Grant Amounts

- Government-Owned Projects - Up to 100% of eligible costs.
- Non-Government-Owned Projects - Up to 75% of eligible costs.
- Additional Funding - Available for electric charging infrastructure.

Equipment Eligibility Criteria

- The equipment must have been owned, registered (on-road only), and used in the applicant's routine operations in Texas for at least two years prior to the application date.
- For on-road vehicles, the diesel engine must be certified to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) heavy-duty emission standards.
- For non-road equipment, the engine must have a rating of 25 horsepower (hp) or greater.
- The vehicle and equipment must be in working condition and have at least five years of useful life remaining.

Priority Areas



At least 51% of the grant-funded vehicle or equipment's annual operation must occur in one of these Priority Areas.
