The following summary is provided for this pending water quality permit application being reviewed by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality as required by 30 TAC Chapter 39. The information provided in this summary may change during the technical review of the application and is not a federal enforceable representation of the permit application.

Denton County MUD 7 (CN603295627) proposes to operate Denton County MUD 7 WWTP (RN TBD), an activated sludge process operating in the complete mix mode. The facility will be located at approximately 0.65 miles southeast of the intersection of Farm to Market 1385 and Lights Ranch Road, in Pilot Point, Denton County, Texas 76258. This is a new application to discharge at a daily flow up to 950,000 gallons per day of treated domestic wastewater.

Discharges from the facility are expected to contain five-day carbonaceous biochemical oxygen demand (CBOD₅), total suspended solids (TSS), ammonia nitrogen (NH₅-N) and E. coli. Domestic wastewater will be treated by an activated sludge process plant.

APPLICATION. Denton County Municipal Utility District No. 7 and GB878 LLC, 16000 Dallas Parkway, Suite 350, Dallas, Texas 75248, have applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for proposed Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (TPDES) Permit No. WO0016751001 (EPA I.D. No. TX0147621) to authorize the discharge of treated wastewater at a volume not to exceed a daily average flow of 950,000 gallons per day. The domestic wastewater treatment facility will be located approximately 0.65 miles southeast of the intersection of Lights Ranch Road and Farm-to-Market Road 1385, near the city of Pilot Point, in Denton County, Texas 76258. The discharge route will be from the plant site via Outfalls 001 and 002 to a man-made channel, thence to unnamed tributary 1, thence to Pecan Creek; and via Outfalls 003 and 004 to an on-site sewer drain, thence to unnamed tributary 2, thence to Pecan Creek; thence all outfalls to Lewisville Lake. TCEQ received this application on March 11, 2025. The permit application will be available for viewing and copying at Pilot Point Community Library, 324 South Washington Street, Pilot Point, in Denton County, Texas prior to the date this notice is published in the newspaper. That notice will contain the deadline for submitting public comments. **PUBLIC COMMENT / PUBLIC MEETING. You may submit public comments or request a public meeting on this application.** The purpose of a public meeting is to provide the opportunity to submit comments or to ask questions about the application. TCEQ will hold a public meeting if the Executive Director determines that there is a significant degree of public interest in the application or if requested by a local legislator. A public meeting is not a contested case hearing.

OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING. After the deadline for submitting public comments, the Executive Director will consider all timely comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. **Unless the application is directly referred for a contested case hearing, the response to comments, and the Executive Director's decision on the application, will be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments and to those persons who are on the mailing list for this application. If comments are received, the mailing will also provide instructions for requesting reconsideration of the Executive Director's decision and for requesting a contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.**

TO REQUEST A CONTESTED CASE HEARING, YOU MUST INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING ITEMS IN YOUR REQUEST: your name, address, phone number; applicant's name and proposed permit number; the location and distance of your property/activities relative to the proposed facility; a specific description of how you would be adversely affected by the facility in a way not common to the general public; a list of all disputed issues of fact that you submit during the comment period and, the statement "[I/we] request a contested case hearing." If the request for contested case hearing is filed on behalf of a group or association, the request must designate the group's representative for receiving future correspondence; identify by name and physical address an individual member of the group who would be adversely affected by the proposed facility or activity; provide the information discussed above regarding the affected member's location and distance from the facility or activity; explain how and why the member would be affected; and explain how the interests the group seeks to protect are relevant to the group's purpose.

Following the close of all applicable comment and request periods, the Executive Director will forward the application and any requests for reconsideration or for a contested case hearing to the TCEQ Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting.

The Commission may only grant a request for a contested case hearing on issues the requestor submitted in their timely comments that were not subsequently withdrawn. If a hearing is granted, the subject of a hearing will be limited to disputed issues of fact or mixed questions of fact and law relating to relevant and material water quality concerns submitted during the comment period.








AUBREY QUADRANGLE TEXAS - DENTON COUNTY 7.5-MINUTE SERIES













PILOT POINT QUADRANGLE
















ATTACHMENT 11 DESCRIPTION OF THE TREATMENT PROCESS

(In reference to Domestic Technical Report 1.0, Section 2, Item A)

The treatment system includes a package plant employing the activated sludge process operating in the complete mix mode. The plant will be developed in three phases and will include two treatment trains when complete. Phase 1, Phase 2, and the Final Phase 3 will have a capacity of 0.15 MGD, 0.30 MGD, and 0.95 MGD, respectively. In the Final Phase, the plant will have a common header between the aeration basins and clarifier to allow for flexibility in plant repairs and operations. Since the chlorine contact basin will be sized for the final Phase 3, the three planned phases will have a common outfall and sampling point.


The completed treatment train will consist of steel "box car" units used for aeration and digestion. Two aeration basins, one sludge digestion basin, one 36' diameter clarifier and one chlorine contact basin will be fabricated for Phase 1. Phase 2 will include an additional aeration basin, two additional sludge digestion basins, and will utilize the Phase 1 clarifier and chlorine contact basin. The Final Phase 3 will include a total of nine aeration basins, eight sludge digestion basins, three clarifiers, two chlorine contact basins, and one 8' by 6' dechlorination basin.

Influent to this facility will be pumped from an on-site lift station to a bar screen. In the Final Phase 3, the bar screen will include a flow splitter thus splitting the influent to each bank of aeration basins. The mixed liquor from the aeration basins will flow to the clarifiers. The clarified effluent from the clarifiers will then flow to the chlorine contact basins, and the disinfected plant effluent will outfall via a 36" pipe. Sludge will be returned to the aeration basins then wasted to the digester basins via air lifts. Sludge from the digesters will be truck hauled for disposal at a registered disposal site.

We are currently preparing an application for a discharge permit for the Denton County MUD 7 Wastewater Treatment Plant in Denton County. The proposed development will require 0.95 MGD of ultimate wastewater service capacity. TCEQ regulations require us to contact all entities with a permitted wastewater treatment plant or collection system within three (3) miles of our plant and identify any available capacity at those facilities. Your system is within a three (3) mile radius of our facility. 



ATTACHMENT – 21 Justification for Proposed Facility

The proposed facility will allow Denton County MUD 7 (the MUD) to treat the wastewater generated within the boundaries of the MUD. Construction for the proposed 0.95 MGD capacity facility will serve the proposed single-family development at full buildout.

There is no existing sanitary sewer collection infrastructure in place in the proposed area of development or in the near vicinity of the service area. Although the MUD lies entirely within Mustang Special Utility District's CCN, the MUD is entitled to provide retail wastewater service (including treatment) within the boundaries of the MUD pursuant to written agreement between Mustang and the MUD. Regardless, coordination with Mustang for service was initiated in July 2024. By letter dated September 4.2024 (the "feasibility Letter") (attached hereto as attachment 22), Steger Bizzell (engineer for Mustang) outlined the required improvements for Mustang to provide service to the MUD. The proposed improvements include at least 3 miles of oversized offsite wastewater interceptor to convey wastewater to a proposed Maverick Farms Water Reclamation Plant (the "MFWRP"). However, the MFWRP is currently not operational, designed, nor fully permitted, and Mustang is unable to provide any commitments regarding when service can be made available to the MUD. Although there is a pending TPDES permit (WQ0016556001) at the location of the MFWRP indicated in the Feasibility Letter, the pending permit requests an ultimate discharge capacity of only 0.90 MGD, which is less than the total ultimate capacity of 0.95 MGD requested in this discharge permit application. As such, it is unclear whether the MFWRP will have enough capacity to provide service to the MUD, in addition to the other developments in that area that are to be served through that facility. Due to the uncertain nature of the MFWRP operation timeline (including a permit which has not been issued), the limitations on capacity at MFWRP, and the cost associated with a long run of offsite line, this permit application is justified and necessary to provide a reasonable and economical alternative for wastewater service to the MUD.

Ms. Simon:

We have conducted an engineering review and feasibility study of the applicable sector of the MSUD system to determine if sufficient facilities and capacity exist to appropriately serve the referenced proposed development without adversely impacting MSUD's system or if additional infrastructure improvements are required. The review/study is based on a simulated hydraulic analysis with parameters in compliance with TCEQ rules and regulations and AWWA standards. It also addresses city limits, ETJs, CCN,100-year flood plain, etc., as per MSUD policies.

The development properties consist of 615.62 acres located out of the M. University Survey (Abstract Number 799) on the east side of FM 1385 and northeast of the intersection of FM 1385 and Friendship Road in Pilot Point, Texas. Denton County Central Appraisal District refers to the property with Parcel ID 41302, owned by Tollway West Point 1385 LP & Coit Main Redemption LLC. The property is within the Pilot Point extraterritorial jurisdiction (ETJ). The property is completely within the MSUD certificated water service area as per CCN No. 11856, and certified sewer service area as per CCN No. 20930 on file with Public Utility Commission of Texas.

FEMA Flood Insurance Rate Map # 48121C0260G, dated April 18, 2011, depicts no portion of the property to be in a special flood hazard area.

The feasibility request indicates that the property will be developed into 2,000 single-family residential lots. Demand is calculated as 2,000 total Living Unit Equivalents (LUEs), assuming 1 LUE per lot. The Utility Evaluation Application indicates a fire flow requirement of 1,000 GPM for a duration of 1 hour.

Domestic Water and Fire Flow

MSUD has an existing 24-inch on the south side of Mobberly Road, approximately 0.25 miles east of the intersection of FM 1385 and Mobberly Road. To provide service, the developer shall connect to this existing water line and construct a minimum 12-inch (oversize to 24-inch) water line west to the intersection of Lights Ranch Road. From here, the water line will reduce to a minimum 12-inch (oversize to 18-inch) water line and extend north along Lights Ranch Road, terminating at the northern end of the proposed development. Additionally, the developer shall be required to provide one (1) 3-acre site and one (1) 2-acre site within the development for the construction of new public water wells and storage facilities. MSUD shall design, permit and construct these facilities, however the developer shall be responsible for all costs associated with these activities.

Based on USGS datum, the property's natural ground elevations vary from approximately 612 to 652 feet above MSL. Based on MSUD's applicable pressure plane for this area (798' Houlihan Pressure Plane), static pressure for this area will be approximately 63 to 80 to psi.

The existing and proposed water lines will have sufficient capacity to provide the requested domestic water and fire flow service. Dynamic residual pressures at peak demand will comply with TCEQ rules and regulations. Existing MSUD customers in the area will not have a decrease in pressures that would cause non-compliance with TCEQ standards.

<u>Wastewater</u>

Using MSUD's wastewater design values of 250 gpd average and 1,000 gpd peak per LUE, this development is expected to produce an average of 500,000 gallons and a peak of 2,000,000 gallons of wastewater per day. The nearest point of adequate point of service is the proposed Maverick Farms Water Reclamation Plant (WRP) located approximately 3 miles southwest of the development. The development shall be required to design and construct the necessary wastewater infrastructure to support the development and discharge to the WRP indicated above. The development shall not be able to put flows into the system until the WRP is completed and online. There is currently no schedule available for the completion of the WRP.

The attached Preliminary Service Map provides an illustration of the above-referenced service provisions. Please note that all public water and/or wastewater lines shall be constructed within exclusive MSUD Utility Easements. These easements shall be provided either by plat or by separate instrument. The developer shall be responsible for the coordination and acquisition of these easements. Additionally, MSUD may, at their discretion, upsize the facilities indicated above to support future growth in the area. Any upsize requirement will be defined and quantified in the Non-Standard Agreement prepared by MSUD.

We recommend a 90-day limit apply for this review from the date of this letter. It should be noted that MSUD's providing service to this subdivision shall be contingent upon the developer's compliance with all relevant Federal, State and County rules and regulations as per MSUD's rate order.




