Applicant's may modify the template as necessary to accurately describe their facility as long as the summary includes the following information: (1) the function of the proposed plant or facility; (2) the expected output of the proposed plant or facility; (3) the expected pollutants that may be emitted or discharged by the proposed plant or facility; and (4) how the applicant will control those pollutants, so that the proposed plant will not have an adverse impact on human health or the environment.

Cheniere Land Holdings, LLC (CN604923789 ) operates the CLH Sherwin Site (RN102318847), a former industrial property intended for future development. The facility is located at 4633 State Highway 361, in Gregory, San Patricio County, Texas 78359.


CLH is requesting 1) Removal of certain authorized wastestreams; 2) Removal of Outfalls 101-501, 102, 002, and 003; 3) Authorization to continue discharge of stormwater associated with industrial activity at Outfalls 601 and 001; and 4) Removal of Enterococci limit and monitoring requirements at Outfall 601.

Discharges from the facility are authorized to contain COD, Oil & Grease, and pH. The only discharge from the Site will be stormwater associated with industrial activity.




Cheniere Land Holdings, LLC (CN604923789) opera CLH Sherwin Site (RN104104716), una propiedad industrial destinada para desarrollo futuro. La instalación está ubicada en 4633 State Highway 361, en Gregory, Condado de San Patricio, Texas 78359. CLH solicita 1) La eliminación de ciertos vertidos autorizados; 2) Eliminación de los Emisarios 101-501, 102, 002 y 003; 3) Autorización para continuar la descarga de aguas pluviales asociadas a la actividad industrial en los Emisarios 601 y 001; y 4) Eliminación del límite de enterococos y requisitos de monitoreo en el Emisario 601.

Las descargas de la instalación están autorizadas para contener DQO, aceite & grasa, y pH. La única descarga del Sitio será agua pluvial asociada con la actividad industrial.

## INSTRUCTIONS

1. Enter the name of applicant in this section. The applicant name should match the name associated with the customer number.
2. Enter the Customer Number in this section. Each Individual or Organization is issued a unique 11-digit identification number called a CN (e.g. CN123456789).
3. Choose “operates” in this section for existing facility applications or choose “proposes to operate” for new facility applications.
4. Enter the name of the facility in this section. The facility name should match the name associated with the regulated entity number.
5. Enter the Regulated Entity number in this section. Each site location is issued a unique 11-digit identification number called an RN (e.g. RN123456789).
6. Choose the appropriate article (a or an) to complete the sentence.
7. Enter a description of the facility in this section. For example: steam electric generating facility, nitrogenous fertilizer manufacturing facility, etc.
8. Choose “is” for an existing facility or “will be” for a new facility.
9. Enter the location of the facility in this section.
10. Enter the City nearest the facility in this section.
11. Enter the County nearest the facility in this section.
12. Enter the zip code for the facility address in this section.
13. Enter a summary of the application request in this section. For example: renewal to discharge 25,000 gallons per day of treated domestic wastewater, new application to discharge process wastewater and stormwater on an intermittent and flow-variable basis, or major amendment to reduce monitoring frequency for pH, etc. If more than one outfall is included in the application, provide applicable information for each individual outfall.
14. List all pollutants expected in the discharge from this facility in this section. If applicable, refer to the pollutants from any federal numeric effluent limitations that apply to your facility.
15. Enter the discharge types from your facility in this section (e.g., stormwater, process wastewater, once through cooling water, etc.)
16. Choose the appropriate verb tense to complete the sentence.
17. Enter a description of the wastewater treatment used at your facility. Include a description of each process, starting with initial treatment and finishing with the



outfall/point of disposal. Use additional lines for individual discharge types if necessary.
