SIP Revision: Implementation Plan for Attaining National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS), February 15, 1974

The Texas State Implementation Plan (SIP) was revised by the Texas Air Control Board (TACB) on February 15, 1974, based on the original Texas SIP, dated January 26, 1972.

Summary of the SIP Revision

Adoption Date: 02/15/1974

EPA Approval Date: Partial Approval on 04/20/1977 (42 FR 20462) and 07/06/1977 (42 FR

34517)

Background: The Texas SIP was revised on February 15, 1974, to reflect organizational changes to the TACB and updated regional classifications reflecting the revised sulfur dioxide (SO_2) and nitrogen dioxide (NO_2) NAAQS. Starting with this SIP revision, air quality data were no longer included in the SIP revision itself, and instead were submitted directly to the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) on a quarterly basis.

Key Changes:

This SIP revision included:

- The addition of TACB enforcement orders:
- A progress update on deployment of the monitoring network;
- Deletion of outdated data from source monitoring;
- Updates to the Permit System Procedures;
- Information on local program funding;
- A reworked emergency episode plan; and
- New TACB rules and regulations.
