SIP Revision: Implementation Plan for Attaining National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS), August 15, 1976

The Texas State Implementation Plan (SIP) was revised by the Texas Air Control Board (TACB) on February 15, 1976; and August 15, 1976; based on the original Texas SIP, dated January 26, 1972.

Summary of the SIP Revision

Adoption Date: 08/15/1976

EPA Approval Date: On 04/18/1977 (42 FR 20130), the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) approved sulfur dioxide (SO₂) classification changes, but rejected the plan's carbon monoxide (CO) and particulate matter (PM) classification changes. The EPA approved other administrative aspects of the plan on 04/20/1977 (42 FR 20462), 06/01/1977 (42 FR 27892), and 07/06/1977 (42 FR 34517).

Background: The Texas SIP was revised on August 15, 1975; February 15, 1976; and August 15, 1976.

Key Changes: The February 15, 1976 SIP revision included an updated Legal Authority, updated compliance schedules, updated information on emergency action staff members, a revision to the review questions used in Permit System Procedures, an updated address list for the Air Quality Control Regions, and revised rules for the control of pollution from smoke, visible emissions, and PM.

The August 15, 1976 SIP revision included an updated compliance abatement schedule and a revised air quality surveillance plan.
