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SIP Revision: One-Hour Ozone Standard Attainment Demonstration (AD), Houston-Galveston (HGA), April 19, 2000

On April 19, 2000, the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission (TNRCC) adopted an AD State Implementation Plan (SIP) revision for the HGA one-hour ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) nonattainment area.

Background: The April 19, 2000, HGA one-hour ozone standard AD included enforceable commitments required by a citizen suit settlement between the Natural Resources Defense Council and the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to address deficiencies in the HGA AD.

Key Changes:

The SIP revision included commitments to take the following actions:

- Quantify the shortfall of nitrogen oxides (NOx) reductions needed for attainment;
- List and quantify potential control measures needed to meet this shortfall;
- Adopt a majority of the needed rules by December 31, 2000;
- Adopt the remaining rules by July 31, 2001;
- Submit a post-1999 rate of progress (ROP) plan by December 31, 2000;
- Submit a mid-course review (MCR) by May 1, 2004;
- Perform the on-road emissions modeling using the MOBILE6 model; and
- Revise the mobile source emissions budget as needed and submit the revised budget within 24 months of the model's release.
