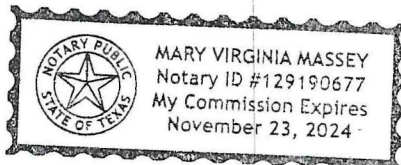

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

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G-P's Grimes takes pole vault silver at state meet

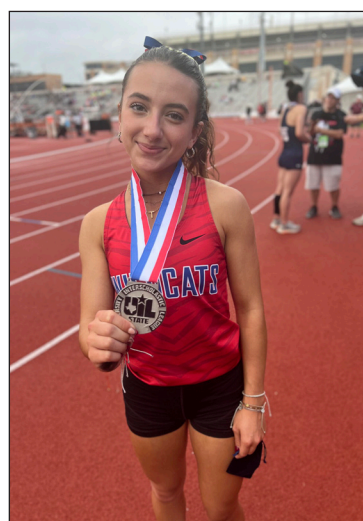
Tristen Grimes acknowledged that her sophomore season has been a little more difficult than her freshman one. But the Gregory-Portland High School pole vaulter pushed through, and can continue to call herself one of the state's best.

Grimes came home with a silver medal after taking home second place in the Class 5A girls' pole vault on May 3 at Mike A. Myers Stadium in Austin.

"This year was definitely a harder season," she said in the aftermath of her silver medal win. "... I think after regionals and getting third place and knowing I got the opportunity to come here, I knew I had to take that opportunity and

do something with it.

She took that opportunity on May 3 and then some. Grimes cleared a height of 12

feet, 9 inches to win the silver, finishing just behind Comal Smithson Valley's Ella Pickron, who cleared 13 feet.

"Honestly, I didn't imagine (getting silver)," she said. "I've

had a really good couple of practices leading up to this meet, so I was just thinking 'come here, build on these, and see where it gets you.'"

What it has gotten Grimes, is another step closer to her ultimate goal. It is the second straight season Grimes has taken home a medal at the state meet, with this season's second-place finish improving upon the third place finish in the event last season.

"After this season, (getting the silver medal), I was just super proud of myself and I felt almost a sense of relief with everything I'd worked up to this season," she said. "All of the hard practices and meets I experienced have gotten me to this point."

Wildcats' Harrison takes silver in boys pole vault

Gregory-Portland sophomore Ryder Harrison's season began with suffering a punctured lung on the football field. It has now ended on as high a note as possible - as a state medalist in Austin.

Harrison took second place and the silver medal in the boys' pole vault at the Class 5A state track and field meet in Austin Friday afternoon.

He cleared a height of 15 feet and was leading through multiple jumps. He would wind up second behind New Caney Porter's Cantrell Brooks, who cleared 15 feet, 6 inches.

"I'm pretty pumped - it was awesome. I enjoyed every second of it, competing at state. It was really fun," Harrison said after the meet.

The Wildcat sophomore also reflected on his journey this season, which began with suf-

fering a punctured lung after a hit in the fourth quarter of the football season's opening game against Calallen last August. To come back and finish as a state medalist, he said, was beyond the way he could've imagined it turning out.

"It's so awesome, I didn't know I could do this," he said. "I came back, and it was unbelievable. I didn't expect it at all."

Corpus Christi Liquefaction, LLC, PO Box 162, Gregory, TX 78359-0162, has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for an amendment to Air Quality Permit Number 105710, which would authorize a modification to operations at Corpus Christi Liquefaction located at 622 State Hwy 35, Gregory, San Patricio County, Texas 78359. This application was submitted to the TCEQ on April 20, 2021. The existing facility will emit the following contaminants: carbon monoxide, hydrogen sulfide, nitrogen oxides, organic compounds, particulate matter including particulate matter with diameters of 10 microns or less and 2.5 microns or less, sulfur dioxide, and hazardous air pollutants.

The executive director has completed the technical review of the application and prepared a draft permit which, if approved, would establish the conditions under which the facility must operate. The executive director has made a preliminary decision to issue the permit because it meets all rules and regulations. Corpus Christi Liquefaction, LLC, 700 Milam Street, Suite 1900, Houston, TX 77002-2835, has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for an amendment to State Air Quality Permit 139479, modification to Prevention of Significant Deterioration (PSD) Air Quality Permit PSDTX1496M1, and modification to Greenhouse Gas (GHG) PSD Air Quality Permit GHGSPDXTX157M1 for emissions of GHGs, which would authorize modification to the Corpus Christi Liquefaction Stage 3 located at 622 Highway 35, Gregory, San Patricio County, Texas 78359. A full PSD increment analysis was not required because the predicted impacts of all pollutants subject to PSD increment review were below the significant impact level for each pollutant.

This application was submitted to the TCEQ on March 30, 2023. The executive director has determined that the emissions of air contaminants from the existing facility which are subject to PSD review will not violate any state or federal air quality regulations and will not have any significant adverse impact on soils, vegetation, or visibility. All air contaminants have been evaluated, and "best available control technology" will be used for the control of these contaminants.

The executive director has completed the technical review of the application and prepared a draft permit which, if approved, would establish the conditions under which the facility must operate. The permit application, executive director's preliminary decision, draft permit, and the executive director's preliminary determination summary and executive director's air quality analysis, will be available for viewing and copying at the TCEQ central office, the TCEQ Corpus Christi regional office, and at the Bell Whittington Library, 2400 Memorial Parkway, Portland, San Patricio County, Texas, beginning the first day of publication of this notice. The facility's compliance file, if any exists, is available for public review at the TCEQ Corpus Christi Regional Office, 500 North Shoreline Boulevard, Suite 500, Corpus Christi, Texas.

OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING. There is no opportunity to request a contested case hearing regarding the portion of the application for GHG PSD Air Quality Permit Number GHGSPDXTX157M1. A contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in a state district court. A person who may be affected by emissions of air contaminants, other than GHGs, from the facility is entitled to request a hearing. A contested case hearing request must include the following: (1) your name (or for a group or association, an official representative), mailing address, daytime phone number; (2) applicant's name and permit number; (3) the statement "I/we request a contested case hearing;" (4) a specific description of how you would be adversely affected by the application and air emissions from the facility in a way not common to the general public; (5) the location and distance of your property relative to the facility; (6) a description of how you use the property which may be impacted by the facility; and (7) a list of all disputed issues of fact that you submit during the comment period. If the request is made by a group or association, one or more members who have standing to request a hearing must be identified by name and physical address. The interests the group or association seeks to protect must also be identified. You may also submit your proposed adjustments to the application/permit which would satisfy your concerns. Requests for a contested case hearing must be submitted in writing within 30 days following this notice to the Office of the Chief Clerk, at the address provided in the information section below.

A contested case hearing will only be granted based on disputed issues of fact or mixed questions of fact and law that are relevant and material to the Commission's decisions on the application. The Commission may only grant a request for a contested case hearing on issues the requestor submitted in their timely comments that were not subsequently withdrawn. Issues that are not submitted in public comments may not be considered during a hearing.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ACTION. The executive director may issue final approval of the application for the portion of the application for GHG PSD Air Quality Permit GHGSPDXTX157M1. If a timely contested case hearing request is not received or if all timely contested case hearing requests are withdrawn regarding State Air Quality Permit Number 139479 and for PSD Air Quality Permit Number PSDTX1496M1, the executive director may issue final approval of the application. The response to comments, along with the executive director's decision on the application will be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments or is on a mailing list for this application, and will be posted electronically to the CID.
