and is limited to a maximum of 100 hours of engine testing annually.
- B. Any operation in excess of the times specified in Special Condition No. 12.A is subject to reporting as required by 30 TAC § 122.

13. The cooling tower (EPN BOPXXCT) shall be designed and operated in accordance with the following conditions:

- A. The total dissolved solids (TDS) concentration and the recirculation rate shall be used to demonstrate compliance with the limits in the MAERT.
- B. The holder of this permit shall monitor the conductivity of the cooling water at a monitoring point in the recirculating water of the cooling tower, and record these conductivity readings on a no less than weekly basis. Each conductivity measurement shall be converted to TDS concentration in ppmw using the conversion factor established in accordance with Special Condition No. 13.E.
- C. The holder of this permit shall monitor the flow rate of the recirculating water of the cooling tower, and record these flow rate values on a no less than hourly basis.
- D. The permit holder shall use the following equation to determine Total Dissolved Solids (TDS) concentration in cooling tower from conductivity measurement:

$$\text{TDS} = \text{Conductivity} \times \text{Conversion Factor (CF}_{\text{TDS}})$$

Where:

- B. An internal floating deck or "roof" or equivalent control shall be installed in all tanks. The floating roof shall be equipped with one of the following closure devices between the wall of the storage vessel and the edge of the internal floating roof: (1) a liquid-mounted seal, (2) two continuous seals mounted one above the other, or (3) a mechanical shoe seal.
 - C. An open-top tank containing a floating roof (external floating roof tank) which uses double seal or secondary seal technology shall be an approved control alternative to an internal floating roof tank provided the primary seal consists of either a mechanical shoe seal or a liquid-mounted seal and the secondary seal is rim-mounted. A weathershield is not approvable as a secondary seal unless specifically reviewed and determined to be vapor-tight.
 - D. For any tank equipped with a floating roof, the permit holder shall perform the visual inspections and seal gap measurements as specified in Title 40 Code of Federal Regulations § 60.113b (40 CFR § 60.113b) Testing and Procedures (as amended at 54 FR 32973, Aug. 11, 1989) to verify fitting and seal integrity. Records shall be maintained of the dates seals were inspected and seal gap measurements made, results of inspections and measurements made (including raw data), and actions taken to correct any deficiencies noted.
 - E. The floating roof design shall incorporate sufficient flotation to conform to the requirements of API Code 650 dated November 1, 1998, or an equivalent degree of flotation, except that an internal floating cover need not be designed to meet rainfall support requirements and the materials of construction may be steel or other materials.
 - F. Uninsulated tank and tote exterior surfaces exposed to the sun shall be painted white, aluminum, or an equivalent light color, except for labels, logos, etc. not to exceed 15 percent of the exterior surface area. Storage tanks must be equipped with permanent submerged fill pipes.
 - G. As an alternative to the control requirements of Special Condition Nos. 14.B through 14.F, the tank vent may be routed for destruction in a combustion device, such as EPNs XXAF01-ST, XXBF01-ST, XXCF01-ST, XXDF01-ST, XXEF01-ST, XXFF01-ST, XXGF01-ST, XXHF01-ST, XXIF01-ST, FLAREXX1, or FLAREXX2. **(xx/xx)**
 - H. During routine operation, the Wastewater tank vent (FIN XXZTK05) shall be routed to the furnace firebox system (EPNs XXAF01-ST, XXBF01-ST, and XXCF01-ST), and the Compressor Wash Oil tank vent (FIN XXZTK11) shall be routed to the flare header (EPNs FLAREXX1 and/or FLAREXX2).
 - I. The permit holder shall maintain a record of tank and tote throughput for the previous month and the past consecutive 12 month period for each tank.
15. Piping, Valves, Connectors, Pumps, Agitators, and Compressors - 28VHP

Except as may be provided for in the special conditions of this permit, the following requirements apply to the above-referenced equipment:

Each open-ended valve or line shall be equipped with an appropriately sized cap, blind flange, plug, or a second valve to seal the line. Except during sampling, both valves shall be closed. If the isolation of equipment for hot work or the removal of a component for repair or replacement results in an open ended line or valve, it is exempt from the requirement to install a cap, blind flange, plug, or second valve for 72 hours. If the repair or replacement is not completed within 72 hours, the permit holder must complete either of the following actions within that time period;

- (1) a cap, blind flange, plug, or second valve must be installed on the line or valve;
or
- (2) the open-ended valve or line shall be monitored once for leaks above background for a plant or unit turnaround lasting up to 45 days with an approved gas analyzer and the results recorded. For all other situations, the open-ended valve or line shall be monitored once within the 72 hour period following the creation of the open ended line and monthly thereafter with an approved gas analyzer and the results recorded. For turnarounds and all other situations, leaks are indicated by readings of 500 ppmv and must be repaired within 24 hours or a cap, blind flange, plug, or second valve must be installed on the line or valve.

- F. Accessible valves shall be monitored by leak-checking for fugitive emissions at least quarterly using an approved gas analyzer. Sealless/leakless valves (including, but not limited to, welded bonnet bellows and diaphragm valves) and relief valves equipped with a rupture disc upstream or venting to a control device are not required to be monitored. If a relief valve is equipped with rupture disc, a pressure-sensing device shall be installed between the relief valve and rupture disc to monitor disc integrity.

A check of the reading of the pressure-sensing device to verify disc integrity shall be performed at least quarterly and recorded in the unit log or equivalent. Pressure-sensing devices that are continuously monitored with alarms are exempt from recordkeeping requirements specified in this paragraph. All leaking discs shall be replaced at the earliest opportunity but no later than the next process shutdown.

The gas analyzer shall conform to requirements listed in Method 21 of 40 CFR part 60, appendix A. The gas analyzer shall be calibrated with methane. In addition, the response factor of the instrument for a specific VOC of interest shall be determined and meet the requirements of Section 8 of Method 21. If a mixture of VOCs is being monitored, the response factor shall be calculated for the average composition of the process fluid. A calculated average is not required when all of the compounds in the mixture have a response factor less than 10 using methane. If a response factor less than 10 cannot be achieved using methane, then the instrument may be calibrated with one of the VOC to be measured or any other VOC so long as the instrument has a response factor of less than 10 for each of the VOC to be measured.

Replacements for leaking components shall be re-monitored within 15 days of being placed back into VOC service.

- L. Compliance with the requirements of this condition does not assure compliance with requirements of 30 TAC Chapter 115, an applicable New Source Performance Standard (NSPS), or an applicable National Emission Standard for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAPS) and does not constitute approval of alternative standards for these regulations.
16. Alternative requirements for the equipment specified in Special Condition No. 15:
- A. In addition to the methods identified in Special Condition No. 15.A, exempted components may be identified by process flow diagrams that exhibit sufficient detail to identify major pieces of equipment, including major process flows to, from, and within a process unit. Major equipment includes, but is not limited to, columns, reactors, pumps, compressors, drums, tanks, and exchangers.
 - B. In lieu of the requirements specified in Special Condition No. 15.E, new and reworked piping connections may be monitored for leaks using an approved gas analyzer within 30 days of the components being returned to service.
 - C. As an alternative to comparing the daily emission rate of the components on the delay of repair (DOR) list to the total emissions from a unit shutdown per the requirements of Special Condition No. 15, Subparagraph I, the cumulative hourly emission rate of all components on the DOR list may be compared to ten percent of the fugitive short term allowable on the Maximum Allowable Emission Rate Table in order to determine if the TCEQ Regional Director and any local program is to be notified. In addition, the hourly emission rates of each specific compound on the DOR list must be less than ten percent of the speciated hourly fugitive emission rate of the same compound.
 - D. Open-ended valves or lines in an emergency shutdown system that are designed to open automatically in the event of a process upset are exempt from the requirements in Paragraphs E(1) and E(2) of Special Condition No. 15. **(11/16)**
17. Additional Flange Monitoring - 28CNTQ
- A. All non-insulated flanges in gas/vapor and/or light liquid service shall be monitored quarterly with an approved gas analyzer in accordance with Special Condition Nos. 15.F through 15.J.
 - B. In lieu of the monitoring frequency specified in paragraph A, flanges may be monitored on a semiannual basis if the percent of flanges leaking for two consecutive quarterly monitoring periods is less than 0.5 percent. Flanges may be monitored on an annual basis if the percent of flanges leaking for two consecutive semiannual monitoring periods is less than 0.5 percent. If the percent of flanges leaking for any semiannual or annual monitoring period is 0.5 percent or greater, the facility shall revert to quarterly monitoring until the facility again qualifies for the alternative monitoring schedules previously outlined in this paragraph.
18. Piping, Valves, Pumps, and Compressors in NH₃ service - 28AVO **(xx/xx)**
- Except as may be provided for in the Special Conditions of this permit, the following requirements apply to the above-referenced equipment:
- A. Audio, olfactory, and visual checks for NH₃ leaks within the operating area shall be made once per shift.

- G. Planned MSS activities during which Furnace XXI's SCR is out of service for planned MSS (EPN XXIF01-MSS) shall not exceed 100 hours per rolling 12-month period.
(xx/xx)

Aqueous Ammonia Transfer

22. Unloading and Storage of Aqueous NH₃ (11/16)

- A. The ammonia sump (EPN XXNH3SUMP) shall be filled such that the water level in the sump is at least 2.95 feet before each ammonia storage drum filling activity. The water shall be drained following each activity.
- B. Audio, olfactory, and visual checks for NH₃ leaks within the operating area shall be performed while drum filling activities are occurring.
- (1) Discontinue the transfer activity once a leak is detected.
 - (2) Immediately, but no later than 24 hours upon detection of a leak, plant personnel shall take at least one of the following actions:
 - (a) Isolate the leak.
 - (b) Commence repair or replacement of the leaking component.
 - (c) Use a leak collection or containment system to prevent the leak until repair or replacement can be made if immediate repair is not possible.
 - (3) Date and time of each inspection shall be noted in the operator's log or equivalent. Records shall be maintained at the plant site of all repairs and replacements made due to leaks. These records shall be made available to representatives of the Texas Commission of Environmental Quality (TCEQ) upon request.
- C. The ammonia sump shall be covered.
- D. The ammonia storage drum filling activity shall be defined as starting with the depressurizing of the ammonia storage drum for filling and ending with the disconnecting of the ammonia truck.
- E. Annual aqueous ammonia transfer to the drum shall be limited to 461,200 gallons per year on a rolling 12-month average.
- F. Ammonia storage drum emissions shall be routed to EPN XXNH3SUMP during drum filling activities. Alternatively, the ammonia vapor can be vapor balanced from the ammonia storage drum back to the ammonia truck.
- G. Records shall be kept for the ammonia sump for at least 5 years from the date upon which they were made and include at least the date of the ammonia drum filling activity, the volume of ammonia transferred from the ammonia truck to the ammonia storage drum, and the date that the ammonia sump is drained.

Continuous Demonstration of Compliance

- (1) All monitoring data and quality-assurance data shall be maintained by the source. The data from the CEMS may, at the discretion of the TCEQ, be used to determine compliance with the conditions of this permit.
 - (2) The appropriate TCEQ Regional Office shall be notified at least 15 days prior to any required RATA in order to provide them the opportunity to observe the testing.
 - (3) Quality-assured (or valid) data must be generated when the furnace is operating except during the performance of a daily zero and span check. Loss of valid data due to periods of monitor break down, out-of-control operation (producing inaccurate data), repair, maintenance, or calibration may be exempted provided it does not exceed 5 percent of the time (in hours) that the furnace operated over the previous calendar year. The measurements missed shall be estimated using engineering judgment and the methods used recorded. Options to increase system reliability to an acceptable value, including a redundant CEMS, may be required by the TCEQ Regional Manager.
24. The NH₃ concentration in each Exhaust Stack (EPNs XXAF01-ST, XXBF01-ST, XXCF01-ST, XXDF01-ST, XXEF01-ST, XXFF01-ST, XXGF01-ST, XXHF01-ST, and XXIF01-ST) shall be tested or calculated according to one of the methods listed below and shall be tested or calculated according to frequency listed below. Testing for NH₃ slip is only required on days when the SCR unit is in operation. (xx/xx)
- A. The holder of this permit may install, calibrate, maintain, and operate a CEMS to measure and record the concentrations of NH₃. The NH₃ concentrations shall be corrected in accordance with Special Condition Nos. 7.C(4) and 7.D(4).
 - B. As an approved alternative, the NH₃ slip may be measured using a sorbent or stain tube device specific for NH₃ measurement in the 5 to 10 ppm range. The frequency of sorbent or stain tube testing shall be daily for the first 60 days of operation, after which, the frequency may be reduced to weekly testing if operating procedures have been developed to prevent excess amounts of NH₃ from being introduced in the SCR unit and when operation of the SCR unit has been proven successful with regard to controlling NH₃ slip. Daily sorbent or stain tube testing shall resume when the catalyst is within 30 days of its useful life expectancy. These results shall be recorded and used to determine compliance with Special Condition Nos. 7.C(4) and 7.D(4).
 - C. As an approved alternative to sorbent or stain tube testing or an NH₃ CEMS, the permit holder may install and operate a second NO_x CEMS probe located between the firebox and the SCR, upstream of the stack NO_x CEMS, which may be used in association with the SCR efficiency and NH₃ injection rate to estimate NH₃ slip. This condition shall not be construed to set a minimum NO_x reduction efficiency on the SCR unit. These results shall be recorded and used to determine compliance with Special Condition Nos. 7.C(4) and 7.D(4).

- (7) Procedure/parameters to be used to determine worst case emissions during the sampling period.

The purpose of the pretest meeting is to review the necessary sampling and testing procedures, to provide the proper data forms for recording pertinent data, and to review the format procedures for the test reports. The TCEQ Regional Director must approve any deviation from specified sampling procedures.

- (a) Air contaminants emitted from the furnaces to be tested include (but are not limited to) SO₂, PM₁₀, PM_{2.5}, and VOC.

The sulfur content in the inlet fuel may be tested as an alternative to including SO₂ in the stack test.

- (b) Sampling shall occur within 60 days after achieving the maximum operating rate, but no later than 180 days after initial start-up of the facilities and at such other times as may be required by the TCEQ Executive Director. Requests for additional time to perform sampling shall be submitted to the appropriate regional office.

- (c) The facility being sampled shall operate at a minimum of 80 percent of the design firing rate during stack emission testing. These conditions/parameters and any other primary operating parameters that affect the emission rate shall be monitored and recorded during the stack test. Any additional parameters shall be determined at the pretest meeting and shall be stated in the sampling report. Permit conditions and parameter limits may be waived during stack testing performed under this condition if the proposed condition/parameter range is identified in the test notice specified in paragraph A and accepted by the TCEQ Regional Office. Permit allowable emissions and emission control requirements are not waived and still apply during stack testing periods.

During subsequent operations, if the firing rate is more than 10 percent higher than the firing rate during the previous stack test, stack sampling shall be performed at the new operating conditions within 120 days. This sampling may be waived by the TCEQ Air Section Manager for the region.

- (d) Copies of the final sampling report shall be forwarded to the offices below within 60 days after sampling is completed. Sampling reports shall comply with the attached provisions entitled "Chapter 14, Contents of Sampling Reports" of the TCEQ Sampling Procedures Manual. The reports shall be distributed to the appropriate TCEQ Regional Office and each local air pollution control program, as required.

- B. After four of the furnaces, two with vent emissions routed for control and two without, have been sampled and tested, the permit holder may submit their final reports to the TCEQ Office of Air, Air Permits Division to request a waiver for sampling and testing the remaining four furnaces. The waiver may be granted based on the consistency of the four final reports. If the waiver is denied, sampling and testing for the remaining four furnaces shall be completed no later than 60 days after receiving the notification letter from TCEQ. Copies of the final sampling report shall be submitted as specified in Special Condition No. 25.A(7)(d).

28. Emissions from sources and activities authorized by this permit shall be included in the compliance demonstration for PAL6.

Low-density apartments tabled by Baytown P&Z

A potential new multi-family housing development on Hunt Road attracted a lot of interest from members of the planning and zoning commission Tuesday before the group voted to table the item for further consideration. City planning staff had recommended denying the developer's zoning request, but commission members did not concur.

The development in question is on a 35-acre tract fronting on Hunt Road near the Lodge at Pine Creek, a senior living facility behind H-E-B.

Developer Tim Crawford said the development is similar to communities his company has in Conroe and under construction in The Woodlands. Unlike traditional apartments, the complex would be a mix of individual cottages and small multi-family units, with duplexes and several six-unit buildings. The six-unit buildings would be two stories, with all other buildings single-story.

The proposal would be for the 35-acre site to have eight units per acre, about half of the 15 units per acre allowed under the proposed MF 1 zoning.

He said that 80% of the

munity amenities like a pool and fitness center.

Christopher Chavis, with planning and development services, said the recommendation to deny the zoning change was based on the number of multifamily projects already approved but not yet built in the same general vicinity. In its written report, city staff said the number of pending projects "do not indicate that there is a community need for this zoning type at this time."

Crawford responded by saying that the development precisely fits a need identified by the city in its comprehensive plan approved in May. "The comprehensive plan talked about a need for different housing types. It talked about promoting different housing types, it talked about promoting horizontal apartment projects, it talked about the 'missing middle.'"

He said the plan presentation even includes a photo of a similar project as an example of what is needed.

Chavis said with the zoning change, there is no guarantee the project would be built as presented, and could be revised up to the 15 units per acre allowed under the zoning regulations. City Council could also

Low-density apartments tabled by Baytown P&Z

A potential new multi-family housing development on Hunt Road attracted a lot of interest from members of the planning and zoning commission Tuesday before the group voted to table the item for further consideration. City planning staff had recommended denying the developer's zoning request, but commission members did not concur.

The development in question is on a 35-acre tract fronting on Hunt Road near the Lodge at Pine Creek, a senior living facility behind H-E-B.

Developer Tim Crawford said the development is similar to communities his company has in Conroe and under construction in The Woodlands. Unlike traditional apartments, the complex would be a mix of individual cottages and small multi-family units, with duplexes and several six-unit buildings. The six-unit buildings would be two stories, with all other buildings single-story.

The proposal would be for the 35-acre site to have eight units per acre, about half of the 15 units per acre allowed under the proposed MF 1 zoning.

He said that 80% of the

munity amenities like a pool and fitness center.

Christopher Chavis, with planning and development services, said the recommendation to deny the zoning change was based on the number of multifamily projects already approved but not yet built in the same general vicinity. In its written report, city staff said the number of pending projects "do not indicate that there is a community need for this zoning type at this time."

Crawford responded by saying that the development precisely fits a need identified by the city in its comprehensive plan approved in May. "The comprehensive plan talked about a need for different housing types. It talked about promoting different housing types, it talked about promoting horizontal apartment projects, it talked about the 'missing middle.'"

He said the plan presentation even includes a photo of a similar project as an example of what is needed.

Chavis said with the zoning change, there is no guarantee the project would be built as presented, and could be revised up to the 15 units per acre allowed under the zoning regulations. City Council

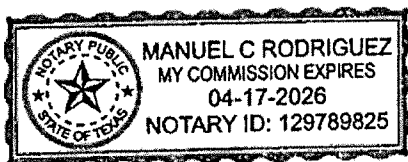

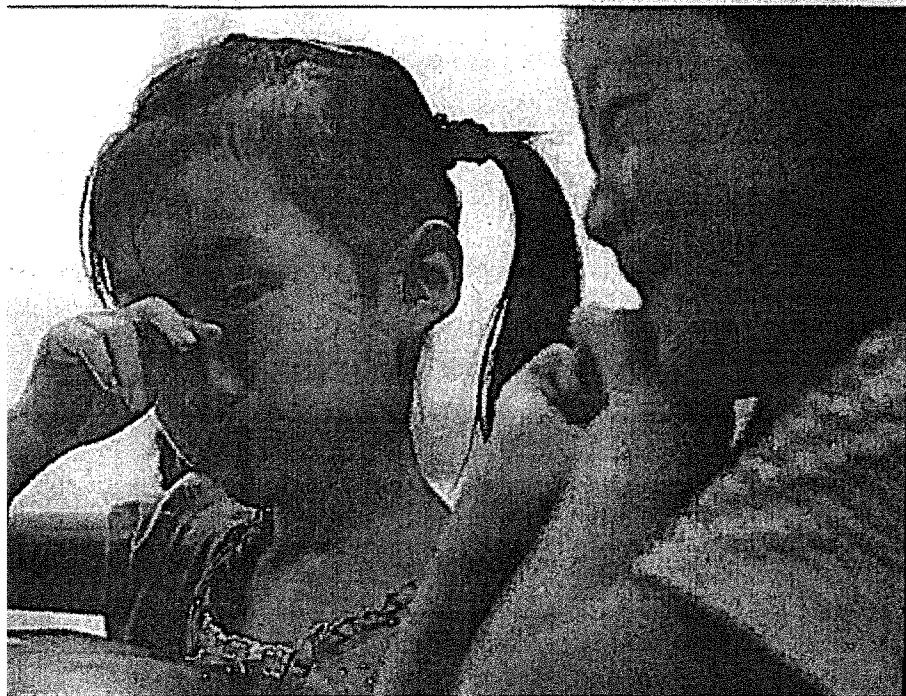

La paradoja de la educación

Para comprender este vínculo sorprendente, es útil analizar cómo se desarrolla la miopía en primer lugar. La mayoría de los bebés recién nacidos comienzan la vida con visión de lejos.

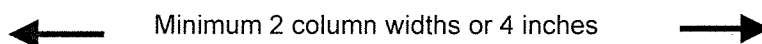
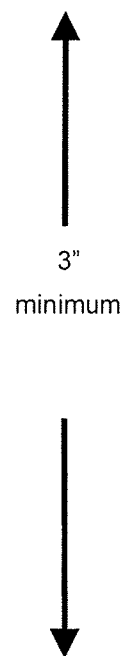

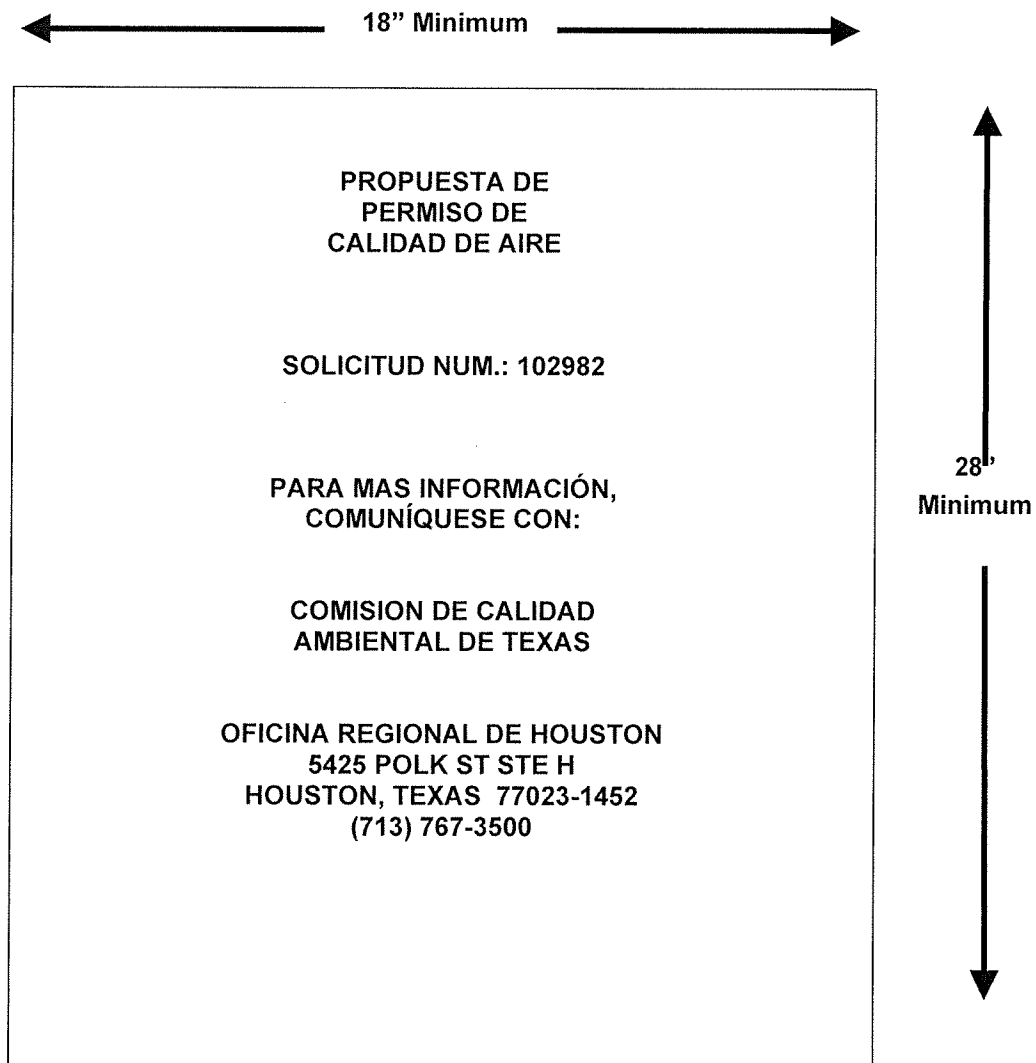

EXAMPLE F

SIGN POSTING

Sign(s) must be in place on day of publication of first newspaper notice and must remain in place and be legible during that designated comment period (30 days). These signs must remain in place until 30 days after the last newspaper publication of the second notice (either English or alternate language notice, whichever is later). Note - The information shown is an example only. It is your responsibility to verify that the appropriate information pertaining to your application is accurate. Each sign placed at the site must be located within 10 feet of each (every) property line paralleling a public highway, street or road. Signs must be visible from the street and spaced at not more than 1,500-foot intervals. A minimum of one sign, but not more than three signs shall be required along any property line paralleling a public highway, street, or road.



Sign(s) must be placed at whatever height above the ground is necessary for sign(s) to be 100% visible from the street.

WHITE BACKGROUND WITH BLACK LETTERS

All lettering must be no less than 1-1/2-inch block printed capitals.

Alternative Language Notice

In certain circumstances, applicants for air permits must complete notice in alternative languages.

- Public notice rules require the applicant to determine whether a bilingual program is required at either the elementary or middle school nearest to the facility or proposed facility location. Bilingual education programs are determined on a district-wide basis. When students who are required to attend either school are eligible to be enrolled in a bilingual education program, some alternative language notice is required (signs, or signs and newspaper notice).
- Since the school district, and not the schools, must provide the bilingual education program, these programs do not have to be located at the elementary or middle school nearest to the facility or proposed facility to trigger the alternative language notice requirement. If there are students who would normally attend the nearest schools eligible to be taught in a bilingual education program at a different location, alternative language notice is required.
- If triggered, publication of alternative language notices must be made in a newspaper or publication primarily printed in each language taught in the bilingual education program. This notice is required if such a newspaper or publication exists in the municipality or the county where the facility is or will be located.
- The applicant must demonstrate a good faith effort to identify a newspaper or publication in the required language. If a newspaper or publication of general circulation published at least once a month in such language cannot be found, publishing in that language is not required, but signs must still be posted adjacent to each English language sign.
- Publication in an alternative language section or insertion within an English language newspaper does not satisfy these requirements.
- The applicant has the burden to demonstrate compliance with these requirements. You must fill out the ***Public Notice Verification Form (Form TCEQ-20244)*** indicating your compliance with the requirements regarding publication in an alternative language. **This form is available at www.tceq.texas.gov/permitting/air/nav/air_publicnotice.html.**
- It is suggested the applicant work with the local school district to do the following:
 - (a) determine if a bilingual program is required in the district.
 - (b) determine which language is required by the bilingual program.
 - (c) locate the nearest elementary and middle schools; and
 - (d) determine if any students attending either school are eligible to be enrolled in a bilingual educational program.
- **If you determine that you must meet the alternative language notice requirements after receipt of the full public notice package, you are responsible for ensuring that the publication in the alternative language is complete and accurate in that language. Spanish notice templates are available through the Air Permits Division Web site at www.tceq.texas.gov/permitting/air/nav/air_publicnotice.html. All italic notes should be replaced with the corresponding Spanish translations for the specific application and published in the alternative language publication. Email a copy to Air Permits Division staff.**
- If you are required to publish notice in a language other than Spanish, you must translate the entire public notice at your own expense.

Failure to Publish and Submit Proof of Publication

You must meet all publication requirements. **If you fail to publish the notice or submit proof of publication on time, then** the TCEQ may suspend further processing on your application or take other actions.

Sign Posting

Applicants for air quality permits must also post signs.

- You must post at least one sign in English and as applicable, in each alternative language.
- Signs must be in place on the first day of publication in a newspaper and must remain in place and be legible and be visible from the street for the entire duration of the publications' designated comment period (see Example C).
- The sign template enclosed (*Example C*) is an example only. Read the sign template carefully and notify the TCEQ if it has an error or omissions. It is your responsibility to verify that the appropriate information pertaining to your application is accurate. Any changes to the text prepared by the TCEQ must be approved by the agency.
- Signs placed at the site must be located within 10 feet of each (every) property line paralleling a public street, road, or highway. Signs must be spaced at not more than 1,500-foot intervals. A minimum of one sign, but not more than three signs are required along any property line paralleling a public street, road, or highway. Sign(s) must be placed at a sufficient height above the ground that is necessary for sign(s) to be 100 percent visible from the street.
- All lettering on the sign must be no less than 1½" in height with block printed capital lettering. The sign must be at least 18" wide and 28" tall and consist of black lettering on a white background.
- Alternative language signs are required if alternative notice is required, even if no newspaper can be found.
- Inspect each posted sign daily to ensure it is present and visible throughout the entire comment period.
- You must submit verification of sign posting using the **Public Notice Verification Form (Form TCEQ-20244)** within **10 business days** after end of the publications' designated comment period. Do not submit the *Public Notice Verification Form* verifying sign posting until after the comment period is over. You cannot certify that the sign posting is in compliance until after the comment period is over. **This form is available at www.tceq.texas.gov/permitting/air/nav/air_publicnotice.html.**

Application in a Public Place

- You must provide a copy of the administratively complete application at a public place for review and copying by the public. This place must be in the county in which the facility is located or proposed to be located.
- A public place is one that is publicly owned or operated. For example, libraries, county courthouses, or city halls.
- The administratively complete application must be available beginning on the first day of newspaper publication and remain available during the entire public comment period.
- If the application is submitted to the TCEQ with information marked as confidential, you are required to indicate which specific portions of the application are not being made available to the
