

**Plain Language Summary for New Source Review (NSR) Renewal Amendment  
Application for Air New Source Review Permit Number 72760**

*The following summary is provided for this pending air permit application being reviewed by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality as required by 30 Texas Administrative Code Chapter 39. The information provided in this summary may change during the technical review of the application and are not federal enforceable representations of the permit application.*

Plains Pipeline, L.P. (CN601440852) has submitted an application for renewal of and amendment to permit number 72760. The Colorado City Tank Farm (RN101296507) is a crude oil storage and transportation facility at 2932 County Road 4156, Hermleigh, Scurry County.

This renewal will authorize the continued operation of thirteen (13) external floating roof crude oil storage tanks and associated fugitives. The amendment will authorize the increased emissions due to the updated storage tank emission calculations method from being based on Tanks 4.09d to being based on the latest United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) AP-42 Chapter 7 calculation methodology and Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) guidance and the increase in the Reid Vapor Pressure (RVP) to 8 pounds per square inch absolute (psia) for the tank contents. Plains Pipeline L.P. has listed in the application the pollutants and amounts that will be emitted for each facility. Below is the current amount allowed, the amount to be added or removed, and the total amount for each pollutant that is proposed to be emitted each year for all the facilities.

The facilities being renewed will continue to meet TCEQ BACT. There is no additional VOC control required for the facilities being renewed under this NSR permit.
