#### DOMESTIC WASTEWATER/STORMWATER

The following summary is provided for this pending water quality permit application being reviewed by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality as required by 30 TAC Chapter 39. The information provided in this summary may change during the technical review of the application and is not a federal enforceable representation of the permit application.

Comal Independent School District (CN600249825) operates Smithson Valley High School WWTP (RN103932638), a wastewater treatment plant serving the school. The facility is located at 14001 SH 46 W, in Spring Branch, Comal County, Texas 78070. The facility disposes of 27,000 gallons of treated wastewater per day through a subsurface area drip dispersal system. This permit will not authorize a discharge of pollutants into water in the state.

Discharges from the facility are expected to contain BOD5, total suspended solids, and E.coli. Domestic sewage is treated by septic tanks, a recirculation tank, dosing tank, gravel filter, and subsurface drip irrigation system.

El siguiente resumen se proporciona para esta solicitud de permiso de calidad del agua pendiente que está siendo revisada por la Comisión de Calidad Ambiental de Texas según lo requerido por el Capítulo 39 del Código Administrativo de Texas 30. La información proporcionada en este resumen puede cambiar durante la revisión técnica de la solicitud y no es una representación ejecutiva fedérale de la solicitud de permiso.

El Distrito Escolar Independiente de Comal (CN600249825) opera la WWTP de Smithson Valley High School (RN103932638), una planta de tratamiento de aguas residuales que presta servicio a la escuela. La instalación está ubicada en 14001 SH 46 W, en Spring Branch, condado de Comal, Texas 78070. La instalación elimina 27,000 galones de aguas residuales tratadas por día a través de un sistema de dispersión por goteo en el subsuelo. Este permiso no autorizará una descarga de contaminantes al agua del estado.

Se espera que las descargas de la instalación contengan BOD5, sólidos suspendidos totales y E.coli. Las aguas residuales domésticas se tratan mediante fosas sépticas, un tanque de recirculación, un tanque dosificador, un filtro de grava y un sistema de riego por goteo subterráneo.

APPLICATION. Comal Independent School District, 1404 Interstate Highway 35 North, New Braunfels, Texas 78130, has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) to renew Texas Land Application Permit (TLAP) No. WQ0014295001 to authorize the disposal of treated wastewater at a volume not to exceed a daily average flow of 27,000 gallons per day via subsurface drip irrigation on 6.2 acres of land. The domestic wastewater treatment facility and disposal area are located at 14001 State Highway 46 West, near the city of Spring Branch, in Comal County, Texas 78070. TCEQ received this application on October 15, 2024. The permit application will be available for viewing and copying at Comal Independent School District Administration Building, 1404 Interstate Highway 35 North, New Braunfels, in Comal County, Texas prior to the date this notice is published in the newspaper. ADDITIONAL NOTICE. TCEQ's Executive Director has determined the application is administratively complete and will conduct a technical review of the application. After technical review of the application is complete, the Executive Director may prepare a draft permit and will issue a preliminary decision on the application. Notice of the Application and Preliminary Decision will be published and mailed to those who are on the countywide mailing list and to those who are on the mailing list for this application. That notice will contain the deadline for submitting public comments.

**PUBLIC COMMENT / PUBLIC MEETING. You may submit public comments or request a public meeting on this application.** The purpose of a public meeting is to provide the opportunity to submit comments or to ask questions about the application. TCEQ will hold a public meeting if the Executive Director determines that there is a significant degree of public

interest in the application or if requested by a local legislator. A public meeting is not a contested case hearing.

OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING. After the deadline for submitting public comments, the Executive Director will consider all timely comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. Unless the application is directly referred for a contested case hearing, the response to comments, and the Executive Director's decision on the application, will be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments and to those persons who are on the mailing list for this application. If comments are received, the mailing will also provide instructions for requesting reconsideration of the Executive Director's decision and for requesting a contested case hearing. A contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.

TO REQUEST A CONTESTED CASE HEARING, YOU MUST INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING ITEMS IN YOUR REQUEST: your name, address, phone number; applicant's name and proposed permit number; the location and distance of your property/activities relative to the proposed facility; a specific description of how you would be adversely affected by the facility in a way not common to the general public; a list of all disputed issues of fact that you submit during the comment period and, the statement "[I/we] request a contested case hearing." If the request for contested case hearing is filed on behalf of a group or association, the request must designate the group's representative for receiving future correspondence; identify by name and physical address an individual member of the group who would be adversely affected by the proposed facility or activity; provide the information discussed above regarding the affected member's location and distance from the facility or activity; explain how and why the member would be affected; and explain how the interests the group seeks to protect are relevant to the group's purpose.

Following the close of all applicable comment and request periods, the Executive Director will forward the application and any requests for reconsideration or for a contested case hearing to the TCEQ Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting.

The Commission may only grant a request for a contested case hearing on issues the requestor submitted in their timely comments that were not subsequently withdrawn. If a hearing is granted, the subject of a hearing will be limited to disputed issues of fact or mixed questions of fact and law relating to relevant and material water quality concerns submitted during the comment period.

TCEQ may act on an application to renew a permit for discharge of wastewater without providing an opportunity for a contested case hearing if certain criteria are met.

If you submit public comments, a request for a contested case hearing or a reconsideration of the Executive Director's decision, you will be added to the mailing list for this specific application to receive future public notices mailed by the Office of the Chief Clerk. If you wish to be placed on the permanent and/or the county mailing list, clearly specify which list(s) and send your request to TCEQ Office of the Chief Clerk at the address below.

PLAIN LANGUAGE SUMMARY

#### DOMESTIC WASTEWATER/STORMWATER

The following summary is provided for this pending water quality permit application being reviewed by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality as required by 30 TAC Chapter 39. The information provided in this summary may change during the technical review of the application and is not a federal enforceable representation of the permit application.

Comal Independent School District (CN600249825) operates Smithson Valley High School WWTP (RN103932638), a wastewater treatment plant serving the school. The facility is located at 14001 SH 46 W, in Spring Branch, Comal County, Texas 78070. The facility disposes of 27,000 gallons of treated wastewater per day through a subsurface area drip dispersal system. This permit will not authorize a discharge of pollutants into water in the state.

Discharges from the facility are expected to contain BOD5, total suspended solids, and E.coli. Domestic sewage is treated by septic tanks, a recirculation tank, dosing tank, gravel filter, and subsurface drip irrigation system.







PROCESS FLOW DIAGRAM






**SMITHSON VALLEY HIGH SCHOOL PROCESS FLOW DIAGRAM**




