Subject: Request for a One-Year Extension of the Houston-Galveston-Brazoria (HGB) 2008 EightHour Ozone Standard Attainment Date

Dear Acting Administrator Gray:
In accordance with Federal Clean Air Act (FCAA), §181(a)(5), the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) requests the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) grant a one-year attainment date extension, to July 20, 2022, for the HGB 2008 eight-hour ozone nonattainment area. The HGB area meets the following FCAA requirements necessary for the EPA to grant the extension.

- $\quad \S 181(\mathrm{a})(5)(\mathrm{A})$ - The TCEQ certifies that the state is implementing all requirements and commitments pertaining to the area in the applicable ozone implementation plan.
- $\S 181(\mathrm{a})(5)(\mathrm{B})$ - The fourth highest daily maximum eight-hour average concentrations for all monitors in the nonattainment area were not greater than 75 parts per billion (ppb) in 2020, the year preceding the area's July 20, 2021 attainment date. The HGB 2008 eight-hour ozone nonattainment area meets the monitoring data requirement with a 75 ppb fourth highest daily eight-hour monitored average as measured at the Conroe Relocated monitor (C78/A321) in 2020.
