DOMESTIC WASTEWATER

The following summary is provided for this pending water quality permit application being reviewed by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality as required by 30 TAC Chapter 39. The information provided in this summary may change during the technical review of the application and is not a federal enforceable representation of the permit application.

Liberty County Municipal Utility District No. 13A (CN606254548) proposes to operate Liberty County Municipal Utility District No. 13A WWTP (RN112197157), a wastewater treatment plant. The facility will be located at between State Highway 146 and Farm to Market Road No. 1409, approximately 3 miles southeast of the intersection between State Highway 146 and U.S. Highway 90., in Dayton, Liberty County, Texas 77535. This application is for a new application to discharge at a daily average flow of 825,000 gallons per day of treated domestic wastewater.

Discharges from the facility are expected to contain five-day carbonaceous biochemical oxygen demand (CBOD5), total suspended solids (TSS), ammonia nitrogen (NH3-N), and Escherichia coli. Additional potential pollutants are included in the Domestic Technical Report 1.0, Section 7. Pollutant Analysis of Treated Effluent in the permit application package. Domestic wastewater will be treated by an activated sludge process plant and the treatment units will include a bar screen, aeration basins, final clarifiers, sludge digesters, and chlorine contact chambers.

APPLICATION. Liberty County Municipal Utility District No. 13A, 202 Century Square Boulevard, Sugar Land, Texas 77478, has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for proposed Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (TPDES) Permit No. WQ0016790001 (EPA I.D. No. TX0147753) to authorize the discharge of treated wastewater at a volume not to exceed a daily average flow of 825,000 gallons per day. The domestic wastewater treatment facility will be located approximately 3 miles south of the intersection of State Highway 146 and U.S. Highway 90, near the city of Dayton, in Liberty County, Texas 77535. The discharge route will be from the plant site to an unnamed tributary, thence to east prong old river, thence to Old River, thence to Old River Lake, thence to Old River, thence to Long Island Bayou, thence to Trinity Bay. TCEQ received this application on April 16, 2025. The permit application will be available for viewing and copying at Jones Public Library, Reference Desk, 801 South Cleveland Street, Dayton, in Liberty County, Texas prior to the date this notice is published in the newspaper. The purpose of a public meeting is to provide the opportunity to submit comments or to ask questions about the application. TCEQ will hold a public meeting if the Executive Director determines that there is a significant degree of public interest in the application or if requested by a local legislator. A public meeting is not a contested case hearing.

OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING. After the deadline for submitting public comments, the Executive Director will consider all timely comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. **Unless the application is directly referred for a contested case hearing, the response to comments, and the Executive Director's decision on the application, will be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments and to those persons who are on the mailing list for this application. If comments are received, the mailing will also provide instructions for requesting reconsideration of the Executive Director's decision and for requesting a contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.**

Following the close of all applicable comment and request periods, the Executive Director will forward the application and any requests for reconsideration or for a contested case hearing to the TCEQ Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting.

The Commission may only grant a request for a contested case hearing on issues the requestor submitted in their timely comments that were not subsequently withdrawn. If a hearing is granted, the subject of a hearing will be limited to disputed issues of fact or mixed questions of fact and law relating to relevant and material water quality concerns submitted during the comment period.



The facility will be located between State Highway 146 and Farm to Market Road No. 1409, approximately 3 miles southeast of the intersection between State Highway 146 and U.S. Highway 90., in Dayton, Liberty County, Texas 77535. This application is for a new application to discharge at a daily average flow of 825,000 gallons per day of treated domestic wastewater..

Discharges from the facility are expected to contain five-day carbonaceous biochemical oxygen demand (CBOD5), total suspended solids (TSS), ammonia nitrogen (NH3-N), and Escherichia coli. Additional potential pollutants are included in the Domestic Technical Report 1.0, Section 7. Pollutant Analysis of Treated Effluent in the permit application package.. Domestic wastewater will be treated by an activated sludge process plant and the treatment units will include a bar screen, aeration basins, final clarifiers, sludge digesters, and chlorine contact chambers.


The treatment system includes a package plant employing the activated sludge process operating in the complete mix mode. The plant will be developed in three phases. Phase I will have a capacity of 0.275 MGD. Phase II will have a capacity of 0.55 MGD, Phase III will have a capacity of 0.825 MGD.

Phases I, II, and III will consist of steel "box car" basins. Phase I will consist of three aeration basins, one 40' clarifier, two aerobic digesters, and a chlorine contact basin. Phase II will include three additional aeration basins, one additional 40' clarifier, two aerobic digesters, and one chlorine contact basin. Phase III will include three additional aeration basins, one 40' clarifier, two aerobic digesters, and one chlorine contact basin. These will be a total of three trains in the final phase, each consisting of three aeration basins, two digesters, a clarifier, and a chlorine contact basin.

Influent to this facility will be pumped from a lift station to a bar screen with a flow splitter. The bar screen with flow splitter will split the influent to each aeration basin. The mix liquor from the aeration basins will flow to the clarifier. The clarified effluent from the clarifier will flow to the chlorine contact basin and the disinfected plant effluent will outfall via a storm sewer to a drainage ditch. Sludge will be returned to the aeration basins and wasted to the digester basins via air lifts, and truck hauled from the digesters via a licensed sludge contact hauler to a registered disposal site.





ATTACHMENT 8.1 PHASE 2 - PROCESS FLOW DIAGRAM (0.55 MGD)







Proposed WWTP Location





Proposed Outfall Location






Photograph 1: WWTP North






Photograph 3: WWTP South






