NOTICE OF RECEIPT OF APPLICATION AND INTENT TO OBTAIN WATER QUALITY PERMIT RENEWAL

PERMIT NO. WQ0010152001

APPLICATION. Colorado County Water Control and Improvement District No. 2, P.O. Box 317, Garwood, Texas 77442, has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) to renew Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (TPDES) Permit No. WQ0010152001 (EPA I.D. No. TX0023329) to authorize the discharge of treated wastewater at a volume not to exceed a daily average flow of 100,000 gallons per day. The domestic wastewater treatment facility is located at 1100 Mansfield Street, in Colorado County, Texas 77442. The discharge route is from the plant site to a drainage ditch; thence to an unnamed tributary; thence to the Colorado River Below La Grange. TCEQ received this application on December 6, 2023. The permit application will be available for viewing and copying at the Colorado County Courthouse, 400 Spring Street, Columbus, Texas prior to the date this notice is published in the newspaper. This link to an electronic map of the site or facility's general location is provided as a public courtesy and not part of the application or notice. ADDITIONAL NOTICE. TCEQ's Executive Director has determined the application is administratively complete and will conduct a technical review of the application. After technical review of the application is complete, the Executive Director may prepare a draft permit and will issue a preliminary decision on the application. **Notice of the Application and Preliminary Decision will be published and mailed to those who are on the county-wide mailing list and to those who are on the mailing list for this application. That notice will contain the deadline for submitting public comments.**

PUBLIC COMMENT / PUBLIC MEETING. You may submit public comments or request a public meeting on this application. The purpose of a public meeting is to provide the opportunity to submit comments or to ask questions about the application. TCEQ will hold a public meeting if the Executive Director determines that there is a significant degree of public interest in the application or if requested by a local legislator. A public meeting is not a contested case hearing.

OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING. After the deadline for submitting public comments, the Executive Director will consider all timely comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. **Unless the application is directly referred for a contested case hearing, the response to comments, and the Executive Director's decision on the application, will be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments and to those persons who are on the mailing list for this application. If comments are received, the mailing will also provide**

instructions for requesting reconsideration of the Executive Director's decision and for requesting a contested case hearing. A contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.

TO REQUEST A CONTESTED CASE HEARING, YOU MUST INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING ITEMS IN YOUR REQUEST: your name, address, phone number; applicant's name and proposed permit number; the location and distance of your property/activities relative to the proposed facility; a specific description of how you would be adversely affected by the facility in a way not common to the general public; a list of all disputed issues of fact that you submit during the comment period and, the statement "[I/we] request a contested case hearing." If the request for contested case hearing is filed on behalf of a group or association, the request must designate the group's representative for receiving future correspondence; identify by name and physical address an individual member of the group who would be adversely affected by the proposed facility or activity; provide the information discussed above regarding the affected member's location and distance from the facility or activity; explain how and why the member would be affected; and explain how the interests the group seeks to protect are relevant to the group's purpose.

Following the close of all applicable comment and request periods, the Executive Director will forward the application and any requests for reconsideration or for a contested case hearing to the TCEQ Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting.

The Commission may only grant a request for a contested case hearing on issues the requestor submitted in their timely comments that were not subsequently withdrawn. **If a hearing is granted, the subject of a hearing will be limited to disputed issues of fact or mixed questions of fact and law relating to relevant and material water quality concerns submitted during the comment period. TCEQ may act on an application to renew a permit for discharge of wastewater without providing an opportunity for a contested case hearing if certain criteria are met.**

MAILING LIST. If you submit public comments, a request for a contested case hearing or a reconsideration of the Executive Director's decision, you will be added to the mailing list for this specific application to receive future public notices mailed by the Office of the Chief Clerk. In addition, you may request to be placed on: (1) the permanent mailing list for a specific applicant name and permit number; and/or (2) the mailing list for a specific county. If you wish to be placed on the permanent and/or the county mailing list, clearly specify which list(s) and send your request to TCEQ Office of the Chief Clerk at the address below.

Dear Application Review Team,

The following summary is provided for this pending water quality permit application being reviewed by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality as required by 30 Texas Administrative Code Chapter 39. The information provided in this summary may change during the technical review of the application and are not federal enforceable representations of the permit application.

The Colorado County Water Control & Improvement District No. 2 (CN600632665) operates the Garwood Facilities Wastewater Treatment Plant (RN102287075), the plant operates as an extended aeration ditch process with chlorination. The facility is located at 1100 Mansfield, Garwood, in Colorado County, Texas 77442.

This application is for a renewal to dispose a daily average flow not to exceed 100,000 gallons per day of treated domestic wastewater via outfall 001.

Discharges from the facility are expected to contain seven-day carbonaceous biochemical oxygen demand (CBOD₅), total suspended solids (TSS), ammonia nitrogen (NH₃-N), and *Escherichia coli*. Additional potential pollutants are included in the Domestic Technical Report 1.0, Section 7. Pollutant Analysis of Treated Effluent in the permit application package. Domestic wastewater is treated by an Existing Phase: The plant operates as an extended aeration ditch process with chlorination. Treatment units include: a lift station; bar screen; oxidation ditch; 2 clarifiers; chlorine contact chamber.

The plant discharges treated wastewater at a volume not to exceed an annual average flow of 100,000 gallons per day. The effluent discharges through a 6" pipe to a drainage ditch; thence to an unnamed tributary; thence to the Colorado River Below La Grange in Segment No. 1402 of the Colorado River Basin.

Estimado equipo de revisión de solicitudes,

El siguiente resumen se proporciona para esta solicitud de permiso de calidad del agua pendiente que está siendo revisada por la Comisión de Calidad Ambiental de Texas según lo requerido por el Capítulo 39 del Código Administrativo de Texas 30. La información proporcionada en este resumen puede cambiar durante la revisión técnica de la solicitud y no son representaciones federales exigibles de la solicitud de permiso.

El Distrito de Control y Mejoramiento del Agua del Condado de Colorado No. 2 (CN600632665) opera la Planta de Tratamiento de Aguas Residuales (RN102287075) de Garwood Facilities, la planta opera como un proceso de zanja de aireación extendida con cloración. La instalación está ubicada en 1100 Mansfield, Garwood, en el condado de Colorado, Texas 77442.

Esta solicitud es para una renovación para disponer de un flujo promedio diario que no exceda los 100,000 galones por día de aguas residuales domésticas tratadas a través del emisario 001.

Se espera que las descargas de la instalación contengan una demanda bioquímica de oxígeno carbonoso de siete días (CBOD5), sólidos suspendidos totales (TSS), nitrógeno amoníaco (NH3-N) y Escherichia coli. Otros contaminantes potenciales se incluyen en el Informe Técnico Doméstico 1.0, Sección 7. Análisis de Contaminantes de Efluentes Tratados en el paquete de solicitud de permiso. Las aguas residuales domésticas se tratan mediante una fase existente: La planta funciona como un proceso de zanja de aireación extendida con cloración. Las unidades de tratamiento incluyen: una estación de bombeo; pantalla de barra; zanja de oxidación; 2 clarificadores; cámara de contacto de cloro.



La planta descarga aguas residuales tratadas a un volumen que no excede un flujo promedio anual de 100,000 galones por día. El efluente se descarga a través de una tubería de 6" a una zanja de drenaje; de allí a un afluente sin nombre; de allí al río Colorado por debajo de La Grange en el segmento No. 1402 de la cuenca del río Colorado.
