PETITION.

Circle S Midlothian, LLC, a Texas limited liability company and HAB 3336, LLC, a Texas limited liability company, ("Petitioners") filed a petition for creation of Circle S East Municipal Utility District of Ellis County (District) with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ). The petition was filed pursuant to Article III, Section 52 and Article XVI, Section 59 of the Constitution of the State of Texas; Chapters 49 and 54 of the Texas Water Code; 30 Texas Administrative Code Chapter 293; and the procedural rules of the TCEQ.

The petition states that: (1) the Petitioners own a majority in value of the land to be included in the proposed District; (2) there is one lienholder, Ag Texas Farm Credit Services, on the property to be included in the proposed District, and the aforementioned entity has consented to the creation of the District and inclusion of all of the land in the District; (3) the proposed District will contain approximately 649.96 acres of land, located entirely within Ellis County, Texas; (4) none of the land to be included in the proposed District is within the corporate limits of any municipality, but a portion of the land is in the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the City of Midlothian, Texas (City); and (5) although the City has not consented to creation of the District, the Petitioner has satisfied the requirements of Texas Water Code Section 54.016(b) and (c) and Texas Local Government Code Section 42.042, so that the authorization for inclusion of the land in the proposed District may be assumed pursuant to the cited statutes.

The petition further states that the proposed District will: (1) construct, maintain and operate a waterworks system, including the purchase and sale of water, for domestic and commercial purposes, (2) construct, maintain and operate a sanitary sewer collection, treatment and disposal system, for domestic and commercial purposes, (3) construct, install, maintain, purchase and operate drainage and roadway facilities and improvements, and (4) construct, install, maintain, purchase and operate such additional facilities, systems, plants and enterprises of such facilities as shall be consonant with the purposes for which the District is created.

According to the petition, a preliminary investigation has been made to determine the cost of the project, and it is estimated by the Petitioners, from the information available at this time, that the cost of said project will be approximately \$103,000,000 (\$75,000,000 for water, wastewater and drainage and \$28,000,000 for roads).

Little engines that can

Don Newbury

Compared to the glamour and glitz of Broadway's "Great White Way" in New York City, two Texas venues fall a bit short. Yet, by many standards, they stand equally tall.

referencing Waxahachie. Texas. and Brownwood, Texas, where the Texas Theater and Lyric Theater, respectively, have been successfully resurrect-ed. Each has scheduled plays early this year that "must see" for my wife Brenda and me. In a world where headlines scream of violence, starvation, fractured budgets, wars and threats of immigration overrun, we visit community theaters for the same reasons

At least we can retreat from reality for a couple of hours.

First up is the Texas

Theater offers Amon: The Ultimate Texan with 8 p.m. productions scheduled Jan. 19-20 and Feb. 23-24. Tickets are now on sale for the grand one-man show that is reflective of the keen insight, meticulous research and humorous persona of Dave Lieber. He is an author and certified public speak-er who is best known for his twice-weekly
"Watchdog" columns
in the Dallas Morning News. The play's first major run was at the Scott Theater in Fort Worth, where most per-

formances were sold out. It has played in sev-eral West Texas cities and has been a smash hit for all 52 performances. The life of the late Amon Carter - longtime pub-lisher of the Fort Worth Star-Telegram and owner of Texas' first TV station and Radio Station WBAP - is brilliantly portrayed by Kelvin Dilks. He was formerly a Birdville ISD trustee and is a retired teacher.

It is directed by Connie Sanchez, also a retired teacher. She maintains a sparkling narrative

continually emphasizing Amon's love of his home-town and disdain for Dallas.

When "Big D" was cho-sen for the 1936 Texas Centennial, Amon was furious as he staged a competing extravaganza in Cowtown, hoping that visitors would "choose Dallas for culture and Fort Worth for fun' We've ordered 40 tick-ets for senior adults at our church, anticipat-ing "sold out" status for all performances. Word has gotten around that this is a "must see" play about a man well known throughout Texas and the Southwest, and per-haps the late Will Rogers' best friend.

Like the Lyric, the Texas opened over a century ago as a vaudeville venue. It was darkened several times by fires and the impact of TV. Its current vitality is largely attributed to Jon and Alyssa Garrett of Waxahachie. Early in the 2000s,

three Brownwood citizens began a campaign to restore the Lyric to its original opulence. Mostly through modest donations, they've raised more than \$4 million, an unprecedented Texas response. The 367-seat house is beyond regal, probably more so than when it opened in 1920. Managing Director Eric Evans confirms that more than 30,000 per-sons attended 2023 productions, with even more

expected in 2024.

Brenda and I – along with a small army of senior adults from our church - will be on hand for the matinee perfor-mance of All Shook Up



musical" of favorite Elvis Presley hits, the play will be directed by Nancy Jo Humfeld, veteran ed-ucator who served 34 years at Howard Payne University before retir ing there in 2020. I hired her in 1986, and natu-rally believe that she's the best. (Thousands of others likewise agree. thankful that she contin ues to pour herself into the local theater scene).

We saw Elvis during a Fort Worth concert in the early 1970s.
Sitting near the stage,

Brenda caught a few drops of sweat and didn't bathe for a week. Other theater ef-

forts, such as those in Granbury and Cleburne, are likewise successful, thanks to continued commitment and hard work.

I salute everyone involved in community theater throughout Texas. They are genuine heroes in this "labor of love."

AG Paxton campaigns against speaker

Attorney General Ken Paxton on Monday ramped up his political revenge tour following his impeachment last year with a visit to the district of his biggest target: House Speaker Dade Phelan, R-Beaumont.

R-Deaumont.
Paxton spent the
day in southeast Texas
campaigning with
David Covey, a GOP
activist from the area
who is challenging
Phelan in the March
primary. The Phelanled House, including
most Republicans,
impeached Paxton in
May on abuse-of-power
charges and the Senate
acquitted him after a
trial in September.

Appearing together Monday evening in Beaumont, Paxton praised Covey for his "tremendous courage" in challenging the speaker and bashed Phelan as being too deferential to Democrats.

age" in challenging the speaker and bashed Phelan as being too deferential to Democrats. "We have to protect Texas, and it's guys like David Covey that are gonna go down there and undo what the speaker has done," Paxton said.

Paxton campaigned with Covey earlier in the day in Orange, and he was set to head Tuesday to North Texas for more campaign stops for Texas House candidates. Paxton has gone on an endorsement spree since his acquittal, mostly backing primary challengers to the dozens of House Republicans who voted

to impeach him.

Paxton's efforts are not just focused on the House. While in Beaumont, he also pitched three primary challengers he recruit-ed to run against judges on the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals, which angered him in 2021 when it struck down his power to unilaterally prosecute voter fraud.

"They're gonna try to put me in jail for doing this, but I don't care," Paxton said of his endorsements against the judges.

Phelan has been similarly unapologetic about the impeachment, which has made him not only a target of Paxton but also deepened a rift with Lt. Gov. Dan Patrick. Patrick served as judge in the trial and ended it with a speech accusing the House of cutting corners in its impeachment process.

During a campaign stop last week in Port Neches, Phelan said Paxton and Patrick 'have a problem with me because I'm gonado what's best for the state of Texas," not what is best for them.
"I'm not gonna turn 'I'm not gonna turn 'I'm not gonna turn 'I'm not gonna turn gonna tu

my back on corruption, I'm not gonna turn my back on malfeasance," Phelan said. "I'm gonna do the right thing all day long, every day."

As Paxton was campaigning with Covey on Monday evening, Phelan announced the endorsement of former Gov. Rick Perry, who had lobbied state senators to consider the evidence against Paxton. Perry's endorsement called Phelan a "fear-less conservative and a

less conservative and a Texas Hero."
Covey and other Phelan critics have sought to undermine the speaker's record by highlighting GOP priorities that have not made it out of the House, like Abbott's yearlong push for school vouchers. They have also point-ed to Phelan's adherence to a tradition of appointing Democratic

committee chairs.
"Friends, in one time, slavery was a tradition here, but a Republican stood up and said, Enough is enough," Covey said Monday evening. He added that Phelan is "undermining and selling out our state."

Phelan has defended Democratic committee chairs as a worth-while practice that prevents the Legislature from seeing the kind of gridlock that regularly grips Congress. Even then, he boasted during the Port Neches stop that last year he appointed "fewer Democratic chairs than any other speaker's ever appointed in the history of the state of Texas as long as we're Republican."

Paxton's appearance in Beaumont came as the state was dealing with unusually freezing conditions that appeared to put a damper on turnout. Paxton left early due to anticipated road conditions, according to an organizer.

Covey is an oil-andgas consultant and the
former chair of the
Orange County GOP.

Alicia Davis, an anti-tax
activist from Jasper,
is also running against
Phelan in the March 5

primary.
Phelan has taken the contest seriously, airing TV ads touting his conservative bona fides since November. He more recently got the endorsement of the National Rifle Association, which cited the House's 2021 passage of a law allowing permitless carry of handguns.

Asked about the NRA
endorsement Monday,
Covey said he was
prouder to have high
marks from the Gun
Owners of America,
which bills itself as a
harder-line alternative
to the NRA. The NRA,
Covey added, has "gone
astray and that makes
me sad."

Covey also got an audience question about
"TEXIT," or the movement for Texas to secede from the United
States. He said he has
signed a petition from
the Texas Nationalist
Movement that calls
for letting voters decide the question.

PETTTION. Circle S Midlothian, LLC, a Texas limited liability company and HAB 3336, LLC, a Texas limited liability company, ("Petitioners") filed a petition for creation of Circle S East Municipal Utility District of Ellis County (District) with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ). The petition was filed pursuant to Article III, Section 52 and Article XVI, Section 59 of the Constitution of the State of Texas; Chapters 49 and 54 of the Texas Water Code; 30 Texas Administrative Code Chapter 293; and the procedural rules of the TCEQ.

The petition states that: (1) the Petitioners own a majority in value of the land to be included in the proposed District; (2) there is one lienholder, Ag Texas Farm Credit Services, on the property to be included in the proposed District, and the aforementioned entity has consented to the creation of the District and inclusion of all of the land in the District; (3) the proposed District will contain approximately 649.96 acres of land, located entirely within Ellis County, Texas; (4) none of the land to be included in the proposed District is within the corporate limits of any municipality, but a portion of the land is in the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the City of Midlothian, Texas (City); and (5) although the City has not consented to creation of the District, the Petitioner has satisfied the requirements of Texas Water Code Section 54.016(b) and (c) and Texas Local Government Code Section 42.042, so that the authorization for inclusion of the land in the proposed District may be assumed pursuant to the cited statutes.

The territory to be included in the proposed District is depicted on the vicinity map designated as Exhibit "A," which is attached to this document.

The petition further states that the proposed District will: (1) construct, maintain and operate a waterworks system, including the purchase and sale of water, for domestic and commercial purposes, (2) construct, maintain and operate a sanitary sewer collection, treatment and disposal system, for domestic and commercial purposes, (3) construct, install, maintain, purchase and operate drainage and roadway facilities and improvements, and (4) construct, install, maintain, purchase and operate such additional facilities, systems, plants and enterprises of such facilities as shall be consonant with the purposes for which the District is created.

According to the petition, a preliminary investigation has been made to determine the cost of the project, and it is estimated by the Petitioners, from the information available at this time, that the cost of said project will be approximately \$103,000,000 (\$75,000,000 for water, wastewater and drainage and \$28,000,000 for roads).



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
